



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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 16, 2026, marks the seventeenth day of the escalating war between the United States and Israel against Iran, a conflict that has now fundamentally reshaped global energy security and diplomatic norms. The military campaign has expanded with [limited ground operations](#) in southern Lebanon and thousands of air strikes targeting Iran's missile infrastructure. However, the strategic centerpiece of the day is the continued closure of the Strait of Hormuz by Tehran, which has trapped approximately one-fifth of the world's oil and gas supply. This blockade has driven Brent crude to [104 dollars per barrel](#), forcing major economies in Asia and Europe to begin releasing strategic reserves to prevent a full-scale industrial collapse.

Geopolitically, the Trump administration faces a crisis of coalition cohesion. Despite direct appeals for military assistance to reopen the Strait, key allies including the United

Kingdom, Germany, Japan, and South Korea have [refused to commit warships](#), fearing entanglement in a broader, undecided conflict. In the Americas, a sharp ideological divide has hardened. While the US promotes a "Shield of the Americas" security bloc with right-wing allies, Mexico continues to defy Washington by [sending humanitarian and fuel aid](#) to a blackout-stricken Cuba. This friction highlights a growing resistance to US regional hegemony, even as new far-right governments in Chile and France signal a shift toward nationalist, security-first domestic policies.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **US-Israel Military Offensive Against Iran (Day 17):**
 - The Israeli military confirmed a [limited ground deployment](#) in southern Lebanon to dismantle Hezbollah infrastructure following a massive aerial campaign.
 - US and Israeli forces have conducted over [7,600 total attacks](#) on Iranian territory, with 4,700 specifically targeting Tehran's missile programs.
 - Iran has retaliated by targeting [Gulf oil infrastructure](#), including a drone strike on a fuel depot at Dubai International Airport.

- **Global Energy Crisis and Hormuz Blockade:**

- The blockade of the Strait of Hormuz has neutralized [22 civilian vessels](#), including oil tankers and gas carriers, causing massive volatility in global markets.
- US President Donald Trump's request for a seven-nation naval coalition has been [rebuffed by major allies](#) who prefer diplomatic solutions.
- The International Energy Agency (IEA) has authorized the release of [400 million barrels](#) from strategic reserves to mitigate supply shortages in Asia and Europe.

- **Mexico-US-Cuba Diplomatic Friction:**

- President Claudia Sheinbaum reaffirmed Mexico's [sovereign right to aid Cuba](#) despite US threats of tariffs on Mexican fuel exports.
- Former President AMLO reappeared on social media to [launch a donation drive](#) for Cuba, calling the US blockade an "attempt at extermination."

- **Rise of Far-Right Governance in Latin America and Europe:**

- José Antonio Kast was inaugurated as [President of Chile](#), immediately decreeing "iron fist" migration policies and a physical border wall with Bolivia.
- In France, the far-right National Rally party saw [significant gains](#) in the first round of municipal elections, signaling a potential shift in the upcoming presidential race.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security & Critical Infrastructure

The global energy architecture is currently under its most severe stress test since 1973.

The [strike on Kharg Island](#), Iran's primary export hub, has crippled 90% of Iranian crude exports while the Hormuz blockade threatens to bankrupt dependent Asian nations. Domestic energy failures in Cuba, exacerbated by the end of Venezuelan oil shipments following the [capture of Nicolás Maduro](#), have led to a total national blackout and civil unrest.

Regional Influence & Power Projection

The Trump administration is attempting to formalize a ["Shield of the Americas"](#) security bloc to counter left-wing governments in Mexico, Brazil, and Colombia. Analysts view this as an attempt to re-establish US hegemony through a "with us or against us" military framework, though it faces stiff resistance from Mexico's ["Humanismo Mexicano"](#) model, which prioritizes regional solidarity and social investment over military alignment.

Corruption & Rule of Law In Mexico, the executive is moving to purge the [Agrarian Courts](#), noting that 19 of 51 tribunals are held by judges with expired mandates, many accused of facilitating land dispossession during the neoliberal era. Simultaneously, the Sheinbaum administration is preparing a [new electoral reform](#) (Plan B) to reduce political spending and increase the representation of Mexican migrants abroad.

International Relations & Coalition Cohesion

The US is experiencing a significant [prestige deficit](#) as its traditional partners in the EU and Asia distance themselves from the Iran war. The refusal of the UK and Germany to support the Hormuz mission suggests a fragmentation of the NATO-aligned security architecture, as nations prioritize domestic economic stability over US-led "lawfare" and military excursions.

National Security & Tactical Warfare The conflict has highlighted a technological asymmetry; the US is utilizing [multi-million dollar missiles](#) to intercept relatively inexpensive Iranian drones, a cost-benefit ratio that is unsustainable for long-term conflict. Domestically, US public opinion has soured, with [59 percent opposition](#) to the war, the highest rejection rate for a military intervention in US history.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity focused on consolidating executive power under the guise of security and fiscal austerity. In Chile, the new administration bypassed traditional parliamentary deliberation to implement sweeping security reforms. In Mexico, the focus remains on constitutional adjustments to the judiciary and electoral systems to align with the "Fourth Transformation" goals.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Mexico's Electoral Reform (Plan B):** A proposal to [reduce the number of regidores](#) and cut "excessive" spending in local congresses, scheduled for presentation on March 17.
- **Chilean Emergency Decrees:** Six immediate decrees signed by President Kast covering [security, treasury, and defense](#), including the "physical border" mandate.
- **Cuba Foreign Investment Law:** An emergency decree allowing [citizens residing abroad](#) to invest in private businesses on the island to alleviate the fuel-driven economic collapse.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **The Mañanera (President Sheinbaum):** Detailed the [Rita Cetina scholarships](#) and disability pensions, while confirming the inauguration of the Tijuana Elevated Viaduct.
- **Trump Press Conference on Hormuz:** The US President [criticized allies](#) for "not being there for us" after 40 years of US protection.
- **UN/IEA Emergency Session:** Discussion on the [modification of the Aspides mission](#) mandate to allow for offensive operations in the Gulf.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Regional Alliances

A trend is emerging where the US uses "National Security" as a pretext to enforce ideological conformity in its sphere of influence. The [threat of tariffs](#) against Mexico for aiding Cuba and the creation of the "Shield of the Americas" suggest that the Trump administration is shifting from a trade-based relationship to a command-and-control model with its neighbors. This is creating a "sovereignty backlash" among Latin American leaders who view US actions as [neocolonial](#).

The Economic Logic of Asymmetric War

The Iran conflict is exposing a fundamental flaw in modern high-tech warfare: the cost of defense is exceeding the cost of offense. As Iran uses [cheap drones and missiles](#) to pin down US and Israeli forces, the economic drain on the US treasury—exceeding 11.3 billion dollars in three weeks—is becoming a primary driver of domestic inflation. This "inflationary war" is eroding Trump's

popularity and could lead to a [forced retreat](#) or a desperate escalation.

Consolidation of the "Iron Fist" Executive

From Kast in Chile to the gains of the far-right in France, there is a clear global trend toward electorates favoring [authoritarian security models](#) over liberal democratic norms. This trend is often fueled by migration crises and perceived government incompetence, as seen in the [collapse of the Boric administration](#) in Chile. This shift is likely to accelerate as energy costs rise and social order becomes more precarious.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect extreme volatility in fuel prices as strategic reserves are depleted faster than they can be replenished. The [second round of French municipal elections](#) on March 22 will serve as a bellwether for far-right sentiment in Europe. In the Gulf, the risk of a miscalculation leading to a direct clash between US and Iranian naval forces remains critical.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): Mexico's judicial and electoral reforms will likely pass, further centralizing power under the Sheinbaum administration. The [US midterm elections](#) in November will be heavily influenced by the Iran war's impact on the domestic "pocketbook," potentially forcing a change in US military strategy if the GOP loses its legislative grip.

Long Term (1-5 Years): The fragmentation of global alliances may lead to the birth of a [multipolar security architecture](#) where regional blocs (EU, BRICS, "Shield of the Americas") operate independently of the post-WWII UN/NATO consensus. Chile's "physical border" and the "Shield of the Americas" initiatives could signal the end of the open-

border, globalized trade era in the Western Hemisphere.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Diplomats should prepare for a [multi-year regional conflict](#) in the Middle East that may persist regardless of US leadership changes.
- The "Shield of the Americas" initiative requires a delicate diplomatic balance to avoid a [sovereignty crisis](#) in Mexico and Brazil.
- International bodies must address the [humanitarian crisis in Lebanon](#), where over 1 million people are displaced, to prevent regional destabilization.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Energy-dependent industries should hedge against [extended oil price spikes](#) exceeding \$110 if Hormuz remains closed.
- Logistics and shipping firms must reroute away from the [Gulf and Red Sea](#), leading to permanent increases in transit times and costs.
- Investment in [Mexican infrastructure](#) (energy, rail, water) remains a high-value opportunity as the country seeks to "blindarse" (armor) itself against global instability.
