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THE US-ISRAEL MILITARY CAMPAIGN IN IRAN HAS TRIGGERED A GLOBAL ENERGY CRISIS AND SYSTEMIC ECONOMIC SHIFTS, WHILE REGIONAL PARALYSIS IN THE BALKANS THREATENS THE COLLAPSE OF KEY INDUSTRIAL SECTORS.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

Geopolitical stability reached a dangerous nadir on March 18, 2026, as the conflict in Iran entered its third week following a series of high-level assassinations by US and Israeli forces. The deaths of Ali Larijani, head of Iran's Supreme National Security Council, and Intelligence Minister Esmail Khatib have decapitated the Iranian security apparatus, leading to [escalating strikes](#) on Tehran, Beirut, and Baghdad. This military escalation has effectively shuttered the Strait of Hormuz, through which [25% of global liquid fuel](#) and significant LNG volumes transit, prompting the International Energy Agency (IEA) to authorize the largest emergency oil release in history. The shock is being felt globally, with African nations warning of "catastrophic scenarios" and South African airlines

[implementing dynamic fuel surcharges](#) after jet fuel prices rose 70% in a single week.

Simultaneously, the transatlantic relationship is fracturing under the weight of President Donald Trump's trade policies and a perceived lack of European support for the Iran campaign. European officials describe the current 15% tariff on EU goods as a "capitulation" to US bullying, while [Trump has publicly castigated NATO allies](#) for refusing to deploy navies to the Persian Gulf. In the Balkans, this global instability is exacerbating internal dysfunction. Bosnia and Herzegovina (BiH) faces the imminent collapse of its steel and transport sectors due to a combination of fuel price spikes, border blockades, and a [critical shortage of coking coal](#) for the Zenica steel plant, which management warns will cease production by May without state intervention.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Decapitation of Iranian Leadership:** Israel and the US confirmed the deaths of several top-tier Iranian officials, including Ali Larijani and [Intelligence Minister Esmail Khatib](#). The IDF also claimed the elimination of Basij commander General Soleimani during meetings in Tehran. [Larijani was described as a "pillar"](#) of the Islamic system by Supreme Leader Khamenei.
- **Blockade of the Strait of Hormuz:** Iranian forces have effectively closed the Strait, demanding that energy exports be [paid for in Chinese currency](#) as a condition for safe passage. This has stranded hundreds of tankers and [severely impacted Kuwait's economy](#), with local fishing fleets banned from the sea due to missile and drone fire.

- **IEA Emergency Oil Release:** In response to the 20% global oil supply disruption, IEA member countries [unanimously agreed to the largest release](#) of emergency oil stocks in history to stabilize markets as Brent crude threatens to exceed \$150 per barrel.
- **BiH Industrial Crisis:** The Nova Zeljezara Zenica steel plant has warned that [11,000 jobs and 2.5% of BiH GDP](#) are at risk if the state does not implement protective import measures. Simultaneously, professional transporters are [planning a total border blockade](#) on March 23 to protest visa and transit restrictions.
- **Transatlantic Trade Rupture:** Nobel economist Joseph Stiglitz warned that relations between the US and Europe are at an all-time low, noting that [US demands for Europe to abandon digital taxes](#) and regulations are seen as an assault on European sovereignty.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security & Resilience: The crisis has exposed the extreme vulnerability of global energy hubs. European nations have successfully [reduced Russian gas dependency to 13%](#), but remain highly exposed to LNG disruptions in the Gulf. In BiH, energy director Mirza Ustamujic emphasized that [South Interconnection projects are now without alternative](#) to ensure long-term stability.

Economic Security & Trade Warfare: President Trump's 15% tariff on European goods has moved the EU from a trade average of 1.2% to a defensive posture. Economic analysts predict a [looming period of global stagflation](#)—high inflation combined with stagnant growth—if the Hormuz blockade lasts more than two months.

Labor & Industry: The BiH steel industry is suffering from a [317% increase in steel imports](#) from subsidized foreign competitors. Management in Zenica argues that without "Day D" intervention on March 23, the [lack of coking coal](#) will stop the furnaces entirely by mid-May.

State Capacity & Corruption: BiH's Indirect Taxation Authority (UIO) continues to face allegations of systemic corruption. During parliamentary hearings, former director Miro Dzakula [faced intense questioning regarding real estate holdings](#) in Croatia and ignored reports of tax evasion by subordinates.

Critical Infrastructure: Analysts warned that Gulf nations are exceptionally vulnerable due to their [dependence on desalination plants](#). If military strikes target these facilities, the region's water security would collapse within days, as most lack natural freshwater alternatives.

Diplomatic Engagement & Bloc Politics: The European Parliament's 2025 report on BiH found [minimal to no progress](#) on EU integration. High Representative Alibi and internal political divisions, specifically [threats by Milorad Dodik](#) to undermine state institutions, remain the primary roadblocks.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative efforts across the globe are currently focused on emergency fiscal measures to mitigate the energy shock and protective trade policies to prevent industrial collapse. In BiH, the debate over fuel excise taxes has become a theater of partisan conflict, with the SNSD blocking measures they previously supported.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **BiH Law on Excise Taxes:** A proposal to [temporarily abolish or reduce fuel excises](#) to lower prices for citizens; currently stalled in the House of Peoples by SNSD delegates who claim it is a "transfer of power" from the parliament to the Council of Ministers.
- **BiH Steel Protective Measures:** Proposed [reduction of import quotas and protective tariffs](#) to shield the Zenica steel plant from subsidized foreign competition.
- **EU-US Trade Agreement (July):** A controversial deal that [sets a 15% tariff on European goods](#) entering the US, seen by many as a capitulation to secure US defense support for Ukraine.
- **Croatia Law on Foreigners:** Amendments intended to [facilitate easier border crossing for professional drivers](#), currently in the first reading.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **UIO Corruption Hearing:** Parliamentary committee hearing where [Miro Dzakula defended himself against corruption allegations](#) and criticized whistleblowers as "malicious."
- **Nova Zeljezara Zenica Management Presser:** Management warned that [production will halt in May](#) without urgent state intervention regarding coking coal and import protection.
- **European Parliament Foreign Affairs Committee:** Presented a report on Serbia and BiH, noting that [Serbia is becoming a security threat](#) due to its procurement of supersonic missiles from China and lack of alignment with EU foreign policy.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Transit Hubs The conflict has moved beyond kinetic warfare into a systemic assault on global transit. Iran's use of the Strait of Hormuz as an "economic weapon" is not new, but the current [demand for Chinese currency payments](#) represents a strategic shift toward de-dollarization under duress. This is mirrored in the Balkans by the "transit war" at the Croatian-BiH border, where [875 drivers were returned from the border](#) in a single day, effectively using bureaucratic "lawfare" to strangle neighboring economies.

The European "Herbivore" Dilemma European leaders are increasingly vocal about the continent's strategic weakness. Former Italian PM Enrico Letta noted that Europe cannot remain the [only "herbivore" in a world of "carnivores."](#) The continent's dependence on the US for security, China for industry, and Russia for energy is being re-evaluated as a "big mistake," with a new emphasis on building a [unified and independent financial market](#) and defense capacity.

Reverse "Brain Drain" as Strategic Asset Economists are observing a nascent trend of high-skilled labor fleeing the US for Europe due to [discontent with the Trump administration's](#) attacks on universities and science. This reversal of the traditional brain drain could provide the foundation for [future European technological superiority](#), provided the EU can maintain its digital sovereignty against Silicon Valley "oligarchs."

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Industrial centers in the Balkans, particularly [Zenica's steel](#)

[production](#), will face a "Day D" on March 23. If the Council of Ministers does not approve protective measures and fuel excises are not reduced, mass protests and [regional supply chain collapses](#) are inevitable. Continued Israeli strikes on Beirut and Tehran will likely provoke a more hardline Iranian response, possibly involving submarine attacks on shipping in the Gulf.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The exhaustion of global oil reserves, despite the IEA release, will lead to [sustained barrel prices above \\$150](#), cementing global stagflation. This will force central banks to [raise interest rates further](#), stifling private investment and housing markets. In BiH, the [bird flu outbreak in Petrovo](#) will likely keep EU poultry exports suspended until late April, causing a 20% loss in poultry revenue.

Long Term (1-5 Years): Europe will accelerate its transition to a [unified defense and energy architecture](#) to decouple from US-led volatility. The "Digital Markets Act" will become a battleground for EU-US relations, potentially leading to a permanent regulatory schism. In the Balkans, if [Serbia continues its current trajectory](#) of military alignment with China and Russia, it may face formal suspension of its EU candidacy and NATO-led containment measures.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The US administration should clarify its strategic objectives in Iran; [confused communication regarding military goals](#) is alienating NATO allies and complicating long-term stabilization.

- The EU must prioritize the [Single Market integration](#) suggested by the Letta report to mitigate the impact of the transatlantic trade war.
- International monitors should increase biosurveillance in the Balkans to manage [bird flu outbreaks](#) that threaten regional food security.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Diversification:** Investors should pivot toward [renewable energy and strategic storage](#) as LNG routes from the Gulf are no longer guaranteed.
- **Supply Chain Risk:** Manufacturers in BiH and the region must plan for the [permanent loss of domestic steel capacity](#) if Zenica's furnaces go cold in May, necessitating new suppliers in Turkey or the Far East.
- **Logistical Contingency:** The [border blockades at the Croatia-BiH frontier](#) require immediate alternative routing strategies through Montenegro or Serbia, though these routes carry higher geopolitical risk.
