

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## ECONOMIC ATTRITION AND ASYMMETRIC ESCALATION: DAY 13 OF THE US-ISRAEL WAR WITH IRAN

### **DAY-AT-A-GLANCE**

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Day 13 of the conflict between the United States, Israel, and Iran is characterized by a deepening disconnect between military triumphalism and economic reality. While US and Israeli leaders claim to have "crushed" Iranian capabilities, Iran has successfully pivoted to a strategy of global economic hostage-taking. By effectively closing the Strait of Hormuz and targeting regional energy infrastructure, Tehran has maintained oil prices at or above \$100 per barrel, rendering the International Energy Agency's (IEA) record release of 400 million barrels of emergency reserves largely performative. The conflict has moved beyond a traditional military engagement into a broad-spectrum assault on global supply chains, affecting everything from semiconductor manufacturing via helium shortages to the stability of Western financial institutions.

The emergence of a first public statement attributed to Iran's new Supreme Leader, Mojtaba Khamenei, suggests a leadership

structure operating from the shadows. The absence of a visual appearance or audio recording fuel intense speculation regarding his physical condition following the strikes that killed his father. This "shadow leadership" appears to be doubling down on a war of attrition designed to outlast the political patience of the Trump administration. Simultaneously, the opening of a more aggressive front in Lebanon, with Israeli forces striking central Beirut and preparing for expanded ground operations, indicates that the conflict is metastasizing into a wider regional reorganization rather than a contained surgical strike on Iranian nuclear assets.

Domestic political pressures are mounting in both the US and UK. In Washington, the revelation that the first six days of the war cost upwards of \$11 billion is colliding with public skepticism and partisan divides. Accountability for civilian casualties, specifically the strike on an Iranian girls' school, has become a focal point for legislative pushback. In London, the Starmer government remains mired in the fallout of the Peter Mandelson appointment, with released documents highlighting systemic vetting failures and a controversial payoff. These domestic distractions, combined with Russian-linked sabotage plots in Europe and a US military aircraft crash in Iraq, suggest that the "victory" declared by Western leaders is far from secure.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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### Shadow Leadership and Iranian Defiance

- Iranian state television broadcast the first statement from [Mojtaba Khamenei](#), who called for national unity and promised vengeance for the deaths of his family members and Iranian citizens.
- Speculation persists regarding [Mojtaba's health](#), as he was neither seen nor heard; reports suggest he may have been seriously injured or is in a coma following the initial February 28th strikes.
- The Supreme Leader's message explicitly ordered the continued [blockage of the Strait of Hormuz](#) and threatened the opening of "new fronts" where the enemy is vulnerable.
- Retaliatory logic has shifted to include [Western financial institutions](#) as legitimate targets following Israeli strikes on Iranian banks.

### Global Energy and Maritime Crisis

- Oil prices remain volatile, hovering around [\\$100 a barrel](#) despite the IEA's historic agreement to release 400 million barrels of oil from emergency reserves.
- Iran-backed forces continue to target commercial shipping, with [three more cargo ships](#) hit in the Gulf, including one US-owned vessel.
- The Strait of Hormuz is at a virtual standstill, with [daily ship movements](#) dropping to near zero compared to pre-conflict levels.
- Energy infrastructure in [Bahrain, Oman, and Saudi Arabia](#) came under attack from Iranian drones and projectiles, causing major fires at fuel storage facilities.

### The Lebanon Front and Regional Displacement

- Israel has expanded its air campaign beyond southern suburbs into [central Beirut](#), including strikes on the corniche that killed at least eight people.
- The Lebanese health ministry reports the [death toll has reached 687](#) since March 2nd, with over 800,000 people displaced.
- Israeli Defense Minister Israel Katz has ordered the military to prepare for [expanded ground operations](#) if the Lebanese government cannot disarm Hezbollah.
- UN agencies warn of a [humanitarian collapse](#) in Lebanon as displaced populations flee to overcrowded and under-resourced northern areas.

### US War Accountability and Military Attrition

- US media reports the Pentagon has spent over [\\$11 billion](#) in the war's first six days, a rate nearly ten times higher than the conflict in Afghanistan.
- A US [KC135 refueling aircraft](#) crashed in western Iraq during "Operation Epic Fury"; rescue efforts are underway for the crew.
- Senate Democrats are demanding answers regarding a [Tomahawk missile strike](#) on a girls' school in Minab that killed 168 people, with evidence mounting of US responsibility.
- The FBI is investigating a [truck ramming](#) at a Michigan synagogue as a "targeted act of terror" amid heightened domestic tensions.

## UK Political Vetting Scandal

- Released documents show PM Keir Starmer was warned of a [reputational risk](#) regarding Lord Mandelson's links to Jeffrey Epstein before his appointment as US Ambassador.
- Controversy surrounds a [£75,000 severance payoff](#) to Mandelson, which the government defended as "good value for money" to avoid an employment tribunal.
- The Met Police continue to investigate Mandelson for [misconduct in public office](#) related to the alleged leaking of sensitive information.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### Energy Security

- The IEA's record reserve release has failed to stabilize markets because it cannot compensate for the [15 million barrels a day](#) lost through the Hormuz closure.
- The Philippines has implemented a [four-day work week](#) for public employees to conserve fuel as reserves dwindle to a few weeks' supply.
- Northern Ireland, where 60% of homes use [heating oil](#), faces a particular crisis as prices surge and theft becomes rampant.

### Geopolitical Power Dynamics

- Russia is emerging as a primary beneficiary, with [oil revenues surging](#) and the US easing sanctions on Russian exports to mitigate the energy shock.
- China remains publicly muted but is [compartmentalizing the conflict](#) to protect a planned trade summit with President Trump.

- India has secured a [30-day waiver](#) from the US to purchase sanctioned Russian oil to maintain its domestic LPG supplies.

### Succession and Stability

- The Iranian regime appears to be operating as a [militarized "deep state"](#) led by the IRGC and veteran bureaucrat Ali Larijani, with the new Supreme Leader potentially incapacitated.
- Internal Iranian stability is enforced through [checkpoints and machine-gun patrols](#), with authorities threatening to treat protesters as "enemies" during wartime.

### Cybersecurity and Hybrid Warfare

- A European police investigation concluded that [incendiary parcels](#) sent to the UK were a Russian sabotage plot coordinated by military intelligence.
- Poland reported stopping a [suspected Iranian cyberattack](#) aimed at breaching security measures.
- Major UK banks (Lloyds, Halifax, Bank of Scotland) suffered a [major data glitch](#) allowing customers to see other users' transactions, raising concerns about infrastructure resilience.

### Supply Chains

- Global helium production has collapsed after [Qatar halted LNG operations](#), threatening the semiconductor and medical device industries.
- Air freight rates between Asia and Europe have [jumped by almost 50%](#) as shipping companies avoid the Gulf and Red Sea.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative and policy actions are focused on managing the fallout of the war and attempting to restore normalcy to trade and energy markets. In the UK, the government is revisiting previously set fiscal goals in light of the energy crisis, while in the US, the debate centers on war funding and the legality of military strikes under the UN charter.

### BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **UK Fuel Duty Review:** PM Starmer announced a review of [planned fuel duty increases](#) originally scheduled for September due to rising pump prices.
- **UK Title Stripping Legislation:** The government plans to introduce laws to [strip Lord Mandelson](#) of his titles following the Epstein vetting scandal.
- **China Ethnic Unity Law:** The National People's Congress is set to approve a law that critics say will speed up the [forced assimilation](#) of ethnic minorities.
- **US Section 301 Investigations:** The Trump administration launched probes into 16 trading partners that could lead to [new tariffs by summer](#).

### HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Netanyahu Press Conference:** In his first full presser, Netanyahu claimed Israel is [crushing the terrorist regime](#) and issued a veiled threat against Mojtaba Khamenei.
- **Jim Himes (Gang of Eight):** The senior Democrat detailed [conflicting objectives](#) within the administration regarding nuclear destruction vs. missile degradation.

- **UN Security Council Resolution:** A resolution condemning Iranian attacks was passed with [Russia and China abstaining](#), citing an unbalanced focus that ignored US/Israeli strikes.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The Evolution of Asymmetric Warfare

Tehran is demonstrating that conventional military inferiority can be mitigated through "asymmetric gravity points." By targeting shipping and desalination plants, Iran is effectively [holding the global economy hostage](#). This strategy relies not on winning battles, but on "disrupting, frustrating, and outlasting" US/Israeli stockpiles. The use of low-tech "go-fast" boats, jet skis with RPGs, and indiscriminate mining creates a [risk profile](#) that insurance markets and commercial ship masters find untenable, regardless of US naval presence.

### Strategic Messaging Inconsistency

There is a widening gap between the Trump administration's "Operation Complete" rhetoric and the reality of a widening war. While Trump claims the US is ["way ahead of schedule,"](#) Secretary of Defense Pete Hegseth and military planners warn of an intensifying conflict. This inconsistency is being used as a weapon by Iran to sow doubt in Western markets and among US voters. The White House's use of [highly stylized social media videos](#) to communicate war progress further underscores a shift in statecraft toward viral narrative control over traditional diplomatic transparency.

### The Return of the "Hidden Imam" Narrative

The Iranian regime's decision to name Mojtaba Khamenei Supreme Leader and then hide him is interpreted by analysts as a "zombie regime" strategy. By creating a [new "hidden imam"](#) figure, the IRGC can maintain the appearance of religious continuity while the military deep state exercises total control. This makes it impossible for the US to "decapitate" the leadership in any meaningful way, as the source of authority remains unseen and unverifiable.

## **STRATEGIC FORESIGHT**

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### **Short Term (1-4 Weeks)**

- Oil prices are likely to experience a ["demand destruction" event](#) as prices exceed \$110, leading to significant airline cancellations and industrial slowdowns.
- Israeli ground forces will likely [expand into Lebanon](#) to create a buffer zone up to the Litani River, regardless of the status of the Iran front.
- The UK government will face a secondary "Mandelson trunche" of [informal communications](#) that could implicate other senior ministers in vetting failures.

### **Medium Term (1-6 Months)**

- The US [November midterms](#) will be increasingly shaped by pump prices, with the Republican party's "no more foreign wars" pledge becoming a central vulnerability.
- The global [helium shortage](#) will lead to acute production delays in the semiconductor industry, potentially triggering a broader tech-sector correction.

- Iran may seek to [re-institutionalize power](#) through a more overtly militarized government if the Supreme Leader's death or incapacitation is finally confirmed.

### **Long Term (1-5 Years)**

- A permanent [alignment between Russia and Iran](#) will solidify, with Russia replacing the West as Iran's primary source of intelligence and financial mediation.
- Middle Eastern "peacemaker" states like the [UAE and Qatar](#) will undergo a fundamental re-evaluation of their security reliance on the US, moving toward more independent or multi-polar defense architectures.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS**

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### **For International Policy:**

- Establish an [international mediation track](#) that prioritizes the reopening of the Strait of Hormuz separately from the nuclear or regime-change objectives.
- Address the [humanitarian funding gap](#) in Lebanon to prevent a collapse of host-community social cohesion, which currently poses a greater risk than military escalation.
- Strengthen [international oversight](#) of AI-driven targeting to prevent mass-casualty errors that erode the moral and legal justification for military action.

### **For Private Sector/Investors:**

- **Supply Chain Resilience:** Companies must immediately secure [alternative sources of helium](#) and other LNG byproducts as Qatar's output remains compromised.

- **Maritime Logistics:** Shippers should transition to [sea-air hybrid routes](#) (e.g., via US West Coast) to bypass the Middle Eastern aviation and shipping bottlenecks.
- **Financial Institutions:** Western banks operating in the Gulf must prepare for [prolonged remote-work mandates](#) and heightened physical and cyber-security threats as they are now designated "legitimate targets."
