DAY-AT-A-GLANCE: DETERIORATION & DEFENSE

BORDER WARFARE (PAKISTAN) (KHOST, PAKTIA, KUNAR)

Lethal cross-border shelling, IEA reports civilian deaths. Framing Pakistan as "mercenary state" for Western interests. IEA claims successful retaliatory strikes on Pakistani posts (unverified).

The 'Mercenary State' Narrative

Dehumanizing Pakistani military as Western agents. Framing conflict as ideological struggle to justify military actions and foment internal dissent in Pakistan.

Economic De-coupling from Pakistan

Strategic move to break historical leverage, seeking "preferential trade" and Northern transit routes to Europe/CIS, a high-risk strategy.

Aggressive Information Sovereignty

Moving beyond denial to offering alternative data (e.g., tourism) to create an "alternate reality" appealing to regional investors focused on control.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 12, 2026, marks a significant deterioration in the relationship between Kabul and Islamabad, characterized by lethal cross-border shelling and high-intensity rhetorical warfare. The Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan (IEA) has officially reported civilian casualties, including women and children, resulting from [Pakistani artillery strikes](#) in Khost, Paktia, and Kunar provinces. IEA officials and state media have framed Pakistan as a "mercenary" state acting on behalf of Western interests, specifically the United States and United Kingdom, to destabilize a nascent Islamic order. This escalation follows IEA claims of [successful retaliatory strikes](#) that purportedly killed or wounded hundreds of Pakistani militia members, though these figures remain

unverified and are part of a broader information operation to project military dominance over a historically superior regional power.

Simultaneously, the IEA is engaged in a defensive diplomatic and narrative campaign to maintain its domestic and international image of "total security." The leadership [categorically rejected a United Nations report](#) alleging a 27.8% increase in security incidents compared to the previous year, dismissing it as "propaganda" intended to confuse public opinion. To counter this narrative of instability, the IEA is emphasizing its expanding economic footprint, highlighting a [preferential trade agreement with Uzbekistan](#) and a reported \$200 million trade volume with Belarus. This strategic pivot toward Central Asia and Iran is intended to mitigate the economic impact of the near-total collapse of trade relations with Pakistan, which has been the traditional transit hub for Afghan goods.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Escalation of Conflict with Pakistan**

- The IEA Ministry of Defense reported that Pakistani forces launched artillery and mortar attacks on [civilian homes and nomad tents](#) in Khost, resulting in at least four deaths and several injuries. [Additional shelling](#) was reported in Kunar's Monwara and Sarkano districts.
- IEA military officials claim to have [destroyed dozens of Pakistani military posts](#) and inflicted heavy casualties in "legitimate defensive responses" along the Durand Line.
- The International Crisis Group has reportedly called for [mediation by Qatar, Turkey, and Saudi Arabia](#) to prevent the conflict from spiraling into a broader regional war.

- **Rejection of UN Security Assessments**

- Spokesperson Zabihullah Mujahid dismissed the UN Secretary-General's report of a [27.8% spike in security events](#), asserting that only minor criminal incidents occur and that the country enjoys "comprehensive security."
- IEA media frames the UN report as a [deliberate attempt to discourage foreign investment](#) and tourism by painting a false picture of instability.

- **Central Asian Economic Integration**

- Uzbekistan President Shavkat Mirziyoyev signed a [preferential trade agreement](#) with Afghanistan, removing customs tariffs on 14 categories of goods to facilitate agricultural exports.
- Belarus Foreign Minister Maxim Ryzhenkov highlighted that [trade with Afghanistan exceeded \\$200 million](#) in the past year, using Uzbekistan as a primary transit gateway.

- **Regional Instability and Iranian Tensions**

- State media carried reports of Iranian President Pezeshkian threatening [attacks on U.S. bases](#) and potentially targets in California if tensions escalate with Washington.
- Despite regional tensions, the IEA claims [gas imports from Iran remain normal](#), with new contracts expected to lower domestic prices by \$40 to \$50 per ton.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

National Security & Border Control The IEA is increasingly viewing its border with Pakistan not merely as a boundary but as an active front in a proxy war. Analysis of official rhetoric indicates a shift from viewing the TTP (Tehrik-i-Taliban Pakistan) as a domestic Pakistani issue to [denying their presence in Afghanistan](#) entirely, while accusing Pakistan of harboring "terrorist groups" and using them as a pretext for invasion. The [mobilization of civil servants and mujahideen](#) in provinces like Takhar and Baglan for "defensive jihad" suggests the regime is preparing for a sustained military standoff.

Economic Security & Trade Diversification

The cabinet has focused on mitigating inflation and securing supply chains through

non-Pakistani routes. Decisions include [extending customs duty discounts](#) for left-hand drive vehicles through the end of 1405 (Solar Year) and purchasing [one million dollars worth of heavy cranes](#) for customs offices in Balkh, Kandahar, and Herat to speed up transit. The IEA is also [approving industrial park plans](#) in Logar (Mohammad Agha district), aiming to host over 85 companies, which signals an attempt at import substitution.

Diplomatic Engagement The IEA is leveraging middle-power diplomacy to bypass Western isolation. Foreign Minister Muttaqi's [phone call with the Omani Foreign Minister](#) focused on regional de-escalation and presenting the Afghan "defensive" perspective on Pakistan. Meanwhile, engagement with [China's special envoy](#) and Belarus indicates a strategy of building a coalition of "non-aligned" or "Eastern-facing" partners to provide economic and political cover.

Rule of Law & Social Order Domestic governance remains focused on Sharia-based "compassion" and "virtue." The regime announced the [release of hundreds of prisoners](#) in Balkh and Herat ahead of Eid-ul-Fitr, a traditional gesture to demonstrate sovereign mercy. Concurrently, the Ministry of Propagation of Virtue and Prevention of Vice reported [rescuing five women from domestic violence](#) and arresting "sorcerers," emphasizing its role as the arbiter of both social morality and family justice.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The IEA Cabinet and administrative commissions held several sessions to formalize trade and social policies, focusing heavily on administrative efficiency and humanitarian mitigation.

BILLS & POLICIES DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Left-Hand Drive Vehicle Customs Extension:** The cabinet [extended the duty discount](#) for non-documented left-hand drive vehicles until the end of 1405 to regularize the massive influx of grey-market imports.
- **Uzbekistan Preferential Trade Agreement:** A [decree to implement the agreement](#) signed in Tashkent, specifically targeting 14 categories of agricultural and industrial goods for tariff-free entry into Uzbekistan.
- **Logar Industrial Park Detailed Plan:** The Ministry of Urban Development [approved a 500-acre development](#) for the Mohammad Agha district to centralize manufacturing.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **16th Cabinet Meeting:** Chaired by Prime Minister Mullah Hasan Akhund, addressing [economic, security, and cultural issues](#), and tasking the Deputy PM for Economic Affairs with regulating the quality of imported goods.
- **Ministry of Defense Press Statement:** Deputy Spokesperson Nasrat [debunked Pakistani claims](#) of militant casualties and detailed "crushing blows" delivered to the Pakistani military.
- **Logar Cultural Gathering:** Poets and writers gathered to [condemn Pakistani airstrikes](#), framing the "pen and the gun" as unified tools of national defense.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The "Mercenary State" Narrative A recurring theme across all broadcasts is the dehumanization of the Pakistani military and its characterization as an ["agent of global arrogance"](#) (referring to the US and UK). This narrative is crucial for IEA domestic stability; it transforms a bilateral border dispute into a grand ideological struggle between "pure" Islam (the IEA) and "corrupt" Western proxies (Pakistan). By framing Pakistan as a [financially insolvent state](#) taking "projects" from Washington to attack Muslims, the IEA justifies its military actions to its base and seeks to foment internal dissent within Pakistan's own religious and Pashtun populations.

Economic De-coupling from Pakistan The emphasis on trade with Belarus, China, and Uzbekistan, alongside the [stable gas imports from Iran](#), signifies a deliberate strategic move to break Pakistan's historical leverage over landlocked Afghanistan. The IEA is no longer just looking for "aid" but for "preferential trade," seeking to build a [corridor to Europe and the CIS](#) that bypasses the Torkham and Chaman border crossings. This is a high-risk strategy that assumes the durability of Central Asian patience and the security of Northern transit routes.

Aggressive Information Sovereignty The immediate and coordinated [refusal to accept UN security statistics](#) shows an evolution in IEA media strategy. They are moving beyond simple denial to offering alternative data—such as [thousands of foreign tourists visiting](#)—as proof of stability. This "alternate reality" is designed to appeal to regional investors who are more concerned with "control" than "human rights," signaling that as long as the

IEA can demonstrate control over the territory, they should be treated as a legitimate government.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect continued [low-to-mid intensity artillery duels](#) along the Durand Line. The IEA will likely use the deaths of civilians in Khost and Kunar to further [mobilize domestic militias](#), potentially leading to more frequent skirmishes. Pakistan may intensify its aerial surveillance and drone strikes, further inflaming the "war crimes" narrative used by Kabul.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The trade pivot toward Uzbekistan and Iran will be tested as [regional gas contracts](#) are implemented. If the IEA can successfully lower fuel prices through Iranian imports while increasing agricultural exports to Uzbekistan, its internal legitimacy will significantly harden. Conversely, any major security incident (likely from ISKP, which the UN report highlighted) would puncture the IEA's narrative of "comprehensive security," potentially forcing a more [aggressive internal crackdown](#).

Long Term (1-5 Years): The structural relationship with Pakistan may be permanently altered. If the IEA successfully develops the [Logar industrial park](#) and other manufacturing hubs, Afghanistan could shift from a consumer of Pakistani finished goods to a competitor or a self-sufficient entity. This economic independence would fundamentally [destabilize the regional power balance](#), potentially leading Pakistan to take more desperate measures to maintain its influence in "Greater Afghanistan."

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The international community should prioritize [multilateral mediation via Qatar and Turkey](#) to prevent a full-scale conventional conflict between two nuclear-adjacent states.
- The discrepancy between UN security reports and IEA claims suggests a [narrowing window for independent verification](#) of ground conditions, requiring more robust remote monitoring of internal stability.
- Diplomatic engagement must account for the IEA's [growing alignment with Central Asian economic interests](#), which may make Western sanctions less effective over time.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Traditional trade routes through Pakistan are [highly volatile and subject to sudden closure](#); investors should prioritize the "Northern Corridor" through Uzbekistan.
- **Energy Opportunity:** The IEA's [aggressive pursuit of Iranian gas](#) and lower energy prices could make the nascent industrial sector (like the Logar park) more viable for basic manufacturing.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** The IEA's focus on [quality standards for construction materials](#) and customs regularization indicates a move toward a more formal, albeit restrictive, business environment that requires close monitoring of the Ministry of Industry and Commerce.
