

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THE MIDDLE EAST WAR ESCALATES AS MOJTABA KHAMENEI TAKES POWER IN IRAN, TRIGGERING A GLOBAL ENERGY CRISIS AND EXPOSING SYSTEMIC CORRUPTION AND LEGISLATIVE PARALYSIS IN BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 10, 2026, marks the eleventh day of the war in the Middle East, a conflict that has fundamentally shifted global geopolitics and economic stability. Following the [death of the Supreme Leader](#), his son Mojtaba Khamenei has assumed control, signaling a more radical and defiant stance against U.S. and Israeli operations. While President Donald Trump claims [significant military success](#), including an 83% drop in Iranian drone launches, Iranian officials maintain that their capabilities remain robust and have [rejected any further diplomacy](#) with the United States. The threat of a total blockade of the [Strait of Hormuz](#) remains the primary lever of Iranian strategy, aiming to make the war "unbearably expensive" for the West and its regional allies.

The economic fallout is acute, with global oil prices [surpassing \\$100 per barrel](#) for the first

time since 2022. In Bosnia and Herzegovina, this has translated into a sharp rise in fuel costs, with diesel prices [approaching 3 KM per liter](#). The domestic situation is further complicated by a total legislative standstill in the House of Peoples, where the HDZ and SNSD are accused of [blocking quorums](#) to prevent the adoption of essential reforms and the 2026 budget. This political gridlock threatens to deprive the country of [EU Growth Plan funds](#), even as public sector workers announce massive protests for late March over wage stagnation and economic hardship.

Simultaneously, a high-stakes anti-corruption hearing has exposed deep-seated [criminality within the Indirect Taxation Authority \(UIO\)](#). Whistleblowers and former investigators have detailed a "mafia-like" structure where individuals linked to the notorious ["Pandora" affair](#) have not only avoided prosecution but have been promoted to high-ranking positions. Estimates suggest the state is losing [700 million KM annually](#) due to customs fraud and tax evasion, orchestrated by a cross-ethnic "brotherhood" of corrupt officials who operate with apparent impunity while the Prosecutor's Office remains largely unresponsive.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Iranian Succession and Escalation:** Following the killing of the Supreme Leader, [Mojtaba Khamenei](#) has taken power, supported by the Revolutionary Guard. Iranian officials claim the system is fully functional and have [ruled out negotiations](#), describing the conflict as an existential struggle. [Russia is reportedly providing](#) intelligence on U.S. troop movements to Tehran.

- **Global Energy Shock:** Crude oil prices peaked [near \\$120 per barrel](#) before settling around \$100. Iran has threatened to [block all oil exports](#) from the Gulf unless U.S.-Israeli strikes cease, while offering [unlimited passage](#) to countries that sever ties with Washington and Tel Aviv.
- **UIO Corruption Scandal:** Whistleblowers testifying before the State Parliament's Anti-Corruption Commission revealed that [customs is being used](#) for personal enrichment. Specific allegations were made against [Goran Marinković](#), the head of the Banja Luka customs office, regarding the [illegal import of biodiesel](#) and other goods.
- **Bosnian Political Gridlock:** The House of Peoples has failed to maintain quorums, [paralyzing the adoption](#) of laws on the budget, VAT, and energy reforms. This has led to [civil service unions](#) scheduling mass protests for March 31, 2026.
- **Regional Security Shifts:** Croatia has officially reintroduced [mandatory military service](#), with the first 800 recruits arriving at barracks. Meanwhile, a diplomatic row has erupted over the [Iranian Embassy in Zagreb](#), which Israel accuses of gathering intelligence for terrorist attacks.
- **Legal Warfare (Lawfare):** Prominent lawyer Vasvija Vidović has been [sentenced to six months](#) in prison for hiding the mobile phone of former court president Ranko Debevec during his 2023 arrest.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security and Economic Resilience

- The war has driven oil prices to levels that [threaten a global recession](#). Analysts note that the U.S. is [producing more oil](#) than in the 1970s, which may mitigate some shocks, but a prolonged [Hormuz disruption](#) would be catastrophic for global supply chains.
- In Bosnia, the lack of [adequate oil reserves](#) (sufficient for only a few weeks of institutional function) leaves the economy highly vulnerable. Calls are growing for a [temporary suspension of excise taxes](#) on fuel to lower the burden on citizens.

Corruption and Governance

- Whistleblowers at the UIO reported that [systemic pressure](#) is applied to inspectors who find tax irregularities. In one instance, an inspector's [performance rating was lowered](#) despite bringing in 1/7th of the entire regional center's profit because they refused to follow "illegal instructions."
- The ["brotherhood" of corrupt officials](#) across ethnic lines is described as the most successful "multi-ethnic project" in the country, effectively [looting the state](#) while the political elite uses ethnic tension as a distraction.

International Relations and Foreign Policy

- The "Trump Doctrine" is characterized as ["Silicon Valley style"](#)—move fast and break things. Critics argue there is [no coherent national security strategy](#), leading to ad-hoc military decisions that destabilize allies in the Gulf.

- EU cohesion is fraying, with [sharp differences](#) between the Spanish PM (calling the Iran strikes a breach of international law) and the German Chancellor (taking a more cautious, pro-U.S. stance).
- The [lifting of U.S. sanctions](#) against Milorad Dodik's associates and the Republic of Srpska is viewed as a major shift in U.S. regional policy, interpreted as a move toward [ideology-based statecraft](#).

Critical Infrastructure

- Bosnian railways are [facing collapse](#) due to a massive drop in freight transport, partially caused by the war's impact on regional industry and the [ongoing disruption](#) of the Ploče-Sarajevo line. Total losses have [exceeded 50 million KM](#).

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity in Bosnia is defined by inaction and obstruction, while regional neighbors are moving toward mobilization and emergency economic measures. High-level hearings have become the primary venue for exposing executive and judicial failures.

- **UIO Anti-Corruption Hearing:** A public session where whistleblowers provided [evidence of customs fraud](#) and internal mobbing. The Commission plans to [summon the UIO leadership](#) and the Prosecutor's Office for follow-up testimony.
- **House of Peoples Blockade:** Representatives from the HDZ and SNSD [abandoned sjednice](#), preventing the passage of a law intended to [increase civil servant wages](#) from the start of the year.

- **Croatia Military Service:** Legislation reintroducing [mandatory military service](#) has been implemented, providing recruits with 700 euros net and [preferential employment rights](#) in state bodies.
- **EU Growth Plan:** Failure to submit the [Reform Agenda](#) on time has already resulted in "punitive bonuses" for Bosnia, with [70 million euros](#) in immediate funding at risk.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of the Global Economy

A clear trend has emerged where regional conflicts are immediately leveraged as economic weapons. Iran's ultimatum regarding the [Strait of Hormuz](#)—linking maritime safety to diplomatic alignment—is a sophisticated form of [economic warfare](#) that bypasses traditional military engagement. This "Hormuz Leverage" aims to split the international community by [offering oil security](#) only to those who abandon the U.S. and Israel, creating a potential new bloc of "energy-neutral" states.

State Capture and Institutional Decay in BiH

The UIO hearing revealed a disturbing trend: [institutional capture](#) is no longer just about theft, but about the active [persecution of law-abiding officials](#). The use of disciplinary proceedings to "break" inspectors who uncover corruption indicates a [criminalization of the bureaucracy](#) itself. When high-level suspects from the Pandora affair are [promoted instead of prosecuted](#), the signal to the private sector and the public is that the Rule of Law has been replaced by a system of organized "spoils."

Militarization as Domestic Policy

In Croatia, the return to [mandatory military service](#) is framed as a response to regional instability and a tool for "generational discipline." This move, combined with [rising defense spending](#) across the Balkans, suggests a shift away from the post-Yugoslav era of demilitarization. The domestic reception, however, is mixed, with some viewing it as a [necessary patriotic duty](#) and others as a distraction from the [rising cost of living](#).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks):

- Expect [civil unrest](#) in Sarajevo as the March 31 protest deadline approaches. If the budget and wage laws are not passed, [radicalization of union demands](#) is likely.
- Fuel prices will likely [exceed 3.20 KM](#) if the Iranian conflict shows no signs of de-escalation, triggering price hikes in [basic food staples](#).

Medium Term (1-6 Months):

- The [failure to reform](#) the electricity market and the UIO will likely lead to [EU sanctions](#) or a total freeze of development funds. This will exacerbate the [railway crisis](#), potentially leading to the bankruptcy of major state enterprises.
- The U.S. midterm elections will influence the [intensity of the Iran campaign](#); Trump will face immense pressure to [lower gas prices](#) by any means necessary before November.

Long Term (1-5 Years):

- The [restructuring of international relations](#) toward a multipolar order will likely see Bosnia caught between [hegemonic blocks](#). If internal corruption is not addressed, the state risk becoming a [vassal of regional interests](#) rather than a sovereign EU aspirant.
- Energy infrastructure will shift toward [economic pipelines](#) rather than political ones, but only if the "gasification" of the country can be [commercially justified](#) to the Sarajevo consumer base.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Diplomatic efforts must prioritize the [neutrality of the Strait of Hormuz](#) as a global common. Failure to do so will allow Iran to [weaponize energy flows](#) to dismantle U.S. alliance structures in Asia and Europe.
- EU and U.S. policy toward Bosnia must shift from "reform through consensus" to "accountability through sanctions," specifically targeting the [financial networks](#) identified in the UIO corruption hearings.
- Address the [Russia-Iran intelligence sharing](#) axis, as it poses a direct [threat to U.S. naval assets](#) and NATO air supremacy in the Mediterranean.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** High alert for disruptions in [critical materials](#) (copper, sulfuric acid) that originate in the Gulf; these are essential for the [global semiconductor industry](#).

- **Investment Climate:** Bosnia remains a high-risk environment for FDI in infrastructure due to [systemic corruption](#) and the potential for [railway bankruptcy](#).
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Companies operating in BiH must increase [due diligence](#) regarding customs and tax payments, as the [unreliability of UIO oversight](#) may expose them to secondary legal risks or extortion.
