

POLAND'S DEFENSE STANDOFF & GLOBAL CRISIS: 2026

CONSTITUTIONAL RIFT OVER FUNDING, US-IRAN CONFLICT, AND ENERGY MARKET TURMOIL SHAPE A CRITICAL JUNCTURE.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 11, 2026, was defined by a deepening constitutional rivalry in Poland over the financing of national defense, occurring against the backdrop of a volatile military escalation between the United States and Iran. The Polish government, led by Prime Minister Donald Tusk, is aggressively pursuing the unilingual European "Safe" program, a massive defense investment initiative funded by EU loans. Simultaneously, President Karol Nawrocki has introduced a competing domestic "Safe 0%" project, proposing to fund the military through the revaluation of National Bank of Poland (NBP) gold reserves. The government has dismissed the President's plan as a [financial "zero PLN" shell](#), accusing the NBP of creative accounting while reporting multi-billion dollar losses.

Internationally, the U.S. "Operation Epic Fury" against Iran has reached a critical juncture.

Following the reported mining of the Strait of Hormuz by Iranian forces, President Donald Trump has threatened [twenty-fold retaliation](#) and hinted at a ground operation to seize enriched uranium. While the White House claims the war could end within a week, global markets remain skeptical; oil prices have surged past \$100 per barrel before fluctuating on rumors of a quick resolution. This has triggered a "fuel panic" in Poland, with significant "fuel tourism" from German citizens crossing the border to exploit lower Polish prices, leading to [shortages and long queues](#) at border stations.

Domestically, the Tusk administration is also navigating critical legislative hurdles, including a reform of the State Labor Inspection (PIP) to secure 11 billion PLN in EU Recovery Fund (KPO) monies. On the legal front, the National Prosecutor's Office has opened a major investigation into Polish links to the Jeffrey Epstein human trafficking network, focusing on the recruitment of [aspirant models for sexual exploitation](#) between 2009 and 2019. These developments collectively underscore a period of high-stakes "lawfare," shifting geopolitical alliances, and acute economic anxiety driven by the spillover of Middle Eastern instability.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

The "Safe" Program Standoff

- The Tusk government advocates for the EU-backed "Safe" program, involving approximately 187 billion PLN for arms procurement, which military leadership describes as a [strategic "game changer"](#) for Poland's defense capacity.

- President Karol Nawrocki and NBP President Adam Glapiński have proposed an alternative "Safe 0%" plan using gold reserves, which the government characterizes as a [marketing "nibylandia" \(Neverland\) scheme](#) to justify a presidential veto of the EU program.
- NBP President Glapiński claims he can generate 200 billion PLN through gold revaluation, despite the bank reporting [massive losses in recent years](#).

U.S.-Iran Conflict: "Operation Epic Fury"

- The United States has conducted strikes on nine Iranian vessels allegedly attempting to [mine the Strait of Hormuz](#), a vital artery for 20% of the world's oil supply.
- President Trump has warned of "death, fire, and wrath" and indicated that U.S. special forces may be deployed to [extract enriched uranium](#) from Iranian facilities.
- The conflict has resulted in significant civilian casualties, including a controversial missile strike on a [girls' school in Minab](#), Iran, which the U.S. administration attributed to Iranian technical failures.

Energy and Border Crisis

- Fuel prices in Germany have hit record highs, exceeding 2.13 EUR per liter, forcing a [surge of German motorists](#) into Polish border towns like Lubieszyn for cheaper fuel.
- The Polish government is considering VAT adjustments and margin reductions at Orlen to prevent domestic fuel prices from [exceeding 8 PLN per liter](#).

The Epstein Polish Investigation

- The National Prosecutor has established a three-person task force to investigate a [trafficking network](#) that operated in Poland, targeting minors and young women for international sexual exploitation.
- Investigators are utilizing "Epstein Files" to identify Polish victims and are issuing [European Investigation Orders](#) to two EU member states.

State Accountability and Lawfare

- An indictment has been filed against PiS MP Michał Dworczyk regarding the ["email affair,"](#) specifically for obstruction of justice and failure to fulfill duties related to the use of private servers for state business.
- The Sejm Presidium has unanimously voted to [strip Zbigniew Ziobro of his parliamentary salary](#) due to his continued absence while seeking political asylum in Hungary.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

National Security and Defense Architecture

- Military leaders, including General Kukula, have signaled that the EU "Safe" program is essential for filling [critical gaps in armament](#), specifically in anti-drone and naval capabilities.
- The presidential project proposes the creation of a new "Defense Investment Fund" managed by BGK, which critics argue creates a [parallel budget outside parliamentary control](#).

Statecraft and Financial Resilience

- The NBP is under intense scrutiny for its proposal to use a "sell and buy back" gold mechanism to create [virtual book gains](#) to fund defense, a move that could jeopardize the bank's credibility with the European Central Bank.
- The Tusk government is racing to pass the PIP reform bill before a late-March deadline to avoid [forfeiting 11 billion PLN](#) in KPO funding.

Energy Security and Infrastructure

- The blockade of the Strait of Hormuz has severely impacted Iraq, causing a [300-megawatt drop in power production](#) and frequent blackouts due to the suspension of gas field operations.
- The Polish government is monitoring critical infrastructure, including major river crossings and border fortifications, which are [included in the "Safe" investment plan](#).

Elite Politics and Leadership Dynamics

- The PiS opposition has designated Przemysław Czarnek as its [candidate for Prime Minister](#) in the 2027 elections, a move perceived by some as a strategy to consolidate the right-wing electorate.
- President Nawrocki's refusal to quickly sign the EU "Safe" act is interpreted by the government as a [politically motivated delay](#) favoring PiS's anti-EU narrative.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity centered on the competing "Safe" defense acts and the urgent labor reform required for EU funding. The Sejm is currently prioritizing the government's defense spending framework while the

President's alternative project has been [submitted for social consultations](#), effectively stalling it.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **The European "Safe" Act:** A government framework for spending 187 billion PLN in EU loans on Polish defense industries like Huta Stalowa Wola and Rosomak. It faces a [looming presidential veto](#).
- **Presidential "Safe 0%" Bill:** A 14-page proposal to fund the military via NBP gold revaluation. Dismissed by the government as lacking [defined financial sources](#).
- **PIP Reform Bill:** Aimed at eliminating "junk contracts" and strengthening labor inspections. It is a [key KPO milestone](#) that must be passed by the end of March.
- **Tobacco and E-cigarette Amendment:** Proposed legislation to ban flavored tobacco products to [protect youth](#) and increase market oversight.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **The Pałac Prezydencki Summit:** A meeting between President Nawrocki, PM Tusk, and NBP President Glapiński yielded no consensus on defense funding, with Tusk demanding [concrete financial data](#) from the NBP.
- **Marszałek Czarzasty Press Conference:** Sejm Speaker Włodzimierz Czarzasty stated he will not process the President's defense bill until a [decision is made on the EU version](#).
- **NBP Mechanism Briefing:** Advisor Leszek Skiba defended the [gold revaluation plan](#), claiming it is a "safe solution without debt."

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

Constitutional Gridlock as "Lawfare"

The executive branch in Poland is currently fractured, with the Presidency and the Prime Ministry utilizing their respective powers to obstruct the other's agenda. The "Safe" program has moved beyond a policy debate into a [jurisdictional battle](#) over who controls the purse strings of national security. The President's attempt to insert himself into defense spending decisions through the BGK fund is viewed by legal experts as an attempt to expand [extra-constitutional prerogatives](#).

The Global Fuel "Shock" and Populism

The U.S.-Iran conflict is being directly felt at Polish gas stations. The opposition PiS party is leveraging the [rising cost of fuel](#) (approaching 8 PLN) to attack the Tusk government, ignoring the global supply constraints caused by the Hormuz blockade. Meanwhile, the German government's desperate measures, such as [releasing oil reserves](#) and limiting price hikes to once per day, illustrate the fragility of European energy resilience in the face of Middle Eastern instability.

Trump's "Epic Fury" and the Retreat of Global Diplomacy

The U.S. administration's rhetoric suggests a shift away from traditional diplomatic de-escalation toward [unilateral military dominance](#). President Trump's focus on ridding the world of the Iranian regime, while simultaneously pressuring European allies to buy more American arms, has created a paradoxical tension. European allies fear that American weapon production will be [diverted to U.S. wars](#), leaving them vulnerable despite increased spending.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a formal presidential veto of the EU "Safe" program, prompting the Tusk government to implement a ["Plan B" through government resolutions](#). This will likely exclude police and border guard funding, focusing solely on the military. Domestic fuel panic may lead to rationing at border stations if German "fuel tourism" continues unabated.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The investigation into the Polish Epstein connection will likely implicate several [high-profile figures](#) in the Polish fashion and entertainment industries, potentially sparking a wider "Me Too" movement in Poland. Conflict in the Middle East will keep oil prices volatile, potentially triggering a [re-evaluation of VAT rates](#) on energy across the EU.

Long Term (1-5 Years): The shift toward European defense autonomy will accelerate as the reliability of U.S. supply chains remains questionable under a "Trump First" doctrine. Poland may undergo a [fundamental constitutional revision](#) regarding the independence of the NBP and the powers of the Presidency, driven by the current deadlock over defense and the rule of law.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The EU must prepare for a formal dispute with Poland over [NBP independence](#) if the "gold revaluation" scheme is implemented, as it sets a dangerous precedent for fiscal manipulation.

- Diplomatic efforts should focus on securing [safe transit corridors](#) in the Strait of Hormuz to prevent a permanent decoupling of Asian and European energy markets.
- Poland should prioritize [joint-venture production](#) with U.S. defense firms in Europe to ensure supply chain continuity during American military engagements elsewhere.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Defense Industry:** Significant opportunities exist for Polish firms like [Cegielski and Huta Stalowa Wola](#) to capture EU defense spending, provided they can modernize their production lines quickly.
- **Energy Sector:** Investors should hedge against prolonged [high energy costs](#) in Europe; the transition to nuclear energy (as championed by Macron) remains the primary long-term hedge against Middle Eastern volatility.
- **Compliance Risk:** The Epstein investigation and PIP labor reforms necessitate a [rigorous audit of labor practices](#) and historical corporate associations for firms operating in the Polish luxury and service sectors.
