



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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

On March 13, 2026, the United States and Israel entered the fourteenth day of an intense military campaign against the Iranian regime, claiming significant tactical success while facing a deepening strategic and economic quagmire. Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth reported that the coalition had struck over [15,000 targets](#), effectively "decimating" Iran's conventional air, sea, and missile capabilities. However, this military dominance has not yet translated into a cessation of hostilities or the reopening of the [Strait of Hormuz](#), which remains effectively closed to Western shipping. The disconnect between the administration's "bullish" rhetoric and the reality of a global energy crisis is widening, as evidenced by Brent crude oil prices [settling above \\$100](#) a barrel for the first time in years.

A significant diplomatic rift has emerged between Washington and its European allies following a unilateral US decision to [ease sanctions on Russian oil](#) to stabilize global

prices. European leaders, including the German Chancellor and the EU Council President, expressed deep concern that this move would [fill Putin's war chest](#) for the ongoing invasion of Ukraine. Simultaneously, the US faces severe internal strain from a [partial government shutdown](#) that has left 100,000 federal workers without pay, leading to major disruptions in domestic transportation security and critical infrastructure oversight.

The humanitarian situation in Lebanon has reached a breaking point, with one in seven residents—over [800,000 people](#)—now displaced by expanding Israeli military operations. Despite coalition claims that Iran's military is "combat ineffective," the regime and its proxies continue to demonstrate resilience through "asymmetric" tactics, including drone attacks on [Dubai's financial district](#) and NATO facilities in Turkey. The ambiguity surrounding the health and location of the new Iranian Supreme Leader, Mojtaba Khamenei, who is rumored to be [wounded and disfigured](#), adds a layer of uncertainty to any potential diplomatic resolution.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

The US-Israel Military Campaign and Tactical Metrics

- US Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth claimed that Iran's missile volume is [down 90%](#) and one-way attack drones are down 95% following two weeks of bombardment.
- The Pentagon announced that all [six crew members](#) died following a mid-air collision involving a US military refueling aircraft over western Iraq.

- President Trump announced that US forces "totally obliterated" military targets on [Harg Island](#), a key Iranian oil export hub, while sparing oil infrastructure as a warning.
- The US has issued a [10 million dollar reward](#) for information regarding the remaining Iranian leadership.

Energy Market Volatility and the Russian Sanctions Pivot

- The US Treasury issued a [30-day waiver](#) allowing countries to buy sanctioned Russian oil currently at sea to lower the price of crude.
- The UK government and European Union formally [refused to follow](#) the US lead in easing sanctions on Russian energy.
- Global shipping insurance rates for the Gulf have surged, with some premiums reaching [7% of vessel value](#), up from 0.5% before the conflict.
- The Strait of Hormuz remains paralyzed, with traffic down [97-98%](#) for vessels using standard identification signals.

Humanitarian Crisis and Regional Spillover

- Israeli evacuation orders in Lebanon have expanded to include all areas [south the Zaharani river](#), displacing hundreds of thousands.
- UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres arrived in Beirut to launch a [325 million dollar](#) humanitarian appeal.
- The first [French military death](#) of the conflict was confirmed following a drone strike on a base in northern Iraq.
- A drone strike in [Oman](#) killed two foreign nationals, highlighting the vulnerability of Gulf states to Iranian retaliation.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security and Alliances

- The US administration's "America First" energy strategy is causing significant friction with the G7, as [six out of seven](#) members opposed easing Russian sanctions.
- The closure of the Strait of Hormuz is impacting fertilizer supply chains, threatening [substantial interruptions](#) to global food production.
- The US government is launching a scheme to [reinsure ships](#) in the Gulf, providing up to \$20 billion in coverage through the International Development Finance Corporation.

Domestic Stability and the US Shutdown

- The partial US government shutdown has entered its [fourth week](#), with critical funding gaps for the Department of Homeland Security.
- Transportation Security Administration (TSA) officers are reporting "excessively long lines" at airports as [personnel leave the agency](#) due to lack of pay.
- A US judge blocked subpoenas against [Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell](#), citing evidence of political pressure to cut interest rates.

National Security and Hybrid Warfare

- The Iran war is being characterized as the first [major conflict in the AI era](#), with drones and autonomous systems playing a decisive role.
- US Cybercom and Spacecom were the [first movers](#) in the war, using non-kinetic effects to "blind" Iranian responses.

- UK and French envoys were summoned by Moscow over the use of [Storm Shadow missiles](#) against targets inside Russian territory.

Elite Politics and Leadership Dynamics

- The Iranian regime's internal control appears [largely intact](#) despite the death of Ali Khamenei, with power shifting toward a "militarized form of government" led by the IRGC.
- A newly unearthed photo from [Jeffrey Epstein's files](#) shows Andrew Mountbatten-Windsor and Peter Mandelson together, creating new political headaches for the UK establishment.
- The Conservative Party in the UK has criticized the Starmer government for [slowness to act](#) in protecting British bases in the Gulf.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative and regulatory focus is currently split between funding the US government amidst a shutdown and managing the domestic economic fallout of the Iran war in both the US and UK. US lawmakers remain deadlocked over DHS funding, while UK ministers are utilizing competition watchdogs to prevent price gouging in the energy sector.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED

- **DHS Funding Bill (US):** Lawmakers [failed to pass](#) a bill to fund the Department of Homeland Security for the fourth consecutive week.
- **Fuel Duty Freeze (UK):** The UK Chancellor reiterated that [fuel duty is frozen](#) until September to mitigate the cost-of-living impact of the Iran war.

- **Russian Oil License (US):** The Treasury approved a [temporary license](#) for the sale of petroleum products already at sea, effectively bypassing standing sanctions.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS

- **Pentagon Press Briefing:** Pete Hegseth and General Dan Kane provided an [update on Day 13](#) of Operation Epic Fury, detailing the destruction of the Iranian navy and missile production capacity.
- **Netanyahu News Conference:** The Israeli PM [gave his first conference](#) since the war began, stating the objective to "take out the regime" is not finished.
- **UK Petrol Retailers Association (PRA) Meeting:** Retailers [withdrew from and then rejoined](#) a meeting with the Chancellor after accusing ministers of using "inflammatory language" regarding profiteering.
- **G7 Virtual Meeting:** A virtual summit on Wednesday revealed that [most members disagreed](#) with US plans to loosen Russian sanctions.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Disconnect Between Military and Economic Success The coalition's rapid destruction of Iranian conventional military hardware is unprecedented, yet it has failed to solve the "Hormuz Problem." Iran has transitioned from a conventional defensive posture to an [asymmetric naval strategy](#), using small speedboats, mines, and drones that are difficult to target from 30,000 feet. The administration's dismissal of the shipping risk—suggesting tankers simply [show some guts](#)—ignores the structural realities of marine insurance and the physical danger of

mining. This creates a trend where military "victory" is achieved, but the economic "defeat" continues through high energy prices and supply chain paralysis.

The Erosion of the Transatlantic Consensus A major strategic shift is occurring as the US under President Trump increasingly acts without consulting European allies on [decisions that affect global security](#). The unilateral lifting of Russian sanctions is seen by Europe as a betrayal of the common goal to defend Ukraine. This has led to an explicit shift where European leaders are [publicly contradicting](#) Washington, moving away from the private diplomacy typical of the alliance. This "rupture" suggests a future where Europe must develop [independent security and energy frameworks](#) rather than relying on US leadership.

Domestic Polarization and the Shadow of "Forever Wars" Despite the initial "righteous mission" rhetoric, the war's popularity is [waning rapidly](#) in the US. Public sentiment is increasingly focused on the [\\$12 billion cost](#) incurred in just two weeks and the rising [petrol prices](#) (up 60 cents in a month). The internal US government shutdown exacerbates this, as voters see their domestic safety (TSA/DHS) compromised while vast sums are spent on a conflict that lacks a [clear end-game or "Day After" plan](#). This domestic strain is a vulnerability Iran is [calculatedly exploiting](#) to force a US withdrawal.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect a further [intensification of air strikes](#) as the US attempts to force a surrender before the next G7 summit or domestic political pressure becomes untenable.

- Naval escort missions for tankers are [unlikely to start](#) at scale until the end of the month, meaning fuel prices will remain high and volatile.
- The US government shutdown could lead to [mass resignations](#) at the TSA and DHS if a funding bill is not reached by the next pay cycle.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- The "temporary" Russian oil waiver may be [extended indefinitely](#) if Hormuz remains closed, leading to a permanent fracture in the sanctions regime against Moscow.
- Republican incumbents may face a significant [electoral backlash](#) in the upcoming midterms if inflation remains "sticky" due to energy shocks.
- Lebanon faces a total [state collapse](#) as the internal displaced population exceeds the capacity of its fragile economy and aid systems.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- The regional balance of power will shift as Iran is "set back [ten years](#)," potentially creating a power vacuum that could lead to "Syria-style balkanization" of the country.
- Alliances in the Indo-Pacific may be [re-evaluated](#) as US assets (like the THAAD system in South Korea) are redeployed to the Middle East, leading to a credibility gap for US security guarantees in Asia.
- Global energy infrastructure will likely pivot toward [sovereignty and renewables](#) to avoid the recurring "fossil fuel roller coaster" triggered by Middle East choke points.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy

- Coalition partners must define a "Day After" governance model for Iran to avoid [vacuum-led chaos](#) if the regime is decapitated.
- European nations should accelerate [energy storage and renewable integration](#) to decouple from the global oil price shock.
- Diplomatic channels must be established with [China and India](#) to manage their "Shadow Fleet" movements and ensure they do not become the sole beneficiaries of weakened sanctions.

For Private Sector/Investors

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Rerouting fuel around the Strait of Hormuz is adding [7 to 10 days](#) to lead times; companies must adjust inventory levels immediately.
- **Regulatory Risk:** The US pivot on Russian oil is unilateral; firms operating in both the US and EU face [severe compliance conflict](#) as sanctions diverge.
- **Cybersecurity Standards:** Businesses must prepare for "insidious" [retaliatory cyber attacks](#) from Iranian proxies, particularly in the financial and utility sectors.
