

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STRATEGIC DEADLOCK IN DEFENSE FUNDING AMIDST GLOBAL ENERGY VOLATILITY AND MIDDLE EASTERN ESCALATION

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 10, 2026, was defined by a critical convergence of high-stakes domestic political maneuvering in Poland and extreme volatility in global energy markets driven by the 11th day of the U.S.-Israeli military operation "Epic Fury" against Iran. While U.S. President Donald Trump signaled a [potential conclusion](#) to active hostilities, markets remained jittery due to the continued [blockade of the Strait of Hormuz](#), through which 20% of the world's oil flows. Brent crude prices experienced unprecedented intra-day swings, peaking near \$120 before retracing to \$90, reflecting deep uncertainty regarding Iranian regime stability and the threat of asymmetric retaliation against global energy infrastructure.

Domestically, Poland is mired in a fundamental governance crisis regarding national security funding. The Tusk administration's reliance on the EU-backed "SAFE" program—a low-interest loan of approximately 200 billion PLN—is facing an

[imminent veto](#) from President Karol Nawrocki. In its place, the President and NBP Governor Adam Glapiński have proposed "SAFE 0%," a project allegedly funded by NBP reserves and gold revaluation. Government officials have dismissed this as ["creative accounting"](#) and a political "alibi" designed to prevent the administration from claiming a massive investment success. This deadlock directly impacts the domestic arms industry, with major entities like Huta Stalowa Wola and Cegielski waiting for [modernization capital](#) amidst a hot war on Poland's eastern border and escalating threats in the Middle East.

Social stability is further challenged by a ransomware attack on the [Szczecin Provincial Hospital](#), forcing a return to paper-based operations and highlighting critical vulnerabilities in healthcare infrastructure. Simultaneously, the rise of AI-generated "deepfakes" has moved from schools to public figures, as seen in the case of a prominent [Poznań teacher](#), while legislative efforts to regulate digital platforms (DSA) remain stalled by presidential vetoes. These disparate events underscore a trend where institutional friction between the "Small Palace" (Chancery of the Prime Minister) and the "Large Palace" (Chancery of the President) is increasingly compromising the state's capacity to respond to both digital and kinetic threats.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

• Operation "Epic Fury" and the Hormuz Crisis

- U.S. and Israeli forces have reportedly [destroyed 80-90%](#) of Iran's ballistic missile and drone launch capabilities, yet the Strait of Hormuz remains blocked by Iranian naval threats and high insurance premiums.
- A controversial U.S. Tomahawk strike on a [school in Minab](#) killed 175-180 civilians, mostly girls; President Trump has expressed a willingness to "live with" the consequences of the investigation.
- Mostafa Khamenei has been named Supreme Leader, signaling a [hardline entrenchment](#) of the Revolutionary Guard (IRGC) despite U.S. efforts to force a regime collapse.

• The Polish Defense Funding Impasse (SAFE vs. SAFE 0%)

- President Nawrocki is expected to veto the EU SAFE implementation bill, proposing a [domestic alternative](#) using NBP profits that currently do not exist due to recorded losses.
- Minister of Defense Kosiniak-Kamysz warns that a veto will [delay critical infrastructure](#) projects, including the "San" anti-drone system and border protection upgrades.
- NBP Governor Glapiński faces intensified calls for a [Tribunal of State](#) trial for alleged political involvement and "printing money" through accounting tricks.

• Global Energy Realignment

- The U.S. has granted a [30-day sanction waiver](#) on Russian oil to stabilize global markets, a move praised by the Kremlin but criticized as a blow to Ukrainian interests.
- The UK reports a critical gas shortage, with [two days of reserves](#) remaining, highlighting the fragility of "just-in-time" energy models during maritime blockades.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security & Market Volatility The blockade of the Strait of Hormuz has forced Orlen to [slash retail margins](#) to zero to prevent domestic prices from exceeding 8 PLN per liter. While the government maintains that [90-day reserves](#) are secure, the "fuel tourism" of German drivers into Poland is straining border station supplies.

Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics The relationship between Prime Minister Tusk and President Nawrocki has reached a historic nadir over the [SAFE program](#). The use of the NBP as a political tool to provide the President with a "SAFE 0%" alibi is seen by analysts as an erosion of [central bank independence](#) and a maneuver to court Skrajna Prawica (far-right) voters.

Cybersecurity & Digital Sovereignty The ransomware attack on the [Szczecin Provincial Hospital](#) illustrates the "asymmetric" nature of modern conflict, where infrastructure is targeted to cause social chaos. Meanwhile, the proliferation of [AI deepfakes](#) remains legally unaddressed due to the Presidential veto of the Digital Services Act (DSA) implementation, which Nawrocki claims would introduce ["preventive censorship."](#)

National Security Architecture The Ministry of Defense announced new [rocket units](#) in Gostynin and Łowicz, while Dutch troops have taken over [Patriot missile batteries](#) in Rzeszów-Jasionka. These moves indicate a transition toward a permanent, multi-national NATO presence on the Eastern Flank, though funding for the necessary [hangars and maintenance](#) remains tied up in the SAFE legislative fight.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The Polish government is currently navigating a period of intense legislative friction, with the President utilizing his veto power as a primary tool of opposition against EU-integrated policies. Key debates focus on defense financing mechanisms and the regulation of the digital space.

- **EU SAFE Implementation Act:** Currently on the President's desk. It would allow Poland to borrow ~200B PLN from the EU at [3% interest](#) for defense. Facing a likely veto.
- **Polish Defense Investment Fund (SAFE 0%):** A [presidential bill](#) submitted to the Sejm. It proposes funding the military using NBP profits and gold revaluation. Critics argue it [violates Article 220](#) of the Constitution regarding the financing of the budget deficit.
- **Digital Services Act (DSA) Implementation:** Vetoed by the President in January; the government continues to [press for its return](#) to address the rise of AI-driven harassment and disinformation.
- **Tobacco and E-cigarette Amendment:** The government adopted a [project to ban](#) disposable electronic cigarettes and flavored nicotine pouches.

- **Animal Welfare ("Chain") Law:** Mentioned as [previously vetoed](#), with new negotiations sought by the Sejm leadership to find a compromise with the Palace.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS

- **Tusk-Nawrocki-Glapiński Meeting:** A [high-tension summit](#) at the Presidential Palace regarding defense funding. Tusk concluded the meeting by calling the President's proposal ["SAFE 0 PLN."](#)
- **Trump "Miami" Briefing:** Trump threatened ["20 times stronger"](#) strikes if Hormuz isn't reopened, while signaling he wants the war to [end this week](#).
- **NBP Press Conference:** Governor Glapiński defended the "SAFE 0%" plan but admitted [no details](#) had been presented to the government before the summit.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Financial Institutions A dangerous trend has emerged where the National Bank of Poland (NBP) is being utilized as a [political shield](#) for the Presidency. The "SAFE 0%" proposal represents an attempt to bypass traditional budget constraints and EU oversight by leveraging central bank assets. Economists warn that "realizing profits" on gold through [buy-back schemes](#) is effectively printing money, which will likely trigger a [second wave of inflation](#) in 2027. This signifies a shift where monetary policy is becoming secondary to partisan survival strategies.

Strategic Decoupling and Alliances The U.S. decision to [waive Russian oil sanctions](#) for 30 days, coupled with President Trump's "America First" rhetoric regarding the Iran conflict, suggests a [fragmentation of the](#)

[Western response](#). While the EU seeks to build autonomous defense capabilities through programs like SAFE, the Polish opposition's preference for [U.S.-only equipment](#) creates a rift in European security architecture. The visit of King Carl XVI Gustaf of Sweden highlights the [growing Baltic-Nordic alliance](#) as a necessary counterbalance to potential U.S. isolationism.

AI and the Erosion of Truth The "deepfake" attack on [Agnieszka Jankowiak](#) and the use of AI-generated videos of [bombings in Dubai](#) to incite panic show that the digital battlefield is now fully integrated into daily life. The lack of a legal framework (DSA) due to domestic political feuding leaves the public [unprotected against AI-driven psychological operations](#). This trend suggests that social order may be compromised by digital disinformation as much as by physical attacks.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

• **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):**

- Expect a [formal veto](#) of the EU SAFE bill by March 20. The government will likely trigger its "Plan B," which may involve shifting funds from the [Armed Forces Support Fund](#) (FWSZ) without a new law, risking further legal warfare.
- Fuel prices will stabilize around 7.50-8.00 PLN as Orlen absorbs [short-term margin losses](#), but long-term sustainability is low.
- The IRGC in Iran may attempt a "swarm" attack on [regional tankers](#) to prove that U.S. claims of 90% destruction are premature.

• **Medium Term (1-6 Months):**

- The NBP Governor may be [suspended](#) as the Tribunal of State process advances, leading to a constitutional crisis over central bank leadership.
- Defense contracts for the [Borsuk IFV](#) and Krab howitzers may see delays if the SAFE funding is not resolved, leading to labor unrest in [Poznań and Stalowa Wola](#).

• **Long Term (1-5 Years):**

- A structural shift toward [European-only procurement](#) will cause friction with the U.S. defense industry if SAFE conditions are strictly enforced.
- The [Polish-Swedish naval partnership](#) will become the cornerstone of Baltic security as both nations procure new submarines and missile systems.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

• **For International Policy:**

- Security: NATO must prioritize [anti-drone and anti-missile architecture](#) in the Mediterranean and Black Sea, as Iranian proxies are expanding their strike radius to target [NATO members like Turkey](#).
- Diplomatic: Pressure should be applied to both the Polish Presidency and Government to find a [non-partisan mechanism](#) for defense funding to avoid signaling "Eastern Flank fragility" to Moscow.
- Economic: Global energy coordination must move beyond "just-in-time" models toward [regional strategic reserves](#) to mitigate the impact of Hormuz-style blockades.

- **For Private Sector/Investors:**

- Supply Chains: Manufacturers should anticipate [significant spikes in logistics costs](#) due to fuel price volatility and should consider hedging against a sustained >\$100 oil environment.
- Regulatory: Companies in the tech sector should prepare for a [legal vacuum](#) in Poland regarding AI liability and digital safety as the DSA remains stalled.
- Investment: The [Polish defense sector](#) remains a high-growth opportunity, but capital flow is currently tied to political risk; investors should favor [joint ventures with European firms](#) to qualify for EU SAFE funding.
