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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The Iranian state apparatus is currently navigating the 60th day of what it terms the "Third Imposed War," a conflict characterized by a naval blockade of the Strait of Hormuz, significant infrastructure damage from US and Israeli strikes, and a profound shift in domestic leadership. Following the martyrdom of the previous Supreme Leader, the consolidation of power under Ayatollah Seyyed Mojtaba Khamenei is being projected through public pledges of loyalty from the judiciary, military, and civil sectors. The state is leveraging this transition to instill a sense of "revolutionary renewal," framing the conflict not as a crisis, but as a "Great Awakening" that has elevated Iran to the status of the world's fourth-ranking power. Domestic stability is being maintained through a massive social mobilization effort known as the "Jan Fada" (Life Sacrificer) movement, which claims over [31 million](#)

[volunteers](#) prepared for social, medical, and military service.

Strategically, Tehran is exploiting the global economic fallout of the Strait of Hormuz closure to isolate the United States. With Brent crude surpassing [111 dollars](#) per barrel and US domestic gasoline prices reaching 6 dollars, Iranian rhetoric portrays President Trump as "trapped" and facing a "suicide of a superpower." Simultaneously, Iran is strengthening its "Eastern Pivot," evidenced by high-level diplomatic engagements with Vladimir Putin in St. Petersburg and a major policy shift by Pakistan to open [transit routes](#) for Iranian goods. On the tactical front, the conflict has shifted toward attrition, with Iran and its proxies increasingly utilizing low-cost FPV drones to negate Israeli and US technological advantages, while the Iranian military warns of high-readiness to [capture US soldiers](#) should a full-scale ground or amphibious escalation occur.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Succession and Leadership Consolidation

- Judiciary Chief Mohseni Ejei publicly reaffirmed that under the leadership of [Ayatollah Seyyed Mojtaba Khamenei](#), the Islamic Revolution will continue toward its goal of a "New Islamic Civilization."
- State media has begun a coordinated campaign to humanize the new leader, releasing poetry and academic reflections on his "civilization-building" vision for the [youth of the Muslim world](#).

The Strait of Hormuz and Global Energy Warfare

- Iran maintains a "restricted navigation" policy in the Strait of Hormuz, which it frames as a legal response to US "maritime piracy" and ship seizures. This blockade has driven oil prices to their highest levels since the [start of the war](#) on February 28.
- Major General Mohsen Rezaei warned that any US attempt to forcibly reopen the Strait would result in the [sinking of US warships](#) and the mass capture of personnel.
- Aramco has reportedly [suspended LPG exports](#) due to damage sustained by its Juaymah facilities during recent hostilities, further tightening global energy supplies.

Tactical Shifts: FPV Drones and Attrition

- Hezbollah has successfully integrated FPV (First-Person View) drones into its operations, claiming to target Israeli [Merkava tanks](#) and troop assemblies with high precision, bypassing traditional electronic warfare defenses.
- Iranian officials are touting the "failure" of the Israeli "Iron Beam" laser system, calling it an [ineffective toy](#) against the saturation of low-cost drone swarms.

Diplomatic Realignment and Regional Influence

- Foreign Minister Araghchi met with Vladimir Putin in St. Petersburg; Putin reportedly expressed support for Iran's sovereignty and sent [personal greetings](#) to the new Supreme Leader.

- The Iraqi Coordination Framework has appointed [Ali al-Zaidi](#) as the new Prime Minister, a move seen as stabilizing a key regional ally during the conflict.
- Pakistan issued a directive officially permitting the [movement of goods](#) from third countries through its territory to Iran via the ports of Gwadar and Karachi.

Domestic Resilience and Economic Mobilization

- The government announced a significant increase in worker benefits, raising the [housing allowance](#) from 900,000 to 3 million Tomans to mitigate the impact of war-time inflation.
- The "Jan Fada" movement has reached a milestone, with [31.1 million citizens](#) registering to support the state, with 60% of participants aged 20 to 45.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Critical Infrastructure and Energy Security The "Third Imposed War" has seen over [487 points of impact](#) on Tehran's electrical grid alone. Despite this, the Ministry of Energy claims that 90% of equipment is now domestically produced, allowing for rapid reconstruction. However, the country faces a [significant imbalance](#) in electricity and gas as it enters the summer peak, prompting calls for "energy jihad" and domestic conservation.

Economic Security and Statecraft The administration is pivoting toward a "war economy" model. To counter the naval blockade, the state is encouraging "socially-led" trade and domestic investment. The Central Bank is implementing [monetary and credit policies](#) to manage inflation while ensuring the supply of basic goods.

Meanwhile, the "Hormuz Check" strategy is being used as a financial weapon to [break the dominance](#) of the US dollar.

Labor and Industry Despite the war, the Ministry of Labor reports a [0.2% decrease](#) in the unemployment rate for Winter 1404 compared to the previous year. To support workers in damaged industries, the state has allocated [130 trillion Tomans](#) for micro-resources and employment support, focusing on "labor resilience."

National Security and Domestic Stability

The "Jan Fada" movement serves as a dual-purpose mechanism for civil defense and psychological warfare. By claiming that [over 50%](#) of the eligible population is "on the battlefield," the state projects an image of total national unity. This is reinforced by nightly "awakening" rallies and public displays of [mass weddings](#) in public squares to signal that life continues normally despite the conflict.

International Relations and Bloc Politics

Tehran is framing its struggle as the catalyst for a global "Strategic Realignment." Iranian analysts claim the war has created a [major rift](#) between the US and Europe, encouraged Russia to accelerate its Ukrainian campaign, and paved the way for [China to take Taiwan](#) within the next few years by exposing US military overextension.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity has focused on "Emergency Governance," with the cabinet and parliament (Majlis) working to stabilize the economy and infrastructure. Oversight committees are conducting field visits to ministries to ensure readiness for a prolonged conflict.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED

- **New Housing Allowance Policy:** Approved by the Cabinet to triple the [housing subsidy](#) for workers to 3 million Tomans for the year 1405.
- **Agricultural Electricity Discount:** A new [50% discount](#) on electricity tariffs for farmers who adhere to consumption patterns during the war.
- **National Housing Movement Expansion:** Allocation of [100-200 million Toman](#) interest-free loans for applicants in the bottom four deciles of the population.
- **Law on Carrying Weapons Reform:** Proposed amendments to [legalize broader weapon use](#) for environmental and border guards in light of the security situation.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS

- **Majlis Health Commission Visit:** Lawmakers visited the Ministry of Health to audit [drug supplies](#) and treatment for 40,000 war casualties.
- **Special News Dialogue with Mohsen Rezaei:** The General outlined the "four paths" for the US: suicide, retreat to Congress, continued blockade, or [surrendering to Iranian conditions](#).
- **Ministry of Labor Briefing:** Minister Midary discussed the "resilience of the labor market" and the [return of 200,000 workers](#) to the market following initial war shocks.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The "Jan Fada" Doctrine: Socialization of Defense

Iran has successfully "socialized" its national defense, transforming civilian life into a logistical tail for the military. The "Jan Fada" movement is not merely a volunteer list; it is a mechanism to integrate [medical professionals, teachers, and engineers](#) into a resilient state structure that can survive the decapitation of its leadership. By linking the defense of the "Soil of Iran" to the religious "Iran of Imam Reza," the state has merged nationalist and religious fervors into a singular [identity of resistance](#).

Narrative Control: The "Failed Superpower"

A consistent theme across all broadcasts is the psychological deconstruction of American power. State media frequently cites Western analysts like John Mearsheimer and articles from [Foreign Affairs](#) and Newsweek to tell the Iranian public that the [US is in a state of suicide](#). By highlighting US domestic issues—such as the [Epstein files](#), 6-dollar gasoline, and Congressional infighting—Tehran is framing the war as a conflict the US has already lost on its own "home front."

Technological Asymmetry: The End of "Expensive" War

The Iranian military narrative emphasizes that "expensive" systems like the [Iron Dome or aircraft carriers](#) are being rendered obsolete by "cheap" Iranian and Hezbollah drones. There is a clear strategic intent to demonstrate that [1,000-dollar drones](#) can successfully challenge billion-dollar defense architectures, thereby encouraging other global actors to challenge US hegemony.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

Expect a period of heightened naval tension as the US faces a "Monday deadline" regarding [Congressional authorization](#) for continued conflict. Iran is prepared for a "desperation strike" by the Trump administration to save face, but Mohsen Rezaei's public calls to [ready weapons in western and southern provinces](#) suggest Iran has preemptively mobilized for a ground or amphibious incursion. Domestic focus will shift heavily to "summer peak" energy management to prevent civil unrest from blackouts.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

The consolidation of Seyyed Mojtaba Khamenei's power will likely be completed through a series of high-profile "unity" events and military victories. If the Strait of Hormuz remains restricted, global [supply chain disruptions](#) in chips and electronics will intensify, potentially forcing European powers to break from the US-led blockade. Reconstruction of [231 damaged university sites](#) and industrial hubs will become a primary driver of the domestic economy.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

Iran is positioning itself for a post-US regional order. The formalization of the [Pakistan-Iran trade corridor](#) and the stabilization of a pro-Tehran government in Baghdad point toward a contiguous land bridge of influence. Structural changes to the global energy market, including a [total shift of 27%](#) of the world's population away from the US dollar, could lead to a permanent multipolar financial system where Tehran is a primary energy and security hub.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The "Third Imposed War" has fundamentally broken the Western "Maximum Pressure" consensus. Diplomatic efforts should prepare for a [multilateral negotiation](#) format that includes Russia, China, and regional neighbors, as Iran now considers bilateral talks with the US "meaningless."
- Watch for the "Monday deadline" mentioned by Iranian military leadership as a [critical inflection point](#) for escalation or a face-saving retreat by the US executive branch.
- The effectiveness of [FPV drones in Lebanon](#) necessitates an immediate re-evaluation of naval and armored troop protections in high-intensity littoral environments.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** High risk of prolonged disruption in [LPG and oil markets](#) as long as the Hormuz "restricted zone" remains active. Diversification away from Gulf-dependent energy is critical.
- **Logistics Opportunity:** Pakistan's [opening of land routes](#) offers a potential, albeit high-risk, alternative for Eurasian trade if sea lanes remain closed.
- **Investment Climate:** While the Iranian domestic market appears resilient, the [sanctions-heavy environment](#) (affecting 27% of global population) suggests that long-term investments will increasingly flow through non-Western financial rails (e.g., BRICS-aligned systems).
