#### DOMESTIC & ECONOMIC STRAIN



**AGRICULTURAL VULNERABILITY:** "Peasant-Extinction" narrative as local farmers face cheaper US imports; fears of "origin laundering".




**INFLATION & ENERGY REALIGNMENT:** UAE's OPEC+ exit threatens global oil prices, fueling domestic inflation and cost-of-living pressures.



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TAIWAN FACES A VOLATILE CONVERGENCE OF DOMESTIC ECONOMIC ANXIETY, HIGH-STAKES DEFENSE BUDGET DISPUTES, AND SHIFTING GEOPOLITICAL ALIGNMENTS IN THE MIDDLE EAST.

## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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The political landscape in Taiwan is currently dominated by a polarizing debate over a proposed TWD 1.25 trillion defense special budget. Opposition leaders from the Kuomintang (KMT) and Taiwan People's Party (TPP) have leveled accusations of "budget padding," citing significant discrepancies between defense ministry reports and the actual procurement costs. This friction is exacerbated by reports that officials from the American Institute in Taiwan (AIT) have expressed confusion over the [massive funding request](#), suggesting the figure may have been inflated by the ruling Democratic Progressive Party (DPP) without a clear mandate or specific procurement list.

Simultaneously, the agricultural sector is bracing for a "zero-tariff" influx of American peanuts, a move mandated by new trade agreements. This has sparked a "peasant-

extinction" narrative among local farmers, who cannot compete with US prices that are [one-third of domestic costs](#). On the international front, the United States continues to project a "collapse" narrative regarding Iran, even as the UAE's withdrawal from OPEC+ threatens to destabilize global energy markets and exacerbate domestic inflation. These developments point to a growing tension between Taiwan's strategic alignment with the US and the preservation of its domestic economic security and social order.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Defense Budget Impasse and Transparency Crisis:** The TWD 1.25 trillion special budget for military procurement has become a flashpoint for legislative gridlock. Opposition lawmakers highlight a [TWD 50 billion discrepancy](#) between the budget bill and the defense ministry's own documentation. Critics argue that the government is asking for a "blank check" without disclosing the specific weapons systems being purchased.
- **Agricultural Vulnerability and Trade Liberalization:** The impending zero-tariff entry of US peanuts is viewed as a systemic threat to Taiwan's central agricultural hubs, particularly Yunlin County. Concerns include not only the decimation of local livelihoods but also [potential food safety risks](#) such as "origin laundering" where Argentine or Brazilian peanuts are re-routed through the US to exploit the tariff exemptions.

- **Global Energy Realignment and Inflationary Pressure:** The UAE's exit from OPEC+ to pursue independent production targets is expected to [destabilize global oil prices](#). For Taiwan, an energy-import-dependent economy, this shift threatens to trigger a new wave of inflation, reflected in the rising costs of imported goods and consumer staples.
- **Public Trust and Institutional Corruption:** A major scandal has emerged involving a police officer in Kaohsiung who allegedly used [AI to create deepfake nudes](#) of female victims. This, combined with the "botched" arrest of a citizen in Taichung and the murder of a tech executive by a company founder, has significantly strained the relationship between the state and the public.
- **US-Iran "Victory" Narrative vs. Reality:** US President Trump has claimed Iran is on the verge of collapse and [seeking a restart of negotiations](#) regarding the Strait of Hormuz. However, analysts remain skeptical, noting that Iran remains a diverse and resourceful power, and the US narrative may be a strategic play ahead of upcoming midterm elections.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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**AI & Technology Policy:** The misuse of artificial intelligence has moved from theoretical risk to a [criminal reality in law enforcement](#), with an officer using AI for sexual exploitation. Separately, the deployment of 5G and AI in [automated port infrastructure](#) in Tianjin demonstrates the rapid advancement of regional competitors in digital sovereignty.

**Economic Security & Trade:** The government's decision to allow zero-tariff

peanuts is being framed as a [betrayal of local farmers](#) to satisfy US trade demands. The loss of approximately TWD 180 million annually in agricultural stability funds due to the removal of peanut quotas further undermines the state's capacity to protect its rural economy.

**National Security & Security Architecture:** The debate over "who we are fighting for" has resurfaced following a controversy where a military officer was disciplined for [showing the film "The Eight Hundred"](#) (800). This has triggered a deeper ideological conflict regarding the "center of thought" within the military and whether the DPP is attempting to "de-sinicize" the history of the Republic of China's armed forces.

**Domestic Stability & Social Order:** Violent crime and public safety are under scrutiny following a [brutal assault in Luzhou](#) on a high school student's grandmother and a village chief by a known stalker. Public anger is compounded by a perceived "lenient" judiciary, especially in cases where [death sentences are sent back](#) for retrial.

**Geopolitical Power Dynamics:** The visit of King Charles III to the US to [repair relations damaged by the Iran war](#) highlights the friction within the Western alliance. At the same time, China's "soft power" move to allow [Fujian residents to travel to Matsu](#) is seen as a tactical opening in cross-strait relations.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative activity centered on the "Special Regulations for the Procurement of Advanced Weapons," a contentious multi-trillion dollar package, alongside significant reforms to the

entertainment tax to stimulate the local arts and culture sector.

- **Defense Procurement Special Budget:** A TWD 1.25 trillion request for advanced US weaponry. Opposition members are [demanding a formal US letter of offer](#) (LOA) before approving any further funding, citing the risk of "blank check" budgeting.
- **Entertainment Tax Law Amendment:** A bill passed its third reading to [remove entertainment taxes](#) on movies, concerts, and athletic events to lower ticket prices and boost domestic consumption.
- **Peanut Import Policy:** While not a single bill, the implementation of the "U.S.-Taiwan Initiative on 21st-Century Trade" (ART) has led to the [removal of peanut tariffs](#), causing a crisis in agricultural policy discussions.
- **Economic Committee Hearing:** Legislators grilled the Minister of Agriculture regarding the [impact of zero-tariff peanuts](#) on the 65-year-old "old farmers" who cannot pivot to new crops like sweet potatoes or soybeans.
- **National Defense Committee Inquest:** Discussions focused on why the [military is being disciplined](#) for viewing historical films and the ideological "red lines" being drawn by the administration.
- **Judicial and Legal Affairs Inquiry:** Lawmakers criticized the [Kaohsiung police department](#) for its failure to prevent "internal wolves" (misconduct) and the light sentencing of officers involved in privacy breaches.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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**The "Predatory Ally" Narrative:** A recurring theme in opposition discourse is the shift in the perception of the United States from a "protector" to a ["predatory" influence](#). Critics point to the peanut trade, the "stealing" of TSMC's manufacturing capacity, and the demand for a TWD 1.25 trillion "protection fee" (defense budget) as evidence that US interests are being prioritized over Taiwan's domestic livelihoods and sovereignty.

**Erosion of Institutional Integrity:** Public trust is being hollowed out by a string of high-profile failures across the police, judiciary, and military. The [police "Oolong" arrest in Taichung](#), where an innocent man was detained for seven hours, and the use of AI for [sexual harassment by a Kaohsiung officer](#) suggest a breakdown in internal oversight. This is mirrored in the judiciary, where the "refusal to execute the death penalty" for a [quadruple murderer](#) has led to accusations of a "green terror" judicial bias.

**The Ideological Battle for History:** The controversy over the film "800" signifies a deep rift in Taiwan's national identity. By labeling a film about ROC soldiers fighting Japan as ["communist propaganda" or "United Front" tactics](#), the administration is accused of trying to sever the historical link between the military and its mainland roots. This has led to concerns about [collapsing morale](#) within the armed forces as their "central purpose" is questioned.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect localized [protests by peanut farmers](#) in Yunlin and Chiayi as the first harvest under the new

trade regime approaches. The legislative showdown over the 1.25 trillion defense budget will likely intensify, possibly leading to a [procedural stalemate](#) if the administration refuses to provide a detailed procurement list.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** Global oil price volatility following the UAE's OPEC exit will [increase the cost of living](#) in Taiwan, potentially leading to lower approval ratings for the government. The "two-tier pricing" model for tourism seen in [Japan \(Kyoto\)](#) may be debated for Taiwan's own 5A scenic spots as a way to manage over-tourism and inflation.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** Structural changes in Taiwan's agriculture may lead to significant [rural-to-urban migration](#) as elderly farmers are forced out of the market. The move toward "unmanned" logistics and ports, as seen in [Tianjin's 5G/AI terminals](#), will become a critical area of competition for Taiwan's own port efficiency and economic resilience.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- The US should clarify the [origins of the TWD 1.25 trillion figure](#) to prevent "AIT skepticism" from being used by opposition parties to undermine the US-Taiwan security relationship.
- Cross-strait travel concessions, such as the [opening of Fujian-Matsu tourism](#), should be monitored for "gray zone" political signaling.
- Diplomatic efforts are needed to address the "perceived abandonment" of [Taiwanese agricultural interests](#) in the pursuit of broader trade agreements.

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- Investors in the automotive sector should prepare for a [potential 10% sales surge](#) if proposed tariff reductions on US imported cars and EV-related goods are enacted.
- The food processing industry faces a [major supply chain shift](#) as cheap US peanuts become the dominant feedstock, but brand risks remain due to local "origin" sensitivities.
- High-tech firms should enhance [internal AI ethics training](#) and cybersecurity to avoid the reputational and legal fallout currently hitting the public sector over deepfake misuse.
