## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 15, 2026, marks a critical juncture in global and regional stability as the conflict between Iran and the United States/Israel enters its third week. Iran has intensified its "Operation True Promise 4," launching its 54th wave of strikes utilizing advanced solid-fuel Sejil missiles and precision drones against U.S. and Israeli assets across the Middle East. The conflict has transitioned into a high-stakes asymmetric war, with Iran targeting critical U.S. infrastructure in Saudi Arabia, Iraq, and Kuwait in retaliation for U.S. strikes on Kharg Island, Iran's primary oil export hub. The appointment of new leadership in Iran signals a strategic shift from defensive posturing to an aggressive offensive doctrine, complicating the Trump administration's efforts to find a diplomatic or military exit strategy.

In Indonesia, the domestic narrative is dominated by the onset of the 2026 "Mudik"

(Eid al-Fitr migration), one of the largest annual human movements globally. While the government manages massive logistical pressures at transit hubs like Pasar Senen and the Port of Ciwandan, it is simultaneously embroiled in significant governance crises. The Corruption Eradication Commission (KPK) has detained the Regent of Cilacap for extortion related to holiday allowances (THR), while former Minister of Religious Affairs Yaqut Cholil Qoumas remains a central figure in a Hajj quota corruption scandal. Furthermore, an acid attack on a high-profile KontraS activist has raised alarms regarding the safety of democratic dissent and the rule of law in Indonesia.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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### Iran-US Conflict and "Operation True Promise 4"

- The Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) launched its [54th wave of strikes](#), marking the first operational use of solid-fuel Sejil strategic missiles.
- Iranian intelligence forces claimed the [capture of Mossad agents](#) and neutralized terrorist networks allegedly allied with Zionist interests across several provinces.
- The "Axis of Resistance," including militias in Iraq, Lebanon, and Yemen, has expanded its operations, [targeting U.S. bases](#) in Erbil (Iraq), Jordan, and Kuwait.
- In Lebanon, Israeli strikes have resulted in over [800 fatalities](#), including 106 children, as infrastructure in Beirut continues to be targeted.

## US Military and Strategic Response

- The United States is deploying [2,500 Marines](#) and three warships, including the amphibious assault ship USS Tripoli, to the Middle East for large-scale operations.
- President Trump has ordered the U.S. Navy to [escort oil tankers](#) through the Strait of Hormuz to secure global energy supplies following the strike on Iran's Kharg Island.
- U.S. strikes on [Kharg Island](#) have reportedly disabled 90% of Iran's crude oil export capacity, a move intended to cripple Iran's economy but risking global price spikes.

## Indonesian National "Mudik" Logistics

- Over [875,000 vehicles](#) have already left Jakarta as the peak of the 2026 Eid migration begins, with officials predicting a total of 3.5 million vehicles.
- State railway PT KAI reported that [700,000 tickets](#) have been sold, with major stations like Pasar Senen operating at high capacity.
- In Bali, a [45-kilometer traffic jam](#) was reported leading to the Port of Gilimanuk as travelers attempt to cross to Java.
- The West Java government has provided [1.4 million IDR compensation](#) to thousands of horse-cart (delman) and pedicab drivers to keep them off main mudik routes to reduce congestion.

## Governance and Corruption Scandals

- The KPK arrested the [Regent of Cilacap](#), Syamsul Aulia Rahman, for allegedly extorting subordinates to fund holiday bonuses for local officials.

- Former Minister of Religion [Yaqut Cholil Qoumas](#) is under investigation for his "central role" in a Hajj quota corruption case, despite his denials of financial gain.
- The National Police Chief has ordered a [professional investigation](#) into the acid attack on activist Andri Yunus, utilizing "scientific crime investigation" techniques.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### Succession and Stability

- Iran has officially appointed [Mostaba Hamenei](#) as the third Supreme Leader of the Islamic Revolution, following a vote by the Assembly of Experts. This transition occurs during a state of war, suggesting a consolidation of hardline power.
- The new leadership has immediately [ordered an escalation](#) of strikes against Israel, signaling a shift toward a more aggressive, offensive military strategy.

### Energy Security

- Minister of Energy and Mineral Resources Bahlil Lahadalia met with Singapore's Energy Minister in Tokyo to finalize plans for [exporting clean electricity](#) to Singapore.
- The Indonesian government is positioning the [Batam, Bintan, and Karimun \(BBK\)](#) region as a "green industry hub" to attract global tech companies through the availability of renewable energy.
- Iran's threat to [close the Strait of Hormuz](#) remains a critical lever for energy blackmail against global markets.

## Corruption and Governance

- The use of "Holiday Allowance" (THR) extortion as a [modus operandi for corruption](#) has been highlighted by the KPK, noting that local leaders often become main actors in such schemes during the Eid season.
- KPK investigators revealed a [coded labeling system](#) used by the Cilacap administration to assign physical infrastructure projects to specific vendors in exchange for bribes.

## National Security and Civil Order

- The acid attack on Andri Yunus is characterized by Coordinating Minister Yusril Ihza Mahendra as a [direct threat to democracy](#), emphasizing that political differences must not lead to criminal violence.
- The Indonesian government has begun [repatriating citizens from Iran](#) due to the deteriorating security situation, with the first wave of students arriving in Jakarta.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Government activity is currently focused on emergency logistical management and bilateral energy agreements rather than new legislative sessions, given the upcoming Eid holiday and global conflict.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The Evolution of Asymmetric Warfare

Analysts observe that Iran is successfully implementing an asymmetric strategy that negates U.S. and Israeli conventional superiority. By [utilizing regional proxies](#) and precision drone technology, Iran has forced the U.S. into a defensive posture, defending multiple high-value bases simultaneously while incurring massive operational costs. The shift in Iranian leadership further suggests that Tehran has abandoned "strategic patience" in favor of a proactive conflict model that targets the economic interests of the West, specifically through threats to global energy shipping and oil production hubs.

### Governance Erosion During Religious Holidays

A disturbing trend in Indonesian governance is the surge in corruption and extortion linked to religious holidays. The [Cilacap and Hajj](#)

[quota cases](#) suggest that religious obligations and cultural norms (like THR) are being weaponized by elites to extract illicit funds. This systemic issue highlights a lack of effective internal oversight in local and ministerial administrations, where "political pressure" for funding often overrides the rule of law.

### **Infrastructure Under Strain: The Logistics of Migration**

The 2026 Mudik season reveals the continuing limitations of Indonesian infrastructure despite massive investment. The [extreme congestion in Bali](#) and at ferry terminals suggests that demand for mobility continues to outpace capacity. The government's reliance on "tactical" measures, such as [paying off traditional vehicle drivers](#) to clear roads, indicates that long-term structural solutions for regional transit remain incomplete.

## **STRATEGIC FORESIGHT**

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### **Short Term (1-4 Weeks)**

- Anticipate a peak in Iranian and proxy strikes on U.S. naval assets as the [2,500 Marines arrive](#) in the region, potentially leading to a direct maritime clash.
- Indonesia will face its highest logistical test on [March 17-18](#) as the second wave of Mudik travelers hits the roads, likely causing severe delays at Cikampek and Merak.
- Expect social unrest or protests if the [investigation into the acid attack](#) on activist Andri Yunus fails to produce suspects quickly, as civil society groups view this as a litmus test for the current administration.

### **Medium Term (1-6 Months)**

- Global energy prices are likely to remain volatile and elevated as [90% of Iran's oil export capacity](#) remains offline due to U.S. strikes.
- Indonesia's push for [green energy exports](#) to Singapore will enter its technical finalization phase, which could trigger a wave of foreign direct investment into Batam and Bintan.
- The political vacuum in Iran following the leadership transition will likely result in a "purge" of moderate elements, solidifying a hardline military government.

### **Long Term (1-5 Years)**

- The Middle East may see a permanent [restructuring of alliances](#) if the U.S. fails to decisively conclude the current conflict, potentially leading to a larger regional hegemony for Iran's "Axis of Resistance."
- Indonesia's "Green Hub" strategy for the BBK region could fundamentally [shift its industrial base](#) away from commodities toward high-tech, energy-efficient manufacturing.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS**

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### **For International Policy:**

- Diplomatic channels should prioritize the [safety and repatriation of foreign nationals](#) in Iran and Lebanon as conflict zones expand.
- Global maritime security must be reinforced through international coalitions to counter [Iranian drone and missile threats](#) in the Strait of Hormuz and the Red Sea.

- International monitoring of the Indonesian activist attack case is necessary to ensure [democratic safeguards](#) are maintained in the Southeast Asian region.

#### **For Private Sector/Investors:**

- Investors in Southeast Asian tech should monitor the [Indonesian green energy sector](#) for opportunities in Batam, Bintan, and Karimun.
- Supply chain managers must prepare for [prolonged oil price volatility](#) and potential disruptions to Middle Eastern logistics routes.
- Compliance and risk officers in Indonesia should increase scrutiny of [local government procurement](#) and vendor relationships in light of the Cilacap corruption revelations.
