





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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 13, 2026, is defined by the Sheinbaum administration's rapid pivot following a significant legislative setback and the deepening impact of the war in the Middle East on global stability. Domestically, the rejection of the constitutional Electoral Reform (Plan A) by Congress—due to the defection of key allies in the PT and PVEM—has forced President Claudia Sheinbaum to launch "Plan B," a strategy aimed at bypassing constitutional hurdles to strip "golden bureaucracies" of their funding at the state and municipal levels. This internal political friction is being met with a narrative of "Austerity vs. Privilege," intended to maintain the administration's high approval ratings ahead of the 2027 interim elections. Simultaneously, the administration is celebrating a major tactical success in security following the seizure of 271 kilograms of fentanyl in Colima, a operation

conducted in close coordination with U.S. authorities.

Internationally, the conflict in Iran has reached a critical juncture, with oil prices hitting \$100 per barrel following the closure of the Strait of Hormuz. Mexico is attempting to position itself as a regional mediator, joining Colombia and Brazil in a joint call for peace, while also managing the domestic inflationary pressures of the energy crisis through a newly renewed six-month cap on gasoline prices. Perhaps the most surprising development of the day is the confirmation of initial high-level talks between Cuba and the United States, suggesting a potential diplomatic opening driven by the acute energy and humanitarian crisis on the island. Meanwhile, the Southern Cone is seeing a sharp ideological shift as Chile's new president, José Antonio Kast, begins implementing hardline migration policies, including the construction of border trenches and detention centers, signaling a regional fragmentation in human rights approaches.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

• **Legislative Setback and the Pivot to "Plan B"**

- The Mexican Congress rejected the constitutional Electoral Reform after it failed to reach a two-thirds majority, with segments of the PT and PVEM [voting against the measure](#) to protect their own party interests.
- President Sheinbaum immediately signaled a shift to "Plan B," which targets the budgets of local congresses and municipalities, aiming to [save 400 million pesos](#) by reducing the number of regidores and cutting legislative perks.
- The administration is leveraging the "Plan B" rollout to frame the opposition and non-compliant allies as [defenders of excessive privilege](#) over the needs of the poor.

• **Escalating War in the Middle East and Global Energy Crisis**

- The closure of the Strait of Hormuz has disrupted 20-25% of global oil supplies, pushing the price of [Brent crude past \\$101](#) per barrel.
- The U.S. has reportedly spent over \$11.3 billion in the first six days of the offensive against Iran, while the [USS Gerald Ford is retreating](#) after sustaining damage from Iranian drones or missiles.
- In Europe, gas prices have surged to over 2€ per liter in Germany, prompting "fuel tourism" to Poland and [government interventions to limit](#) daily price increases.

• **Major Fentanyl Interdiction in Colima**

- Security forces seized 271 kilograms of fentanyl (approximately 14 million doses) in Villa de Álvarez, Colima, and [arrested Yair Leobardo N](#), a leader with active warrants in Chicago.
- Secretary Omar García Harfuch emphasized that the operation was the result of [bilateral intelligence sharing](#) with the U.S. FBI and DEA, but executed solely by Mexican forces.

• **Cuba-United States Diplomatic Opening**

- President Miguel Díaz-Canel confirmed that Cuban officials have held [direct talks with U.S. representatives](#) to find solutions to the ongoing energy blockade and bilateral tensions.
- Mexico continues to provide [humanitarian aid and oil](#) to the island, with Sheinbaum confirming three recent shipments to stabilize the Cuban grid.

• **Ideological Re-alignment in Chile**

- Chilean President José Antonio Kast has declared a "government of emergency," signing executive orders for [border trenches and deportations](#) via charter flights.
- Kast's administration marks a stark departure from previous regional consensus, aligning closely with Donald Trump's [migration and security rhetoric](#).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Coalition Cohesion and Elite Politics The rejection of the electoral reform highlights growing fissures within the "Fourth Transformation" (4T) bloc. The refusal of the PT and PVEM to support the elimination of proportional representation (plurinominales)

suggests that allied parties are increasingly [prioritizing their own survival](#) over the presidency's centralized agenda. Sheinbaum's refusal to negotiate the core tenets of the bill—and her subsequent public "naming and shaming" of defectors—indicates a shift toward [disciplining the coalition](#) through public opinion rather than backroom deals.

Energy Security and Economic Resilience

Mexico is aggressively shielding its domestic economy from global shocks. The renewal of the [24-peso-per-liter cap](#) on Magna gasoline for six months is a strategic move to contain inflation, which is currently ravaging Europe and the U.S. The administration's emphasis on the [sovereignty of the Dos Bocas refinery](#) serves as a nationalist counter-narrative to the global energy insecurity caused by the Middle East war.

Corruption and Governance of State Assets

A retrospective analysis of the "Los Pinos" presidential residence has revealed a legacy of systemic asset stripping. Historians and whistleblowers describe the removal of [33 major works of art](#) and entire dinner services of silver and porcelain during the transition from the Peña Nieto administration. The current government is utilizing the ["Memorica" digital repository](#) to recover the "right to memory" and document these losses as a form of "cultural corruption."

Domestic Stability and Social Order The government is expanding its "Centros LIBRE" network, aiming to reach [1,001 centers by the end of 2026](#). These centers are designed to combine psychological and legal aid for women with "economic autonomy" projects, serving as a grassroots pillar for [preventing femicides](#). This social investment is paired with hard security measures, such as the [25% reduction in homicides](#) reported in Colima since the start of the current strategy.

Regional Influence & International Relations

Mexico's foreign policy is focused on "Diplomacy for Peace." By coordinating with Colombia's Gustavo Petro, Mexico is seeking to build a [bloc of neutral Latin American nations](#) to call for a ceasefire in Iran. This is a deliberate attempt to project "soft power" while distancing the region from the [stratospheric military spending](#) of the global powers.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The day was dominated by the aftermath of the failed constitutional electoral reform and the presentation of a "Plan B" focused on secondary laws and local-level spending caps. Additionally, the administration is moving toward a legal initiative to [homologate femicide investigation](#) methodologies across all 32 states.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Constitutional Electoral Reform (Plan A):** Rejection of the bill that sought to eliminate "plurinominal" legislators and reduce funding to the INE and political parties; [failed to achieve two-thirds majority](#).
- **Electoral Reform Plan B:** Proposed secondary legislation to [cap the budgets of state congresses](#) and reduce the number of municipal regidores; expected to be formally presented next week.
- **Femicide Methodological Initiative:** A proposal to standardize how state prosecutors investigate violence against women, based on the [Ernestina Godoy model](#) in Mexico City.

- **No-Reelection Initiative:** A reform to return to the historical principle of [prohibiting the reelection](#) of immediate family members to the same office (anti-nepotism), set for 2030 implementation.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Conferencia de Prensa (Manzanillo):** President Sheinbaum and the security cabinet reported on [declining crime rates in Colima](#) and the "Kukulcán" security strategy for the 2026 World Cup.
- **AICM Taxi Dialogue:** Ongoing negotiations regarding the [regulation of ride-share apps](#) (Uber/Didi) vs. traditional concessions at the Mexico City airport.
- **G20 Armamentism Proposal:** A reiteration of Sheinbaum's proposal to divert [1% of global military spending](#) to environmental and social programs like "Sembrando Vida."

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Austerity The Sheinbaum administration is successfully transforming legislative failures into populist victories. By focusing Plan B on the "excessive" costs of local lawmakers in states like Baja California—where each legislator [costs the treasury 34 million pesos](#)—the presidency is positioning itself as the only barrier between the public treasury and a predatory political class. This trend suggests that future federal-state relations will be increasingly characterized by [fiscal disciplining](#) of local governments under the banner of "Austerity."

The Resurgence of the "Strongman" in the Southern Cone The rise of José Antonio

Kast in Chile and the influence of Donald Trump represent a significant right-ward shift in the region's migration and security architecture. The move to [militarize borders and build trenches](#) reflects a growing disillusionment with multilateral human rights frameworks. Mexico's "peace-first" foreign policy is increasingly at odds with this new [hard-right axis](#) forming between Chile, El Salvador, and the United States.

Energy Insecurity as the New Global Reality The global economy is entering an era of "structural insecurity" where energy prices are no longer predictable. The [refusal of markets to react](#) to the release of 400 million barrels from strategic reserves indicates that speculators have already priced in a long-term conflict in the Middle East. Mexico's decision to prioritize [internal price stability](#) over export profits is a defensive posture that may serve as a model for other emerging economies.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect heightened tensions within the Morena-PT-PVEM alliance as "Plan B" moves through Congress. The government will likely use [public audits and exposes](#) to pressure local congresses into accepting spending caps. In the Middle East, the return of the [USS Gerald Ford](#) suggests a temporary reduction in U.S. naval capability in the region, which could lead to further Iranian provocations in the Strait of Hormuz.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The 2026 World Cup security strategy (Plan Kukulcán) will undergo rigorous stress testing as the [17,600 elements of the defense group](#) are deployed. Economically, the 24-peso gasoline cap will be a significant fiscal burden if oil remains at \$100/barrel, potentially leading to

[budget reallocations](#) from non-priority infrastructure projects. The Cuba-U.S. talks may lead to a limited "energy-for-stability" deal to prevent a total collapse of the island's government.

Long Term (1-5 Years): If Mexico succeeds in standardizing femicide investigations and expanding the "Centros LIBRE" network to [all 2,478 municipalities](#), it will represent a historic shift in state capacity to address gender-based violence. Regionally, the success or failure of Kast's "trench" policy in Chile will determine if the Americas see a [permanent militarization of migration](#) routes or a return to diplomatic management.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Diplomatic interests should monitor the [Mexico-Colombia-Brazil "Peace Bloc"](#) as a potential alternative to Western-led Middle East mediation.
- Security agencies must coordinate with Mexico's newly created [Secretaría del Deporte](#) and Plan Kukulcán to ensure the safety of international fans during the 2026 World Cup.
- Watch for "Lawfare" developments as Mexico seeks to [reduce the power of local judiciaries](#) in the second phase of its judicial reform in 2028.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Energy investors should factor in [high volatility and "risk premiums"](#) as the Strait of Hormuz remains closed and the world enters a "new era of insecurity."

- Retail and logistics firms in Mexico should plan for [stable transport costs](#) in the short term due to the government's gasoline price cap, though long-term inflationary pressure remains high.
- Companies operating in Chile should prepare for a [significant regulatory shift](#) as the Kast administration prioritizes security over economic liberalization in its first 100 days.
