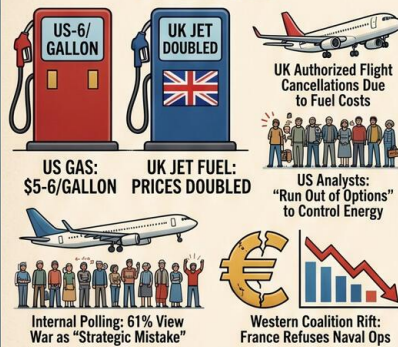

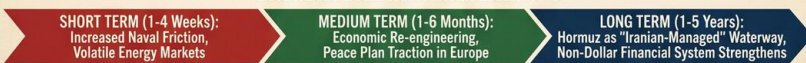

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## IRAN ASSERTS NAVAL SOVEREIGNTY OVER HORMUZ STRAIT AMID ESCALATING GLOBAL ENERGY CRISIS AND DOMESTIC MOBILIZATION

### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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On May 4, 2026, Iranian state media solidified a narrative of "Victory in the Third Imposed War," characterized by a transition from defensive posturing to active enforcement of naval sovereignty in the Hormuz Strait. The Revolutionary Guard (IRGC) and the Iranian Navy have published precise maps of their operational zones, mandating that all commercial and military traffic adhere to Iranian "transit protocols" or face "serious risks." This enforcement is framed as a response to US "maritime piracy" and "Project Liberty," a US-led effort to reopen the strait that Iran dismisses as a failed bluff. State rhetoric suggests the US is currently in a "strategic trap," unable to secure the waterway while suffering from domestic inflation and fuel costs exceeding \$6 per gallon in some regions.

Domestic stability remains a primary focus of the Ebrahim Raisi administration, with the

Ministry of Economy launching a massive three-tier financial support package to prevent labor layoffs in businesses affected by the conflict. While infrastructure damage from US and Israeli strikes is acknowledged—notably the "martyrdom" of 168 students in the Minab school bombing—the government is aggressively promoting reconstruction and "national empathy" (Iran Hamdel) campaigns. Internationally, Iran is highlighting a growing rift in the Western coalition, citing France's refusal to join US naval operations and China's open defiance of US sanctions by continuing to purchase Iranian "shadow fleet" oil.

### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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#### Enforcement of the "Hormuz Protocol"

- The IRGC published a detailed map defining the limits of the Hormuz Strait, extending from Mubarak Mountain in Iran to Fujairah in the UAE, and from Qeshm to Umm Al-Quwain [published the map](#).
- Commander of the Khatam al-Anbiya Central Headquarters warned that any approaching US naval assets would be [targeted for attack](#).
- Reports indicate that Iran has begun collecting "transit fees" for environmental and safety services, with 30% allocated to military funding and 70% to public welfare [collecting transit fees](#).

#### Western Economic Fragility and Fuel Crisis

- UK jet fuel prices have doubled, leading the British government to authorize the [cancellation of flights](#).

- US gas prices are reportedly approaching \$5-6 per gallon, with analysts claiming the US has "run out of options" to [control energy costs](#).
- Internal US polling cited by Iranian media suggests 61% of Americans view the war with Iran as a "strategic mistake" [war is a mistake](#).

## **Domestic Economic Shielding and Reconstruction**

- The Ministry of Economy has initiated a support program for small, medium, and large enterprises, offering [loans of 44 million Tomans](#) per worker to prevent layoffs.
- Major infrastructure projects, including the Shahid Soleimani Freeway in Qom, were inaugurated to demonstrate state capacity [Soleimani Freeway inaugurated](#).
- Reconstruction of over 5,000 housing units in Tehran's Region 4 is underway following "US-Zionist" missile strikes [5,181 units repaired](#).

## **KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS**

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### **National Security & Regional Influence**

- Iran has rejected US "Project Liberty" as a propaganda tool and insists that no naval transit has occurred without [explicit Iranian coordination](#).
- The IRGC Navy reportedly fired "warning cruise missiles" and drones at US destroyers attempting to enter the strait with [radars turned off](#).

### **Energy Security & Trade**

- China has officially banned its domestic companies from following US sanctions, signaling a total collapse of the [US maximum pressure](#) campaign.
- Iran's "Shadow Fleet" continues to move oil to the Far East, with one supertanker (the \*Huge\*) successfully evading US naval blockades with [19 million barrels](#).

### **Labor & Social Order**

- The government has increased the credit for "Omid Cards" for mothers and expanded the "Kalabarg" (electronic coupon) system for [87 million citizens](#).
- Public gatherings under the "Iran Hamdel" banner have continued for 64 consecutive nights, serving as a barometer for [regime social support](#).

### **Diplomatic Engagement & Lawfare**

- Iran has presented a "14-point peace plan" through Pakistan, which demands a permanent end to the war but [refuses nuclear concessions](#).
- Legal proceedings have been initiated in the International Court against the US for "war crimes" related to the [Minab school bombing](#).

## **LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP**

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Governance activity has shifted toward wartime emergency measures and social welfare expansions. The Raisi administration is utilizing "data-driven governance" to identify distressed sectors and target subsidies to maintain the labor market.

## BILLS & POLICIES DISCUSSED

- **The 14-Point Peace Proposal:** A diplomatic framework submitted to the US via Pakistan, insisting on an unconditional withdrawal of US forces and a 30-day timeline for a [permanent ceasefire](#).
- **Hormuz Transit Fee Law:** Implementation of a maritime levy on all commercial vessels passing through Iranian-controlled waters, with fees [payable in Rials](#).
- **Enterprise Support Tier-3:** A new policy targeting large firms (over 50 employees) to provide working capital and [liquidity for wages](#).
- **Rural Cooperative Guarantee Expansion:** Increasing the guarantee limit for rural and nomadic cooperative members from 5 million to [100 million Tomans](#).

## HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS

- **Ministry of Economy Briefing:** Dr. Rahimi detailed the use of "Shaparak" transaction data and tax analysis to map [war-impacted business sectors](#).
- **Foreign Ministry Press Conference:** Spokesman Esmail Baghaei emphasized that Iran is the "guardian of the strait" and that US threats [have no utility](#).
- **IRGC Naval Briefing:** Detailed the interception of US destroyers and the publication of the [new maritime map](#).

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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**The Narrative of "American Decline"** State media is heavily investing in the "Vietnamization" of the Iran conflict for the US. Analysts frequently cite the "post-American world," suggesting that the US has

lost its role as the global "hegemonic center" [post-American world](#). This is supported by reports of US bases in the region, particularly "Al-Udeiri" in Kuwait, suffering significant damage from IRGC "Vadeh Sadegh 4" operations, forcing a 90% [withdrawal of personnel](#). The narrative suggests that while the US spends \$1 trillion on its military, it is being defeated by Iran's "asymmetric" and "cheap" drone/missile technology [cheap technology winning](#).

**Strategic Patience vs. Economic Asymmetry** Iran's strategy appears to be a calculated "attrition" of Western energy markets. By restricting Hormuz and forcing the US into "Project Liberty" bluffs, Iran is driving global prices of nickel, jet fuel, and crude to record highs [nickel prices spike](#). The state believes that the Iranian population, accustomed to 47 years of sanctions, has a higher "resilience threshold" than Western voters who are [revolting against gas prices](#). The use of local platforms like "Eitaa" and "Bale" for "digital economy" growth during internet outages is highlighted as a form of [digital sovereignty](#).

**The "Minab Martyrdom" as a Moral Pivot** The bombing of the Shajareh Tayyebbeh school in Minab has been elevated to a central pillar of Iranian war propaganda. It is used to justify the "Third Imposed War" label and to mobilize children as "Mohitiar" (environmental/social) activists under the [Mission Makan](#) program. This theme merges nationalist mourning with a religious call to action, framing the conflict as a struggle for "حق" (truth) against "باطل" (falsehood) [truth vs falsehood](#).

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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### Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Increased naval friction is likely as Iran begins enforcing its "transit fees." Any US attempt to escort ships without Iranian coordination will likely result in [warning fires or interceptions](#).
- Global energy markets will remain volatile; if the UK fuel crisis worsens, expect more severe [domestic flight restrictions](#) in Europe.

### Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- Iran will likely complete the "re-engineering" of its economy toward "downstream industries" and "raw material processing" to bypass maritime export reliance [downstream industry shift](#).
- The 14-point peace plan may gain traction with European allies (France/Spain) who are increasingly vocal about [independence from US policy](#).

### Long Term (1-5 Years)

- Structural shifts in global oil transit: The Hormuz Strait could transition into a permanently "Iranian-managed" waterway with international acceptance of [Iranian maritime law](#).
- The acceleration of the "Non-Dollar" financial system (BRICS/China-Iran) could fundamentally weaken the US Treasury's [sanctions capability](#).

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- **Diplomatic De-escalation:** The US and its allies should evaluate the Iranian 14-point plan seriously, as the current "Project Liberty" naval posture is being [effectively neutralized](#) by Iranian asymmetric forces.
- **Energy Diversification:** European states must accelerate alternative fuel sourcing as the "Hormuz risk" is no longer a theoretical threat but an [enforced reality](#).
- **Alliance Friction:** Policy makers should prepare for a fracture within NATO regarding Iran, as states like France and Spain [publicly condemn US aggression](#).

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** High-tech components and critical minerals (Nickel) will see continued price spikes due to [transit restrictions](#).
- **Maritime Insurance:** Commercial vessels should expect mandatory "Iranian insurance" or transit fees, adding a [fixed cost](#) to all Middle Eastern logistics.
- **Infrastructure Investment:** Opportunities exist in Iranian reconstruction and "digital sovereignty" sectors as the state pivots toward [local platforms](#).
