

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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 14, 2026, marks the fifteenth day of "Operation Epic Fury," a massive military offensive by the United States and Israel against the Islamic Republic of Iran. The day was defined by a significant strategic escalation: a massive US aerial assault on [Kharg Island](#), the terminal responsible for over 90% of Iran's crude oil exports. While US President Donald Trump claimed military infrastructure was the sole target, he explicitly leveraged the threat of destroying Iran's oil industry to force the reopening of the Strait of Hormuz. This "moral" restraint appears increasingly fragile as global oil prices surge toward \$120 per barrel and shipping insurance in the Persian Gulf becomes unobtainable.

Domestically, Iran remains under a near-total [internet blackout](#), with traffic at less than 1% of the national average. This information vacuum has been weaponized by the state to

facilitate a "Wikipedia propaganda war" and a crackdown on dissent, characterized by the arrest of dozens of "monarchists" and "agents of foreign powers." Meanwhile, the vacuum created by the death of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei on February 28 is being filled by his son, [Mojtaba Khamenei](#). However, Mojtaba's status remains ambiguous—reports suggest he may have been wounded in the same strike that killed his father—and he has yet to make a public appearance, leading to a "ghost leadership" scenario where the IRGC manages the war effort in his name.

The conflict has fully regionalized, with nine countries now under fire. Iran and its proxies have retaliated by striking [US bases in Saudi Arabia](#), Iraq, and Bahrain, while also targeting economic hubs like the Fujairah port in the UAE. Israel is simultaneously intensifying its front in Lebanon, signaling a potential ground invasion to push Hezbollah north of the Litani River. The convergence of these events suggests a move away from targeted decapitation strikes toward a war of economic attrition that threatens the structural stability of the global energy market and the internal social order of the entire Middle East.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

The Assault on Kharg Island and Energy Brinkmanship The US military conducted what it termed one of the most powerful air strikes in history on [Kharg Island](#), destroying military installations while intentionally sparing oil infrastructure.

- US Central Command (CENTCOM) reported hitting [90 military targets](#), including naval bases and missile silos, to degrade Iran's ability to mine the Strait of Hormuz.

- Trump frames the sparing of oil facilities as a "moral decision," but analysts note it serves as a [last-resort lever](#) to prevent a global \$200/barrel oil shock.
- Iran has retaliated with threats to turn the region's energy infrastructure into a ["pile of ash,"](#) specifically naming US-affiliated companies in the UAE and Saudi Arabia as targets.

Succession and the Rise of Mojtaba Khamenei The Islamic Republic has officially named Mojtaba Khamenei as the third Supreme Leader, though the process and his physical condition remain [shrouded in secrecy](#).

- Analysis suggests the IRGC "selected" Mojtaba as the [most viable option](#) to ensure continuity of their economic and security interests.
- Skepticism persists regarding Mojtaba's religious credentials and his [lack of public presence](#), raising the possibility of a military junta ruling through a symbolic figurehead.
- Dissident voices within the establishment, like Hassan Rouhani, have issued statements hinting at internal [fragmentation and alarm](#) over the state of the nation.

Regional Retaliation and the "Gates of Hell" Iran's "asymmetric warfare" strategy has drawn [nine neighboring countries](#) into the line of fire.

- RETALIATION: Five US tanker aircraft were damaged at [Prince Sultan Air Base](#) in Saudi Arabia, and the US Embassy in Baghdad was hit by rocket fire.

- UAE TARGETED: The Fujairah port's operations were disrupted by [drone strikes](#), and Iran warned UAE residents to evacuate port areas near US "hideouts."
- QATAR/BAHRAIN: Drones have been intercepted over Dubai and Doha, leading Qatar to evacuate areas near [US-linked economic sites](#).

Internal State of Emergency and Suppression Iranian security forces have shifted to a "war footing" domestically to prevent a resurgence of the "Woman, Life, Freedom" movement.

- MASS ARRESTS: At least [56 individuals](#) were arrested for alleged "monarchist" ties and possession of weapons, intended to signal zero tolerance for internal revolt.
- URBAN CONTROL: Cities like Tehran are under de facto [martial law](#), with checkpoints moved into tunnels (e.g., Hakim Tunnel) to avoid Israeli drone strikes.
- ECONOMIC PARALYSIS: Banking services are failing, and the internet blackout has destroyed the [digital economy](#), leaving many unable to afford the costs of fleeing urban centers.

Destruction of Cultural Heritage Aerial bombardments have resulted in collateral damage to some of the world's most significant cultural sites.

- SITES DAMAGED: The Ministry of Cultural Heritage reports that [56 museums and historical buildings](#) have been damaged, including the Chehel Sotoun in Isfahan and the UNESCO-listed Golestan Palace in Tehran.

- **ISRAELI RESPONSE:** Former Israeli PM Yair Lapid claimed Israel has ["no war with Iranian history."](#) though military necessity continues to drive strikes near urban historical cores.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Succession & Stability: The Mojtaba Mandate The elevation of Mojtaba Khamenei represents a critical test of state capacity. The IRGC appears to have [bypassed traditional clerical consensus](#) to install a leader who is deeply tied to the security apparatus. This move signals a definitive shift toward a praetorian state where religious legitimacy is secondary to military loyalty. However, the lack of a "coronation" or public speech suggests the regime is currently [ruling from a bunker](#), a strategy that may alienate the 7-8% of the population that forms its core ideological base.

Technology Policy & Digital Sovereignty: The Information Iron Curtain The state's maintenance of a 15-day internet blackout is a record-breaking exercise in digital sovereignty. By severing the global internet while maintaining the [National Information Network](#), the regime is attempting to force citizens into state-controlled digital channels. Simultaneously, a coordinated campaign on [Wikipedia](#)—uploading over 10,000 state-approved images—aims to poison the data sets used by global AI models like ChatGPT and Gemini, ensuring that the regime's narrative persists even outside Iran's borders.

Energy Security: The Hormuz Bottleneck The blockade of the Strait of Hormuz, through which 20-25% of global oil passes, has created an economic nightmare for the West. Trump's request for [China, France, and Japan](#) to send their own navies to escort tankers suggests

that the US Navy's capacity is overstretched. The strategic ambiguity regarding whether the US will [seize Kharg Island](#) or other Gulf islands (Abu Musa, the Tunbs) is the primary driver of current market volatility.

Geopolitical Power Dynamics: The Russia-China Pivot The war is perversely benefiting Russia, as the US has been forced to [relax sanctions on Moscow](#) to bring Russian oil into the market to offset Persian Gulf losses. China, meanwhile, remains Iran's primary customer, and reports suggest Iran is demanding [payment in Yuan](#) for any tankers it allows to pass Hormuz, a move that directly challenges the US dollar's status as the global energy currency.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Given the wartime state of emergency, traditional legislative activity in Iran has been suspended in favor of decrees from the [Khatam al-Anbiya Central Headquarters](#) and the Judiciary.

- **Decree on Asset Seizure:** The Iranian Judiciary announced a policy to [confiscate the assets](#) of "rioters" and protesters to fund the compensation of war victims. This effectively uses "lawfare" to paralyze domestic opposition.
- **Martial Law Enforcement:** New directives issued by the IRGC Intelligence Department threaten citizens who "accompany the enemy" with [punishments including death](#).

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS

- **Trump's "Truth Social" Briefings:** The US President continues to bypass traditional press pools, using social media to announce the [destruction of Kharg military targets](#) and to call for an international coalition to reopen Hormuz.
- **UN Secretary-General in Beirut:** Antonio Guterres called for an [immediate ceasefire](#) and warned that Lebanon cannot become "another Gaza," though he admitted the UN lacks enforcement power in this conflict.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The "Sunwarization" of Iranian Military Doctrine Analysts note that the current Iranian leadership is operating under a "[Yahya Sinwar logic](#)," believing that a protracted, destructive war ultimately weakens the US and Israel more than it hurts the regime's long-term survival. This doctrine prioritizes the "resistance" narrative over national reconstruction, accepting the [total destruction of Iran's economy](#) as a necessary price for forcing a US withdrawal from the Middle East. This is a departure from previous "pragmatic" cycles of "Heroic Flexibility."

Moral Hazards and the Weaponization of Ethics A recurring theme is the rhetorical use of "morality" by both sides. Trump claims he hasn't hit oil for "[moral and human reasons](#)," while Iran claims its regional strikes are "moral obligations" to avenge Khamenei. Skepticism is warranted: both narratives serve to justify escalations while [shifting blame](#) for civilian suffering onto the opponent. This "ethics of responsibility" vs. "ethics of conviction" is being debated by philosophers in the context of the [tragedy of January's protest crackdowns](#).

The Kurdish Wildcard Armed Kurdish groups (Pajak, Komala) are [massing on the borders](#) in Iraqi Kurdistan. While they deny receiving direct CIA support, their readiness to enter the fray suggests that the regime's control over its western provinces is nearing a breaking point. The regime's [bombing of refugee camps](#) in Arbil indicates they view this ethnic-militant convergence as a primary existential threat alongside the US air campaign.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect an intensified [regional drone war](#) targeting UAE and Qatari energy hubs if the US attempts to move ground troops toward Kharg or the Three Islands.
- Internal unrest in Iran may reach a boiling point as the [Nowruz \(New Year\) holiday](#) approaches amidst starvation, inflation, and a lack of banking services.
- Israel is likely to launch a [limited ground incursion](#) into Southern Lebanon to establish a buffer zone.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- The US [midterm elections](#) will exert immense pressure on Trump to resolve the conflict or "finish the job" before domestic gas prices trigger a political collapse for the Republican party.
- If Mojtaba Khamenei remains hidden, expect [factional infighting](#) between IRGC traditionalists and "technocratic" survivors who may seek a back-channel deal through Oman or Switzerland.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- The destruction of 90% of Iran's export capacity would necessitate a [30-year recovery period](#) for the Iranian economy, likely leading to a permanent state of underdevelopment or total dependency on Chinese infrastructure investment.
- A structural shift in energy transit may occur, with the [East-West pipeline](#) in Saudi Arabia and the Fujairah bypass becoming the permanent primary routes for global oil, bypassing the Strait of Hormuz entirely.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy

- Coalition management: The US must move beyond social media diplomacy to formalize an [escort coalition](#) that includes Asian powers (China, India) whose energy security is most at risk.
- Humanitarian corridors: Pressure is needed to establish [aid routes](#) for medicine and baby formula, as strikes on industrial parks (e.g., Hamadan) have already paralyzed local pharmaceutical supplies.
- Succession vetting: Intelligence agencies should prioritize confirming the [viability of Mojtaba Khamenei](#) to determine if there is a centralized authority capable of signing a surrender or ceasefire.

For Private Sector/Investors

- Energy diversification: Investors should anticipate [sustained oil prices above \\$100](#) and look to non-Gulf producers, as the "gates of hell" threat to Aramco and QatarEnergy remains a 7/10 risk.

- Cyber/Digital Risk: Companies operating in the Middle East should brace for increased [state-sponsored "jamming"](#) and digital disruption as Iran attempts to export its internet blackout tactics to neighboring states.
- Supply Chain Fragility: Beyond energy, the Gulf blockade threatens [nitrogen fertilizer and aluminum](#) supplies; industrial sectors should seek alternative sources in the Americas or Africa immediately.
