



DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 12, 2026, marks a critical inflection point in global stability as the war in the Middle East expands into a direct maritime blockade of the Strait of Hormuz. Following Iranian attacks on international tankers, the [Strait of Hormuz is essentially closed](#), strangling 20% of the world's oil and gas supply. This has forced the International Energy Agency (IEA) to authorize a historic release of [400 million barrels of oil](#) from strategic reserves—the largest mobilization in history—in a desperate bid to contain a price surge that has already pushed Brent crude past the \$100 mark. The conflict has transitioned from a localized exchange between Israel and Hezbollah into a regional conflagration involving Iran, Iraq, the US, and Gulf monarchies, with Iranian "swarm" tactics and drone strikes targeting critical financial and energy infrastructure in Dubai and Oman.

On the domestic front, Catalonia is facing a localized state of emergency as [African Swine Fever \(ASF\)](#) has been detected for the first time within the Barcelona municipal area. Authorities have responded with an immediate and [total closure of Collserola Natural Park](#) to all human activity to prevent the virus from spreading via footwear or bicycle tires to the region's vital pork industry. This convergence of geopolitical energy shocks and internal biosecurity threats is creating a volatile environment for the Spanish government, which is simultaneously navigating hostile rhetoric from the Trump administration regarding NATO contributions and a high-stakes corruption trial involving the Pujol family legacy.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Blockade of the Strait of Hormuz and Maritime Warfare**
 - Iran has effectively closed the Strait, demanding that all vessels [request permission to pass](#). The US Pentagon claims to have [neutralized 50 Iranian vessels](#) suspected of laying mines, though Iranian drone and "suicide boat" attacks continue to inflict damage on tankers from Greece, Thailand, and the US.
 - Iraq has [closed all its oil ports](#) and evacuated crews after attacks on tankers in its waters left at least one dead. Iraqi oil production has been slashed by 75% due to the inability to export.
 - A drone strike targeted a [skyscraper in Dubai's financial district](#), signaling a shift in Iranian strategy toward punishing the economic hubs of US allies in the Gulf.

• Global Energy Crisis and Strategic Interventions

- The IEA's release of 400 million barrels includes a [172 million barrel contribution](#) from the US, nearly half of its remaining strategic reserve. Analysts warn this is a [short-term "patch"](#) that leaves the global economy exposed to future shocks.
- The Spanish government has ordered [400 energy companies](#) to prepare for the release of national reserves to mitigate the impact of diesel prices, which have now [surpassed gasoline prices](#).

• Biosecurity Emergency in Barcelona

- Detection of an ASF-positive wild boar in Barcelona has triggered the [closure of Collserola Park](#) across nine municipalities. Authorities plan to [cull approximately 600 boars](#) inhabiting the park to eliminate the viral reservoir.
- The pork industry expresses extreme concern, as several international markets have [rejected the "regionalization" policy](#), potentially leading to a total ban on Spanish pork exports regardless of the infection's specific location.

• Political Shifts in Chile

- Far-right leader José Antonio Kast has been [inaugurated as President of Chile](#), marking the return of Pinochetist ideologies to power. Kast immediately signed decrees for an [audit of state finances](#) and increased military presence at borders to curb irregular migration.

• Judicial and Corruption Proceedings in Spain

- In the Pujol trial, bankers testified regarding the [unverified origins of cash deposits](#), while "Operation Catalonia" allegations suggest the "Patriotic Police" used [extortion against Andorran banks](#) to obtain fiscal data on Catalan leaders.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security and Critical Infrastructure

- The [Brent crude price exceeding \\$100](#) has triggered emergency consultations between the Spanish government and transport sectors. Freight companies report that the cost to [refill a 1,400-liter diesel tank](#) has surged from €2,000 to €2,400 since the conflict began.
- TotalEnergies has implemented a [price cap of €2.09 per liter](#) for diesel in France to prevent civil unrest ahead of municipal elections, a move the Spanish government is being pressured to emulate.

Biosurveillance and Domestic Stability

- The Generalitat is treating the ASF outbreak as a high-stakes economic threat. The prohibition of [recreational and sports activities](#) in the Barcelona metropolitan forest is intended to prevent "human-assisted" dispersal of the virus, which can survive on surfaces for extended periods.
- Public pushback is emerging, with some residents labeling the measures ["excessive" or "exaggerated"](#), though the agricultural department maintains that the pork sector's survival depends on total containment.

International Relations and Security Architecture

- Diplomatic relations between Spain and Israel have reached a [new low](#) after the Spanish government dismissed its ambassador to Israel. Simultaneously, President Trump has continued to [insult the Sánchez administration](#), calling Spain "very bad" and accusing it of failing to pay its fair share to NATO.
- The UN Security Council remains paralyzed; a resolution [condemning Iranian attacks](#) passed with Russian and Chinese abstentions, but a Russian counter-proposal to halt all attacks (including US/Israeli strikes) was rejected.

Succession and Stability in Iran

- The emergence of [Mogtaba Khamenei](#) as the voice of the Iranian regime, following reports that he may be [wounded or in hiding](#), suggests a chaotic leadership transition. His first official communique via a [female television presenter](#) avoided providing proof of life, fueling speculation about the regime's internal stability.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity on March 12 focused heavily on emergency social relief and economic protection measures to buffer the population against war-driven inflation and terminal illness costs.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **The ELA Law (Ley ELA):** Implementation of a [new "Grade 3 Plus" dependency level](#) for ALS and other neurodegenerative patients. The law provides up to [€15,000 per month](#) for 24-hour home care, a significant increase from previous caps of €4,900.
- **OdioAm (Hate Speech Tool):** A new [technological tool](#) announced by the Sánchez government to track "hate speech" on social media and hold tech companies accountable for algorithmic manipulation.
- **Fuel Subsidies and Tax Relief:** The Spanish executive is debating a [tax aid package](#) for farmers, ranchers, and transporters, though the Ministry of Economy currently [rejects a general 20-cent discount](#) for all citizens as seen in previous crises.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **IEA Strategic Release Briefing:** Jorge León, former OPEC official, testified that while the 400M barrel release is historic, it is [simply a "patch"](#) that leaves no remaining "cards to play" if the conflict persists.
- **ASF Emergency Press Conference:** The Generalitat's Secretary of Agriculture [officially announced the closure](#) of Collserola, clarifying that while recreation is banned, residents and schools within the park can continue essential movements.
- **Barça Presidential Debate:** A televised ["cara a cara"](#) between Victor Font and Joan Laporta descended into personal attacks, with Font accusing Laporta of leading the club to "ruin" and Laporta calling Font a "technocrat" disconnected from the club's soul.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Logistics

The conflict has evolved beyond territorial disputes into a war of global logistics. Iran's shift from conventional military engagement to [asymmetric "swarm" tactics](#) in the Strait of Hormuz is designed to inflict maximum economic pain on Western consumers. By targeting [20 million barrels of daily flow](#), Tehran is betting that domestic political pressure on President Trump (facing midterms) and European leaders will force a ceasefire on Iranian terms. The [targeting of tankers](#) owned by neutral nations like Greece and Thailand further complicates the "maritime protection" mission, as it forces the US to choose between total naval escort or economic strangulation.

The Governance of Scarcity

A recurring theme across the day is the failure of international governance to manage scarcity. The [IEA's record-breaking intervention](#) is an admission that the global energy market is broken. Domestically, this scarcity is reflected in the [lack of educational resources](#) for children facing eviction, the [shortage of Potable water](#) in Pedralba following Dana-related damage 17 months prior, and the [externalization of logistics](#) causing labor layoffs at automotive plants in Abrera. The state is increasingly forced into "emergency management" mode, as seen in Kast's ["emergency government"](#) in Chile and the Generalitat's [€20 million contingency fund](#) for ELA care.

Technological Warfare: Drones and Cyber

The battlefield is no longer limited to the Middle East. FBI warnings of [potential drone attacks in California](#) targeting high-profile events like the Oscars highlight the

"democratization of death." Drones are cited as the ["new lethal tool"](#) that evades traditional anti-missile barriers. Parallel to this is the ["cyber battle"](#) mentioned in newspaper headlines, as both state and non-state actors use digital infrastructure to amplify the effects of physical blockades.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect fuel prices to remain volatile despite the IEA release, as the [physical blockade of Hormuz](#) remains unbroken. In Catalonia, the [lockdown of Collserola](#) will likely persist as authorities begin the culling of 600 boars. The US may increase naval deployments to the Gulf, potentially leading to a direct kinetic engagement with Iranian coastal missile batteries if "suicide boat" attacks continue.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The Spanish economy will face [significant inflationary pressure](#), potentially leading to a revival of the "yellow vest" style protests seen in France if fuel caps are not implemented. The Chilean government under Kast will likely [militarize internal security](#), leading to clashes with leftist opposition groups. The [regionalization of the ASF outbreak](#) will be a major diplomatic hurdle for Spain, as it attempts to convince non-EU partners that its pork exports remain safe.

Long Term (1-5 Years): Structural changes in energy procurement will accelerate, with Europe potentially reconsidering its [abandonment of nuclear energy](#) following the energy insecurity exposed by the Hormuz blockade. The [return of Pinochetist ideologies](#) in Chile and far-right surges in Europe (evidenced by the Spanish government's "hate speech" crackdown) suggest a period of high

social polarization and the potential for shifts in long-standing democratic norms.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Establish an [international maritime escort corridor](#) in the Gulf of Oman and Arabian Sea to bypass the Strait of Hormuz where possible via pipeline-to-tanker nodes.
- Negotiate a [common biosecurity protocol](#) with major Asian trade partners to prevent a total collapse of the Spanish agricultural export sector due to ASF.
- Diversify [supply chains away from Dubai](#) as a transshipment hub, as it has been proven vulnerable to Iranian asymmetric strikes.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Manufacturers using petroleum derivatives (e.g., [plastic packaging firms in Terrassa](#)) should expect immediate 10-12% raw material price increases.
- **Energy Investment:** The exhaustion of strategic reserves makes [renewable and nuclear energy infrastructure](#) in Europe a high-priority, long-term hedge against geopolitical instability.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Tech companies operating in Spain must prepare for [stricter algorithmic audits](#) under the new "OdioAm" hate speech framework, which carries potential criminal liability for non-compliance.
