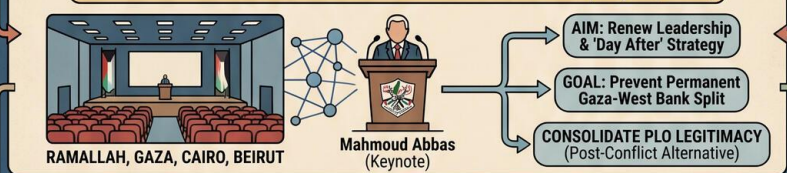

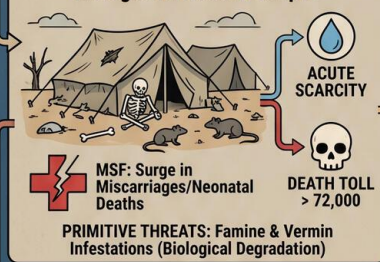

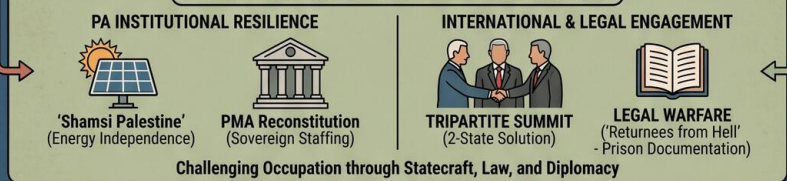

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

May 7, 2026, marks a pivotal moment in the regional security architecture as diplomatic maneuvers for a "Final Deal" between the United States and Iran reach a critical threshold, while on the ground, the humanitarian and military situation in the Palestinian territories and Lebanon deteriorates. US President Donald Trump has signaled a potential [breakthrough agreement](#) to end hostilities before his upcoming visit to China, placing immense pressure on both Tehran and Tel Aviv. This development comes as Israel expands its air campaign in Lebanon, specifically targeting the [Hezbollah Radwan force](#) leadership in Beirut, signaling that a regional ceasefire remains elusive despite the

high-level diplomatic signaling from Washington.

In the Palestinian domestic sphere, the Fatah movement is finalizing preparations for its 8th General Conference on May 14, 2026. This conference is framed as a foundational event to [renew leadership](#) and consolidate a unified "Day After" strategy for Gaza, aiming to prevent the permanent separation of the Strip from the West Bank. However, this political maneuvering occurs against a backdrop of unprecedented humanitarian collapse in Gaza, where the [death toll](#) has surpassed 72,000, and a resurgence of primitive health threats, including famine and [vermin infestations](#) attacking displaced populations in tent camps.

Simultaneously, the West Bank is facing a systematic campaign of structural annexation. Large-scale [agricultural land seizures](#) in Tulkarm for industrial zones and the conversion of the former Qalandia airport into an [Israeli heritage center](#) suggest a transition from temporary military control to permanent civilian infrastructure. These moves, coupled with intensifying settler violence and the withholding of Palestinian clearance funds, are pushing the Palestinian Authority toward a fiscal and security breaking point even as it seeks to revitalize its governing institutions through new leadership appointments and renewable energy initiatives.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Regional Conflict and Lebanon Front Expansion

- Israel launched a significant strike on the [Haret Hreik](#) district in Beirut's southern suburb, reportedly targeting Malik Ballout, a high-ranking commander in Hezbollah's Radwan Force.

- Escalating hostilities in Lebanon have resulted in civilian casualties in [Saksakiyeh and Ansariyeh](#), with Israeli warnings issued for the immediate evacuation of 20 towns and villages in southern Lebanon.
- The Lebanese Ministry of Health reports a total of [2,715 martyrs](#) and over 8,300 injuries since the current escalation cycle began, highlighting the failure of previous ceasefire attempts.

Geopolitical Maneuvering: US-Iran Negotiations

- President Trump announced a [14-point proposal](#) to end the war, threatening intensified bombing if Iran does not accept terms prior to his China visit next week.
- Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu has expressed deep concern to Washington regarding potential [economic sanctions relief](#) for Iran in exchange for nuclear concessions and the clearing of shipping lanes in the Strait of Hormuz.
- Iran is reportedly reviewing the proposal through Pakistani intermediaries, while the IRGC maintains [strict control](#) over maritime traffic in the Gulf.

Palestinian Domestic Politics: Fatah 8th General Conference

- President Mahmoud Abbas is set to deliver a [keynote address](#) on May 14 to open the conference, which will involve 2,500 members across four locations: Ramallah, Gaza, Cairo, and Beirut.
- The conference aims to [inject "new blood"](#) into the Central Committee and Revolutionary Council to confront the "Day After" challenges and administrative reform requirements.

- Fatah leadership emphasizes the movement's role as the [backbone of the PLO](#) and the only entity capable of preventing a permanent Israeli-engineered rift between Gaza and the West Bank.

Gaza Humanitarian and Health Catastrophe

- Doctors Without Borders (MSF) reports a surge in [miscarriages and neonatal deaths](#) directly linked to Israeli-imposed famine and the targeting of medical infrastructure.
- The [vermin infestation](#) in displacement camps has reached a critical stage, with infants suffering from severe rat bites and the spread of zoonotic diseases.
- Water scarcity remains acute, with residents in northern Gaza forced to wait [entire days](#) for a few liters of saline or contaminated water.

West Bank Structural Annexation and Demolitions

- Israeli authorities have moved to approve a [settlement heritage center](#) at the site of the former Qalandia airport, further choking Palestinian contiguity in East Jerusalem.
- A massive [industrial settlement project](#) known as "Bustan Hefetz" is being accelerated in Tulkarm, threatening to seize 800 dunams of agricultural land and isolate the city from its southern rural areas.
- Systematic demolitions of [commercial shops](#) in Eizariya and agricultural structures in the Jordan Valley (Bardala and Al-Mughayir) indicate a strategic effort to dismantle the Palestinian rural economy.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Statecraft and Institutional Resilience

- The Palestinian Authority continues to staff its sovereign institutions, with new [board members](#) of the Palestinian Monetary Authority (PMA) taking their legal oath before President Abbas.
- Prime Minister Mohammad Mustafa launched the "[Shamsi Palestine](#)" program, a \$25 million initiative to fund solar energy projects for local municipalities, aimed at reducing energy dependence on Israel.

International Relations and Diplomatic Engagement

- A tripartite summit between [Jordan, Cyprus, and Greece](#) in Amman reaffirmed that a two-state solution based on 1967 borders is the only path to regional stability.
- President Abbas held high-level [consultations with Canadian PM](#) Mark Carney, discussing Canadian recognition of Palestinian statehood and the implementation of international law.
- Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez has formally called for the [activation of "blocking mechanisms"](#) to protect ICC and UN officials from US and Israeli sanctions during their investigations into genocide.

Legal Warfare (Lawfare)

- Egyptian and Palestinian journalists in Cairo launched a [new book](#), "Returnees from Hell," documenting Israeli prison conditions as a legal tool for future international prosecutions.

- The PA is leveraging the [National Observatory](#) for Monitoring Violence Against Women to document both social and occupation-linked violence for reporting to international human rights bodies.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Governance activity focused on administrative staffing of financial regulators and the pursuit of energy independence policies through municipal funding frameworks.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Presidential Decree on PMA Reconstitution:** Formalizes the [reconstitution of the board](#) of the Palestinian Monetary Authority, including representatives from the Ministry of Finance and independent experts.
- **Draft Palestinian "Temporary Constitution":** Discussion of a constitutional bridge to transition from a self-governing authority to a [sovereign state](#) under occupation, focusing on institutional permanence.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Fatah 8th Conference Briefing:** Executive Director Munir Salama detailed [voting procedures](#) and the use of video-conferencing for members in Gaza and the diaspora to ensure a simultaneous democratic process.
- **Solar Energy Program Launch:** PM Mustafa signed agreements between the [PMA, Energy Authority, and UNDP](#) to provide 80% financing and 20% grants for municipal solar projects.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

Consolidating Political Legitimacy in the "Day After" Shadow

The Fatah 8th General Conference is less about internal party mechanics and more about establishing a legitimate governing alternative to Hamas for the post-conflict period. By convening 2,500 delegates across [disparate geographies](#), Fatah is attempting to demonstrate a national reach that its rivals currently lack due to military degradation. The emphasis on "new blood" and "revitalization" is a direct response to international pressure for a "revamped" Palestinian Authority capable of managing Gaza. This political maneuvers are designed to prove that the PLO remains the [sole representative](#) of the Palestinian people before any regional "Final Deal" is signed by the US and Iran.

The Weaponization of Agriculture and Infrastructure

A distinct trend in the West Bank is the shift from sporadic settlement expansion to the **dismantling of the Palestinian rural backbone**. The acceleration of the [Bustan Hefetz industrial project](#) and the destruction of greenhouses in Bardala and Al-Mughayir target the PA's economic self-sufficiency. By destroying the "Bada" (seed) distribution centers and the [agricultural research stations](#) in Jenin, Israeli forces are effectively targeting the long-term food security and genomic heritage of Palestinian agriculture. This "economic lawfare" is intended to make Palestinian presence in Area C unsustainable, forcing a migration toward urban enclaves.

Primitive Biological Threats as War Metrics

Humanitarian reports have moved beyond kinetic casualties to document the **biological degradation** of Gaza. The report of an [infant bitten by a rat](#) in a Khan Yunis tent is emblematic of a broader collapse in basic sanitation (biosurveillance). The intersection of destroyed sewage systems and the blockage of hygiene products has created a niche for vermin and zoonotic diseases. This is being analyzed not as collateral damage, but as a deliberate [policy of attrition](#) against the civilian population to facilitate voluntary migration or total administrative collapse.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect a surge in military activity in [southern Lebanon](#) as Israel attempts to degrade Hezbollah's command-and-control ahead of any US-brokered regional pause.
- The Fatah 8th Conference will likely result in a consolidated leadership body under Abbas, aimed at securing [international donor confidence](#) for Gaza reconstruction.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- The US-Iran deal, if signed, could lead to a [reopening of the Strait of Hormuz](#), but internal Israeli political instability may grow as the right-wing coalition views a Trump-Tehran pact as a "betrayal."
- Palestinian municipalities will likely begin the [installation of solar grids](#) to bypass Israeli electric company (IEC) shutdowns, though these assets will be at high risk for Israeli military confiscation in Area C.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- The West Bank may be transformed into a series of [industrial-settlement blocks](#), permanently severing the northern and southern districts and rendering the 1967 borders physically impossible to restore.
- Succession planning within Fatah will move to the forefront; the 8th Conference is the [bridge](#) between the "Old Guard" and a new generation of technocratic/nationalist leaders who will navigate a post-Abbas era.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Security Interventions:** International actors must prioritize the protection of [UN and ICC officials](#) to ensure that legal accountability mechanisms remain functional despite threats of unilateral sanctions.
- **Humanitarian Health:** Immediate air-drops or corridors specifically for [veterinary and pest control](#) agents are required in Gaza to prevent a zoonotic plague outbreak in displaced camps.
- **Diplomatic Recognition:** The trend toward [Canadian and European recognition](#) of Palestine provides a counter-weight to the physical annexation of the West Bank, but it must be backed by fiscal guarantees to the PA.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Renewable Energy:** The PA's ["Shamsi" project](#) represents a significant opportunity for solar technology providers and micro-grid engineers, albeit with high political risk regarding asset seizure.

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Continued IRGC maritime [boarding operations](#) in the Gulf mean that shipping insurance rates will remain volatile until the 14-point US-Iran deal is fully ratified and operational.
- **Agricultural Resilience:** There is a niche for investments in [genomic seed banks](#) and off-site Palestinian agricultural research to preserve native landraces currently under threat of destruction in Jenin and Tulkarm.
