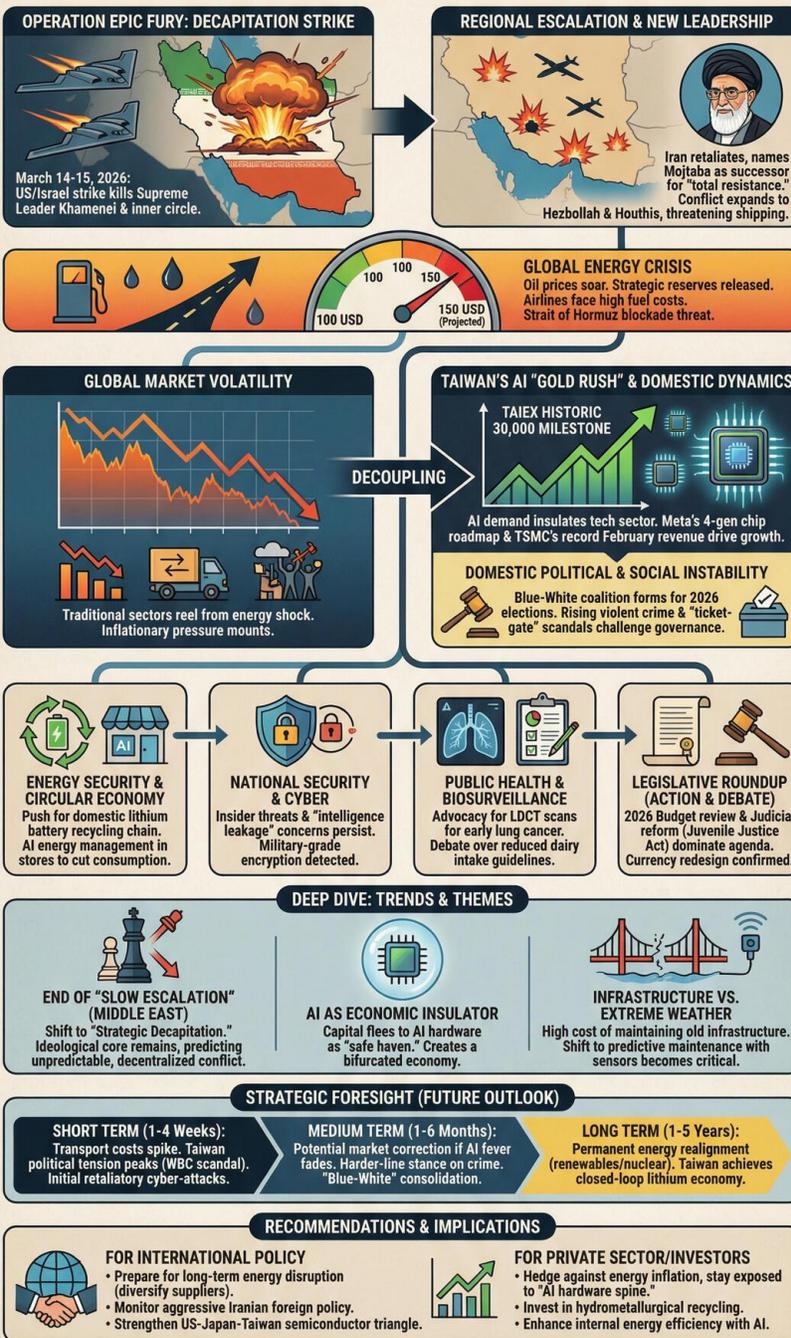

## GLOBAL SHOCK: MIDDLE EAST WAR & TAIWAN'S AI BOOM (A DUAL NARRATIVE)

Operation Epic Fury Assassination Triggers Protracted Conflict as Energy Markets Reel and Taiwan's Tech Sector Surges Amidst Domestic Instability.



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THE MIDDLE EAST DESCENDS INTO A PROTRACTED WAR FOLLOWING THE ASSASSINATION OF IRAN'S SUPREME LEADER AS GLOBAL ENERGY MARKETS FACE A HISTORIC SUPPLY SHOCK.

## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 14-15, 2026, marks a watershed moment in global geopolitics as the "Operation Epic Fury" joint military action by the United States and Israel has fundamentally altered the Middle East power structure. The reported [death of Supreme Leader Khamenei](#) and several high-ranking Iranian officials in a massive localized bombing campaign has triggered immediate and violent retaliation against U.S. and allied assets across the Persian Gulf. This escalation has moved beyond a targeted strike into a [protracted war](#) scenario, with Iran's leadership quickly transitioning to Mojtaba Khamenei, who has signaled a policy of total resistance and asymmetric warfare against Western interests.

The economic fallout is immediate and severe, with global oil prices surging toward [150 USD per barrel](#) amid threats of a total blockade of

the Strait of Hormuz. In Taiwan, this external volatility contrasts with a domestic "AI gold rush" as the TAIEX reaches a historic [30,000-point milestone](#), driven by insatiable demand for advanced semiconductors and Meta's aggressive new [four-generation AI chip roadmap](#). However, the Taiwanese government is simultaneously grappling with rising domestic instability, including a surge in violent crime and a contentious political atmosphere ahead of the 2026 local elections, where "Blue-White" coalition dynamics are being tested by scandals involving top leadership travel and legislative priorities.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Total War in the Middle East and Iranian Leadership Transition**
  - The U.S. and Israel launched a massive aerial offensive, utilizing F-35I and B-2 stealth bombers to strike over [1,200 targets](#) in a single day, reportedly killing the Iranian Supreme Leader and his inner circle.
  - Iran has retaliated with drone and missile strikes on U.S. bases in Saudi Arabia and the UAE, while naming [Mojtaba Khamenei](#) as the new Supreme Leader to maintain regime continuity.
  - The conflict has expanded to involve Hezbollah in Lebanon and Houthi rebels in Yemen, creating a multi-front regional war that [threatens global shipping](#) and energy infrastructure.

## • Global Energy Crisis and Market Volatility

- Oil prices have breached the 100 USD mark and are projected to hit [150 USD](#) if the Strait of Hormuz remains contested or blocked.
- U.S. and European nations have begun releasing [strategic petroleum reserves](#) to mitigate the impact of Iranian strikes on major refineries like those in the UAE.
- Airlines globally are preparing to [increase fuel surcharges](#), with some low-cost carriers facing potential insolvency if high fuel costs persist.

## • The AI Infrastructure Super-Cycle

- Meta has announced a roadmap to produce [four generations of AI chips](#) by 2027, deepening its reliance on TSMC's advanced nodes.
- TSMC reported its [strongest February revenue](#) in history (317.6 billion TWD) despite fewer working days, signaling that AI demand is decoupling from broader economic trends.
- OpenAI's potential IPO is being viewed by analysts as a [pivotal moment](#) for the industry's long-term capital structure and valuation sustainability.

## • Taiwanese Domestic Political Realignment

- The KMT and TPP are intensifying cooperation for the 2026 elections, focusing on joint policy platforms in [AI governance and justice reform](#).
- Premier Cho Jung-tai faces criticism over his trip to Japan for the World Baseball Classic (WBC), with opposition parties alleging [abuse of power](#) regarding ticket procurement.
- President Lai is considering an [official visit to Eswatini](#) in April to solidify diplomatic ties amid shifting global alliances.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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**Energy Security and the Circular Economy** Industry leaders are calling for the establishment of a [domestic lithium battery recycling chain](#) to prevent "black powder" (valuable battery minerals) from being exported. Currently, 90% of Taiwan's battery waste is processed overseas, which is viewed as a [loss of critical resources](#) during a time of global supply chain instability.

- The government is urged to provide incentives for [legal recycling operators](#) over the next five years to secure local supplies of lithium, cobalt, and nickel.
- AI-driven [energy management systems](#) are being deployed in over 3,000 convenience stores to reduce electricity consumption by 10-15% without hardware upgrades.

**National Security and Cybersecurity** The detection of [military-grade encryption](#) or "intelligence leakage" concerns has surfaced regarding a former National Security Bureau (NSB) staff member who sought employment in China. This underscores the persistent

threat of [insider threats](#) to Taiwan's sensitive intelligence infrastructure.

**Public Health and Biosurveillance** Medical experts are advocating for the expanded use of [Low-Dose CT \(LDCT\) scans](#) for early lung cancer detection, noting that traditional X-rays are insufficient for early-stage diagnosis. Concurrently, the government is revising dietary guidelines, suggesting a [reduction in daily dairy intake](#) to one cup, sparking debate over calcium deficiency in the general population.

**Domestic Stability and Social Order** Taiwan is experiencing a notable spike in [violent crime](#), including random machete attacks, fraud-related kidnappings in Pingtung and Taipei, and high-speed illegal racing. There is a growing legislative movement to [reform the Juvenile Justice Act](#) following high-profile incidents involving minors, with protesters demanding stricter penalties to prevent future tragedies.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative activity this week has been dominated by the 2026 budget review and urgent calls for judicial reform in response to rising crime and public safety concerns. Opposition parties are leveraging these issues to pressure the ruling administration on "law and order" platforms ahead of local elections.

### BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **2026 General Budget:** Opposition parties have criticized the administration for "freezing" the budget in committee and have demanded a [comprehensive review](#) of defense and social spending.

- **Juvenile Justice Act Amendments:** Cross-party support is forming to [prioritize amendments](#) that increase accountability for juvenile offenders and their guardians following a fatal school stabbing incident.
- **Currency Redesign Policy:** The Central Bank has confirmed a [comprehensive redesign](#) of New Taiwan Dollar banknotes for 2025-2026, aimed at enhancing anti-counterfeiting features and reflecting modern Taiwanese identity.

## HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Blue-White Joint Policy Presser:** KMT and TPP representatives announced [four major collaborative areas](#), including AI governance and digital sovereignty, signaling a unified front against the DPP.
- **Foreign Ministry Briefing:** Foreign Minister Lin Chia-lung confirmed that Taiwan has received an [invitation from Eswatini](#) and is evaluating a presidential visit to the African ally.
- **Health Ministry Guideline Release:** Officials defended new [nutritional draft guidelines](#) amid public skepticism regarding reduced milk consumption recommendations.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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**The End of "Slow Escalation" in the Middle East** For decades, Middle Eastern conflicts were characterized by proxy battles and "calibrated" responses. The March 14 strikes represent a shift to ["Strategic Decapitation,"](#) where the U.S. and Israel have opted for direct, high-level eliminations. The immediate naming of a successor suggests that while the Iranian leadership was physically devastated, its [institutional](#)

[ideological core](#) remains intact, likely leading to a more unpredictable and decentralized phase of the conflict.

**AI as an Economic Insulator** Taiwan's financial markets are demonstrating a unique decoupling. While global markets are reeling from oil shocks, the TAIEX is [surging to 30,000](#) because of the perceived inevitability of the AI transition. The trend shows that capital is fleeing traditional sectors vulnerable to energy costs and [flowing into AI hardware](#) (TSMC, Meta, and cooling systems) as a "safe haven" for growth, creating a "bifurcated economy" where tech thrives while traditional services and transport struggle with inflation.

**Infrastructure Resilience vs. Extreme Weather** The successful [restoration of the Pingxi Line](#) after 100 days of repair highlights a critical trend: the increasing cost of maintaining 20th-century infrastructure in an era of 21st-century "extreme weather." With [1,000mm of rain](#) falling in just three days, the government is moving toward automated monitoring systems (slope sensors and "smart" hydration monitors) to predict failures, signaling a shift from reactive to [predictive maintenance](#) as a survival necessity.

## **STRATEGIC FORESIGHT**

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect a [sharp increase](#) in transportation and logistics costs as airlines and shipping companies adjust to the Persian Gulf instability. Domestic political tension in Taiwan will peak as the WBC "ticket-gate" controversy is used as a proxy for larger [governance critiques](#). We may see initial retaliatory cyber-attacks from Iranian-aligned groups targeting Western and allied financial or energy nodes.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The Taiwan stock market may face a [corrective phase](#) if the high-tech "AI fever" cannot offset the broader inflationary pressure of 150 USD oil. Legislative progress on the [Juvenile Justice Act](#) will likely result in a harder-line stance on crime, influencing the 2026 local election manifestos. The "Blue-White" coalition will likely consolidate around [joint candidates](#) for key mayoral races in Taipei and New Taipei City.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** The Middle East war will likely lead to a permanent [realignment of energy routes](#), accelerating the global transition to renewable and nuclear power as "energy sovereignty" becomes synonymous with national security. Taiwan will likely achieve a [closed-loop lithium economy](#) as the 2026-2030 battery recycling targets are met, reducing its reliance on imported minerals for its burgeoning EV and electronics sectors.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS**

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### **For International Policy:**

- Governments should prepare for a [long-term disruption](#) of Persian Gulf energy supplies and prioritize diplomatic engagement with alternative suppliers in Southeast Asia and the Americas.
- The transition to [Mojtaba Khamenei's](#) leadership suggests a more aggressive Iranian foreign policy; intelligence agencies must monitor for increased proxy activity in non-traditional theaters.
- Strengthening the [U.S.-Japan-Taiwan semiconductor triangle](#) is critical to ensuring that AI hardware production remains insulated from kinetic conflicts in the Middle East.

## For Private Sector/Investors:

- Investors should hedge against [persistent energy inflation](#) while maintaining exposure to the "AI hardware spine" (Foundries and specialized chip designers like Meta's internal teams).
- The circular economy in Taiwan presents a [high-growth opportunity](#) for firms specializing in hydrometallurgical recycling and mineral recovery as local supply chains tighten.
- Companies operating in Taiwan must enhance [internal energy efficiency](#) using AI management tools to remain competitive as electricity costs are inevitably adjusted upward due to global fuel price spikes.
