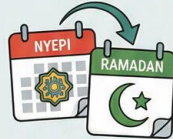

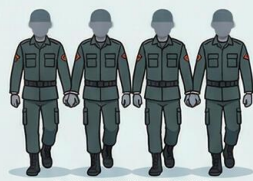

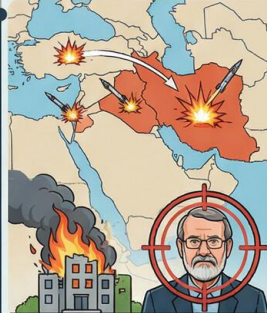

## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 18-19, 2026, represents a critical juncture for Indonesia, characterized by the convergence of the world's largest seasonal migration, a deepening domestic security crisis involving the military, and a volatile geopolitical environment in the Middle East. Domestically, the "Mudik 2026" phenomenon has reached its peak, with an estimated 143.9 million citizens in transit. The government has implemented unprecedented traffic engineering, including a "National One-Way" system spanning hundreds of kilometers on the Trans-Java toll road to manage the 58% surge in vehicle volume. However, infrastructure strain is evident at major maritime gateways like Merak and Gilimanuk, where extreme heat and congestion have led to medical emergencies among travelers. This logistical feat is further complicated by the intersection of the Islamic Ramadan month with the Balinese Hindu Day of Silence

(Nyepi), requiring delicate inter-faith coordination to maintain social order.

Simultaneously, the Indonesian government is grappling with a severe blow to its democratic image following the arrest of four active-duty military personnel from the Strategic Intelligence Agency (Bais TNI) for an acid attack on Kontras human rights activist Andri Yunus. The swift involvement of the House of Representatives (DPR) Commission III, which has formed a special working committee (Panja), underscores the gravity of this breach of the rule of law. Externally, the global risk landscape has darkened significantly as direct kinetic conflict between the United States/Israel and Iran intensifies. The reported assassination of Ali Larijani, Secretary of Iran's Supreme National Security Council, in a US-Israeli strike on Tehran, alongside retaliatory Iranian missile strikes on Israel, signals a shift toward high-intensity regional warfare with profound implications for global energy security and trade routes.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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### 1. Crisis in the Middle East: Direct US-Israel Strikes on Tehran

- The conflict between the US-Israeli coalition and Iran has escalated into its 18th day of direct engagement, featuring [large-scale strikes](#) across Tehran targeting high-value military and political assets.
- Iran has confirmed the "martyrdom" of Ali Larijani, a central political figure and Secretary of the [Supreme National Security Council](#), following an aggression by the US and "Zionist" forces.

- Retaliatory Iranian missile strikes have [hit residential areas](#) in Ramat Gan, Israel, resulting in fatalities and significant infrastructure damage, including hits on railway stations.
- In Iraq, the US Embassy in Baghdad was [targeted by drone](#) swarms, with at least one drone penetrating the complex and causing fires.

## 2. Bais TNI Personnel Implicated in Activist Acid Attack

- The Indonesian Military Police (Puspom TNI) has detained [four active members](#) of the Denma Bais TNI (Strategic Intelligence Agency) for the acid attack on Kontras activist Andri Yunus.
- The suspects include a Captain (NDP), two First Lieutenants (SL, PHW), and a Non-Commissioned Officer (TS), signaling [organized military involvement](#) in domestic repression.
- DPR Commission III has responded by [forming a Working Committee](#) (Panja) to oversee the investigation and ensure the military court process remains transparent and accountable to the public.
- Civil society groups, including Kontras, have raised concerns over [conflicting suspect data](#) between the police (two suspects) and the military (four suspects), calling for a Presidential Fact-Finding Team.

## 3. Mudik 2026: Logistical Strain and Infrastructure Response

- Authorities have officially launched the [National One-Way](#) system from KM 70 (Cikampek) to KM 414 (Kalikangkung) to facilitate the peak flow of nearly 144 million travelers.

- Port congestion at Merak and Gilimanuk has reached critical levels, with [reports of travelers](#) suffering respiratory distress and exhaustion due to extreme heat and vehicle exhaust.
- State-owned port operator ASDP has implemented [single-tariff policies](#) and diverted vehicle classes to secondary ports (Ciwandan and BBJ) to alleviate bottlenecks at the primary Merak-Bakauheni corridor.
- The Ministry of Transportation and the Cabinet Secretariat have [inspected rail services](#), emphasizing the "Modernization of People's Economy" trains that offer subsidized fares with improved facilities.

## 4. Climate Outlook: 2026 Forecasted as Critically Dry Year

- The Meteorology, Climatology, and Geophysics Agency (BMKG) has issued a [severe drought warning](#) for 2026, predicting it will be significantly drier than 2025.
- The transition from a weak La Niña to a potential El Niño by mid-2026 is expected to [shorten the rainy](#) season and trigger early water shortages in Java and Nusa Tenggara starting in April.
- Government agencies are urging [early mitigation efforts](#) for forest fires (Karhutla) and agricultural resilience, referencing the severe drought cycles of 2015 and 2019.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### National Security and Rule of Law

- The involvement of [intelligence agency personnel](#) in a domestic assault case creates a significant governance challenge, testing the administration's commitment to the new Criminal Code (KUHP) and military-civilian legal synchronization.
- DPR Commission III is leveraging [Article 170 of the new KUHP](#) to ensure that military personnel involved in crimes against civilians can be processed with greater transparency.

### Critical Infrastructure and Energy

- PLN has projected a peak [electricity load of 35,017 MW](#) during the Eid period, while maintaining a supply capacity of 51,960 MW to ensure grid stability as industrial activity slows and residential demand shifts.
- Pertamina has deployed [52 mobile fueling units](#) ("motoris") along the Trans-Java and Pantura routes to prevent vehicle stranding during traffic congestion.

### Domestic Stability and Social Order

- The synchronization of [Nyepi and Ramadan](#) in Bali is being managed through inter-faith agreements, such as restricting the use of loudspeakers for Takbiran and encouraging walking to mosques to respect the silence of Hindu observers.
- Vice President Gibran Rakabuming Raka's office is engaging in [reconciliation gestures](#) (Restorative Justice) toward critics, though significant legal disputes regarding presidential qualifications and academic credentials remain a background noise in the political discourse.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative activity has focused almost exclusively on emergency oversight of the national security apparatus and the implementation of the new legal framework for military-civilian criminal cases. The DPR is utilizing the newly enacted 2025/2026 legal codes to assert authority over traditionally opaque military investigations.

### BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Law No. 20 of 2025/2026 (New KUHP/ KUHP):** Invoked by DPR Commission III members as the [primary legal basis](#) for trying Bais TNI personnel in a manner that allows for public and parliamentary oversight.
- **Government Regulation on Single-Tariff Mudik:** Discussed as a [temporary economic measure](#) to equalize travel costs across various port routes (Merak vs. Ciwandan) during the peak holiday season.

### HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **DPR Commission III Emergency Meeting:** A high-profile session that concluded with a 5-point resolution [condemning the acid attack](#) on Andri Yunus and demanding LPSK protection for the victim and his family.
- **Puspom TNI and Metro Jaya Police Joint Briefing:** Confirmed the [identity of military suspects](#) and attempted to synchronize the narrative between civilian investigators and military police.
- **BMKG Annual Climate Outlook:** Head of BMKG provided a [strategic briefing](#) on the 2026 drought, calling for immediate local government intervention.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### Militarization of Internal Repression

The Andri Yunus case is not being viewed as an isolated criminal act but as a potentially systemic trend of "militarized" silencing of activists. The use of Bais TNI personnel—those specifically trained in intelligence and clandestine operations—suggests a higher level of organization than typical street-level intimidation. The DPR's rapid move to form a Panja is a reactive measure to prevent a "civil-military divide" and to [protect democratic principles](#) that are currently perceived as being under threat by "intellectual actors" behind the scenes.

### Logistics as a Tool of Social Cohesion

The "Mudik" operation has evolved from a simple transport challenge into a massive state-capacity demonstration. By offering [discounted "Economy Kerakyatan" fares](#) and mobilizing military-style traffic management, the Prabowo administration is attempting to solidify its populist credentials. However, the [medical emergencies](#) at ports highlight the limits of existing infrastructure when faced with a 144-million-person surge, suggesting that future stability may depend on massive port expansions rather than just traffic management.

### Geopolitical Proximity to Total War

The death of Ali Larijani in Tehran is a watershed moment. Unlike previous proxy engagements, this represents a direct, kinetic strike by the US-Israel coalition on a [high-level Iranian state official](#) within the capital. The resulting "martyrdom" rhetoric from Tehran and the subsequent strikes on [Israeli residential infrastructure](#) indicate that the

conflict has moved beyond the "shadow war" phase. For Indonesia, the risk is twofold: the disruption of global oil prices and the potential for domestic radicalization or protests as the "Zionist" narrative gains traction during Ramadan.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** The focus will remain on the safe return of 144 million travelers (Arus Balik). Traffic engineering will shift to the [inbound Jakarta lanes](#). We expect intensified public scrutiny of the Bais TNI investigation, with potential for further arrests of "intellectual actors." Middle East tensions will likely cause a spike in global energy prices, impacting Indonesia's fuel subsidy budget.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The [onset of the 2026 drought](#) will create localized water crises and agricultural yield losses. The DPR Panja on the acid attack will likely release its findings, which could lead to calls for intelligence agency reform. If the Middle East conflict persists, Indonesia may face pressure to take a more active diplomatic stance or provide humanitarian aid to victims of the US-Israel-Iran strikes.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** Indonesia must accelerate its [water management infrastructure](#) to adapt to more frequent and severe climate anomalies. The legal precedent set by the Bais TNI trial will determine the long-term balance of power between the civilian judiciary and the military. Structural reliance on the Trans-Java toll road for Mudik will likely reach a breaking point, necessitating a shift toward massive high-speed rail and maritime ferry expansions.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- Monitor the US-Israel-Iran escalations for potential [shipping lane disruptions](#) that could impact Indonesian exports/imports in the Indian Ocean.
- Engage in proactive diplomacy through ASEAN to ensure that the Middle East conflict does not further polarize domestic religious sentiment.
- Advocate for international climate assistance as Indonesia faces a [drier-than-average El Niño cycle](#) in 2026.

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Logistics Risk:** Companies relying on road freight during the Eid period must account for the [One-Way National system](#), which effectively shuts down westbound Trans-Java lanes for days.
- **Agribusiness Vulnerability:** Investors in Indonesian palm oil or staples should prepare for [drought-related production drops](#) in Q3/Q4 2026.
- **Security Compliance:** Foreign entities collaborating with Indonesian security or intelligence agencies should conduct enhanced due diligence in light of the [Bais TNI personnel arrests](#) to avoid reputational or legal risks associated with domestic repression.
