DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 10, 2026, marks a pivotal moment of global instability as the war between the US-Israeli coalition and Iran enters a high-intensity phase, significantly impacting energy markets and security architectures. The conflict, characterized by the US as operation "Epic Wrath" and by Israel as "Lion's Roar," has seen the death of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei and his replacement by his son, [Mojtaba Khamenei](#), a move widely seen as a consolidation of power by the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC). Iran's subsequent [blockade of the Strait of Hormuz](#) has triggered a violent surge in global oil prices, which briefly touched \$120 per barrel, forcing the United States to consider a partial lifting of oil sanctions on Russia and Venezuela to prevent a domestic and global economic meltdown.

In Ukraine, the tactical situation has shifted following a series of [successful counterattacks](#)

on the "Alexandrovsk direction" at the junction of the Dnipropetrovsk and Zaporizhzhia regions. Ukrainian forces have reportedly [liberated over 400 square kilometers](#) of territory, aiming to push Russian forces away from critical supply routes and the city of Zaporizhzhia. However, this success is tempered by the continued loss of elite personnel, including the commander of the 39th Tactical Aviation Brigade, [Colonel Oleksandr Dovhach](#), and the emergence of new Russian weaponry such as the "Izdelie 30" hybrid missile, which recently [devastated a residential building](#) in Kharkiv.

The day is further defined by a sharpening diplomatic and legal confrontation between Ukraine and Hungary. The [seizure of Ukrainian bank trucks](#) by Hungarian authorities—containing \$40 million, €35 million, and 9kg of gold—has escalated from a financial dispute into a full-scale "lawfare" crisis. Viktor Orban's government is leveraging the incident to stall Ukraine's EU integration, while Kyiv prepares international legal action. Internally, Ukraine is grappling with the security implications of anonymous digital platforms, with [parliamentary inquiries into Telegram](#) highlighting its role as a tool for Russian recruitment and disinformation, even as the state considers its own "Max" alternative.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

The US-Iran War and the Strait of Hormuz Crisis

- Operation "Epic Wrath" has resulted in the destruction of over 1,700 Iranian targets, yet Iran maintains significant asymmetric strike capabilities, [attacking US consulates](#) and regional allies across 12 countries.

- The blockade of the Strait of Hormuz has [paralyzed 20% of global oil trade](#), leading France to announce an [unprecedented naval mission](#) involving the aircraft carrier *Charles de Gaulle* to escort tankers.
- President Trump has indicated a willingness to [partially lift oil sanctions](#) to stabilize prices, a move that potentially hands a [financial lifeline to the Kremlin](#).

Ukraine's Southern Counteroffensive (Alexandrovsk Direction)

- Ukrainian forces have executed a [high-speed tactical push](#) at the Dnipro-Zaporizhzhia border, [reclaiming 285-450 square kilometers](#) previously lost over the last year.
- Military analysts note that while the gains are significant, the ability to [hold these positions](#) against Russian reserves, including the 40th Marine Brigade, remains an open question.
- Russia is retaliating with high-precision strikes on logistics, [introducing the "Izdelie 30" missile](#) to the Kharkiv theater with lethal results.

The Oshchadbank-Hungary Seizure Incident

- Hungarian law enforcement [detained seven Ukrainian citizens](#) and seized vehicles carrying nearly \$80 million in assets transit from Austria.
- Ukraine's Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) has [charged Budapest with violating](#) three international conventions, while Hungary frames the transport as a "military mafia" operation.

- The incident has [triggered a diplomatic firestorm](#) in the European Parliament, where pro-Orban forces unsuccessfully attempted to censure President Zelensky for "threats" against Orban.

Ukraine as an Exporter of Security Expertise

- Following [requests from 11 nations](#), Ukraine has [deployed anti-drone specialists](#) to the Middle East to protect American bases in Jordan and assist regional allies against Iranian Shahed-type UAVs.
- This "security export" is seen as a way to [offset the cost of Western aid](#) and validate the high technological status of the Ukrainian defense industry.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security and Economic Resilience

- The [shock to the oil market](#) has immediately [inflated fuel prices](#) in Ukraine, prompting government intervention to prevent speculation and a projected [9 billion UAH loss](#) to the national economy.
- The EU asserts that gas reserves are [sufficient for the season](#), but high volatility [threatens industrial output](#) and airline stability.

National Security and Digital Sovereignty

- The Ukrainian Parliament's Temporary Investigative Commission (TIC) is [investigating the tax evasion](#) and "reservation" (mobilization exemption) of [anonymous Telegram channel owners](#), alleging some are SBU employees.

- The rise of [AI-generated "deepfake" propaganda](#) on TikTok, depicting Ukrainian soldiers attacking the government, is being identified as a primary threat to domestic stability.
- Ukraine has [advanced digital battle systems](#) like "Grafit" and "Sova," which provide real-time drone detection to frontline troops.

Corruption and Rule of Law

- The case of [Ivan Ablov](#), son of a prominent judge accused of murder, highlights persistent [delays in the judicial system](#) and the "elite" immunity culture that continues to plague reform efforts.
- The "Hospitaliers" medical battalion is [facing scrutiny over financial transparency](#), with accusations of multiple collection accounts and a lack of audit, raising concerns about the [credibility of the volunteer movement](#).

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Ukrainian legislative activity focused on international anti-corruption standards and controversial social assistance reforms. Tensions between the executive and legislative branches were evident in the failure of key social bills and calls for the removal of tainted officials.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **OECD Anti-Bribery Convention (Bill 0367):** Parliament [successfully ratified the convention](#) on the fight against bribery of foreign public officials, a critical [requirement for EU accession](#).

- **Basic Social Assistance (Bill 14051):** This [bill failed to pass](#), with opposition parties [criticizing the abandonment](#) of the "minimum subsistence level" in favor of a "budget-dependent" variable.
- **Self-Organization of the Population (Bill 6319):** Debated as a means to [improve local democracy](#), it was [denounced by critics](#) as a mechanism for local governments to "buy" civil society through budget grants.
- **Taxation of Digital Platforms (Bill 14025):** Proposed [5% tax on gig-economy](#) and resale platform (OLX, Glovo) incomes; [fiercely opposed](#) as an attack on the poor.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Telegram Oversight TIC:** A parliamentary commission [scrutinized the lack of transparency](#) in Telegram channels, with the SBU notably [absent from the hearing](#).
- **Ministry of Interior Mobilization Report:** Minister Ihor Klymenko [clarified that police only detain](#) individuals already marked as "wanted" by the TCC, refusing to [disclose specific numbers](#) for national security reasons.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Global Transition to Asymmetric, High-Tech Warfare

The conflict in the Middle East is mirroring the Ukrainian experience, with [autonomous drone swarms](#) and AI-driven targeting outperforming [traditional naval and air power](#). The US and Israel's struggle to [deblock the Strait of Hormuz](#) against Iranian sea-drones demonstrates that modern "super-fleets" are [unusually vulnerable](#) to cheap, asymmetric

Lawfare and Asset Seizure as the New Frontline

By utilizing "anti-terrorism" and "national security" labels to [freeze sovereign assets](#), the Orban administration is engaging in a form of financial piracy that undermines European institutional trust. This "lawfare" is intended to [provoke an emotional response](#) from Kyiv that can then be used to [justify blocking Ukraine's](#) path to the EU and NATO.

Domestic Social Fragmentation and the "Fatigue" Narrative

Despite military gains, internal Ukrainian discourse is increasingly fractured by [forced mobilization \(busification\)](#) and the perception of a [tiered justice system](#) where the children of the elite escape consequence. The [proliferation of deepfake videos](#) depicting mutiny is successfully [exploiting real grievances](#) regarding the economy and libraries' collapse [due to poverty wages](#). The state's failure to pass a unified "Human Capital Policy" [risks permanent demographic loss](#) as millions abroad lose the incentive to return.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect [extreme volatility](#) in fuel prices globally and in Ukraine as the Hormuz blockade continues. If [naval escorts fail](#), crude could sustain prices over \$130.

- The [Oshchadbank legal battle](#) will escalate to the EU court system, likely leading to a temporary [suspension of certain bilateral agreements](#) between Kyiv and Budapest.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- Hungarian [parliamentary elections in April](#) will determine the trajectory of the Druzhba pipeline and EU aid. A loss for Orban [would fundamentally shift](#) Central European geopolitics.
- Ukraine will likely [formalize its anti-drone advisory missions](#) into a permanent defense export program, providing a [new stream of non-aid revenue](#).

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- A structural shift in European security will see the [integration of Ukrainian drone and AI technology](#) as the baseline for NATO's eastern flank defense.
- The US-Iran conflict may [permanently redraw energy transit maps](#), with high-investment pipelines [replacing maritime routes](#) through the Persian Gulf.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Maritime Security:** Nations must rapidly [adapt naval doctrines](#) to counter asymmetric sea-drones, as the blockade of Hormuz [renders current carrier groups](#) insufficient for trade protection.
- **Sanctions Strategy:** Policy makers should resist the [lifting of Russian oil sanctions](#) as a fix for the Iran crisis, as this [undermines the Ukrainian frontline](#) and rewards Moscow for regional chaos.

- **Institutional Stability:** The EU must create [mechanisms to bypass single-state vetoes](#) on security issues to prevent domestic electoral politics (like Orban's) from [crippling continental defense](#).

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Supply Chains:** Investors should [hedge against prolonged maritime closures](#) in the Middle East by pivoting to [North American and West African](#) energy producers.
- **Cybersecurity/Information Risk:** Companies operating in Central/Eastern Europe must [prepare for AI-driven "cognitive warfare"](#) that can [trigger sudden civil unrest](#) or localized strikes.
- **Defense Tech Opportunity:** The [Ukrainian "Grafit" systems](#) and similar field-proven AI battle management software represent a [high-growth investment sector](#) as global defense budgets shift to autonomous systems.
