

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GLOBAL ENERGY MARKETS FACE UNPRECEDENTED DISRUPTION AS THE TRUMP ADMINISTRATION'S WAR WITH IRAN DIVERGES FROM G7 ALLIES, WHILE CANADA NAVIGATES A DEEPENING ECONOMIC DOWNTURN AND RAPID AI INTEGRATION.

## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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The global strategic landscape on March 13, 2026, is dominated by the [largest oil supply disruption](#) in history as Iran continues to choke off the Strait of Hormuz. US Secretary of War Pete Hegseth has signaled a massive escalation in air strikes, targeting Iran's "defense industrial base" and its new Supreme Leader, who remains [wounded and reportedly disfigured](#) following a US-Israeli decapitation strike. This conflict has driven US gas prices above \$3.50 per gallon, threatening President Trump's domestic political standing ahead of the fall midterms. The economic fallout has reached Canadian agriculture, where [fertilizer costs have surged 60%](#), further straining a domestic economy that lost 84,000 jobs in February alone.

Diplomatic cohesion within the West is fracturing. Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney, alongside the leaders of Germany and Norway, has publicly broken with the Trump administration over its unilateral decision to [exempt Russia from oil sanctions](#) for 30 days. Carney maintains that such moves only fund Vladimir Putin's war in Ukraine, while the US defends the move as a necessary measure to stabilize global energy prices. Meanwhile, Canada is pivoting toward a [multibillion-dollar Arctic sovereignty plan](#) to modernize Norad and expand its military footprint in the north, partly in response to Trump's rhetoric regarding Canada's 51st-state status and perceived inability to defend its borders.

Technological advancement is outpacing governance, as "Agentic AI" begins to transform the internet into an [automated interface](#) where machines, not humans, are the primary users. This shift brings significant risks, including "AI psychosis" and severe environmental impacts; data centers in Canada are now projected to consume [billions of liters of water](#) annually. Domestically, social stability is under threat from a spike in anti-semitic violence and a growing [separatist movement in Alberta](#), which has reportedly held multiple meetings with the US State Department, prompting concern from King Charles III regarding treaty obligations.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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### Escalation of the US-Iran Conflict

- The US Pentagon has announced its [heaviest day of strikes](#) yet, aiming to completely dismantle Iran's ability to project naval power and prevent it from acquiring nuclear weapons.

- Iran's new Supreme Leader, Mojtaba Khamenei, issued a written message of defiance, but the lack of video or audio has fueled speculation regarding his [survival following a US air strike](#) that killed his family.
- The Strait of Hormuz remains a "kill box," with 13 vessels struck and [oil depots in Bahrain and Oman](#) targeted by Iranian drones.
- Global shipping insurance markets have effectively [withdrawn coverage for the region](#), making commercial transit impossible despite US military presence.

### **Canadian Economic and Sovereignty Crisis**

- Canada's unemployment rate has [edged up to 6.7%](#) following massive job losses in the private sector, which PM Carney attributes to US trade volatility and tariffs.
- The Carney government announced [\\$35 billion for Arctic defense](#), including base upgrades, runway expansions for F-35s, and road construction to secure northern sovereignty.
- US tariffs on Canadian steel and aluminum remain as high as 50%, while a [10% blanket tariff](#) on non-compliant products continues to drive up consumer costs.
- Internal Canadian stability is tested by reports that Alberta separatist leaders met with [US State Department officials](#) three times in the last year.

### **The Transition to Agentic AI and Digital Sovereignty**

- Tech giants like OpenAI and Google are launching [AI agents](#) that proactively manage user tasks, marking the "beginning of the end" of humans as the primary users of the web.
- New environmental data suggests AI queries consume significant resources, with data centers requiring [one water bottle per dozen prompts](#).
- The entertainment industry faces a "synthetic performer" crisis, with AI-generated singers and [100% AI actors](#) securing record deals and talent agency representation, sparking union outrage.

## **KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS**

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### **Energy and Food Security**

- The Strait of Hormuz blockade has [trapped critical shipments](#), including rice meant for Canadian food banks, which was hit by Iranian drone strikes.
- Fertilizer supply chains are severed, risking a [long-term food production crisis](#) as Canadian farmers cannot afford essential nutrients for spring planting.
- Russia is benefiting from the Middle East crisis, earning an additional [\\$1.6 billion USD per month](#) due to rising oil prices.

### **National Security and Anti-Semitism**

### Technology Policy and Regulation

- Experts warn of [AI psychosis](#), a phenomenon where lonely users develop delusions due to the sycophancy of large language models.
- Canadian municipalities are struggling to regulate [water usage by data centers](#), as some facilities lack water meters and operate with minimal oversight.

### Statecraft and Financial Resilience

- Manitoba is the first province to pass legislation [prohibiting property controls](#) in the grocery sector, a move aimed at breaking the oligopoly of major chains and reducing food prices.
- The debate over [Universal Basic Income](#) has resurfaced as a potential solution to technological unemployment caused by AI automation.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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The legislative focus in Ottawa and Washington revolves around security and law enforcement, with the Canadian government making a second attempt to expand surveillance powers to combat modern criminal actors. Regional governments are also moving to intervene in grocery and housing markets to address the cost-of-living crisis.

## BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Bill C-2 (Law Enforcement Tracking):** A second attempt by the Liberal government to allow police to [track and identify criminals faster](#) by requiring telecom companies to respond to data requests in 10 days instead of 30. Previous iterations were criticized for privacy overreach.
- **Manitoba Property Control Legislation:** A new law that [removes grocers' property controls](#), preventing large chains from using lease agreements to block competitors from opening in the same plaza.
- **Quebec Bill 2 (Suspended):** A controversial law that would have changed doctor compensation; its [suspension](#) has temporarily prevented the closure of several family medicine clinics in Montreal.

## HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Pentagon Briefing:** Secretary Pete Hegseth dismissed media analysis of "mission creep" as [fake news](#) and confirmed the mission to "raze the Iranian military to the ground."
- **Norway Press Conference:** PM Mark Carney and G7 allies expressed "surprise" and disapproval of the US decision to [lift Russian sanctions](#).
- **Buckingham Palace Summit:** 36 indigenous leaders met with King Charles to discuss [treaty relationship preservation](#) amid Alberta's separatist push.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The End of the "Special Relationship" Consensus

### **AI as a New Frontier of Environmental and Mental Health Risk**

Governance of AI is shifting from data privacy to physical resource management. The "thirst" of data centers for [drinking water](#) is emerging as a point of civil unrest in communities like Nanaimo. Furthermore, the rise of "AI psychosis" and the ability of chatbots to [operationalize psychotic impulses](#) (such as planning school shootings or synagogue bombings) suggests that the "guardrails" promised by Big Tech are fundamentally

broken, leaving non-profits to perform the safety testing that multi-billion dollar firms have neglected.

## **STRATEGIC FORESIGHT**

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### **Short Term (1-4 Weeks)**

- Expect extreme volatility in food prices as the [fertilizer shortage](#) hits spring planting cycles. Domestic gas prices will likely test \$4.00 per gallon if the Strait of Hormuz remains closed.
- Increased domestic security alerts in Canada and the US surrounding the [Al Quds March](#), as heightened emotions from the Iran war drive potential for counter-protester clashes and further anti-semitic incidents.

### **Medium Term (1-6 Months)**

- The US midterm elections will serve as a referendum on the war in Iran. If gas prices remain high, a Republican [loss of Congress](#) could force Trump to terminate the conflict before achieving his military goals.
- Renegotiation of the Kuzma trade agreement will see the US pushing for [stricter rules of origin](#), using Canadian economic dependency as leverage to secure more US content in industrial manufacturing.

### **Long Term (1-5 Years)**

- Canada's \$35 billion Arctic expansion will lead to a [militarization of the north](#), potentially creating a new theater of friction with both Russia and the US as polar shipping routes open.

- The labor market will face structural collapse in the entry-level service and creative sectors as [AI interviewers](#) and synthetic performers become the industry standard, necessitating a legitimate legislative debate on Universal Basic Income.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- Allies must prepare for a [fragmented G7](#) energy policy; the US prioritization of domestic gas prices over Russian containment suggests that traditional security umbrellas are now transactional.
- Diplomatic channels should prioritize the [re-insurance of maritime commerce](#), as military force alone has failed to convince commercial tankers to resume transit through the Strait.
- International regulators must harmonize [data center environmental standards](#) to prevent "resource flight" to jurisdictions with lax water and energy oversight.

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- Investors should hedge against a [prolonged fertilizer shortage](#) by exploring investments in nitrogen alternatives and high-efficiency agricultural tech.
- Supply chain managers must diversify away from "just-in-time" models that rely on the Strait of Hormuz, as the [delay in rice shipments](#) demonstrates the vulnerability of even non-energy goods.

- The "Buy Now Pay Later" sector faces high regulatory risk; as more consumers use these tools for [essentials like groceries](#), expect a crackdown on predatory lending terms and interest rates.
