

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### POLAND TRANSITIONS TO "PLAN B" GOVERNANCE AMID CONSTITUTIONAL PARALYSIS AND A GLOBAL ENERGY CRISIS TRIGGERED BY MIDDLE EAST ESCALATION

#### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 18, 2026, marks a critical inflection point for Polish domestic stability and global economic security. Domestically, the Tusk administration has effectively transitioned to a "Plan B" governance model to bypass institutional blockades erected by President Karol Nawrocki. This constitutional standoff has reached a zenith with the President's refusal to swear in six newly elected Constitutional Tribunal (TK) judges and his veto of the "SAFE" defense program—a multi-billion PLN initiative critical for military modernization. The government's response, involving alternative swearing-in ceremonies and the redirection of funds, suggests a deepening "lawfare" environment where traditional executive-legislative cooperation has entirely collapsed.

Simultaneously, a massive geopolitical shock in the Middle East has overshadowed

domestic concerns. The assassination of high-ranking Iranian leader Ali Larijani by Israeli forces has triggered a regional conflagration, including the blockage of the Strait of Hormuz. This development has sent energy and fertilizer prices into a tailspin, threatening global food security and forcing Poland to accelerate its 1 trillion PLN energy transition plan. The rift within NATO has also widened, as U.S. President Donald Trump expresses "fury" over European allies' refusal to join a military mission to unblock the Strait, leading to renewed threats of a U.S. withdrawal from the alliance.

#### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Constitutional Tribunal Standoff and "Plan B":** Following the Sejm's election of six new judges, President Nawrocki has refused to accept their oaths, leading the government to consider [alternative swearing-in venues](#) such as the Sejm or before a notary. The Tribunal itself has delayed proceedings until April 17, seeking an opinion from the President, which critics label a [stalling tactic](#) to maintain the previous administration's influence.
- **Escalation in the Middle East:** Israeli strikes on Beirut and Tehran have resulted in the death of Ali Larijani, a figure central to potential Western negotiations. In retaliation, Iran has launched [coordinated missile strikes](#) using cluster munitions against Tel Aviv and targets in Qatar and the UAE, effectively closing the Strait of Hormuz to non-aligned shipping.

- **The "SAFE" Program Veto:** President Nawrocki's veto of the "SAFE" defense fund—a program involving EU-backed loans for military modernization—has been characterized by the government as [politically motivated sabotage](#). The administration is now implementing a "Plan B" to secure the nearly 187 billion PLN required for the [Shield East initiative](#) and other defense contracts.
- **Cenckiewicz Security Clearance Scandal:** The Internal Security Agency (ABW) has notified the prosecutor's office regarding Sławomir Cenckiewicz, the head of the National Security Bureau (BBN), for participating in a [classified National Security Council meeting](#) without a valid security clearance. This move intensifies the "lawfare" between the intelligence services and the Presidential Palace.
- **Global Energy and Fertilizer Crisis:** The blockage of the Strait of Hormuz has disrupted 30% of the world's nitrogen fertilizer transport and 20% of oil supplies. Analysts warn of a [massive price spike](#) in food and fuel by autumn 2026, prompting PM Tusk to demand a [reform of the EU's ETS system](#) to protect the Polish industry from rising energy costs.

## **KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS**

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**Energy Security and Transition:** The Polish government has announced a massive investment of [1 trillion PLN over the next decade](#) to transform the national energy sector. This plan focuses on nuclear power, offshore wind, and grid distribution to reduce dependence on fossil fuels, which currently account for nearly 75% of coal and 97% of oil imports. The current [Strait of Hormuz crisis](#) is being used as a primary justification for accelerating this sovereign energy push.

**National Security and Hybrid Warfare:** Poland continues to face high-intensity hybrid threats from the East. New methods of smuggling and provocation include [GPS-equipped balloons](#) from Belarus, while the ABW has recently dismantled a [spy network](#) involved in tracking military transports and planning sabotage on railway lines. The government is urging citizens to be [highly vigilant](#) of non-accidental presence near critical infrastructure.

**Geopolitical Power Dynamics:** A significant rift has emerged between the Trump administration and NATO. Trump has criticized the alliance for its [refusal to support military operations](#) against Iran, calling it a "failed test." Meanwhile, Ukraine is emerging as a [security provider](#), deploying over 200 military experts to the Persian Gulf to share drone-defense expertise gained from the war with Russia.

**Rule of Law and Institutional Conflict:** The "Plan B" strategy extends to the judiciary, where the Ministry of Justice is attempting to circumvent the President's refusal to swear in TK judges. Legal experts argue that the President's role is [technical, not discretionary](#), and that his refusal constitutes a dereliction of duty. This conflict is eroding the [international credit rating](#) of Poland, as noted by the Fitch ratings agency.

**Public Health and Critical Infrastructure:** A major water contamination crisis has left over [2,000 residents in Warmia-Mazury](#) without access to potable water due to E. coli bacteria. The crisis has forced the closure of schools and the deployment of military tankers to 41 localities, highlighting vulnerabilities in regional [water infrastructure](#).

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative activity is currently characterized by a flurry of "corrective" proposals aimed at bypassing Presidential vetoes and adjusting to the energy crisis. The government is also pushing social-digital reforms intended to curb the "digital addiction" of minors.

### • **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**

- **SAFE Program (Vetoed):** A 187 billion PLN defense funding mechanism. Currently being bypassed via [alternative financing models](#) within the Ministry of Defense.
- **Constitutional Tribunal Reform:** A package of laws intended to reset the TK and elect new judges. Faces total [Presidential opposition](#).
- **Mobile Phone Ban in Schools:** Legislation set for implementation on [September 1, 2026](#), to prohibit smartphone use in primary schools.
- **ETS Reform Proposal:** A formal request to the European Commission to [maintain free CO2 emission permits](#) for the industry during the current energy crisis.

- **Power Connect Energy Summit (Gdańsk):** PM Tusk and Minister Motyka outlined the [trillion-zloty energy roadmap](#).
- **Zelensky's Address to UK Parliament:** Ukrainian President confirmed the deployment of [drone experts](#) to the Middle East.
- **ABW Press Briefing:** Spokesperson Jacek Dobrzyński confirmed the [prosecutorial notification](#) regarding BBN head Sławomir Cenckiewicz.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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**The Drone Nexus and Globalized Defense Expertise** The conflict in Ukraine has transformed the country into a global exporter of high-tech defense knowledge. President Zelensky's visit to London revealed a [production capacity of 2,000 interceptor drones per day](#). More importantly, the deployment of Ukrainian specialists to the Persian Gulf signifies a new trend where Ukraine leverages its combat experience to secure [strategic depth and alliances](#) in regions previously outside its sphere of influence. This "drone diplomacy" is becoming a critical tool for Kijów to maintain Western attention while global focus shifts to Iran.

**Governance via "Plan B" as the New Normal** The Polish executive is no longer seeking compromise with the Presidency; it is seeking circumvention. Whether it is the [SAFE defense fund](#) or the swearing-in of [Tribunal judges](#), the administration is systematically identifying legal "cracks" to bypass Nawrocki's vetoes. This trend suggests a move toward a more "cabinet-parliamentary" system in practice, though the constitutional framework remains "presidential-parliamentary," creating a volatile legal [gray zone](#) that could persist until the next presidential election.

**The Weaponization of the Strait of Hormuz** The current Middle East conflict is not merely a military confrontation but a [calculated economic strangulation](#). By targeting the transport of fertilizers (ammonia and urea) and the helium needed for semiconductor manufacturing, Iran is hitting the "bottlenecks" of Western industry and global agriculture. The [implications for food prices](#) by autumn 2026 are severe, and the

Polish government's shift toward "energy pragmatism" over "green ideology" reflects a broader European panic regarding the [fragility of supply chains](#).

## **STRATEGIC FORESIGHT**

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect a further spike in retail fuel prices in Poland as the Hormuz blockage is priced in. Domestically, the government may attempt a [symbolic swearing-in](#) of TK judges to force a physical confrontation at the Tribunal's headquarters. The Cenckiewicz investigation will likely lead to calls for his [removal from the BBN](#), potentially sparking a new protest wave from the opposition.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The fertilizer shortage will likely trigger a [crisis in Polish agriculture](#) during the spring sowing season, leading to increased demands for government subsidies. Within NATO, if the U.S. continues to operate unilaterally in the Gulf, we may see the first [reduction of the U.S. troop kontyngent](#) in Europe as Trump redirects resources toward the Middle East and Pacific theaters.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** The 1 trillion PLN energy plan will fundamentally reshape the Polish economy, likely leading to a massive [re-industrialization of the Baltic coast](#) (nuclear and wind). However, the constitutional damage from the "Plan B" governance era may lead to a permanent [political polarization](#) that necessitates a complete rewrite of the 1997 Constitution, as already suggested by several political actors.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS**

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### **For International Policy:**

- Allies should prepare for a [fragmented NATO](#) where bilateral security agreements (like the UK-Ukraine or Poland-Ukraine pacts) supersede collective alliance actions.
- Diplomatic efforts must focus on securing alternative [fertilizer supply chains](#) from North Africa and the Americas to mitigate the looming food security crisis.
- International legal bodies may be called upon to mediate Poland's [constitutional deadlock](#) to ensure the stability of EU funding and democratic norms.

### **For Private Sector/Investors:**

- The energy sector in Poland represents a [trillion-PLN opportunity](#), particularly for firms involved in nuclear technology, offshore wind, and smart grid distribution.
- Companies reliant on semiconductors or nitrogen-based chemicals must hedge against [severe shortages](#) caused by the Hormuz blockade.
- Regulatory compliance in Poland will be complex due to the [clash between the government and Presidency](#); investors should prioritize projects with multi-partisan or local-level support to mitigate political risk.
