DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 13, 2026, marks a critical convergence of global and regional crises, as the ongoing war between the United States-Israel alliance and Iran triggers the most severe disruption to global energy supplies in history. The blockade of the [Strait of Hormuz](#) has pushed oil prices above \$100 per barrel, forcing the United States to enact a paradoxical 30-day suspension of sanctions on [Russian oil](#) to stabilize a collapsing global market. In the Middle East, the conflict has escalated to targeting civilian infrastructure, with Israel admitting to strikes on [Lebanese bridges](#) while the physical condition of Iran's new Supreme Leader, Mojtaba Khamenei, remains a subject of intense psychological warfare after reports surfaced that he was [wounded or disfigured](#) in recent strikes.

Domestically, Serbia is navigating a period of profound democratic regression, punctuated by the 23rd anniversary of the assassination of Prime Minister Zoran Đinđić. The

anniversary serves as a stark backdrop to current civil unrest, as the "Nedam" student-led movement faces increasing state intimidation ahead of the [March 29 local elections](#). Concurrently, the Serbian government is leveraging the global energy crisis to tighten its domestic grip, implementing temporary [excise tax cuts](#) while President Vučić promotes a "siege mentality" narrative, alleging a military alliance between [Croatia, Albania, and Kosovo](#) aimed at dismantling the Serbian state.

Regional security architecture is fraying as Serbia confirms its acquisition of [hypersonic ballistic missiles](#), making it the first European operator of such technology. This development has triggered an immediate diplomatic crisis with Croatia, which has vowed to raise the issue with its [NATO partners](#). Meanwhile, in Kosovo, the impending March 15 implementation of the [Law on Foreigners](#) threatens to effectively dismantle Serbian-run healthcare and education systems, pushing the region closer to a definitive rupture in institutional coexistence.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

• Middle East Conflict and Global Energy Shutdown:

- The Strait of Hormuz remains blocked, preventing the passage of approximately [20 million barrels](#) of oil per day, while the US military reports the loss of a [KC-135 refueling aircraft](#) in western Iraq.
- US President Donald Trump asserts that the US is [completely destroying](#) the Iranian regime, while the US Treasury (OFAC) allows a temporary window for [Russian oil sales](#) to prevent a total economic freeze.
- Iran's Supreme Leader, Mojtaba Khamenei, issued his first [written statement](#) promising revenge for "martyrs," though his failure to appear on camera fuels rumors of his [severe injury](#).

• Serbian Strategic Re-Armament and Regional Alarm:

- Serbia has acquired [hypersonic missiles](#) with a range of up to 400km, capable of reaching Zagreb, a move Croatian PM Plenković labeled an [extraordinary threat](#).
- President Vučić claims that neighboring states are forming a [hostile military alliance](#), utilizing the global "chaos" as a pretext to prepare for future [defensive operations](#).

• Democratic Backsliding and Electoral Malpractice:

- Ruling SNS party members are accused of using [state-owned machinery](#) with swapped license plates to perform roadwork in municipalities where [local elections](#) are imminent.
- Student activists in [Smederevska Palanka](#) and Arandjelovac report systemic intimidation, including police [house searches](#) and job-related threats against opposition candidates.

• Kosovo Institutional Crisis:

- The March 15 deadline for the [Law on Foreigners](#) looms, which Serbian leaders warn will treat Serbian residents and institutional staff as [aliens in their own cities](#).
- University staff in North Mitroica report a [lack of guidance](#) from both Belgrade and local rectors on how to navigate the impending [integration or "kosovarization"](#) process.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security and Economic Mitigation: The Serbian government has lowered [oil excise taxes](#) by 20% until April 15 to cap diesel prices at [210 RSD per liter](#), after market forecasts suggested prices would reach [246 RSD](#). Global shipping giants [Maersk and MSC](#) have rerouted vessels around Africa, a move expected to cause long-term [supply chain congestion](#) and significant cost increases for consumer goods. In the agricultural sector, farmers in Spain and the Balkans warn that [surging fertilizer costs](#)—driven by gas prices—are making [corn planting](#) unprofitable.

AI and Media Ethics: United Media is accelerating the implementation of its [AI](#)

[newsroom system](#), which is already operational in Bulgaria and expected to be fully [deployed in Serbia](#) by autumn. While AI assists in [contextualizing data](#) and improving production speed, senior journalists warn that [synthetic voices and faces](#) could further erode [public trust](#) in a region already saturated with state-aligned fake news. Concurrently, European leaders at [Vivatech 2025](#) are pushing for "digital sovereignty" to reduce reliance on US-based [processing power](#).

Rule of Law and Judicial Independence:

Allegations of political interference in the Serbian judiciary have resurfaced, with reports of prosecutors receiving [instructions from the BIA](#) (Security Intelligence Agency) regarding internal [judicial voting](#). In Bosnia and Herzegovina, Chief Prosecutor Milanko Kajganić is defending [personnel reshuffles](#) that critics claim sidelined prosecutors investigating high-level corruption and [assaults on the constitutional order](#).

Security Architecture and Arms Proliferation: Serbia's arms imports have tripled over the last five years, making it the [largest importer](#) in the Western Balkans. The introduction of [hypersonic missiles](#) marks a qualitative shift in regional power projection, as these systems can bypass existing [missile defense](#) networks in neighboring NATO states. This is framed by a broader regional [arms race](#) that analysts suggest serves domestic political signaling as much as tactical defense.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity on March 13 focused on emergency economic stabilization measures and regional compliance with EU mandates. Serbian policy has notably diverged from EU foreign policy alignments regarding the [IRGC's terrorist designation](#), while Bosnia and

Herzegovina continues to struggle with [anti-money laundering](#) legislation required to avoid international blacklisting.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Serbian Excise Tax Amendment:** A temporary decree cutting excise on [diesel and gasoline](#) by 20% to mitigate war-driven inflation, valid through [April 15, 2026](#).
- **Kosovo Law on Foreigners:** Legislation set for [March 15 implementation](#) that requires Serbian institutional staff to register as foreigners, potentially [criminalizing Serbian institutional presence](#).
- **BiH Manival/Legislative Package:** Draft laws aimed at preventing [money laundering](#) and terrorist financing to avoid being placed on the [Manival gray list](#).
- **Republika Srpska Margin Caps:** Government decision [limiting margins](#) on petroleum products (0.25 KM/liter) and [essential goods](#) like flour and medicine until June 1.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **BiH Chief Prosecutor's Annual Briefing:** Milanko Kajganić addressed [leaked information](#) and personnel transfers, including the reassignment of [Džermin Pašić](#) from organized crime to war crimes.
- **Vučić German Media Blitz:** The Serbian President gave interviews to [German newspapers](#) (*Süddeutsche Zeitung*, *Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung*), presenting Serbia as a [neutral actor](#) rather than a Russian puppet.

- **Patriarch Porfirije Slovenian Lawsuit:** Confirmation of a [lawsuit in Ljubljana](#) against the Serbian Patriarch for [labor abuse](#) related to his tenure as Metropolitan.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of History and Anniversary Politics: The 2026 Đinđić anniversary is being used as a lens to critique the current administration's [intellectual and political capacity](#). Analysts note that questions Đinđić raised 23 years ago—such as whether [politics or crime](#) is stronger in Serbia—remain unresolved. This sits alongside the 11th anniversary of the [Surcin helicopter crash](#), where the lack of [judicial accountability](#) for high-ranking officials is cited as evidence of the state's [institutional "bestidnost" \(shamelessness\)](#).

Economic Desperation and Political Patronage: A recurring theme is the struggle for [economic survival](#) among the working class. In small towns like [Majdanpek and Knjazevac](#), the government is accused of employing "election tourism" and [subtle threats](#) against livelihoods to maintain control. The disparity in [fuel prices](#) between Serbia and its neighbors (where diesel is up to [80 RSD cheaper](#)) is increasingly framed as a [direct state "theft"](#) by opposition figures.

The Paradox of "Russian Oil" Stabilization: Strategically, the US decision to [partially lift sanctions](#) on Russian oil to counter the Iranian blockade represents a significant shift in [bloc politics](#). It demonstrates that in the 2026 global war environment, [energy pragmatism](#) outweighs ideological alignment, potentially providing

the Kremlin with unexpected [geopolitical leverage](#) over the Western alliance.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): The March 15 deadline in Kosovo is likely to trigger [civil disobedience](#) or institutional shutdowns in the north as the Serbian community resists the [Law on Foreigners](#). Expect a spike in [global shipping delays](#) as rerouted vessels fail to reach European ports, potentially causing [shortages of key commodities](#) by early April. In Serbia, local election tensions will peak as the [March 29](#) vote approaches, with further [police actions](#) against student organizers anticipated.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The exhaustion of [strategic oil reserves](#) (currently estimated at [93 days](#) for Serbia) will create a critical pricing cliff by mid-summer 2026. The implementation of AI in [regional newsrooms](#) will likely lead to the first major scandals involving [AI-generated disinformation](#) during the next parliamentary cycle. Croatia's diplomatic push in [NATO](#) regarding Serbian hypersonic missiles will likely lead to a new [deployment of missile defense](#) systems along the Sava and Danube rivers.

Long Term (1-5 Years): Serbia's "stalled" EU progress—as noted in the [Picul-drafted report](#)—suggests a multi-year decoupling where Serbia remains in the ["second class" of membership](#) or moves toward a permanent [non-aligned status](#). The green energy transition in Europe, specifically [fusion research \(W7X\)](#) and Finnish [nuclear waste solutions \(Onkalo\)](#), will emerge as the only viable path to [energy independence](#) as Middle Eastern and Russian supply lines remain volatile.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- NATO should establish a [crisis communication channel](#) with Belgrade to monitor the operational status and intent behind newly acquired [hypersonic assets](#).
- The EU must clarify the [financial consequences](#) of the "stalled" progress, specifically regarding [Growth Plan funds](#) for BiH and Serbia, to provide a tangible [incentive for reform](#).
- Diplomatic pressure is required on Pristina to [delay or modify](#) the Law on Foreigners to prevent a [humanitarian crisis](#) in the healthcare sector.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Hedging:** Investors should anticipate a permanent [15-20% increase](#) in maritime freight costs due to the abandonment of the [Red Sea route](#).
- **Energy Exposure:** Companies reliant on natural gas for [chemical or fertilizer production](#) should prepare for [curtailed production](#) or shift toward regions with [nuclear-heavy](#) energy mixes like Finland.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Media and tech companies in the Balkans must prepare for [AI-related ethical guidelines](#) being mandated by platforms like [Google and Meta](#) to avoid search index [penalization](#).
