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THE EXPANSION OF THE US-ISRAELI CONFLICT WITH IRAN INTO A REGIONAL ENERGY WAR, COUPLED WITH THE DECAPITATION OF IRAN'S SECURITY LEADERSHIP AND THE NAMING OF MOJTABA KHAMENEI AS SUCCESSOR, HAS PUSHED THE MIDDLE EAST TOWARD A TOTAL SYSTEMIC COLLAPSE.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 19, 2026, marks the 20th day of "Operation Epic Fury," a joint US-Israeli military campaign against Iran that has escalated into a direct assault on critical energy infrastructure. Following an Israeli strike on the [Pars Southern gas field](#) in Asaluyeh, Iran launched massive retaliatory strikes against oil and gas facilities in Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, Qatar, and the UAE. This infrastructure-level warfare has triggered a global energy shock, with Brent crude prices [surpassing \\$116 per barrel](#) and European gas prices doubling. The conflict's geography now spans from the Persian Gulf to the Caspian Sea, with recent strikes reported as far north as [Bandar Anzali](#).

Internally, the Iranian regime is facing a leadership vacuum following the reported deaths of key figures, including Secretary of the Supreme National Security Council Ali Larijani and [Minister of Intelligence Esmail Khatib](#). In a move of desperation or planned consolidation, [Mojtaba Khamenei has been named](#) as the successor to his deceased father. While US Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth claims that 90% of Iran's [missile production capacity](#) has been destroyed, Iran continues to demonstrate regional reach, prompting a significant diplomatic shift from former allies like Qatar, which has issued an ultimatum to [expel Iranian diplomats](#).

Domestic repression within Iran has intensified under the "fog of war." The judiciary announced the [execution of three protesters](#) from the January uprisings, including a national wrestling champion. Simultaneously, a total internet blackout entering its 20th day has severed the population from the outside world, forcing activists to rely on [decentralized mesh networks](#) like Ceno and Briar to relay information. Despite the military pressure, the US administration appears divided; reports suggest the White House was [not informed in advance](#) of Israel's strike on the Pars Southern field, indicating a growing strategic rift between Washington and Tel Aviv over the war's endgame.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Regional Infrastructure Warfare:** The war has shifted from military targets to "infrastructure paralysis." Israel's strike on Asaluyeh prompted Iranian retaliation against [Kuwait's Mina Abdullah](#) refinery and Qatar's [Ras Laffan gas hub](#), which accounts for 20% of global LNG supply.

- **Leadership Decapitation and Succession:** The deaths of Larijani and Khatib have severely degraded Iran's decision-making apparatus. The appointment of [Mojtaba Khamenei](#) as Supreme Leader suggests a hardline consolidation despite rumors of internal IRGC dissent and military [command fractures](#).
- **US Military Claims vs. Operational Reality:** The Pentagon reports the destruction of [120 Iranian vessels](#) and 7,000 targets, yet Iran maintains the ability to launch [ballistic missiles at Israel](#) and regional ports, including a reported hit on the [Haifa refinery](#).
- **Diplomatic Realignment:** Former mediators like Qatar and Oman are distancing themselves from Tehran. Qatar [condemned Iranian aggression](#) as a violation of international law, effectively ending its role as a bridge to the West.
- **Judicial Hardening:** The execution of [Saleh Mohammadi](#) and others signifies a regime strategy to use the war as cover for liquidating internal political threats.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security: The deliberate targeting of the [Pars Southern gas field](#) has removed nearly 100 million cubic meters of gas from Iran's domestic supply, threatening total failure of the national power grid and food production. Globally, the threat to the [Strait of Hormuz](#) and pipelines in Yanbu and Fujairah remains the primary driver of market volatility.

Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics: The transition to Mojtaba Khamenei is viewed by analysts as an attempt to [stabilize the system](#), though the lack of transparency regarding his

support within the IRGC's second and third tiers [creates high uncertainty](#) about regime longevity.

Technology Policy & Digital Sovereignty: Iran's "digital darkness" strategy aims to prevent [coordinated civilian uprisings](#). However, the emergence of [blockchain-based messaging](#) and satellite-fed data mirrors a growing arms race between state censors and decentralized tech advocates.

Economic Security: The Iranian economy is characterized as a ["failed state" model](#), with zero investment and total reliance on a dwindling stock of refined products. US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent is exploring the release of [140 million barrels](#) of sanctioned Iranian oil held in tankers to prevent a global recession.

Domestic Stability & Social Order: Despite the war, Chaharshanbe Suri celebrations became a [battleground for narratives](#), with protesters using the cover of fire festivals to chant against the regime while the state attempted to repurpose the event as "Trump burning" [political theatre](#).

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The US administration is facing significant domestic pushback regarding the war's mounting costs and legal basis, while the Iranian Majlis has largely been sidelined by military commands. Regional governance is shifting toward a wartime emergency footing.

- **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:** US Senate War Authorization: Democrats failed to pass a [war powers resolution](#) that would require Trump to seek congressional approval for ongoing operations, with a 47-53 vote split.

- **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:** Pentagon Briefing: Defense Secretary Hegseth requested an [additional \\$200 billion](#) to restock munitions and continue the campaign, criticizing "ungrateful" European allies for failing to join the coalition.
- **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:** 12-Nation Riyadh Summit: Arab and Islamic nations issued a [joint statement](#) invoking Article 51 of the UN Charter, claiming the right to military self-defense against Iranian strikes.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

- **The Disintegration of the US-Israel Unified Front:** A significant trend is the divergence of operational goals. While Trump emphasizes [nuclear and missile destruction](#), Netanyahu is explicitly pursuing [regime change](#). Trump's public disavowal of the Asaluyeh strike suggests he is concerned about the [electoral fallout](#) of \$120 oil.
- **The End of Iranian "Strategic Depth":** For decades, Iran relied on the threat of regional chaos to deter direct attacks. The current campaign shows this "deterrence by proxy" has failed; Israel and the US are now [hitting the heart](#) of the regime's economic and military power despite the resulting [attacks on Gulf refineries](#).
- **Information Warfare in a Blackout:** The regime's total control over internal communications is being challenged by "Lifeline Radio" [shortwave broadcasts](#) and satellite imagery analysis by forensic journalists to verify [civilian casualties](#) in Minab and Lar.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a surge in [internal executions](#) as the regime attempts to preempt any domestic uprising during the Nowruz holiday. Regional energy markets will remain at [peak volatility](#) as long as the Strait of Hormuz remains contested and Gulf refineries are in the line of fire.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): Mojtaba Khamenei will likely face a challenge from within the [remaining IRGC leadership](#) or a potential "palace coup" if military losses continue at the current rate. US domestic pressure for a [budgetary cap](#) on "Epic Fury" will intensify ahead of the November midterm elections.

Long Term (1-5 Years): The destruction of Iran's oil and gas infrastructure [will take a decade](#) to repair, potentially permanently altering the Middle East's energy map in favor of a new [Israel-linked pipeline corridor](#) through the Arabian Peninsula, bypassing the Hormuz "choke point."

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The international community must brace for a [massive refugee crisis](#) as Iranian civilian infrastructure collapses; border pressure on Turkey is already [reportedly increasing](#).
- Diplomatic efforts should focus on a "safe harbor" for [Iranian oil tankers](#) to enter the market under international monitoring to stabilize energy prices.
- Strengthening the [defense of Gulf LNG hubs](#) is a critical priority for European and Asian energy security.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Supply chain risks for [refined products and aviation fuel](#) from the Gulf are at critical levels; diversification of sourcing is mandatory.
- The "Lawfare" risk is increasing; the [legality of US strikes](#) in third-party waters (e.g., Sri Lanka) and the targeting of [dual-use infrastructure](#) will likely trigger future international litigation.
- Investment in [censorship-resistant communications](#) and satellite-based connectivity for regional operations is essential to maintaining business continuity during state-mandated blackouts.
