





DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The conflict between the United States, Israel, and the Islamic Republic of Iran has entered a critical new phase characterized by the systematic decapitation of Iran's political and intelligence leadership and a transition to high-stakes infrastructure warfare. The confirmation of the death of [Intelligence Minister Esmail Khatib](#) following the assassination of Ali Larijani signifies a total breach of the regime's security architecture. This leadership vacuum is occurring just as military operations expand to target vital economic assets, most notably the [Assaluyeh gas facilities](#), which provide roughly 75% of Iran's domestic gas and power. The immediate cessation of gas exports to Iraq and the resulting 40% drop in domestic availability threaten to paralyze the Iranian state's ability to provide basic services, effectively pushing the nation toward "failed state" status.

Regional spillover has shifted from a threat to a reality. In direct retaliation for the strikes on Assaluyeh, Iran targeted the [Ras Laffan LNG refinery](#) in Qatar, a facility responsible for 20% of global LNG supply. This move, coupled with Iranian ballistic missiles being intercepted over Riyadh and reported strikes on Emirati facilities, marks the beginning of an "infrastructure for infrastructure" doctrine. The geopolitical alignment remains fragile; while Israel and the US continue their offensive, [Arab nations and European allies](#) remain largely resistant to joining a formal military coalition, fearing the long-term consequences of a regional energy collapse and the uncontrolled implosion of the Iranian state.

Domestically, the US administration faces an unprecedented internal rift. The resignation of the [Director of the National Counterterrorism Center](#), citing a lack of imminent threat from Iran, and the refusal of the Director of National Intelligence to corroborate President Trump's "imminent threat" narrative in Senate testimony, highlight a growing crisis of legitimacy within the American security apparatus. As global oil prices surge past \$108 per barrel and gasoline rationing begins in Asia, the economic cost of Operation Epic Fury is beginning to create significant political pressure on the White House, even as military successes on the ground in Iran and Lebanon accelerate.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

• Systematic Leadership Decapitation

- The Israeli Defense Ministry confirmed the targeted killing of [Intelligence Minister Esmail Khatib](#) in a strike in northern Tehran, occurring less than 24 hours after the death of Ali Larijani and Basij commander Gholamreza Soleimani. [minister of information](#)
- Defense Minister Israel Katz announced a [blanket authorization](#) for the IDF to eliminate senior Iranian officials on sight without seeking specific political approval, indicating a permanent shift toward an "uninterrupted hunt" policy. [uninterrupted hunt](#)
- The removal of Ali Larijani, viewed by many Western analysts as a pragmatic "bridge" between the military and political wings of the regime, is expected to [radicalize the remaining leadership](#) or hand total control to the IRGC. [pragmatic bridge](#)

• Infrastructure Warfare and Energy Shocks

- Israeli forces targeted the [Assaluyeh/South Pars](#) gas refineries, specifically hitting Phases 3, 4, 5, and 6, resulting in a loss of over 100 million cubic meters of production. [South Pars](#)
- In a rapid escalation, Iran launched a retaliatory strike against Qatar's [Ras Laffan refinery](#), causing extensive fires and threatening nearly a fifth of the world's LNG supply. [LNG refinery](#)
- Iraq's Ministry of Electricity announced a [total halt of gas imports](#) from Iran, immediately impacting one-third of Iraq's power generation capacity. [halt of gas imports](#)

• US Intelligence and Administrative Crisis

- Joseph Kent resigned as [Director of the National Counterterrorism Center](#), stating he could not support a war based on "misinformation" and lacking a genuine imminent threat. [Joseph Kent](#)
- DNI Tulsi Gabbard testified before the Senate Intelligence Committee, explicitly stating that she would not use the term "imminent" to describe the Iranian nuclear or military threat, contradicting [President Trump's stated justifications](#) for the war. [Senate Intelligence Committee](#)
- NATO Secretary General Mark Rutte indicated that while allies agree on the necessity of [reopening the Strait of Hormuz](#), there is currently no consensus on active participation in the military conflict. [Mark Rutte](#)

• Retaliatory Strikes and Civilian Impact

- Iranian ballistic missiles with [cluster warheads](#) struck Tel Aviv, killing a couple in Ramat Gan and causing extensive damage to the main railway line and Ben Gurion Airport. [cluster warheads](#)
- US forces utilized [5,000-pound bunker-buster bombs](#) to target underground missile silos along Iran's southern coastline to prevent further interference with shipping. [bunker-buster bombs](#)
- The fire festival of [Chaharshanbe Suri](#) became a theater of conflict, with regime supporters urged to burn American and Israeli flags while protesters utilized the event to chant against the "octopus" of the Islamic Republic. [Chaharshanbe Suri](#)

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics

- The death of Ali Larijani is described as more significant than the death of the Supreme Leader, as he was the [primary operative managing](#) the state and military response since the conflict began. [primary operative](#)
- A power struggle is emerging between the [remnants of the political class](#) (represented by President Pezeshkian) and the IRGC (led by Ahmad Vahidi), with the latter reportedly operating under "fire at will" (Atash-be-ekhtiar) protocols. [Ahmad Vahidi](#)
- The emergence of Mojtaba Khamenei remains [shrouded in secrecy](#); he has released written condolences but has yet to appear in video or audio, fueling rumors of his health or location status. [Mojtaba Khamenei](#)

Energy Security & Infrastructure

- Targeting Assaluyeh is a "madness" that could permanently damage the South Pars field if [wellheads are targeted](#), potentially leading to a decade-long recovery period. [South Pars field](#)
- Refineries in Saudi Arabia (Yanbu), the UAE (Fujairah), and Qatar are now [under direct threat](#) from Iranian proxies and IRGC missile units. [direct threat](#)
- The global LNG market is facing a [supply catastrophe](#) following the strike on Ras Laffan, with implications for European heating and Asian industrial sectors. [LNG market](#)

Succession & Stability

- The Iranian government is reportedly shifting toward a ["Heiaat" \(informal mourning committee\) style](#) of management, moving away from formal bureaucratic structures as government buildings and ministers are systematically eliminated. [Heiaat style](#)
- There is a growing fear that the collapse of the "state" (the ability to govern) will precede the collapse of the "regime" (the ideological core), leading to [uncontrollable chaos](#) and humanitarian disaster. [uncontrollable chaos](#)

Digital Sovereignty & Information Warfare

- The internet in Iran remains [almost totally blacked out](#), with the government granting limited access only to "trusted individuals" to spread regime narratives. [trusted individuals](#)
- A massive coordinated campaign on [Wikipedia](#) has been detected, with over 10,000 regime-aligned photos and videos uploaded to dominate search results for "Iran protests 2026." [Wikipedia](#)

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity centered on the Senate Intelligence Committee's oversight of the war's justification and the Iranian government's emergency measures to

criminalize internal dissent during the bombardment.

- **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED**

- **Anti-Espionage Emergency Law (Iran):** Enacted to allow [execution and asset seizure](#) for any citizen "cooperating with the enemy," leading to the immediate execution of Kurush Keivani. [Kurush Keivani](#)

- **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS**

- **Senate Intelligence Committee Hearing:** DNI Tulsi Gabbard and FBI Director Christopher Wray were [questioned on the assessment](#) of the Iranian threat prior to the strike. DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The End of Pragmatism The assassination of Ali Larijani represents the closing of the diplomatic "exit ramp." Larijani was the only figure with sufficient gravitas to negotiate a "soft landing" or a managed surrender of the regime's nuclear assets. By removing him, Israel and the US have effectively chosen a

path of total destruction over a negotiated settlement. This suggests that the goal is no longer behavioral change but the [total liquidation](#) of the Islamic Republic's power structure. However, this creates a "Gaza-fication" of Iran, where there is no centralized authority left to sign a peace treaty or manage the resulting humanitarian crisis. [total liquidation](#)

Resource Interdependence as a Weapon

The strikes on Assaluyeh and the counter-strike on Ras Laffan demonstrate that "energy globalization" has become a strategic liability. The [Strait of Hormuz](#) is no longer the only choke point; the physical infrastructure of the refineries is now the primary battlefield. The strike on Ras Laffan is particularly calculated to hurt Western allies and China, forcing them to pressure the US to cease operations. This "mutual assured destruction" of energy infrastructure is a trend that could lead to a global economic depression if it extends to Saudi and Emirati oil hubs. [energy infrastructure](#)

The "Jazz" Strategy of Donald Trump

Analysts are struggling to identify a coherent US strategy, with some describing it as "Jazz"—an [improvisational approach](#) where goals change daily based on the latest tactical success or economic pressure. The contradiction between targeting infrastructure (which hurts the Iranian people) and claiming to "support the Iranian people" has created a credibility gap. Furthermore, the [internal dissent](#) within the MAGA movement, represented by Joseph Kent, indicates that Trump's own base is beginning to fracture over the departure from "America First" isolationism toward a high-cost regional war. STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Severe energy shortages in Iran will lead to [bread and medicine rationing](#), as bakeries and pharmaceutical plants depend on gas. [bread and medicine](#)
- Further high-profile assassinations are likely, with [Mohammad Bagher Ghalibaf](#) being the next probable target in the political decapitation campaign. [Ghalibaf](#)
- The Strait of Hormuz will see a [US-led attempts](#) to land commandos or marines on Iranian islands (Tunbs, Abu Musa) or the Bushehr coastline to secure nuclear material. [secure nuclear material](#)

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- Global oil prices could stabilize at a "war premium" of [\\$120-\\$150 per barrel](#) if Saudi and Emirati terminals are struck, leading to widespread inflation in the West. [\\$150 per barrel](#)
- The [IRGC may effectively replace](#) the civilian government entirely, operating as a decentralized insurgent force even if Tehran falls. [IRGC](#)
- A massive [refugee crisis](#) at the Turkish and Iraqi borders will escalate as urban life in Iran becomes unsustainable. [refugee crisis](#)

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- A "failed state" scenario for Iran, similar to Syria or Libya, is increasingly likely, with [ethnic factions \(Kurds, Baluchis\)](#) seeking autonomy or independence in the vacuum. [ethnic factions](#)

- The reconstruction of Assaluyeh and other energy hubs will cost [hundreds of billions of dollars](#) and take over a decade, delaying Iran's return to the global market indefinitely. [reconstruction](#)

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

• For International Policy

- **Security:** Prepare for "non-state" threats from IRGC remnants; the destruction of the central command may lead to ["fire-at-will" terrorism](#) globally. [fire-at-will](#)
- **Diplomatic:** The US must address the [credibility gap](#) created by internal resignations to maintain the support of hesitant European and Asian partners. [credibility gap](#)
- **Humanitarian:** Establish [safe zones](#) along the Turkish border immediately to handle the expected surge of displaced civilians fleeing the energy/food collapse. [displaced civilians](#)

• For Private Sector/Investors

- **Supply Chains:** Critical shortage of [nitrogen fertilizers](#) (one-third of global supply passes through Hormuz) will hit global agricultural outputs within one planting cycle. [nitrogen fertilizers](#)
- **Energy Costs:** Companies should hedge against sustained [\\$120+ oil](#) and prepare for LNG spot market volatility following the Ras Laffan attack. [oil](#)
- **Asset Risk:** Infrastructure in the GCC (Saudi, UAE, Qatar) is no longer safe from ["asymmetric" sabotage](#) or direct missile strikes by Iranian proxies. [asymmetric sabotage](#)
