

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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 13, 2026, marks a significant strategic pivot in the dual-theater conflicts involving Iran and Russia. The Trump administration has issued a 30-day temporary license allowing the sale of [Russian oil stuck at sea](#), a move designed to stabilize skyrocketing domestic fuel prices caused by the escalating war in the Middle East. This decision has sparked a severe diplomatic rift with European allies, who argue that the move effectively [finances Moscow's war effort](#) against Ukraine at a critical juncture. While Washington prioritizes domestic economic relief and its military campaign against Tehran, European leaders, particularly in Germany and France, view the move as a betrayal of the collective sanctions regime.

In the Middle East, the war against Iran has entered its second week with unprecedented intensity. The United States and Israel have reportedly struck over 15,000 targets,

including [IRGC headquarters and weapon depots](#) in Tehran. However, the conflict is increasingly defined by geographic rather than purely military bottlenecks, as Iran's blockade of the [Strait of Hormuz](#) continues to choke global energy markets. Conflicting reports suggest that while major Iranian naval vessels have been neutralized, smaller craft continue to mine the strait, complicating US efforts to establish a [naval escort system](#) for international tankers.

Domestically, Lithuania is grappling with the spillover effects of these global crises. Farmers are warning of a [critical collapse in the agricultural sector](#) due to high fertilizer and energy costs, while the government remains hesitant to implement price caps or tax cuts. Simultaneously, a natural disaster in the form of [ice-jam flooding](#) in the Kaunas district has exposed flaws in local emergency warning systems, further straining the public's trust in state capacity during a period of heightened regional anxiety.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **US Sanction Easing and Transatlantic Friction**
 - The US Treasury issued a license allowing the delivery and sale of Russian crude oil and petroleum products until [April 11, 2026](#).
 - German Chancellor and French President Emmanuel Macron criticized the move, claiming it could inject up to [10 billion dollars](#) into Putin's war chest over 30 days.
 - The Trump administration defended the move as a "narrowly tailored" measure to prevent a [global economic collapse](#) and stabilize the US energy market.

• **Escalation of the Iran-Israel-US Conflict**

- Reports indicate that Iran's new Supreme Leader, Mojtaba Khamenei, may have been [wounded in recent strikes](#) and is currently in hiding.
- Turkey's NATO-operated air defenses intercepted an [Iranian ballistic missile](#) over its territory, marking a dangerous expansion of the conflict zone.
- A US refueling aircraft with a crew of six crashed in western Iraq; the IRGC claims it was [shot down by Iranian missiles](#), while the Pentagon maintains the cause is under investigation.

• **Poland's Constitutional and Defense Crisis**

- President Karol Nawrocki vetoed a 44 billion euro EU defense loan (SAFE program), citing [sovereignty concerns](#) and a refusal to "surrender independence to foreign decisions."
- Prime Minister Donald Tusk's administration accused the President of [state treason](#), arguing the veto leaves Poland vulnerable while Russia "drinks champagne."

• **Zelensky's Diplomatic Offensive in Paris**

- President Zelensky met with President Macron to secure air defense systems and ensure that the [90 billion euro EU loan](#) proceeds despite blocks from Hungary and Slovakia.
- Ukraine is offering its unique expertise in [intercepting Iranian Shahed drones](#) to help Western allies currently facing similar threats in the Middle East.

• **Lithuanian Domestic Unrest and Infrastructure Failures**

- Massive ice jams on the Nėris river caused flooding in Radikiai, with residents reporting that [emergency sirens failed](#) to activate until after the water had already entered their homes.
- Lithuanian farmers met with the Prime Minister to warn that the milk and grain sectors are facing [total insolvency](#) due to the geopolitical situation and new domestic taxes.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security and Statecraft The global energy market is in a state of extreme volatility. The Lithuanian Energy Minister noted that 16 million barrels of oil are [lost daily](#) due to the Hormuz blockade, prompting a coordinated release of 400 million barrels from international reserves. Despite this, fuel prices in Lithuania have surged, with the [Finance Minister](#) warning that while the situation is not yet "critical," the risk of **stagflation**—stagnant growth combined with high inflation—is increasingly real. The US decision to allow Russian oil sales represents a desperate attempt to use energy statecraft to prevent domestic political fallout from gas prices exceeding [2 euros per liter](#).

AI & Technology Policy The war in the Middle East is accelerating the deployment of **autonomous weapon systems**. Experts highlight a shift toward [Human-Machine Teaming](#), where pilots are accompanied by swarms of autonomous drones. Significant concerns are being raised regarding [AI "hallucinations"](#) in combat, where systems may misidentify retreating troops or civilian decoys as valid targets. Furthermore, the use of AI in **information warfare** has reached new levels, with automated algorithms

capable of analyzing social media "bubbles" to [sow societal division](#) more effectively than human operatives.

Coalition Cohesion The Western alliance is showing visible cracks. In Poland, the rift between President Nawrocki and the Tusk government over the [SAFE defense program](#) highlights a growing "sovereignty vs. integration" debate that threatens NATO's eastern flank. Meanwhile, the US-Europe divide over [Russian oil sanctions](#) suggests a divergence in strategic priorities, with the US focusing on Iran and domestic economics while Europe remains focused on the existential threat from Russia.

Domestic Stability & Social Order In Lithuania, the failure of [flood sirens in Radikiai](#) has become a symbol of state incapacity. Coupled with the [farmers' protests](#), the government faces a multifaceted challenge to maintain social order. The Finance Minister's dismissive tone regarding the agricultural crisis has only exacerbated tensions with rural populations who feel the [cost of the war](#) is being placed solely on their shoulders.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity centered on emergency economic measures and defense funding, with significant roadblocks appearing in both the EU and national parliaments.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **SAFE Program (Poland):** A proposal to accept 44 billion euros in EU loans for defense strengthening. [Vetoed by President Nawrocki](#) on constitutional and sovereignty grounds.

- **EU 90 Billion Euro Ukrainian Loan:** A massive financial aid package for Kyiv. Currently [blocked by Hungary and Slovakia](#), with Macron promising an alternative "workaround" by April.
- **Lithuanian Fuel Tax Relief:** Proposed reductions in excise duties or VAT for diesel. The Finance Minister currently [opposes this](#), citing the need for fiscal discipline.
- **Russian Oil License (US):** An administrative action by the US Treasury [suspending certain sanctions](#) on Russian petroleum for a 30-day window.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Pentagon Press Briefing:** Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth defended the Iran campaign, dismissing claims of miscalculation in Hormuz as ["fake news" from CNN](#).
- **Lithuanian Farmers' Meeting:** Agricultural leaders met with the Prime Minister to demand [working capital loans](#) and an end to new environmental taxes.
- **Petr Pavel in Rukla:** The Czech President emphasized the importance of the [Military Schengen](#) system to ensure rapid troop movement across Europe.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Geography The current conflict in the Middle East has moved beyond traditional military engagement to a battle over **choke points**. While the US can hit thousands of targets in Iran, the [geographic reality of the Strait of Hormuz](#) allows Tehran to project power disproportionate to its naval strength. The shift to using smaller, unmanned boats for

mining reflects an asymmetric strategy that the US Navy is struggling to counter without [boots on the ground](#) in southern Iran—a move that would be politically catastrophic for the current US administration.

The Automation of Attrition Warfare is entering a phase where the speed of decision-making outpaces human biology. The discussion of [AI in drones](#) reveals that the primary advantage of these systems is not just their lack of a pilot, but their ability to process target data and [engage in milliseconds](#). This creates a "race to the bottom" where ethical considerations are sacrificed for combat effectiveness, as seen in the lack of "brakes" in the current [military-industrial AI arms race](#).

Total Defense and Civil Resilience The NATO ["Cold Response" drills](#) in the Arctic represent a return to the "Total Defense" models of the Cold War. The inclusion of hospitals, private businesses, and civilian transport in military exercises in Norway suggests that the alliance no longer views war as a purely military affair. This "civil-military bridge" is being tested in real-time in Lithuania, where [flood warning failures](#) suggest that the "home front" is far from ready for a high-intensity hybrid conflict.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a temporary dip in global oil prices as Russian crude enters the market, but this will likely be offset by Iranian [mining of the Hormuz Strait](#). In Poland, the Tusk government will likely seek "extra-constitutional" ways to bypass the Presidential veto on defense spending, potentially leading to a [domestic political crisis](#). Tensions in Lithuania will peak if the Finance Ministry continues to refuse [aid to](#)

[farmers](#) during the critical spring planting season.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The US "30-day" window on Russian oil may be extended if the war in Iran does not conclude quickly, further alienating EU allies and potentially [fracturing the G7](#). Ukraine will likely face a new Russian offensive funded by the oil revenue "windfall" granted by the US sanction easing. In the Middle East, if Mojtaba Khamenei remains incapacitated, a [power struggle within the IRGC](#) could lead to even more erratic military actions.

Long Term (1-5 Years): The current shift toward **AI-driven autonomous warfare** will lead to a total restructuring of military procurement, with human pilots and tank crews becoming secondary to [AI-managed swarms](#). The "Military Schengen" and "Total Defense" concepts will become the new standard for European security, but their success will depend on whether states can [rebuild trust](#) with their own populations following current economic hardships.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Allies must establish a **clear deconfliction mechanism** regarding sanctions to prevent Washington's domestic economic needs from inadvertently subsidizing Moscow's aggression.
- The "Total Defense" model should be expanded to include [cross-border civil infrastructure](#) (hospitals, railways) to ensure the Baltic states and Scandinavia function as a single defensive unit.

- Diplomatic pressure must be maintained on [Italy and other EU states](#) to prevent the normalization of Russian participation in cultural and political forums like the Venice Biennale.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Hedging:** Investors should prepare for extreme volatility beyond the current 30-day US window, as the [threat of stagflation](#) in Europe remains high.
- **Defense Tech Opportunities:** The rapid pivot to [AI and autonomous systems](#) represents a significant growth area, particularly for "Human-Machine Teaming" software and drone-interception technologies.
- **Supply Chain Risk:** The [crisis in the Lithuanian agricultural sector](#) signals a broader European risk to food supply chains; investors should monitor fertilizer costs and rural stability in the CEE region closely.
