DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 20, 2026, marks a pivotal convergence of religious, national, and geopolitical milestones for the Islamic Republic of Iran. On the 21st day of the "Ramadan War" (Jang-e Ramezan), the country is navigating a high-stakes leadership transition following the death of the previous Supreme Leader. Sayyid Mojtaba Hosseini Khamenei has effectively assumed the mantle of leadership, delivering a [Nowruz and Eid al-Fitr message](#) that emphasizes "Economic Resilience" alongside national unity. This transition is being framed by state media as seamless, despite the ongoing military conflict and the recent loss of several high-ranking officials, including the Intelligence Minister, the IRGC Spokesman, and senior political figures like Dr. Ali Larijani.

On the military front, the IRGC has escalated "Operation True Promise 4," reaching its [70th wave of strikes](#) against Israeli and U.S. targets

across the Middle East. A central pillar of current Iranian propaganda is the claimed [shoot-down of a U.S. F-35](#) stealth fighter by domestic air defense systems, an event being leveraged to dismantle the "myth of Western technical superiority." Concurrently, the global economic fallout is intensifying, with oil prices surging past \$120 per barrel and the [closure of the Strait of Hormuz](#) causing systemic disruptions to global energy and fertilizer supply chains. Domestically, the state is utilizing Nowruz celebrations to project an image of "business as usual," dismissing reports of civil unrest as "AI-generated" propaganda from the West.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Leadership Succession and Consolidation:** Sayyid Mojtaba Khamenei has been confirmed as the successor to the "Martyred Leader," issuing his first major [strategic roadmap for 1405](#), which focuses on "Economic Resistance in the shadow of National Unity and Security." [Legislative leaders and judicial heads](#) have formally pledged allegiance to the new leadership.
- **Operation True Promise 4 Escalation:** The IRGC and regular military (Artesh) have launched massive combined missile and drone strikes (Waves 60-70). Key targets include the [Haifa refinery and Tel Aviv](#), along with U.S. bases in Qatar (Al-Udeid), the UAE (Al-Dhafra), Iraq (Victoria), and Jordan (Al-Azraq).
- **Aviation and Air Defense Claims:** Iran claims the first-ever combat [interception of a Lockheed Martin F-35](#) by a "domestic indigenous system," which state analysts argue has shifted the "balance of war" and invalidated trillion-dollar U.S. defense investments.

- **Global Energy Shock:** Crude oil prices have reached [record levels of \\$120/barrel](#) following strikes on energy infrastructure. UAE gas production is reported to have "zeroed out," and European gas reserves are at [critically low levels](#) due to the conflict.
- **High-Level Assassinations/Martyrdoms:** The state is holding mass funerals for IRGC Spokesman [General Naeini](#), Intelligence Minister Esmail Khatib, and Dr. Ali Larijani, all reportedly killed in the context of the recent conflict or "terrorist" actions.
- **Domestic "War-Life" Integration:** Despite the conflict, the government is proceeding with [Nowruz holiday patrols](#) (over 138,000 police deployed) and preparing for [City and Village Council elections](#) scheduled for May 2026 to demonstrate institutional stability.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Succession & Stability: The transition to Sayyid Mojtaba Khamenei is being handled with extreme care to prevent internal fractures. The new Leader's speech focused on [national reconciliation](#) while maintaining a hardline stance against foreign intervention. The rapid confirmation by the Assembly of Experts is intended to signal that the "political system remains intact" despite the [loss of the previous Supreme Leader](#).

Economic Security: The government is grappling with war-induced inflation. Measures include [SME relief loans](#) of 15 million Tomans per job preserved and the distribution of [state-subsidized fruit](#) for Nowruz. The Central Bank of Iran is reportedly managing "hyper-inflationary pressures" as the U.S. Fed warns that [oil prices above \\$115](#) will sustain global inflation.

Critical Infrastructure & Cyberwarfare: Iran is reporting [continuous cyberattacks](#) on its banking sector, claiming that despite "rain-like" attacks, services remain 80-100% operational. Militarily, Iran claims to have paralyzed the [Israeli rail system](#) and disrupted Haifa's power grid through precision strikes.

Geopolitical Power Dynamics: Iran is leveraging its regional proxies to maintain pressure. The [Iraqi Resistance \(Saraya Olia al-Dam\)](#) has claimed responsibility for strikes on U.S. bases in Baghdad, while Hezbollah continues to target [Israeli Merkhava tanks](#) in southern Lebanon. Iran is also issuing warnings to [neighboring oil-producing nations](#) (Qatar, UAE, Saudi Arabia) to distance themselves from U.S. assets.

International Relations & Foreign Policy: Diplomatic tension with the UK has spiked following reports that British bases were used for [U.S. bombing missions](#) against Iran. Foreign Minister Araghchi has warned that such cooperation [makes British assets legitimate targets](#).

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Governance activity has shifted toward wartime emergency measures and ensuring the continuity of the electoral cycle despite the state of war.

- **Election Continuity Policy:** The Election Staff announced that [nearly 300,000 candidates](#) have registered for the upcoming May 11, 2026, Council elections, with the vetting process continuing on schedule [despite war conditions](#).

- **Economic Support Packages:** The Execution of Imam Khomeini's Order (EIKO) has allocated [50,000 food packages](#) for war-affected citizens, while the Ministry of Economy is providing [tax holidays and extensions](#) for businesses impacted by the conflict.
- **Strait of Hormuz Regulatory Stance:** While not a formal bill, the state has codified a "no-transit" policy for [unfriendly energy shipments](#), effectively turning the strait into a weapon of economic leverage.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The "AI Narrative" War: A significant rhetorical theme has emerged regarding the "authenticity" of public support. President Pezeshkian and other officials have mocked Donald Trump's claims that [Iranian street crowds are AI-generated](#). State media is using "real-life" footage of Nowruz shopping and night-time rallies to argue that the Iranian people possess "Real Intelligence" (Houshe-Vaghe'i) in [opposition to Western virtual propaganda](#).

Strategic Technological Parity: The discourse has shifted from Iran as an asymmetric actor to Iran as a peer competitor. The emphasis on [hypersonic Fattah missiles](#) and the "Nasrallah" guidance system for ballistic missiles is designed to convince the domestic and regional audience that [U.S. stealth technology is obsolete](#). The state is actively publicizing the [failure of the THAAD and Patriot](#) systems to intercept Iranian "Khorramshahr-4" and "Ghadr" multiple-warhead missiles.

Regional Disengagement of U.S. Allies: Iranian media is highlighting a perceived fracture in the U.S.-led coalition. Reports

suggest that [Austria, Belgium, and Italy](#) have refused to participate in military escalations, and that the [USS Gerald Ford has retreated](#) from the combat zone due to "exhaustion" and "ineffectiveness."

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a heightened period of domestic "rally-around-the-flag" sentiment as Nowruz and Eid al-Fitr coincide with burial ceremonies for high-level martyrs. Military operations will likely continue in "waves" to [deplete Israeli and U.S. interceptor stocks](#). Pressure on the Strait of Hormuz will be maintained to force a diplomatic opening or a reduction in sanctions.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The May 2026 elections will serve as a referendum on the new Supreme Leader's legitimacy. If the conflict persists, the "Economic Resistance" model will face its [greatest test](#) as foreign reserves are drained by war spending and localized infrastructure damage from U.S. retaliatory strikes on [South Pars gas facilities](#).

Long Term (1-5 Years): The successful transition to Sayyid Mojtaba Khamenei could lead to a more consolidated, security-centric Iranian state. The claimed defeat of high-end U.S. platforms (F-35, Aegis) may accelerate a [regional shift toward Iranian or Eastern security architectures](#), particularly if U.S. forces are compelled to withdraw from Iraq and Syria due to unsustainable [war costs \(currently estimated at \\$18 billion\)](#).

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The "Succession Crisis" expected by some Western analysts appears to have been averted in the short term; diplomatic engagement must now account for **Sayyid Mojtaba Khamenei** as the definitive decision-maker.
- The "Hormuz blockade" is no longer a threat but a [functioning reality](#) that is actively re-routing global logistics; alternative energy corridors are now a strategic necessity.
- A significant **technical reassessment** of Western stealth and missile defense efficacy is required if Iranian claims of F-35 interceptions and THAAD bypasses are even partially verified.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Volatility:** Markets should prepare for sustained [triple-digit oil prices](#) as long as Iranian and UAE production facilities remain targets or are shuttered.
- **Supply Chain Risk:** The shortage of [aluminum, fertilizers, and chemicals](#) due to Middle Eastern industrial disruptions will likely impact global agriculture and manufacturing sectors through 2026.
- **Cyber Resilience:** Organizations with ties to the Middle East must harden [cyber defenses](#) as the conflict spills over into systemic digital warfare against financial and energy networks.
