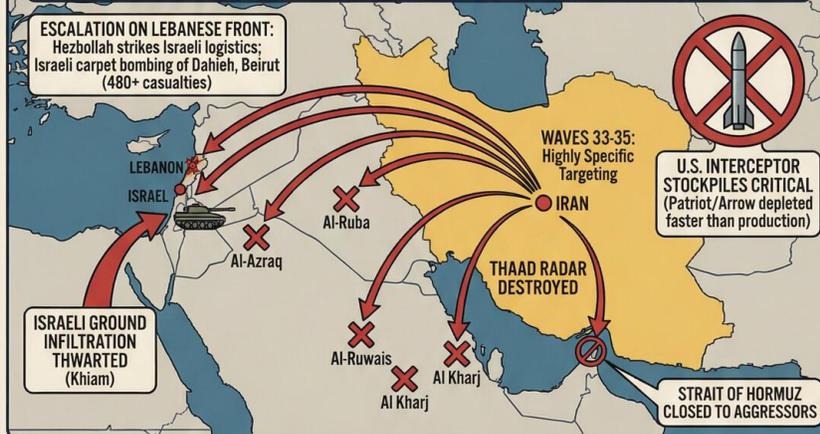
NEW SUPREME LEADER: MUJTABA KHAMENEI

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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 10, 2026, marks a critical inflection point in the U.S.-Israeli war against Iran, defined by the formalization of Iranian leadership succession and a significant shift in regional military dynamics. The Iranian Assembly of Experts has officially appointed [Ayatollah Sayyid Mujtaba Khamenei](#) as the third Leader of the Islamic Revolution, succeeding his father who was assassinated in a U.S.-Israeli strike roughly one week prior. This appointment signals continuity and stability within the Iranian establishment, effectively neutralizing U.S. expectations of a regime collapse following the decapitation of its top leadership. Institutional [allegiance to the new leader](#) has been swift, with the IRGC and regular armed forces pledging full support amid ongoing hostilities.

On the kinetic front, Iran has accelerated "Operation True Promise 4," launching its

33rd through 35th waves of missile and drone strikes. These operations have transitioned from broad swarms to [highly specific targeting](#) of U.S. and Israeli air defense infrastructure. Reports indicate the systematic destruction of [Terminal High Altitude Area Defense \(THAAD\) radar systems](#) across three countries, with replacements estimated to take five to eight years to manufacture. Simultaneously, the depletion of U.S. interceptor stockpiles has reached a critical stage, with regional actors like the UAE reportedly making [emergency calls for more munitions](#) as current inventories are rationed to protect only high-priority assets.

The economic consequences of the conflict have begun to hemorrhage into the global market. While U.S. President Donald Trump has claimed the war is "pretty much complete," market realities contradict this narrative. The Strait of Hormuz remains closed to [vessels linked to the aggressors](#), driving oil prices toward \$120 per barrel and causing a massive [outflow of capital from Dubai](#) toward Asian markets. In Europe, natural gas reserves are reportedly down to [only two days](#) of supply, threatening industrial collapse. Domestic pressure is mounting on President Trump as gasoline prices hit \$7 per gallon in major U.S. cities, prompting rumors of a [general military draft](#) to sustain a conflict that was initially sold as a short-term operation.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Leadership Succession and Institutional Stability

- The Assembly of Experts appointed [Ayatollah Mujtaba Khamenei](#) as Supreme Leader, emphasizing his theological credentials and experience as a close aide to his father.
- Mass rallies were held across Iranian cities to [show popular support](#) for the new leadership, despite the threat of ongoing aerial strikes.
- The Iranian government has [suspended all negotiations](#) with the United States, citing a total breakdown in diplomatic trust following strikes during previous negotiation rounds.

Systematic Degradation of Regional Air Defenses

- Iranian forces targeted and [eliminated four THAAD radars](#) at Al-Ruba, Al-Ruwais, Al Kharj, and Al-Azraq within a 24-hour period.
- U.S. interceptor missiles, specifically the [Patriot and Arrow systems](#), are being depleted at rates exceeding annual production capacities.
- The IRGC has announced that all future missile strikes against Israel will utilize warheads [no lighter than one ton](#), increasing the lethality and bypass capability of Iranian projectiles.

Escalation on the Lebanese Front

- Hezbollah has intensified strikes on [Israeli regional logistics centers](#) and military industries, including the Yodafat and Samson bases.

- Israeli forces have conducted "carpet bombing" of the [Dahieh district in Beirut](#) and targeted residential buildings, resulting in over 480 Lebanese casualties.
- Lebanese Resistance forces [thwarted multiple infiltration attempts](#) by Israeli ground forces in the town of Khiam, reportedly destroying three Merkava tanks.

Global Economic and Financial Volatility

- Oil benchmark prices reached [\\$114 to \\$120 per barrel](#), with analysts predicting a spike to \$250 if the conflict persists.
- Asset relocation is accelerating in the Gulf, with case studies showing [\\$1 billion outflows](#) from single fund managers in Dubai to Singapore and Hong Kong.
- Saudi Arabia's [Ras Tanura refinery](#) faced temporary closure, and Iraqi Kurdistan oil exports have been suspended.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Succession & Stability The rapid appointment of Mujtaba Khamenei serves as a masterclass in [decentralized power structures](#) and institutional resilience. Analysts suggest the "mosaic structure" of Iranian governance allowed for seamless continuity despite the loss of the head of state and the chief of staff. The transition has [galvanized the population](#), shifting the domestic mood from mourning to a "sacred defense" posture, which complicates U.S. attempts to instigate civil unrest.

Energy Security The closure of the Strait of Hormuz has created an [unprecedented energy crisis](#) for the West. While the U.S. claims energy independence, the global nature of pricing has driven domestic gasoline to [\\$7 per gallon](#) in California. Europe's situation is more dire, with [natural gas reserves](#) hitting critical lows, forcing the G7 to hold emergency

meetings with central banks to prevent total economic contagion.

Security Architecture The conflict has exposed fundamental flaws in the U.S. regional security umbrella. Gulf monarchies are discovering that [hosting U.S. bases](#) makes them targets for Iranian retaliation without providing a guaranteed defense, as interceptors are redirected to protect Israel. This is prompting a [realignment among regional actors](#), with countries like the UAE and Qatar explicitly stating they will not allow their territories to be used as launching pads for strikes against Iran.

Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics Inside the U.S. administration, there appears to be a [growing rift](#) between "Israel-first" hawks like Lindsey Graham and Pete Hegseth and advisors seeking an "off-ramp" for President Trump. Trump's rhetoric has become increasingly [contradictory](#), claiming military victory while simultaneously seeking mediation through Italy and Oman to secure a ceasefire that Iran has already rejected.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislation and policy discussions centered on emergency measures to combat the economic fallout of the war and the potential for a return to conscription in the United States. In the UK, the government is grappling with the legality of [using British bases](#) for offensive strikes, while in Iran, the Assembly of Experts

invoked [Article 109 of the Constitution](#) to facilitate the leadership transition.

- **U.S. General Military Draft Proposal:** Reports indicate the Trump administration is considering a [national draft](#) to address manpower shortages and prepare for a potential ground invasion of Iran, a move seen as politically suicidal ahead of the midterms.
- **Iranian Economic Stabilization Measures:** The Interior Ministry has implemented a [long-term strategic reserve plan](#), ensuring 45 days of flour supply for bakeries and monitoring market prices to prevent gouging during the war.
- **UK Enlistment Act of 1870:** Activists are calling for the enforcement of this act to [investigate British citizens](#) returning from service in the Israeli military during the Gaza genocide.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Collapse of "Strategic Patience" A primary theme of the day is the formal end of Iran's "strategic patience." After years of measured responses to assassinations and sanctions, Iran has [transitioned to a doctrine of total retaliation](#). This is evidenced by the direct targeting of 28 U.S. bases and the refusal to accept any ceasefire that does not include the [unconditional removal](#) of U.S. forces from West Asia. Commentators suggest that the West's "rules-based order" has been [exposed as a mockery](#) by the ongoing strikes on Iranian schools and hospitals. The perception that international law only applies to the enemies of the West is driving a [broad global awakening](#). This is manifesting in growing anti-war movements in the UK and US, where citizens are beginning to connect [domestic economic suffering](#) directly to "imperialist" military expenditures.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect an intensification of [missile exchanges](#) as Iran deploys its "next generation" solid-fuel projectiles to overwhelm remaining U.S. interceptors.
- U.S. domestic unrest will likely spike as [gasoline prices exceed \\$8 per gallon](#), potentially forcing emergency rationing or federal intervention in energy markets.
- The Israeli domestic front will face [continued blackouts](#) and infrastructure degradation, potentially leading to a "mass exodus" of dual-nationals to Europe.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- Iran may [revisit its nuclear fatwa](#) if the existential threat persists, moving toward formal weaponization as a final deterrent against a U.S. ground invasion.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- The permanent [exit of U.S. military bases](#) from at least two regional countries (likely Iraq and Bahrain) as the "liability" of their presence outweighs their strategic value.
- A structural shift in the global energy trade, with ["petrodollar" dominance](#) giving way to yuan- or local-currency-based oil trades to bypass U.S. financial leverage.
- The possible [collapse of the Zionist project](#) in its current form, as the economic and security costs of maintaining a "fortress state" become untenable for its population and Western sponsors.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy

- Security: Recognize that traditional missile defense systems are [economically unsustainable](#) against high-volume asymmetric projectile warfare; a new regional security architecture is required.

- Economic: Global powers must prepare for a [long-term closure](#) of the Strait of Hormuz and the permanent loss of Dubai as a "safe haven" for Western capital.
- Diplomatic: Engagement with the new Mujtaba Khamenei administration will require [total sanctions removal](#) as a baseline, as "incremental" diplomacy is no longer viewed as credible by Tehran.

For Private Sector/Investors

- Supply Chains: Diversify away from reliance on [Gulf-based logistics hubs](#) immediately; relocate critical regional headquarters to Singapore or Hong Kong to avoid asset freezing or physical destruction.
- Regulatory: Anticipate [extreme price volatility](#) in aluminum, energy, and LNG markets, with high risk of industrial "force majeure" declarations in Europe.
- Safety: Personnel in regional countries hosting U.S. assets should be [evacuated or relocated](#) away from base perimeters, as Iran has removed all "red lines" for strikes on those facilities.
