## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

---

March 11, 2026, marks a critical pivot in the conflict known as "Operation Epic Fury," where the initial US-Israeli objective of decapitating the Iranian leadership has evolved into a grinding war of attrition with global economic consequences. While US President Donald Trump continues to characterize the campaign as a [little excursion](#) that is "way ahead of schedule," the reality on the ground reflects a resilient Iranian military apparatus that has successfully projected chaos across the Middle East. Iran has effectively [closed the Strait of Hormuz](#), targeting commercial vessels and triggering an unprecedented response from the International Energy Agency (IEA), which has authorized the

release of [400 million barrels](#) of emergency oil reserves—the largest in history.

The conflict has expanded significantly beyond Iranian borders, with Israel launching intensive strikes against Hezbollah in Lebanon, causing the displacement of nearly [800,000 people](#). Simultaneously, Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) states, which have historically acted as mediators, find themselves under direct fire from Iranian missiles and drones. This has prompted a major diplomatic shift, culminated in the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) adopting [Resolution 2817](#), which condemns Iranian aggression against its neighbors. The day is defined by a widening "credibility gap" between the US administration's claims of having destroyed Iran's [combat effectiveness](#) and the persistent, daily barrages hitting Israeli cities and Gulf infrastructure.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

---

### The Maritime Blockade and Shipping Attacks

- The IRGC has transitioned from threats to active kinetic operations in the Strait of Hormuz, hitting [three commercial ships](#) including a Thai cargo vessel and a Japanese container carrier.
- President Trump claimed the US has destroyed [60 mine-laying vessels](#), yet military experts warn that Iran's reliance on small, asymmetric "suicide boats" and mini-submarines makes the waterway [impossible to fully secure](#).
- Two foreign tankers carrying Iraqi fuel were [set ablaze](#) by explosive-laden boats in Iraqi territorial waters, further choking regional exports.

## Global Energy and Economic Shockwaves

- The IEA's decision to release 400 million barrels of crude aims to curb [skyrocketing energy prices](#), though analysts note this only covers roughly four days of global consumption.
- US gasoline prices have surged [21% in a month](#), creating a domestic political crisis for the Trump administration ahead of the midterm elections.
- The blockade is disrupting the global [fertilizer market](#), with a third of the world's urea supply at risk, threatening a multi-year global food security crisis.

## The Lebanon Front and Humanitarian Crisis

- Israel has intensified its "Dahiyeh Doctrine," targeting residential buildings in [central Beirut](#) and eastern Lebanon, resulting in over 600 deaths in a single week.
- The Lebanese government has declared Hezbollah's actions [illegal](#) but admits it has no capacity to enforce disarmament as the country faces total economic and social collapse.

## UNSC Resolution 2817 and Diplomatic Realignment

- A record [135 countries](#) co-sponsored a resolution condemning Iran's strikes on GCC states.
- Russia and China [abstained](#) from the vote, a move interpreted as a signal of their own displeasure with Iran's targeting of civilian infrastructure, despite their opposition to the US-Israeli campaign.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

### Energy Security & Financial Resilience

- The European Union is struggling with internal divisions over [Russian fossil fuels](#), with some member states calling for a lift on sanctions to stabilize prices while others warn this would be a "strategic blunder."
- Japan and Germany have initiated the release of [strategic oil reserves](#) to protect their industrial bases from the supply shock.

### Succession & Stability: The New Iranian Leadership

- Following the assassination of Ali Khamenei, his son [Mojtaba Khamenei](#) has assumed the role of Supreme Leader, signaling a shift toward a more defiant, dynastic, and militarily aggressive posture.
- Mass funerals in Tehran for high-ranking commanders served as [political statements](#) of unity and defiance, countering US hopes for an internal uprising.

### Security Architecture: GCC Vulnerability

- The "shield" of US military presence in the Gulf has arguably become a [target](#), with Qatar and Bahrain facing daily missile interceptions near US bases.
- Qatar's Ministry of Foreign Affairs described the current regional war as the [biggest "I told you so"](#) in history, reflecting frustration with the US's failure to consult allies before launching the offensive.

## Geopolitical Power Dynamics: The Russian Benefit

- Russia is emerging as the primary financial [beneficiary](#) of the conflict, with its Urals crude hitting \$90 per barrel and Asian buyers snapping up surplus oil at market rates.
- The diversion of [Patriot interceptors](#) from Ukraine to the Middle East has created a significant military opening for Russian forces on the Ukrainian front.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

---

Domestic and international legislative bodies are reacting to the war's fallout through emergency budgeting and sovereignty-focused legal measures. In the US, the administration is attempting to pivot to [domestic populist legislation](#) to mitigate the political damage of rising costs.

### BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Save America Act (US):** A Republican-led bill focused on [voter ID and citizenship](#) requirements, which President Trump is promoting during the war to maintain his political base.
- **Operation Roaring Lion (Israel):** An emergency [defense budget expansion](#) of \$13 billion to finance the prolonged war against Iran and Hezbollah.
- **UNSC Resolution 2817:** A binding [international law](#) resolution condemning Iran's attacks on GCC countries and demanding a cessation of hostilities against uninvolved neighbors.

## HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Pentagon Press Briefing:** Secretary of Defense Pete Hegseth promised [victory](#) but failed to provide a timeline for reopening the Strait of Hormuz.
- **UN Lebanon Emergency Meeting:** Humanitarian officials warned that the [humanitarian crisis](#) in Lebanon is intensifying with "alarming speed."
- **White House Marine One Stakeout:** President Trump declined to comment on [regime change](#) as a final war aim, suggesting a possible shift in strategic objectives.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

---

### The Failure of "Venezuela-Style" Precision

The US administration appears to have entered the conflict expecting a [surgical regime change](#) similar to the January operation in Venezuela. However, Iran's decentralized command structure and decades of preparation for asymmetric warfare have prevented a quick collapse. The trend has shifted from "surgical" to "systemic" destruction, with both sides now [targeting civilian infrastructure](#)—hospitals, schools, and oil depots—to induce psychological and economic fatigue.

### The End of Regional Neutrality

The concept of "neutral neighbors" has been eviscerated. Iran's strategy of ["burning the entire region"](#) if it is attacked has forced the GCC into a defensive posture that bridges the gap between the US and Israel. This trend is creating a new regional security architecture where Gulf states are no longer just hosts for US bases but [active combat-adjacent](#)

participants, as evidenced by their sponsorship of the UNSC resolution.

### **Energy as a Primary Weapon of War**

Energy is no longer a byproduct of the conflict but the central [front line](#). Iran's blockade of the Strait of Hormuz is a calculated move to force a global economic intervention. The IEA's historic release of reserves indicates that the West's "strategic patience" is nearing its end, as [stagflation](#) (high inflation and low growth) becomes a credible global threat.

## **STRATEGIC FORESIGHT**

---

**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect an increase in [asymmetric maritime attacks](#) using drones and mini subs as Iran attempts to nullify any US attempt to provide naval escorts for tankers. Domestic unrest in the US and Europe over fuel prices will likely lead to emergency [rationing systems](#) in more nations, following the model already established in Bangladesh.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The US midterm elections will likely force the Trump administration to seek an [off-ramp](#) or a "victory" declaration, even if Iran's system remains intact. In Lebanon, the displacement of over 10% of the population will create a permanent [humanitarian corridor](#) into Syria and Europe, potentially triggering a secondary migration crisis.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** A structural shift in the global energy market is likely, with Asian manufacturers (China, India) aggressively [diversifying](#) away from Gulf dependence toward Russian and African sources. The GCC may move toward a more [independent regional defense](#) pact that seeks to distance itself from offensive US operations to avoid being targeted in future conflicts.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS**

---

### **For International Policy:**

- **Intervention in Maritime Security:** UN-led or neutral-party naval escorts may be the only way to [stabilize insurance premiums](#) for the shipping industry, as US-only escorts are viewed by Iran as legitimate combat targets.
- **Re-supply of Defense Systems:** European and US allies must prioritize the manufacturing of [interceptor missiles](#) (Patriots), as the current rate of consumption against Iranian/Hezbollah swarms is unsustainable.
- **Diplomatic Off-ramps:** Qatar and Oman remain the only viable [diplomatic bridges](#); international pressure should focus on using these channels to define a "status quo ante" for regional security.

### **For Private Sector/Investors:**

- **Supply Chain Contagion:** Companies reliant on [petrochemicals and fertilizers](#) should brace for multi-quarter disruptions and initiate near-shoring or sourcing from non-Gulf regions immediately.
- **Aviation Disruption:** Airlines must prepare for a [permanent "polycrisis"](#) environment in the Middle East, with major hubs like Dubai and Doha remaining high-risk zones for the foreseeable future.
- **Inflation Hedging:** With [stagflation](#) risks rising, investors should look toward energy-independent markets and companies providing high-speed interceptor technologies, such as Ukraine's new [interceptor drones](#).
