

## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 11, 2026, represents a transformative moment of global and domestic volatility for Nigeria. Internationally, the escalation of "Operation Epic Fury"—the US-Israeli military campaign against Iran—has entered a decisive phase following the [death of Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei](#). The conflict has severely degraded Iranian military infrastructure, with US forces striking over [2,000 targets](#) in 100 hours, including naval assets in the Strait of Hormuz. This geopolitical shock has sent oil prices into a erratic oscillation between \$80 and \$120 per barrel, prompting the International Energy Agency (IEA) to propose the [largest-ever release](#) of strategic reserves to prevent a global energy collapse. For Nigeria, this manifests as a "mixed grill" of fiscal windfall from crude exports and crippling domestic inflation as refined fuel costs spike.

Domestically, the Nigerian political landscape is shifting toward a de facto one-party state. A pivotal Court of Appeal ruling invalidated the People's Democratic Party (PDP) national convention, effectively handing control of the party's machinery to the [pro-Wike faction](#) aligned with the ruling All Progressives Congress (APC). This has triggered a mass exodus of opposition lawmakers, with the APC now controlling [31 of 36 states](#) and a supermajority in the Senate. Amidst this consolidation, the administration is racing to stabilize the economy by confirming [Taiwo Oyedele](#) as Minister of State for Finance to lead fiscal reforms. However, the security situation remains dire as a new insurgent group, "Lakurawa," expands its influence in the [Sokoto-Kebbi axis](#), and traditional banditry continues to inflict mass casualties in Katsina and Borno.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Escalation of US-Iran War (Operation Epic Fury):**
  - US Central Command and Israel have executed "surgical strikes" using [B-2 and B-52 bombers](#) to decimate Iranian air defenses and ballistic missile sites.
  - Iran has begun [laying mines](#) in the Strait of Hormuz, a critical chokepoint for 20% of global oil, leading to the destruction of 10 Iranian mine-laying vessels by US forces.
  - The Iranian Assembly of Experts has reportedly named [Mustafa \(Mojtaba\) Khamenei](#) as the successor to his deceased father, signaling a continuation of the hardline regime.

- **Collapse of the Political Opposition:**

- The Court of Appeal ruled in favor of the Nyesom Wike-led faction of the PDP, invalidating the Ibadon convention and the [Turaki-led caretaker committee](#).
- Mass defections continue, notably Rivers Senator [Ipalibo Banigo](#), further shrinking the PDP's presence in the National Assembly.
- The House of Representatives has moved to [criminalize dual membership](#) in political parties to curb the "anti-party" activities paralyzing the opposition.

- **Fiscal and Economic Re-alignment:**

- The Senate confirmed tax expert [Taiwo Oyedele](#) as Minister of State for Finance to address Nigeria's low revenue-to-GDP ratio and lead debt management.
- Nigeria's merchandise trade surplus [narrowed sharply](#) in Q4 2025 as crude exports declined and imports increased.
- The Dangote Refinery implemented [back-to-back price adjustments](#), eventually lowering petrol to 1,075 Naira per liter in an attempt to provide domestic relief.

- **Emergence of "Lakurawa" and Regional Security Threats:**

- A highly sophisticated group, Lakurawa, is reportedly dismantling [institutional security bases](#) in the North-West, including Customs and Immigration posts.
- Casualties mount in Katsina's [Musawa local government](#) following a bandit attack during Ramadan, while Borno continues to suffer from [lethal assaults](#) on military formations.

- **Energy Infrastructure Milestone:**

- The long-delayed [Bonga Southwest Deepwater](#) project reached a Final Investment Decision (FID), ending 20 years of stagnation and promising to boost offshore production.

## **KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS**

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**Energy Security:** The volatility in the Middle East has exposed Nigeria's lack of [strategic fuel reserves](#). Analysts warn that unless Nigeria manages its exchange rate and domesticates crude supply to local refiners like Dangote, pump prices could [surpass 1,500 Naira](#) per liter. The IEA's coordinated release of [182 million barrels](#) is seen as a temporary measure to stabilize global markets.

**Economic Security & Social Order:** To cushion the impact of rising food and energy costs, the federal government has flagged off [emergency food distribution](#) and is providing [7,500 Naira cash transfers](#) to 7 million vulnerable households. However, inflation in the agricultural sector is being driven higher by the [rising cost of diesel](#) used for farm operations, now reaching 1,600 Naira per liter.

**Rule of Law & Lawfare:** The judiciary has become the primary theater for political warfare. The Court of Appeal's intervention in [internal party disputes](#) is being criticized by some as an overreach, while others argue it is necessary to check "political rascality." Simultaneously, the FCCPC is training judges on [competition law](#) to manage increasingly complex digital and fintech market disputes.

**National Security & Terrorism:** The emergence of the Lakurawa group, allegedly supported by [foreign Islamic militants](#) and illicit miners, highlights a failure in border

surveillance. The military is under pressure to [overhaul regional surveillance](#) following deadly attacks on bases in Borno and the infiltration of border communities in Sokoto and Kebbi.

**International Relations:** The US is expressing [mounting frustration](#) with South Africa's refusal to align on key diplomatic demands, including expropriation and hate speech issues, potentially straining trade ties. Meanwhile, Mexico has inaugurated an [honorary consulate](#) in Lagos to bridge the \$1.8 trillion trade gap between the two regional giants.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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The National Assembly resumed from a three-week recess with a heavy focus on political stability and fiscal oversight. Key legislation centers on tightening party discipline and confirming executive appointments to lead the economic recovery plan.

### BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Electoral Act Amendment 2026:** A bill to [criminalize dual political party membership](#), carrying a 10 million Naira fine and a two-year prison term to prevent "Trojan horse" politics.
- **Special Seats for Women Bill:** A strategic proposal to [correct gender imbalance](#) in the legislature, where women currently hold only 4.5% of seats.
- **FCT Statutory Budget 2026:** Presented by President Tinubu for [Senate consideration](#) to fund infrastructure in the capital territory.

## HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Ministerial Screening of Taiwo Oyedele:** The Senate [screened and confirmed](#) Oyedele, focusing on his plans to expand the tax base and resolve contractor debt backlogs.
- **NUPRC Confirmation:** The Senate began the process to [confirm Magnus Abe](#) as Chairman of the Nigeria Upstream Petroleum Regulatory Commission.
- **NDLEA Seizure Briefing:** The agency announced the seizure of [6 tons of illicit drugs](#) valued at 1.2 billion Naira, highlighting the link between drug trafficking and insurgency funding.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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**The Transition to a Dominant-Party System:** The systematic collapse of the PDP, accelerated by judicial rulings and the strategic influence of the "Wike group," suggests a deliberate [narrowing of political options](#) ahead of 2027. With 31 states under APC control and the opposition's internal machinery effectively neutralized, the primary political contest is shifting from inter-party rivalry to [intra-APC power struggles](#) between factions vying for proximity to the presidency.

**The Weaponization of the Strait of Hormuz:** The Iran-US conflict has evolved into a maritime siege. Iran's use of [asymmetric naval warfare](#) (mines and drones) is specifically targeted at disrupting the "Malaccan straits" supply route to China, suggesting the US is leveraging the conflict to [choke Chinese energy imports](#). Nigeria sits in a precarious position, earning high prices for crude but suffering from the [doubling of](#)

[freight rates](#) and war-risk insurance premiums for its own fuel imports.

**Institutional Fragility vs. Executive Ambition:** While the executive branch is moving aggressively with "Renewed Hope" reforms—such as the [National Single Window](#) for exports and the [Bonga Southwest FID](#)—the state's basic capacity to protect citizens is faltering. The normalization of "wartime numbers" in civilian casualties and the [institutional attacks](#) by Lakurawa indicate that territorial control is being contested by non-state actors even as political control is being consolidated at the center.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect heightened domestic fuel price volatility as the Strait of Hormuz remains contested. The ASUU strike at Unilag over [amputated salaries](#) may spread to other federal universities if the "Catter" allowance dispute is not resolved. In the Middle East, a [counter-retaliation](#) by Iran's proxies (Hezbollah/Houthi) is likely following the decimation of Iranian naval assets.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The [fiscal reforms](#) led by Taiwo Oyedele will likely result in aggressive tax enforcement and a push to digitalize all government revenue streams. The PDP will likely experience a final [fracture at the Supreme Court](#), leading to the formation of a new "Third Force" coalition or total APC hegemony ahead of the 2027 cycle.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** Nigeria's deepwater sector will see a [renaissance](#) following the Bonga Southwest FID, but this will be undermined if the Lakurawa insurgency in the North-West matures into a [Boko Haram-style caliphate](#). Globally, the US-Iran conflict may permanently alter energy supply chains, forcing Nigeria to accelerate [domestic](#)

[refining self-sufficiency](#) to survive future geopolitical shocks.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

### **For International Policy:**

- The US and G7 must fast-track the [IEA reserve release](#) to stabilize prices for emerging markets like Nigeria, which are facing social unrest due to energy-driven inflation.
- Diplomatic pressure should be applied to resolve the [South Africa-US standoff](#) to prevent a fracture in the BRICS-Western trade balance.
- Regional security cooperation must focus on the "Lakurawa" group, which represents a new [cross-border threat](#) spanning Niger, Benin, and Nigeria.

### **For Private Sector/Investors:**

- **Energy Transition:** Investors should pivot toward [CNG and electric mobility](#) charging infrastructure as the federal government subsidizes these sectors to escape the volatility of petrol.
- **Agriculture Risk:** Supply chains for [imported fertilizers \(Urea\)](#) are at high risk due to the Hormuz blockade; domestic production investments are now a strategic priority.
- **Legal/Regulatory Compliance:** Companies must prepare for stricter [competition and consumer protection](#) enforcement as the judiciary receives specialized training to handle digital market disputes.
