DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

On the 60th day of the "Ramadan War," the conflict between the United States-Israeli alliance and the Axis of Resistance has evolved into a high-stakes war of attrition characterized by severe global economic disruptions and domestic political instability within the United States. Following the death of the previous Leader of the Islamic Revolution, Iran has successfully transitioned power to Sayyid Mujtaba Khamenei, who today emphasized national endurance and the failure of Western efforts to incite internal collapse. Iranian state organs remain defiant, dismissing claims from the Trump administration regarding the imminent destruction of oil infrastructure and instead highlighting the "humiliating defeat" of U.S. naval assets in the region.

The strategic centerpiece of the day is the continued weaponization of the Strait of

Hormuz. Despite a nominal ceasefire that is "hanging by a thread," Iran continues to exercise de facto control over maritime traffic, driving global oil prices to over \$126 per barrel and causing cascading failures in global supply chains for plastics, aluminum, and fertilizers. In Washington, the political fallout is intensifying; Secretary of War Pete Hegseth faced a bruising six-hour congressional hearing where lawmakers labeled the war a "strategic blunder" and a "self-inflicted wound." Simultaneously, the humanitarian crisis in Gaza has expanded into international waters, with Israeli forces reportedly seizing a large humanitarian flotilla near Crete, further isolating the alliance from European and regional partners.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Consolidation of Iranian Leadership

- Sayyid Mujtaba Khamenei issued a high-profile message on National Persian Gulf Day, framing the [humiliating defeat](#) of U.S. and Israeli forces as the precursor to a new global order.
- Nationwide rallies were held to [renew allegiance](#) to the new leader, signaling a successful transition 40 days after the death of the previous leader.
- Parliament Speaker Mohammad Baqir Ghalibaf asserted that the Iranian government and military remain [completely united](#), contrary to Western reports of internal rifts.

U.S. Military and Political Crisis

- Secretary of War Pete Hegseth was grilled by Congress over the [ballooning costs](#) of the war, estimated at \$25 billion, and the depletion of critical munitions.

- Reports confirm the [loss of 44 U.S. aircraft](#) since late February, including F-15s and MQ-9 Reaper drones, costing approximately \$8 billion in air assets alone.
- The USS Gerald R. Ford is set to [leave West Asia](#) following 300+ days of deployment, citing technical failures and the need for major repairs, reducing the U.S. naval footprint.

Global Economic Fallout

- Oil prices have surged to [over \\$126 per barrel](#) as daily transits through the Strait of Hormuz have plummeted from 129 to just a few vessels.
- The blockade has triggered a [30-47% spike](#) in fertilizer prices (nitrogen and urea), threatening global food security and pushing an estimated 30 million people toward poverty.
- European airlines warned of significant [hikes in ticket prices](#) due to fuel surcharges and the necessity of re-routing around the conflict zone.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security & Critical Infrastructure

- Ghalibaf dismissed President Trump's social media claims of [exploding oil infrastructure](#), offering to live-stream well operations to prove their integrity.
- Iran's Navy Commander, Rear Admiral Shahram Irani, warned of a [dreadful new weapon](#) that will be revealed soon to "strike fear" into enemies near Iranian waters.
- Total Energy CEO warned that France's energy reserves will only [last 2-3 months](#) if disruptions in the Strait of Hormuz persist.

Economic Security & Financial Statecraft

- The U.S. Treasury has [withheld \\$500 million](#) in cash shipments to Iraq, citing concerns over funds reaching the Islamic Resistance, sparking a liquidity crisis in Baghdad.
- Iran's Ambassador to Moscow confirmed a strategic shift toward [national currency use](#) (Ruble and Rial) within the BRICS framework to bypass the "dictatorship of the dollar."
- The UAE is facing a significant [investor confidence crisis](#), with reports of expatriates relocating as the "security promise" of Dubai is undermined by regional instability.

Regional Influence & Power Projection

- The "Greater Israel" project is cited by regional analysts as the [central driver](#) of the war, with Israel allegedly seeking to annex southern Lebanon up to the Litani River.
- Hizbullah has introduced [fiber-optic guided drones](#) that are immune to electronic jamming and GPS spoofing, significantly altering the battlefield dynamics in southern Lebanon.
- Bahrain has moved to [revoke the citizenship](#) of dozens of nationals for expressing sympathy with Iran, a move condemned by human rights activists as a violation of international law.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity centered on aggressive oversight of the Trump administration's war conduct and the financial repercussions of the blockade. Debate in Tehran and Washington reflects two different realities: one of defiant

consolidation and the other of fractured accountability.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS

- **U.S. House Armed Services Committee Hearing:** A volatile session where Secretary Pete Hegseth was accused of [lying to the public](#) about war objectives and the "catastrophic" bombing of an elementary school in Iran that killed 165 children.
- **National Persian Gulf Day Statement:** President Pezeshkian reaffirmed that regional security must rely on [regional cooperation](#) and the exclusion of "hostile states" from maritime governance.
- **Iraqi Central Bank Briefing:** Officials addressed the risk of [dangerous escalation](#) following the U.S. Federal Reserve's decision to halt dollar shipments required for public sector salaries.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Collapse of Strategic Ambiguity

The conflict has transitioned from localized skirmishes to a transparent global war of attrition. Allegations of [dementia and derangement](#) against Donald Trump are being amplified by both domestic U.S. critics and foreign adversaries. This psychological framing serves to delegitimize U.S. diplomatic overtures and portrays the war as the result of personal instability rather than coherent national interest.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect a resumption of high-intensity hostilities if the "ceasefire" expires without a formal extension, as both sides have utilized the pause for [tactical recalibration](#).
- Domestic protests in the U.S. are likely to intensify following the [Hegseth hearings](#) and reports of high civilian casualties in Iran, potentially impacting 2026 midterm election strategies.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- Global food shortages are predicted to peak in late summer due to [fertilizer supply disruptions](#), likely resulting in civil unrest in vulnerable nations like Pakistan, Egypt, and Kenya.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- Urgent humanitarian intervention is required to secure [aid delivery to Gaza](#), as traditional naval flotillas are now being intercepted in international waters.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Manufacturers must anticipate a [3-4 month lag](#) for plastic and aluminum shortages to propagate globally due to the blockade.
- **Financial Resilience:** Institutional investors should [divest from U.S. bonds](#) or hedge against bond yield curve spikes as "unwritten sales ceilings" are hit by Arab institutional investors.
- **Logistics Adaptation:** Maritime insurance rates will remain prohibitive; logistics firms should prioritize [land-based corridors](#) or alternative routes that avoid the Strait of Hormuz entirely.
