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ALGERIA ADVANCES LARGE-SCALE INFRASTRUCTURE AND CULTURAL SOVEREIGNTY INITIATIVES AMID HEIGHTENED COUNTER-TERRORISM OPERATIONS AND REGIONAL ECONOMIC SIGNALING.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 13, 2026, was defined by a dual-track state narrative: the maintenance of hard security through lethal counter-terrorism actions in the east and the aggressive pursuit of "Plan Jaune," a multi-billion dinar infrastructure overhaul of the capital. While the People's National Army (ANP) successfully neutralized a high-value terror cell in the Fifth Military Region, the martyrdom of three soldiers triggered high-level condolences from President Abdelmadjid Tebboune, signaling the persistent threat of residual extremist groups during the Ramadan period. This internal security focus is balanced by a massive effort to modernize Algiers through tunnels and bridges, intended to resolve decades-old congestion issues and demonstrate state capacity.

On the diplomatic and cultural front, Algeria is leveraging its religious and historical

heritage to project soft power. The celebration of the Grand Mosque of Paris's centenary and the promotion of Sufi "Zawiyas" as the bedrock of Algerian intellectual identity serve to insulate the domestic population from radical ideologies while positioning Algeria as a center of "moderate" Islamic thought. Simultaneously, the state continues to use its media apparatus to highlight the "socio-economic collapse" of Morocco, contrasting it with Algerian stability and the expansion of regional connectivity, such as the new international bus route to Tunisia. This suggests a continued strategy of regional competition through the narrative of governance excellence and financial resilience.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

High-Intensity Counter-Terrorism Operation in Tissa The Algerian military conducted a major "qualitative operation" in the Tissa sector of the Fifth Military Region. This engagement resulted in significant casualties on both sides and the recovery of substantial weaponry.

- Seven terrorists were neutralized, including two high-ranking "Emirs" identified as [Unis Salah and Haddad Bilal](#).
- The operation resulted in the [martyrdom of three soldiers](#), prompting official condolences from President Tebboune and Army General Said Chanegriha.
- Military hardware recovered included seven sub-machine guns and a [considerable quantity of ammunition](#).

Infrastructure Modernization: Algiers "Plan Jaune" The government is accelerating its "Plan Jaune" (Yellow Plan) to de-congest

the capital and modernize urban flow through major engineering works.

- Construction of [tunnels, bridges, and other major engineering structures](#) is currently underway across several districts.
- The project aims to modernize infrastructure and [improve traffic flow](#) for drivers in the capital.

Regional Connectivity and Diplomatic Expansion Algeria is strengthening ties with Tunisia through new terrestrial transport links while maintaining its cultural presence in Europe.

- A new [international bus route](#) linking Algiers to Tunisia was launched, providing twice-weekly trips in both directions.
- The Grand Mosque of Paris marked its [centenary during Ramadan](#), hosting its fifth annual ambassador's Iftar to promote dialogue and solidarity.

Strategic Shift in Cultural and Media Policy The executive branch is refocusing on cinema as a tool of national influence and economic diversification.

- The Prime Minister presided over an inter-ministerial meeting to examine the [National Strategy for Cinema 2026-2030](#).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Terrorism and National Security The state remains in a high state of vigilance, particularly during the last ten days of Ramadan. The Tissa operation highlights the military's proactive stance on "optimal

exploitation of information" provided by security services.

- Security forces have [stepped up checks](#) in public spaces and transport hubs like the metro and tramway.
- Operations focus on [drug trafficking and psychotropic substances](#) to ensure "tranquility" during the holy month.

Domestic Stability & Civil Society Non-governmental organizations, such as the United Algerian Foundation (UAF), are filling critical gaps in social services, particularly in healthcare and disability support, reflecting a collaborative model of "solidarity."

- The UAF is launching pluridisciplinary [medical caravans toward Boussaada](#) for early diagnostic screening.
- The foundation operates "Dar المتحدة" (United House) to provide [housing and psychological support](#) for cancer patients from remote provinces.
- Targeted programs for [entrepreneurship for persons with disabilities](#) are being integrated into the national economy.

Geopolitical Power Dynamics Algerian state media continues to broadcast a stark contrast between domestic "progress" and the "suffering" in neighboring Morocco and the Palestinian territories.

- Reports highlight Moroccans [scavenging through garbage for food](#) due to collapsing purchasing power and inflation.
- Coverage of Gaza focuses on the "unprecedented humanitarian catastrophe" and the [suffering of cancer patients](#) due to closed border crossings.

Succession & Stability: The Role of the Zawiya The state is emphasizing the

historical role of Sufi Zawiyas in Algerian education to reinforce national identity and religious moderate-ism.

- A focus on the [history of Algeria's Zawiyas](#) and their role in preserving the Quran and fighting foreign "ideological invasions."
- The promotion of [free education provided by Zawiyas](#) as a historical model for charitable social structures.

Regulatory Environment & Heritage

Efforts are underway to professionalize the tourism sector and provide legal protections for Algerian historical sites.

- The Heritage Association is working to [professionalize tour guides](#) with university-level training to ensure information accuracy.
- Legal experts are proposing new [regulations for the protection of heritage](#) sites like the Casbah and ancient palaces.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Policy discussions focused heavily on long-term sectoral strategies for cinema and heritage protection, alongside municipal security mandates for the Ramadan period.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

Sovereignty through Archeological and Cultural Claims A nascent trend is the use of archaeology and heritage to bolster Algerian nationalism and tourism. State-aligned associations are now promoting the theory that [Algeria is the "cradle of humanity,"](#) based on recent finds of ancient bone fragments. This narrative aims to "correct" history written by "orientalists" and position the country as a primary global historical destination. By professionalizing guides and seeking legal protections for sites, the state is attempting to formalize its "cultural sovereignty."

The Militia-to-Manager Transition The government is highlighting the history of "student-soldiers" and the role of [Quranic students in the liberation of cities like Oran](#) to bridge the gap between religious identity and military duty. By celebrating the Zawiya as a "military barracks" that protected the nation's "intellectual borders," the state is co-opting traditional religious structures into the modern security architecture, ensuring that the next generation of "men of the state" are

rooted in traditional Sufi values rather than radical imports.

Civil Society as a Crisis Buffer The extensive coverage of foundations like the UAF suggests that the Algerian state is increasingly relying on private and charitable sectors to manage chronic social issues. From [medical transport for the bedridden](#) to providing [specialized entrepreneurship training](#) for the disabled, these organizations act as a vital safety net. This allows the state to focus on large-scale infrastructure and security while maintaining social peace through charitable "solidarity" networks.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect continued high-alert security operations through the end of Ramadan, with potential for further small-scale "qualitative" military strikes in the Fifth and Seventh military regions. Public transport hubs will see sustained police presence to deter petty crime and drug trafficking during the Eid festivities. The [medical caravan to Boussaada](#) on April 3 will likely be a major domestic PR event for the Ministry of Health.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The completion of initial phases of the "Plan Jaune" roadworks will be used as a metric of government efficiency. We will likely see the formalization of the [National Cinema Strategy 2026-2030](#) into executive decrees, potentially offering new incentives for international co-productions. Diplomatic pressure on Morocco is expected to persist as a diversion from any potential domestic inflationary pressures.

Long Term (1-5 Years): Algeria's push for "heritage tourism" will likely result in a new regulatory framework that could restrict uncertified tour operators and centralize the management of historical sites like Cherchel

and the Casbah. The state's focus on the [Sufi educational model \(Zawiya\)](#) may lead to increased state funding for traditional Quranic schools as a long-term counter-radicalization strategy.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Security Cooperation:** The persistence of high-level terror cells in the Fifth Military Region suggests that intelligence sharing on [cross-border extremist movements](#) remains vital for regional Mediterranean security.
- **Soft Power Alignment:** European partners should note the centennial of the [Grand Mosque of Paris](#) as a platform for Algeria to exert influence over its diaspora and promote its version of "compatible" Islam.
- **Regional Transport:** The [Algeria-Tunisia bus route](#) signals a broader intent to integrate the Maghreb terrestrial economy, bypassing Moroccan routes.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Infrastructure Opportunities:** "Plan Jaune" indicates a sustained [demand for civil engineering, bridge-building technology, and urban traffic management systems](#) in the capital.
- **Healthcare and Tech:** Growth in NGOs like the UAF indicates a market for [medical diagnostic equipment and telemedicine platforms](#) to support regional medical caravans.

- **Content Industry:** The [Cinema Strategy 2026-2030](#) could open opportunities for investment in film studios, post-production facilities, and training centers as the state seeks to monetize its cultural history.
