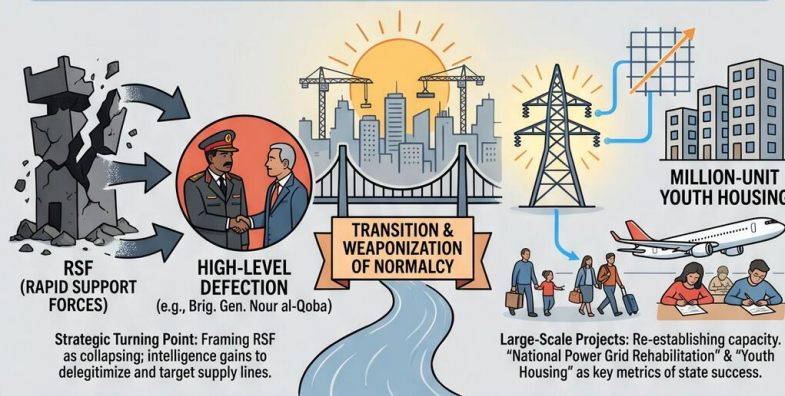

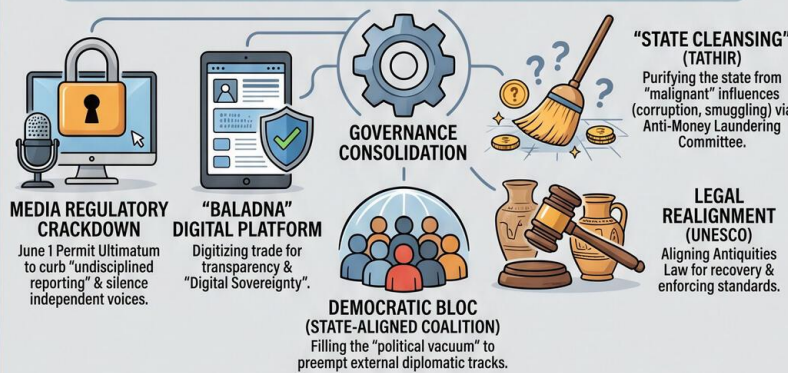

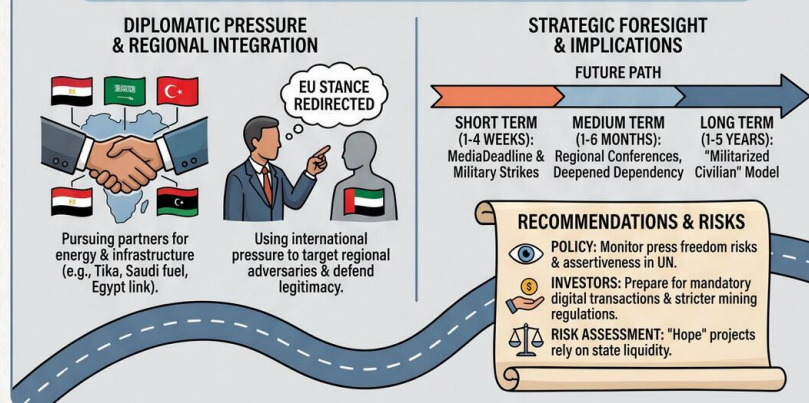

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SUDAN PROJECTS A NARRATIVE OF IMMINENT VICTORY AND SYSTEMIC RECONSTRUCTION WHILE INTENSIFYING REGULATORY CONTROL AND DIPLOMATIC PRESSURE ON REGIONAL ADVERSARIES.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

On April 29, 2026, Sudanese state media broadcast a coordinated narrative of transition from active conflict toward "reconstruction and normalization," branded under the aegis of a "Government of Hope." While military operations continue, the government is increasingly focused on re-establishing state capacity through large-scale infrastructure projects, such as the [million-unit youth housing initiative](#) and the rehabilitation of the national power grid. This pivot to governance is bolstered by reports of high-level defections from the Rapid Support Forces (RSF), most notably [Brigadier General Nour al-Qoba](#), which the state characterizes as evidence of a total militia collapse. Simultaneously, the government is tightening its grip on the domestic information environment, issuing a [one-month ultimatum](#)

[for all media outlets](#) to obtain official permits or face legal consequences.

The diplomatic landscape is defined by a paradox of international engagement and pointed accusations. The European Union has officially called for foreign actors to [stop fueling the conflict](#), a sentiment state analysts have redirected specifically toward the United Arab Emirates (UAE). Despite the ongoing war, Sudan is actively pursuing regional integration, evidenced by the [return of over 300 citizens](#) from Kuwait and the implementation of the "Baladna" digital trade platform. These developments suggest a strategic effort by the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF)-aligned government to fill a perceived political vacuum and project sovereignty to both domestic audiences and international observers, even as the humanitarian crisis in Darfur and Blue Nile remains acute.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **High-Level RSF Defections and Intelligence Gains:** The defection of [Brigadier General Nour al-Qoba](#), a senior commander in North Darfur, is being framed as a strategic turning point. Officials expect his "witness-king" testimony to reveal [clandestine foreign supply routes](#) and the identities of regional backers, further delegitimizing the RSF.
- **Media Regulatory Crackdown:** The Ministry of Culture and Information has mandated that all local and international media platforms, including digital outlets, [secure official work permits](#) by June 1, 2026. This move is explicitly aimed at curbing "undisciplined" reporting that officials claim harms national values.

- **Critical Infrastructure and Energy Recovery:** The Ministry of Energy announced short- and medium-term plans to [rehabilitate the electrical grid](#), noting that massive destruction to generation and distribution facilities requires significant funding. This is coupled with the launch of the "[Baladna](#)" [platform](#) to digitize and secure import-export transactions.
- **Refugee Repatriation and Social Normalization:** The arrival of the first [voluntary return flight from Kuwait](#) carrying 300 Sudanese citizens is being used to signal that the capital is once again safe for habitation. Similarly, the hosting of [1,600 Darfuri students](#) for exams in Nile River State is presented as a model of national unity.
- **Legal Realignment with International Norms:** The government is prioritizing the [alignment of the 1999 Antiquities Protection Law](#) with UNESCO standards to facilitate the recovery of looted artifacts. Concurrently, a high-level committee led by Ibrahim Jaber is enforcing [anti-money laundering and counter-terrorism](#) financing standards.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Technology Policy & Digital Sovereignty

The government is leaning into digital governance to streamline trade and monitor the financial sector.

- The "Baladna" platform was launched to [link government institutions electronically](#) for import and export transactions, aimed at reducing corruption and accelerating clearing processes.

- Mining officials announced a shift toward using [Artificial Intelligence \(AI\) systems](#) to monitor occupational health and safety standards in the gold sector.
- Sudan's embassy in Ethiopia began [issuing National Numbers and passports](#) to citizens abroad, attempting to maintain the state's link to the diaspora via digital identity.

Corruption & Governance The "illegal collection" of road fees and checkpoints remains a major hurdle for economic recovery.

- The Technical Committee for Preventing Illegal Collection issued [decisions to remove checkpoints](#) on the Medani-Sennar road, describing them as a source of corruption.
- The government stressed that all [revenue must be deposited](#) via electronic or approved paper receipts to ensure funds reach the Ministry of Finance rather than local militias or corrupt officials.

Energy Security Rebuilding the power sector is viewed as the linchpin for citizen returns.

- The Ministry of Energy is addressing [massive damage to the network](#), warning citizens to stop illegal connections that destabilize the fragile grid.
- Strategic cooperation with [Egypt \(electricity link\)](#), Saudi Arabia (fuel), and Libya (fuel via the Sahel-Sahara Bank) is being formalized to secure stable supply chains.

Critical Minerals Gold remains the primary engine of the state economy, though its environmental impact is under fire.

- Nile River State reportedly produces [70% of Sudan's gold](#), but the governor warned that mining operations must be moved at least 25km away from residential and agricultural zones to protect public health.
- The Mineral Resources Company declared 2026 the [year of safety and health](#), focusing on the psychological and social environment of mining workers.

International Relations & Foreign Policy

Sudan is aggressively defending its legitimacy while seeking reconstruction partners.

- Turkey's Tika agency is rehabilitating the [Soba West Central Nursery](#) and provided solar power and transformers to various universities and localities.
- State analysts condemned the ["Berlin Conference" and the "Quartet"](#) for excluding the official government, viewing these initiatives as attempts to legitimize the RSF.
- Sudan praised [Saudi Arabia's Crown Prince](#) for direct engagement with the US to clarify the "real situation" in Sudan, countering what it calls a "distorted mental image" in the West.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The governance focus today centered on tightening regulatory frameworks over the media, financial transparency, and cultural property, alongside ambitious social welfare proposals for the post-war phase.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Antiquities Protection Law of 1999 (Amendment):** Discussion of urgent legislative amendments to [update definitions of cultural property](#) and stiffen penalties for looting and illegal export, aligning with UNESCO's 1970 convention.
- **Mining Occupational Safety Standards:** Implementation of continuous improvement principles and [AI-driven monitoring](#) for mining site safety.
- **Youth Productive Housing Policy:** A proposal for [one million productive housing units](#) designed to move beyond traditional aid to a productive economic model for youth.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Ministry of Information Press Circular:** Issuance of a [legal ultimatum to media outlets](#) to register and obtain permits by June 1, 2026, or face prosecution.
- **Anti-Money Laundering Committee First Meeting:** Ibrahim Jaber chaired the inaugural meeting to [execute standards against money laundering](#), terrorism financing, and gold smuggling.
- **Darfur Displacement Briefing:** The Governor of North Darfur requested a [precise census of displaced persons](#) and host families to better allocate humanitarian aid.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

From Crisis Management to "State Cleansing" A recurring linguistic shift is evident across several broadcasts: the use of the term "cleansing" (*tathir*) rather than just "liberation." This applies not only to the

[physical removal of RSF "filth"](#) from cities but also to the economy and information space. The Anti-Money Laundering Committee spoke of ["cleaning the Sudanese square"](#) of war-related effects like currency speculation and gold smuggling. This suggests the government is framing its current phase as a purification of the state apparatus and society from "malignant" influences introduced during the conflict.

Filling the "Political Vacuum" Political analysts highlighted a critical concern: the "political vacuum" left by the conflict, which they argue has been filled by "enemies of Sudan" who ["roam the world" claiming to represent](#) the Sudanese people. The consolidation of the "Democratic Bloc"—a coalition of political parties and armed movements aligned with the state—is being positioned as the only [legitimate civil face](#) of the nation. This reflects an urgent effort to preempt international diplomatic tracks (like the Berlin or London conferences) that might favor non-SAF-aligned civilian groups.

The Weaponization of Normalcy The state is aggressively projecting normalcy as a strategic tool. High-profile coverage of [reopening Khartoum's airport](#) to international flights (via Kuwait Airways) and the hosting of [Darfur's students for exams](#) in the relatively peaceful north serves to contrast the state's "order" with the "chaos" of RSF-held areas. This narrative is essential for encouraging the return of middle-class professionals and the diaspora, whose skills are needed for the [reconstruction of the energy](#) and health sectors.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a flurry of media registration applications as the June 1

deadline approaches. Platforms that fail to comply—particularly those perceived as neutral or sympathetic to the RSF—will likely be [blocked or their local offices raided](#). On the military front, the intelligence provided by [Nour al-Qoba](#) may lead to surgical strikes on RSF supply lines in North Darfur.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The government will likely attempt to hold regional "conferences for reconstruction" in Khartoum or Port Sudan to bypass external diplomatic tracks. The [Million Housing Unit](#) project and energy grid repairs will become the primary metrics of state success. However, the [dependency on Turkey, Saudi Arabia, and Egypt](#) for these projects will deepen Sudan's alignment with a specific regional bloc.

Long Term (1-5 Years): The transition of [armed movements into political parties](#) within the Democratic Bloc will reshape Sudan's political landscape. If successful, this "militarized civilian" governance model could stabilize the country but may delay a return to pure technocratic or liberal democratic rule. The [anti-money laundering frameworks](#) established now will be the foundation for Sudan's eventual reentry into the global financial system.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The EU's stance on foreign interference is being utilized to [pressure the UAE](#); policymakers should prepare for heightened Sudanese diplomatic assertiveness in international forums like the UN Security Council.

- The government's new [media licensing requirement](#) poses a risk to press freedom; diplomatic missions should monitor the June 1 deadline to prevent the total silencing of independent voices.
- Reconstruction efforts are increasingly [channeled through Turkish and Saudi agencies](#), potentially sidelining Western NGOs and developmental partners.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- The "Baladna" platform represents a [significant shift toward transparency](#) in trade; importers and exporters should prepare for a transition to mandatory digital transactions.
- The [mining sector is facing stricter environmental](#) and safety regulations; firms operating in Nile River State must evaluate their proximity to residential zones to avoid legal shutdowns.
- Infrastructure opportunities in [housing and power](#) are expanding, but rely heavily on government "Hope" project guarantees, necessitating careful risk assessment of the state's financial liquidity.
