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GLOBAL SUPPLY CHAINS FACE SYSTEMIC COLLAPSE AS THE MIDDLE EAST WAR FORCES UNPRECEDENTED ENERGY INTERVENTIONS AND THE BOSNIAN RULING COALITION FRACTURES OVER IDEOLOGICAL DIVISIONS.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The thirteenth day of the conflict in the Middle East has triggered a global energy crisis of historic proportions, characterized by the continued closure of the [Strait of Hormuz](#) and a resulting surge in oil prices toward the \$100 per barrel threshold. International response has been swift but defensive; the International Energy Agency (IEA) has coordinated a record release of [400 million barrels](#) of oil to stabilize markets, while the United States has issued a temporary thirty-day permit for the sale of sanctioned [Russian oil](#) to alleviate immediate shortages. On the military front, the conflict has escalated with kamikaze boat attacks on Iraqi tankers and the targeted destruction of Iranian [nuclear infrastructure](#), while the status of Iran's new Supreme Leader, Mojtaba Khamenei, remains

shrouded in mystery following reports of [severe injury](#) or disfigurement during U.S. operations.

In Bosnia and Herzegovina, the domestic political landscape has been upended by the removal of [Dragan Mioković](#) as Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Federation of BiH. This ouster, facilitated by an unusual alliance between the HDZ, SDA, and DF, signals a significant fracture in the "Trojka" ruling coalition and potentially a broader realignment of power ahead of the October elections. Simultaneously, the country faces critical deadlines for anti-money laundering legislation to avoid the [Manival grey list](#), even as citizens grapple with a [fuel panic](#) driven by global price spikes. Regional tensions also persist in Serbia and Croatia, with disputes over historical memory and significant increases in [arms imports](#) characterizing the Western Balkans' security posture.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

• Middle East War Escalation and Global Trade Disruption

- The Strait of Hormuz remains closed, with Iran utilizing it as a [blockade mechanism](#) to pressure international adversaries, effectively trapping shipping in the Upper Gulf.
- Shipping giant Maersk has confirmed that [ten ships](#) are currently stuck in the region, forcing a total rerouting of global cargo [around Africa](#).
- U.S. President Donald Trump has issued aggressive public statements via social media, claiming the [complete destruction](#) of the Iranian regime and citing the elimination of its leaders as a "great honor."
- Israel has expanded its air campaign, targeting [Hezbollah command centers](#) across Lebanon and Iranian nuclear facilities.

• Energy Market Emergency Interventions

- The IEA's release of 400 million barrels includes [172 million barrels](#) from U.S. strategic reserves to combat prices that could otherwise hit \$200.
- The U.S. Treasury's short-term license for [Russian oil](#) sales is intended strictly to stabilize the market and applies to oil loaded before March 12.
- Fuel prices in Bosnia and Herzegovina have risen to [2.90 KM for diesel](#), prompting the Republic of Srpska government to [limit margins](#) on petroleum products.

• Bosnian Federal Governance Crisis

- Speaker Dragan Mioković was removed following a [controversial statement](#) regarding the victims of Bleiburg, though he claims the move was a pre-arranged [political maneuver](#) by the HDZ and SDA.
- The "Trojka" coalition's stability is in doubt as the SDP [remained neutral](#) during the vote, while Naša Stranka and NiP opposed the removal.
- The FBiH Parliament failed to pass a [declaration condemning fascism](#) and antisemitism due to a lack of consensus between the SDA and HDZ.

• Western Balkans Security and Legal Affairs

- Serbia has become the largest [arms importer](#) in the Western Balkans over the last five years, with significant procurement from China, France, and Russia.
- BiH State Prosecutor Milanko Kajganić announced upcoming [indictments](#) against former Minister Nenad Nešić and fugitive Sipe Deputy Director Zoran Galić.
- In Croatia, former prefect Damir Dekanić was sentenced to [four years](#) for a drunk driving cover-up.

• European Digital and Social Initiatives

- Swiss researchers debuted the [Aperatus AI model](#), a multilingual open-source alternative to U.S. platforms, emphasizing European [digital sovereignty](#).
- The Croatian government introduced [consumer protection changes](#), including a "button for unilateral contract termination" for distance selling.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security The global economy is reeling from the [closure of Hormuz](#), which affects 20% of the world's oil supply. Expert Edhem Bičakčić warns that BiH is particularly vulnerable due to its [lack of strategic reserves](#) and its transition to becoming an electricity importer. While the FBiH government claims [current supplies](#) are safe, the lack of operational reserves in terminals like Živinice remains a critical failure.

- IEA coordination of [400 million barrels](#) release to counteract "unprecedented" market volatility.
- Ongoing disputes over the [Southern Interconnection](#) gas project, which remains stalled by political deadlock.

Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics The removal of Dragan Mioković signifies a [tectonic shift](#) in Bosnian federal politics. Mioković attributed his ouster to his apology for past rhetoric, arguing that [apologizing in BiH politics](#) is treated as an "excess." The move by HDZ to align with SDA for this vote suggests the "Trojka" is losing its [parliamentary grip](#).

- The mystery surrounding Mojtaba Khamenei's [physical absence](#) from public view, despite releasing written orders.
- Ongoing internal struggles within the FBiH Ministry of Culture regarding the funding of [seven key institutions](#).

Economic Security & Supply Chains The Transport Community has warned that BiH has only adopted [43% of EU transport laws](#), with professional drivers facing severe [Schengen stay limitations](#). Maersk's CEO described the current maritime situation as ["uncharted territory"](#) with ripple effects

reaching global transshipment hubs like Jebel Ali.

- Maersk rerouting around the Cape of Good Hope due to [militia risks](#) in the Red Sea and Gulf.
- Mostar's trash collection collapse due to a [4 million KM debt](#) to the landfill.

Rule of Law & Corruption State Prosecutor Kajganić is defending his [reassignment of prosecutors](#) who were investigating him, claiming these were "redistributions" and not disciplinary actions. Meanwhile, the "Vila na Dedinju" case against Milorad Dodik remains [stalled](#) due to a lack of evidence from Serbia.

- BiH parliamentarians rushing [anti-money laundering](#) laws to avoid international blacklisting.
- Croatia's sentencing of Dekanić seen as a test of [equality before the law](#).

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity today was dominated by emergency measures to address the energy crisis and the fallout from the Speaker's removal in the FBiH Parliament. Regional governments are focusing on margin controls to prevent social unrest amid inflation, while the EU integration process remains hampered by procedural delays and political blockades.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **FBiH Anti-Money Laundering & Terrorist Financing Act:** A draft aimed at preventing BiH from being placed on the Manival "grey list." [Adopted as a draft](#) by the Council of Ministers.
- **RS Margin Limitation on Petroleum Products:** A regulation [limiting margins](#) to 0.06 KM in wholesale and 0.25 KM in retail.

- **Croatian Consumer Protection Amendments:** Legislation introducing the "[raskid ugovora](#)" button for online sales and banning "greenwashing."
- **FBiH Financial Market & Social Protection Laws:** A set of over [ten legislative changes](#) debated during the two-day parliamentary session.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **State Prosecutor milanko Kajganić Annual Report:** A press conference detailing [prosecutorial results](#) and addressing internal scandals.
- **FBiH Ministry of Culture Annual Report:** Minister Vlasisavljević presented a [79 million KM budget](#) overview, highlighting infrastructure projects in smaller communities.
- **Transport Community Annual Presentation:** Presentation of findings regarding [BiH transport legislation](#) and driver rights in Schengen.
- **Post-Removal Press Conference of Dragan Mioković:** Mioković addressed the media following his [dismissal](#), alleging a political "deal" between his opponents.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The End of "Trojka" Hegemony The ouster of Mioković is not merely a personnel change but a signal that the [ruling coalition](#) in the Federation is effectively paralyzed. The HDZ's decision to vote with the opposition SDA and DF indicates a return to **ad-hoc power-sharing** rather than principled coalition governance. Critics within the SDP, who [remained suzdržani \(neutral\)](#), suggest the move was a pre-election tactic by all sides to distance themselves from the current

government's perceived failures. This instability is likely to stall the [Southern Interconnection](#) and other critical infrastructure projects indefinitely.

Energy as a Geopolitical Weapon The conflict has evolved into a war over **energy arteries**. Iran's use of the Strait of Hormuz to blockade global oil is being countered by the U.S. and Israel targeting [nuclear and military infrastructure](#). The MAERSK CEO's warning that "[there is enough oil in the world, but not enough everywhere](#)" highlights the logistical nightmare of the blockade. The U.S. decision to [partially lift Russian oil sanctions](#)—an unprecedented move—underscores the desperation of the administration to keep global inflation from unseating political stability.

Weaponized Historical Memory The controversy surrounding Mioković's [Bleiburg comments](#), the anniversary of [Zoran Đinđić's assassination](#), and the [Toni Cetinski Spens camp](#) allegations show that the Western Balkans remains trapped in **competitive victimhood**. In Serbia, the focus on the Milošević era in state media, contrasted with the Đinđić legacy, indicates a [restoration of nationalist narratives](#). This "lawfare" over the past is used by elites in BiH, Serbia, and Croatia to consolidate their bases and distract from [economic mismanagement](#).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect **fuel shortages** and price spikes at pumps in BiH despite margin controls, as the global supply lag hits local markets.
- Social unrest in Sarajevo and Tuzla is likely to grow, driven by the [tram tragedy protests](#) and [medical strikes](#).

- The mystery of Mojtaba Khamenei's health will either be resolved by a [video proof of life](#) or lead to an internal IRGC power struggle.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- The FBiH coalition will likely remain in a state of **managed chaos** until the October elections, with no major reforms passing through parliament.
- BiH faces a significant risk of **Manival blacklisting** if the currently adopted drafts are not fully ratified and implemented.
- Global shipping rates will remain high as the **rerouting around Africa** becomes the semi-permanent "new normal."

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- The Western Balkans will see an **accelerated arms race**, led by Serbia's massive imports, potentially shifting the regional power balance.
- European **digital sovereignty** will either gain ground through projects like Aперatus or fail as US/China AI dominance becomes irreversible.
- BiH's energy policy will require **forced centralization** or a total overhaul to build the strategic reserves missing in the current crisis.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Monitor the **Mojtaba Khamenei succession** carefully; a wounded leader reliant on a written proxy could signify an IRGC military junta in all but name.

- Pressure the FBiH government to resolve the **Southern Interconnection** deadlock, as reliance on single-source energy is now a systemic regional threat.
- Establish a **clear monitoring mechanism** for the use of US-released Russian oil to ensure it does not indirectly fund the Kremlin's war chest beyond its intended stabilization role.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Companies reliant on Jebel Ali or Doha transit hubs must diversify routes immediately, as Maersk indicates ["ripple effects"](#) will last indefinitely.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Investors in BiH should prepare for potential financial transaction delays if the country falls to the [Manival grey list](#).
- **Energy Volatility:** Agricultural and transport sectors in the Balkans and Southern Europe should hedge against [sustained fuel inflation](#) as production costs rise.
