### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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May 7, 2026, marked a significant pivot in Algerian statecraft, characterized by the elevation of relations with Turkey to a "comprehensive strategic partnership" and a vigorous reassertion of national identity ahead of National Memory Day. President Abdelmajid Tebboune's visit to Ankara culminated in the first session of the [High-Level Strategic Cooperation Council](#), yielding 13 agreements across vital sectors including energy, agriculture, and media. This diplomatic offensive aims to reach a \$10 billion trade volume by 2030, leveraging Turkish industrial expertise to bolster Algerian infrastructure and its "near-shoring" appeal for the African market.

Parallel to this international outreach, the state is intensifying its focus on domestic resilience and historical narrative. The launch of the [Baladna project's first harvest](#) in Adrar signals a concrete step toward food

sovereignty, while President Tebboune's directive to draft a new Law on National Memory serves to solidify the state's anti-colonial stance. Meanwhile, state media continues to highlight systemic instability in neighboring Morocco, contrasting it with Algeria's purported stability and strategic growth. This dual-track approach—securing high-level international partnerships while hardening the domestic ideological and economic base—suggests an administration focused on long-term structural resilience amidst regional volatility.

### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Algerian-Turkish Strategic Realignment:** President Tebboune and President Erdogan co-chaired the inaugural council meeting, signing 13 agreements and setting a [target of \\$10 billion](#) in bilateral trade.
  - Agreements include mutual recognition of driver's licenses, cooperation in media/information to combat "disinformation," and investment promotion through [partnerships between investment agencies](#).
  - Major industrial players like Tosyali (steel) and Tayal (textiles) were highlighted as pillars of this [long-term industrial partnership](#).
- **Institutionalizing "National Memory":** On the eve of the May 8th anniversary of the 1945 massacres, the Presidency announced [two major memory projects](#).
  - A directive was issued for "National Sessions on Memory and History" and the preparation of a [draft bill on National Memory](#) to protect the historical narrative.

- Rhetoric heavily emphasized the "moral downfall" of the colonial era and the refusal to "forget" historical crimes [against defenseless Algerians](#).
- **Agricultural Sovereignty Initiatives:** The Algerian-Qatari "Baladna" project reached a symbolic milestone with its [first harvest of wheat and barley](#) in the southern province of Adrar.
  - The project utilizes 300 hectares of irrigated desert land, aiming to scale up to support [national food security](#).
  - Parallel Turkish agricultural investments in the south, such as the Dunaysir project, emphasize [advanced desert farming techniques](#).
- **Regional Conflict Framing:** Algeria and Turkey expressed "aligned positions" on the Middle East, specifically condemning [zionist violations in Gaza](#) and Lebanon.
  - Notably, the administration condemned violations against the [sovereignty of Somalia](#), framing regional threats in the Horn of Africa as a breach of the UN Charter.
- **Focus on Moroccan Internal Instability:** Extensive reporting detailed [forced demolitions and protests](#) in Casablanca and Agadir.
  - Reports characterized the Moroccan regime (the "Makhzen") as [repressive and "deaf"](#) to the housing and social rights of over 100,000 families.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### Diplomatic Engagement & International Relations

- The elevation of the [Strategic Cooperation Council](#) indicates a shift from transactional trade to a long-term geopolitical alignment with Turkey.
- High-level exchanges emphasized "multilateralism" and "diplomacy of equilibrium," with Turkey positioned as a [facilitator of regional stability](#).
- Diplomatic activity extended to the "Med 9++" initiative, where Algeria discussed [access to fertilizers](#) and global food security via the Strait of Hormuz.

### Economic Security & Investment Climate

- The Turkish Business Forum highlighted the [attractiveness of Algerian energy costs](#) and its role as a "gateway" to the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA).
- Investments by Turkish firms currently total roughly [\\$8 billion](#), largely concentrated in steel, textiles, and construction.
- A [preferential trade agreement](#) is under negotiation to reduce tariffs and customs barriers for specific goods.

### Food and Water Security

- The "Baladna" project's successful experimental harvest in the Sahara suggests a state strategy to [mitigate import dependence](#) on strategic grains.
- State-supported Turkish investments in Adrar are focusing on [diversifying production](#) to include fruit trees and greenhouse tomatoes.

## National Security & Border Stability

- Security forces reported the dismantling of a transnational [organized drug network](#) with links from Morocco to Europe, seizing 84kg of cocaine.
- The administration continues to frame the Sahel region and Western Sahara as [areas of strategic concern](#) where Algeria must regain initiative and influence.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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The current legislative focus is primarily on identity-based lawmaking and economic formalization. The Presidency is leveraging administrative directives to bypass traditional legislative gridlock on sensitive issues like national history, while also seeking to streamline international trade via executive-level bilateral agreements.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### Strategic Convergence with Turkey

The relationship with Turkey has evolved from a purely economic trade-off (Algerian gas for Turkish textiles) into a [shared geopolitical identity](#). Both nations seek "strategic autonomy" from Western-centric alliances. Turkey offers Algeria a path to [standardizing its industrial sector](#) to European levels without the political baggage of traditional European partners. For Turkey, Algeria serves as a stable [hub for Mediterranean and African power](#) projection.

### Identity as a Statecraft Tool

The administration is increasingly using the "Memory" file as a litmus test for diplomatic and domestic loyalty. By proposing a [Law on National Memory](#), the government is effectively "lawfaring" history to ensure internal cohesion. This focus on the [dark colonial past](#) serves to maintain a permanent state of ideological mobilization, particularly useful when facing regional pressures from neighboring Morocco.

### The Southern Pivot: From Desert to Breadbasket

There is a concerted shift toward [Sahara-based industrial agriculture](#). Projects in Adrar (Baladna, Dunaysir) are no longer mere experiments but are being integrated into the [national food security strategy](#). This "southern pivot" aims to utilize deep aquifers and vast

land to decouple the Algerian economy from volatile global grain markets.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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### Short Term (1-4 Weeks):

- Expect heightened domestic mobilization and potentially strained relations with France following the [rhetoric surrounding Memory Day](#).
- Bilateral working groups will likely begin fast-tracking the [preferential trade list](#) to show immediate progress on the \$10 billion goal.

### Medium Term (1-6 Months):

- The [draft law on National Memory](#) will likely move through the legislative process, potentially creating new legal barriers for foreign historical research or media interpretations of the colonial era.
- Further [investment in southern agriculture](#) will likely be announced as the "Baladna" project expands into dairy production.

### Long Term (1-5 Years):

- If current trends continue, Turkey could displace traditional European partners as the [primary non-hydrocarbon investor](#) in Algeria.
- Structural integration of Algerian gas into a [Turkish energy hub](#) for Europe could reshape Mediterranean energy flows, provided the 2027 contract renewals are secured.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- Diplomats should monitor the [Algerian-Turkish alignment on Somalia](#); this represents a widening of Algeria's security concerns into the Horn of Africa.
- The "Memory" legislation indicates a hardening of the state's ideological stance; international partners should expect [increased sensitivity](#) on historical issues in bilateral talks.
- Algeria's growing role as a "hub" for Turkey [within the AfCFTA](#) makes it a key node for any regional African trade strategy.

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Opportunity:** Turkish industrial success in Algeria (Tosyali, Tayal) provides a [proven management roadmap](#) for other foreign investors seeking to benefit from low energy costs.
- **Risk:** Increasing state control over historical and national narratives may lead to [regulatory changes in media](#) and education sectors.
- **Supply Chain:** The move toward [domestic grain production](#) in the south offers long-term stability for the domestic agro-industrial supply chain but requires significant water management oversight.
