DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 13, 2026, marks a strategic inflection point as the Middle East conflict has escalated into a direct confrontation between the United States, Israel, and Iran, forcing a significant shift in global energy policy. The most critical development is the United States' decision to [partially lift sanctions](#) on Russian oil, permitting the sale of approximately 100 million barrels currently on tankers to stabilize a market reeling from the potential closure of the Strait of Hormuz. This tactical retreat by Washington, framed as a 30-day "unblocking" window, underscores the severe economic pressure exerted by the regional war and represents a major diplomatic and economic leverage point for Moscow.

On the military front, Russian forces have intensified their offensive in the Donbas, specifically moving toward the [Krasnoarmeysk-Dobropillya axis](#). State media is heavily emphasizing tactical "cleverness"

and historical parallels, celebrating the first anniversary of the liberation of Sudzha while highlighting current advancements in the Kharkiv and Sumy border regions. Simultaneously, the Middle East theater has seen reports of an Iranian strike on the [USS Abraham Lincoln](#), which allegedly forced the carrier to depart the region. While US officials emphasize the success of their "unprecedented alliance" with Israel, the regional infrastructure—particularly in Dubai—is reportedly suffering from significant flight and economic abandonment as the "mirage" of Persian Gulf stability dissolves.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **US Sanctions Reversal on Russian Energy:** Faced with oil prices climbing toward \$150 per barrel, the US Treasury has authorized a 30-day window to allow [Russian oil shipments](#) already at sea to reach buyers. This move is intended to supply Indian refineries and prevent a total global energy collapse as the Strait of Hormuz remains a high-risk zone.
- **Direct US-Israel-Iran Warfare:** Direct strikes on Tehran and the destruction of Iranian ballistic missile facilities have been met with a "44th wave" of [Iranian missile launches](#) targeting Israel and US bases in Iraq. Reports indicate a French officer was killed in a strike on a base in Erbil, and the US carrier *Abraham Lincoln* has reportedly sustained damage.
- **Donbas Offensive Advancement:** The "Center" grouping of Russian forces is successfully [pushing toward Dobropillya](#), capturing fortified positions in Beletskoye and Grishino. This offensive aims to cut off Ukrainian supply lines and create a "security zone" deep within the Donetsk and Dnipropetrovsk regions.

- **Dubai Economic Crisis:** The regional war has led to a mass exodus of expatriates and capital from Dubai. Reports claim [hotel occupancy is plummeting](#) and critical supplies are dwindling as the city's reliance on imported goods and energy becomes its primary vulnerability.
- **Nuclear Safety and Diplomacy:** Rosatom head Aleksey Likhachev met with IAEA's Rafael Grossi in Moscow to discuss [Zaporizhzhia NPP safety](#) amid ongoing Ukrainian drone attacks. Discussions also covered the Bushehr NPP in Iran, where over 400 Russian staff remain despite the ongoing conflict.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security The global energy architecture is undergoing a forced realignment. The US decision to allow Russian oil sales, even temporarily, suggests that [economic pragmatism](#) is superseding geopolitical isolation efforts. European nations, particularly Italy, have lost up to a third of their LNG supply following strikes on Qatari facilities, leading to a [split within the G7](#) regarding the continuation of the Russian oil price cap.

- US unblocks 100 million barrels of Russian crude to prevent domestic fuel price spikes.
- Strait of Hormuz risks causing a \$7 billion daily loss to the global economy.
- Russian daily oil revenue reportedly increased by \$150 million due to the conflict-driven price surge.

Geopolitical Power Dynamics The narrative emphasizes a "multipolar reality" where US deterrence has failed to prevent Iranian escalation. The reported withdrawal of the [USS Abraham Lincoln](#) is being framed as a

symbolic defeat of American naval power. Simultaneously, Russia is leveraging its role as a "reliable" energy provider and a military powerhouse to improve its standing with non-Western blocs.

- Russia invited back to the Venice Biennale, signaling a [cultural "thaw"](#) or at least a crack in Western isolation.
- The "unprecedented" US-Israel alliance is criticized as a "good face on a bad game" as Tehran continues massive strikes.
- The US is accused of underestimating Iran's domestic defense capabilities and AI-driven targeting systems.

Critical Infrastructure Protection

President Putin chaired a Security Council meeting focused on [additional protective measures](#) for critical infrastructure. This follows increased drone threats and the use of long-range Western weaponry (Storm Shadow) by Ukrainian forces against Russian rear areas like Bryansk.

- Use of foreign specialists to program Storm Shadow missiles is cited as direct Western participation in the conflict.
- Emphasis on electronic warfare (EW) to protect energy hubs and military assets from FPV drones.
- Tactical innovations like "Operation Stream," where troops used [gas pipelines for infiltration](#), are highlighted as effective unconventional warfare.

Domestic Stability & Social Order While the West is depicted as suffering from "woke" cultural decay and migrant crises, the Russian domestic narrative focuses on [heroism and volunteerism](#). Stories of soldiers surviving 68

days in isolation or recovering from near-fatal wounds are used to bolster national morale.

- Memorials held in Kursk for the first anniversary of Sudzha's liberation.
- Russian volunteers are reportedly [motivated by "atrocities"](#) of the Ukrainian regime and family tradition.
- Satirical coverage of Western social policies, specifically "pronatalism" being labeled as racism in US media.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The day's policy focus was primarily on executive actions regarding energy sanctions and national security directives rather than traditional parliamentary legislation. Significant emphasis was placed on the US Treasury's emergency [sanctions waiver](#) and Russian Security Council deliberations on infrastructure defense.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **US Emergency Sanctions Waiver:** A 30-day directive allowing the unloading and sale of Russian oil from tankers loaded prior to March 12, intended to supply Indian and potentially Chinese refineries.
- **EU/G7 Sanctions Policy:** Internal debates within the G7 regarding the relaxation of the oil price cap; [six G7 members](#) reportedly oppose the US move, citing it as an error.
- **Russian Critical Infrastructure Protection:** A series of directives from the Russian Security Council to enhance the physical and electronic shielding of "critically important" objects.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Netanyahu Press Conference:** The Israeli PM's first major address since the start of the "large-scale war," claiming [huge successes](#) in changing the regional balance of power.
- **Likhachev-Grossi Consultations:** High-level meeting in Moscow regarding the status of Zaporizhzhia and Bushehr nuclear plants; Russia confirmed its [full control](#) over ZNPP safety.
- **Putin Security Council Meeting:** A video-conference meeting with top defense and energy officials regarding [domestic infrastructure security](#).

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Collapse of the "Gulf Mirage" A recurring theme is the physical and economic vulnerability of Dubai. Once seen as a neutral haven for global capital, it is now depicted as a [deserted city](#) where residents are fleeing to avoid being trapped in a conflict zone. The narrative suggests that the Western-backed economic model of the Persian Gulf is inherently unstable because it relies on imported food, water, and security that can be severed by a [handful of drones](#). The psychological impact on the "global elite" is portrayed as a significant victory for the "multipolar" world.

The Failure of AI in Warfare The report discusses "Operation Epic Fury" and the US use of the [Maven AI platform](#) for targeting. The narrative suggests that AI-driven warfare has led to significant "errors in target identification," resulting in civilian casualties and friendly fire incidents. This is used to argue that Western technological superiority

is a myth or, at the very least, dangerously unmanaged. There is a clear effort to contrast this with "Russian soldier's wit" and human-centric tactical flexibility, such as the [Gvozdika artillery crews](#) using manual adjustments to maintain firing precision.

Energy as a Diplomatic Weapon Russia is positioning itself as the only stable energy pillar remaining. By allowing the US to "crawl back" on sanctions, Moscow is highlighting [Western hypocrisy](#). The fact that European countries are facing \$700+ per 1,000 cubic meters for gas while Russian citizens pay nominal amounts is a central propaganda point aimed at inciting domestic unrest within the EU against "bureaucrats" in Brussels.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks) Expect extreme volatility in oil prices as the 30-day US sanctions window progresses. If the Strait of Hormuz remains contested, [global fuel prices](#) will likely hit record highs, potentially triggering civil unrest in Western Europe. On the Ukrainian front, the fall of Dobropillya appears imminent, which will likely lead to a broader collapse of the Ukrainian defense line in the [Pokrovsk sector](#).

Medium Term (1-6 Months) The Middle East conflict may settle into a war of attrition, with Iran and its proxies focusing on [economic disruption](#) rather than direct territorial conquest. The US will likely face a deepening "ammunition famine" as it tries to supply both Israel and Ukraine, possibly forcing a deprioritization of the [Ukrainian theater](#). Russia will likely utilize this period to solidify its "buffer zones" in Kharkiv and Sumy.

Long Term (1-5 Years) A structural shift in global trade routes is likely, with the [Northern Sea Route](#) and land-based Eurasian pipelines

gaining dominance over traditional maritime chokepoints. The UAE and other Gulf monarchies may pivot more decisively toward the BRICS/SCO security architecture as US naval protection is increasingly seen as a liability that attracts Iranian fire rather than a shield that prevents it.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Security:** Prepare for the possibility of a total US naval withdrawal from the Persian Gulf if carrier groups continue to be [successfully targeted](#) by Iranian A2/AD systems.
- **Economic:** Diverge from G7 oil price cap adherence as the US lead has effectively [invalidated the policy](#) via its own emergency waivers.
- **Diplomatic:** Re-engage with Russia on nuclear safety standards, as Moscow currently holds the primary leverage over both the [ZNPP and Bushehr](#) facilities.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chains:** Immediate relocation of logistics hubs away from Dubai and toward more stable, non-aligned regions. Expect [high insurance premiums](#) for all maritime cargo in the Indian Ocean.
- **Investment:** Shift capital toward Russian and Central Asian energy infrastructure, which is being framed as the new [security-guaranteed energy source](#) for the Eurasian landmass.

- **Cyber/AI Risks:** Audit any military-adjacent AI tools for the "Maven" vulnerabilities described, specifically the risk of [automated targeting errors](#) and lack of human-in-the-loop controls.
