


THE US-ISRAEL WAR ON IRAN: GLOBAL ENERGY CRISIS & DIPLOMATIC COLLAPSE

From Preemptive Strike to Asymmetrical War: Energy Markets Brace for Historic \$180/Barrel Oil Price Hike as Norms Shatter.



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THE US-ISRAEL WAR ON IRAN HAS TRIGGERED A GLOBAL ENERGY CRISIS AND A COLLAPSE OF DIPLOMATIC NORMS AS ENERGY MARKETS PREPARE FOR A HISTORIC \$180 PER BARREL OIL PRICE HIKE.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The conflict between the United States, Israel, and the Islamic Republic of Iran has entered its third week, characterized by a shift from a "preemptive" strike narrative to an asymmetrical war of attrition. While the US and Israel have successfully targeted high-level Iranian leadership—including the Minister of Intelligence and the IRGC spokesman—the Iranian state appears to be maintaining [structural integrity](#) through a decentralized "mosaic" defense and clear lines of succession. The battlefield has expanded horizontally, with Iran striking energy infrastructure in Qatar and Israel in retaliation for attacks on its own natural gas fields, specifically the South Pars facility. This has sent Brent Crude toward \$110 per barrel, with analysts and Saudi officials warning of a

surge to \$180 if the [Strait of Hormuz](#) remains blocked through April.

The Trump administration is facing significant internal and external pressure as the "imminent threat" justification for the war is publicly challenged by high-ranking intelligence officials. Director of National Intelligence Tulsi Gabbard and former counter-terrorism officials have admitted that Iran was not actively enriching uranium or planning an attack on the US prior to the strike. Simultaneously, the administration is exploring the desperate measure of "unsanctioning" 140 million barrels of [Iranian oil](#) currently at sea to stabilize global markets. Diplomatic relations have reached a nadir, highlighted by Russia summoning the Israeli ambassador after an IDF strike nearly killed an RT news crew in Lebanon, an event Moscow has characterized as a deliberate [violation of international law](#).

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Energy Infrastructure Warfare and Market Destabilization

- Israel conducted a major strike on the South Pars gas field, the world's largest natural gas reserve, which supplies 20% of the world's [liquefied natural gas](#).
- Iran retaliated by targeting an oil refinery near Haifa and Qatar's LNG terminals, citing the use of regional bases for [US-Israeli operations](#).
- The US Treasury is considering lifting sanctions on 140 million barrels of Iranian oil to provide a [two-week supply buffer](#) for the global market.

Leadership Decapitation and State Resilience

- The funeral for Iranian Minister of Intelligence Ismail Khatib was held following his [assassination in Tehran](#).
- The Iranian Supreme Leader delivered a Nowruz address, claiming the state has suppressed a [coup attempt](#) on January 12th and remains united against "global arrogance."
- Analysts suggest the IRGC's decentralized command structure allows for [sustained operations](#) despite the loss of top-tier military and political figures.

The Strike on Journalists and Diplomatic Fallout

- RT correspondent Steve Sweeney and cameraman Ali Rida were injured by a [precision fighter jet strike](#) on a bridge in southern Lebanon.
- The Russian Foreign Ministry summoned Israeli Ambassador Simona Halperin to protest the strike, which was captured on [multiple cameras](#).
- The UK government has largely ignored the attack on Sweeney, a [British national](#), focusing instead on his previous reporting activities.

Netanyahu's "Jesus vs. Genghis Khan" Controversy

- Prime Minister Netanyahu sparked international outrage by comparing the legacy of Jesus Christ unfavorably to [Genghis Khan](#) to emphasize that "might makes right."

- The comments were condemned by the Catholic Church and the Iranian Foreign Ministry as an insult to [Christian religious sensibilities](#).
- Netanyahu later backtracked, claiming he was quoting historian Will Durant to argue that [morality requires power](#) for survival.

Russian Domestic Militarization

- Documentaries detailed the training of new cadets at the Ryazan Guards Higher Airborne Command School, focusing on the [VDV's role](#) in current operations.
- Recruitment efforts emphasize the "Airborne Brotherhood" and the use of [new technologies](#) such as FPV drones and decentralized mortar teams.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security and Blockade Dynamics

- The total shipping blockade in the [Strait of Hormuz](#) is forcing the world to look for alternative pipeline routes through the Arabian Peninsula to Israeli Mediterranean ports.
- Saudi Arabia warns that if the conflict is not resolved by late April, the \$180/barrel price target [will be met](#).
- The strike on the South Pars field has impacted the global [helium supply chain](#), critical for the US semiconductor industry.

National Security and Intelligence Whistleblowing

- DNI Tulsi Gabbard testified that the intelligence community did not assess an [imminent nuclear threat](#) from Iran prior to the war.

- Former Counter-Terrorism Director Joe Kent resigned in protest, stating the "imminent threat" narrative [did not exist](#) and the war was driven by Israeli interests.
- US Secretary of War Pete Hegseth is requesting [another \\$200 billion](#) from Congress to refill ammunition and fund future ground operations.

Diplomatic Engagement and Bloc Politics

- NATO has begun a temporary [withdrawal of mission personnel](#) from Iraq due to the threat of Iranian-backed militia attacks.
- BRICS nations, specifically India and the UAE, are [recalibrating relations](#) with the US as the war threatens their economic stability.
- African nations, led by Ghana and Namibia, are pushing a UN resolution for [comprehensive reparations](#) for the transatlantic slave trade, leveraging shifting global power dynamics.

Religious and Social Order

- The Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem has been [closed to the public](#) citing security concerns, threatening Easter services.
- Israeli security forces dispersed Muslim worshippers at the Al-Aqsa Mosque with [stun grenades](#) during Eid al-Fitr.
- In Tehran, 18,000 homes have been [destroyed or damaged](#) by US-Israeli strikes, displacing tens of thousands of civilians.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The US Congress is currently debating a massive \$200 billion supplemental funding bill for the war effort, while the Senate Oversight Committee has held a "Worldwide Threats"

hearing that exposed significant rifts between the DNI and the White House. International bodies, specifically the UN, are preparing to vote on a major resolution regarding [African reparations](#) on March 25th.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Supplemental War Appropriation (\$200B):** A request by Pete Hegseth to fund multi-million dollar missile strikes and refill munitions; critics note this amount equals the [GDP of New Zealand](#).
- **UN Resolution on Reparations:** Supported by 54 African Union member states to address structural inequalities and the return of [looted artifacts](#).

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Senate Worldwide Threats Hearing:** DNI Tulsi Gabbard confirmed Iran's enrichment capabilities were [obliterated last year](#) and no attempt has been made to restore them.
- **Commander-in-Chief Trophy Presentation:** President Trump joked about Pearl Harbor and "taking Cuba" while [congratulating the Navy](#) on their victory and their recent "complex military maneuvers" against Iran.
- **Russian Foreign Ministry Presser:** Maria Zakharova condemned the strike on journalists as a [deliberate attempt](#) on their lives and a violation of the Geneva Conventions.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Petrodollar Crisis and the "Unsanctioning" Paradox The most significant economic trend is the sudden realization in Washington that the US cannot maintain a war with a major oil producer

without [economic self-destruction](#). The proposal to "unsanction" Iranian oil while simultaneously bombing Iranian territory is viewed by economists as an act of [pathetic desperation](#). This theme suggests that conventional airpower alone is [insufficient to force](#) regime change in a geographically rugged and militarily prepared nation like Iran.

Digital Sovereignty and Media Deplatforming The cancellation of Rick Sanchez's YouTube channel reflects a broader trend of [media warfare](#). Platforms are increasingly being viewed as political tools used to enforce war-time narratives. The migration of alternative media to platforms like [BitChute and X](#) highlights a fracturing of the digital public square, where dissent on foreign policy is increasingly pushed to the [fringes](#).

The Rise of the Global South Alignment Across the transcripts, there is a recurring narrative of non-Western nations (India, UAE, African Union) seeking to distance themselves from [US "neocolonialism."](#) The war is accelerating the creation of a [new security architecture](#) in the Persian Gulf that excludes the US, as regional actors realize that hosting US bases makes them a [military target](#) rather than a protected ally.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks) Expect a further escalation of "energy warfare" as Iran continues to target Gulf LNG facilities to force a [global ceasefire](#). Internal US political strife will intensify as the Gabbard/Kent whistleblower narratives gain traction, potentially leading to [Congressional investigations](#) into the war's origin.

Medium Term (1-6 Months) The US may be forced to choose between a full-scale ground invasion (requiring up to [3 million troops](#)) or a humiliating withdrawal. Global inflation will likely enter a "cataclysmic" phase as supply chain collapses move from fuel to [minerals and medicine](#). A shift in the European energy strategy is inevitable, as they realize the [blockade of Hormuz](#) is a permanent threat under current conditions.

Long Term (1-5 Years) Structural changes to the global financial order are likely, with the "petroyuan" or other BRICS-based currencies replacing the [petrodollar](#) in energy trade. Regional security in the Middle East will likely move toward a littoral-state architecture that [marginalizes US influence](#). The "nuclear anarchy" predicted by some analysts may become reality as regional powers like Saudi Arabia and Turkey seek [deterrents](#) in the wake of the Iranian invasion.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Diplomatic missions must prioritize the protection of [media personnel](#) in conflict zones to ensure the transparency of information.
- The US must address the legal and constitutional rifts regarding the [War Powers Act](#) to prevent "freelancing" by the executive branch.
- Regional actors should accelerate the development of [independent security architectures](#) to mitigate the risk of being drawn into US-Israel-Iran conflicts.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Investors should diversify energy portfolios away from the Persian Gulf and toward [non-littoral producers](#) to hedge against the Strait of Hormuz closure.
- Companies in the semiconductor industry must secure alternative [helium sources](#) as the Qatar hub remains a primary military target.
- The airline and logistics industries should prepare for sustained [fuel shortages](#) and consider long-term shifts in global trade routes.
