DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 13, 2026, marks a transformative and perilous juncture for the Islamic Republic of Iran, characterized by the formalization of a leadership succession following the martyrdom of the previous Supreme Leader. The state has officially elevated [Ayatollah Seyyed Mojtaba Hosseini Khamenei](#) as the third Leader of the Revolution. This transition occurs in the crucible of the "Ramadan War," a direct military conflict with the United States and Israel. Public discourse is now centered on "Sacred Unity," as top officials, including President Pezeshkian and Judiciary Chief Ejei, conducted high-profile, [unprotected appearances](#) during nationwide Quds Day rallies to project stability and defiance despite ongoing aerial bombardments of Iranian urban centers.

Militarily, Iran has escalated its "True Promise 4" operation, launching successive waves of missile and drone strikes (Waves 45 through 47) against Israeli territory and US regional assets. Iranian state media claims significant successes in bypassing missile defense systems and [targeting command centers](#) in Tel Aviv, Haifa, and US bases in Qatar and Jordan. Concurrently, the Iranian government maintains a total blockade of the [Strait of Hormuz](#), driving global oil prices toward \$100 per barrel and triggering a systemic crisis in the petrodollar system. The domestic narrative is heavily fueled by the "Minab School Massacre," an alleged US/Israeli strike on a girls' school that killed 168 students, which the state is utilizing to galvanize [unwavering public support](#) for the new leadership and the continuation of the war.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Leadership Succession and State Continuity

- The formal recognition of **Ayatollah Seyyed Mojtaba Khamenei** as the Supreme Leader, succeeding the "Martyred Leader" (Ayatollah Ali Khamenei), who was reportedly killed in an [initial attack on February 28](#).
- President Pezeshkian reaffirmed the executive branch's total [submission to the new Leader's](#) directives, emphasizing that no international or domestic policy will be pursued without his explicit coordination.

- The martyrdom of several top military and political figures, including **General Mohammad Bagheri** (former Chief of Staff), **General Mohammad Pakpour** (IRGC Ground Forces), and **Admiral Ali Shamkhani**, has led to a sweeping [realignment of the military command structure](#) under General Seyyed Abdolrahim Mousavi.

Military Operations: "True Promise 4"

- Execution of Wave 47 of Operation True Promise 4, involving "Khyber-Shekan" (solid-fuel) and "Ghadr" (liquid-fuel) missiles targeting [Negev, Tel Aviv, and Haifa](#).
- Claims of strikes on the **Al-Udeid Air Base** in Qatar and US installations in [Erbil and Jordan](#).
- Iranian air defenses report the destruction of 114 enemy drones, including [advanced MQ-9 Reaper](#) and Hermes platforms, over major cities like Tehran and Tabriz.
- The reported downing of a US **KC-135 Stratotanker** over western Iraq, resulting in the [death of all crew members](#).

The Strait of Hormuz Blockade and Economic Warfare

- The Strait remains [closed to international traffic](#) by order of the Supreme Leader, though Iran has significantly increased its own oil exports to over 2.1 million barrels per day via its "shadow fleet."
- Strategic shift in the Gulf: Iranian analysts report that regional states are [abandoning the petrodollar](#) in favor of energy deals with Russia to bypass US-led financial architecture.

- Impact on US markets: Reports indicate a massive [decline in US stock values](#) and rising domestic fuel prices as the war of attrition continues.

The Minab School Incident and Civil Mobilization

- The alleged targeting of the **Shajereh Tayyebeh school** in Minab has become a central pillar of state propaganda, with 168 students [confirmed martyred](#).
- Quds Day rallies served as a massive display of **civil defiance**, with citizens continuing to march even as [missiles impacted near](#) the demonstrations in Tehran.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics: The transition to Seyyed Mojtaba Khamenei appears to be consolidated. State media has aggressively synchronized the "Martyred Leader's" legacy with the new Leader's authority. The presence of high-ranking officials like Ali Larijani and President Pezeshkian in the streets [without bodyguards](#) is a calculated move to contrast their "bravery" with Israeli and US leaders who are depicted as [hiding in bunkers](#).

Energy Security & Geopolitical Power Dynamics: Iran is leveraging its geographic control over the Strait of Hormuz to execute "asymmetric economic warfare." By allowing its own tankers to pass while blocking others, Iran is [increasing its market share](#) even during a hot war. Analysts suggest that the "petrodollar" is effectively dead, with Russia emerging as the [primary alternative partner](#) for Gulf states like the UAE and Qatar, who are losing faith in US security guarantees.

National Security & Security

Architecture: Iran's defense strategy has shifted to a "distributed command" model. The "fire at will" (atash-be-ekhtiyar) protocol ensures that even if central command is disrupted, [individual missile units](#) will continue targeting pre-assigned US and Israeli assets. This doctrine is designed to make "regime change" efforts militarily irrelevant by [guaranteeing continued strikes](#) regardless of leadership survival.

Domestic Stability & Social Order: Despite 12-14 days of sustained bombardment, the state reports "normalcy" in urban centers. "Neighborhood checkpoints" manned by the Basij have become [integrated into daily life](#). The state is successfully framing the conflict as a "national defense" rather than a sectarian or political struggle, utilizing [diverse demographics](#)—including women and Gen Z—to demonstrate ideological resilience.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The Iranian government has shifted to an emergency wartime legislative and regulatory footing, prioritizing economic resilience and military readiness.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **2026-2027 Agricultural Insurance Act:** A landmark policy where the government will [pay 100% of the insurance premiums](#) for wheat farmers to ensure food security during the war.
- **Targeted Subsidy Table Adjustment (1405 Budget):** Reallocation of national funds to [cover the costs of industrial and agricultural](#) insurance, moving toward a full war economy.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Khatam al-Anbiya Central Command Press Release:** Official denial of missile launches [toward Turkey](#), framing such reports as US/Zionist disinformation to fracture regional alliances.
- **Ministry of Health Briefing:** Confirmation that all major hospitals and emergency centers are in [full mobilization mode](#) to handle civilian casualties from aerial strikes.
- **Judiciary Press Conference:** Chief Ejei praised the "Kyber-like" spirit of the people and [dismissed the impact of bombings](#) on public morale.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Myth of the "Underground" Leader A major psychological warfare theme today is the rejection of US Intelligence claims that Iranian leaders have fled to bunkers. By broadcasting President Pezeshkian [walking unprotected in Tehran](#) during an active air raid, the state is attempting to shatter the "invincibility" of Western intelligence and the perceived cowardice of US leaders. This is being paired with reports that **Donald Trump** is personally profiting from high oil prices while US citizens [suffer at the pump](#).

Asymmetric Replacement Economics A recurring strategic theme is the "cost-to-kill" ratio. Iranian analysts highlight that Iran is using [inexpensive, mass-produced drones](#) and missiles to force the US to expend multi-million dollar interceptors (like the THAAD and Patriot systems). State media reports that US and Israeli [interceptor stockpiles are depleting](#), forcing the relocation of systems from other global theaters like South Korea to

the Middle East, thereby weakening US global posture.

The New Regional Realism There is a notable shift in how Iran discusses its neighbors. While Bahrain is condemned for [arresting citizens](#) who filmed Iranian missile strikes, there is an opening toward Egypt and Russia. The conversation with **President El-Sisi** and the mention of **Russia bypassing the dollar** suggest Iran is successfully fostering a "resistance bloc" that includes major non-aligned or formerly Western-aligned states [weary of US military volatility](#).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect intensified "vengeance strikes" for the Minab school incident. Iran will likely target specific US command figures or "high-value" military assets to match the perceived "war crime" in Minab. Domestic mobilization will peak around the funeral services for [General Nasirzadeh and Admiral Shamkhani](#). Military operations will likely expand to target US "shadow targets" in the Gulf to further strain insurance markets.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The Strait of Hormuz closure will likely trigger a global recession, which Iran calculates will force the US to the negotiating table on Iranian terms. The new Supreme Leader, Seyyed Mojtaba Khamenei, will likely oversee a purge of any remaining "moderate" elements in the bureaucracy to ensure a [unified hardline stance](#) as the war enters a war-of-attrition phase. The 2026 World Cup in the US will likely become a [focal point for diplomatic warfare](#), following Trump's threats against the Iranian team.

Long Term (1-5 Years): If the current trajectory holds, the security architecture of

the Middle East will be permanently altered. The "Petrodollar" system may be replaced by a multi-currency energy market involving [Russia, China, and Iran](#). The US military presence in the Gulf may be reduced to a purely defensive posture or forced out entirely if "True Promise" operations continue to render regional bases [militarily untenable](#).

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The leadership transition to Mojtaba Khamenei is a "fait accompli." Diplomatic channels should prepare for a **significantly more aggressive** and ideologically rigid Iranian foreign policy.
- The closure of the Strait of Hormuz is not a temporary tactic but a **strategic lever**; partial lifting will only occur in exchange for significant sanctions relief or the withdrawal of US forces.
- The "petrodollar" is under systemic threat; international financial institutions must model for a **non-dollarized energy market** in the Middle East.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Maritime transit through the Gulf of Oman and Arabian Sea is highly volatile; insurance premiums will likely [remain at "war risk" levels](#) indefinitely.
- **Energy Volatility:** Oil prices are unlikely to stabilize below \$95 so long as the "Ramadan War" continues; companies should pivot toward **alternative energy sources** or Russian/Central Asian routes.

- **US Domestic Risk:** The war is impacting US stock markets and creating **internal political dissent**; investors should hedge against US economic instability as the conflict draws in more resources [without a clear exit strategy](#).
