

SUDAN ASSERTS SOVEREIGN  
AUTHORITY AMID ESCALATING  
REGIONAL CONFLICT AND MOVES  
TOWARD DIGITAL GOVERNANCE

### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

---

On May 7, 2026, the Sudanese "Government of Hope" intensified its campaign to consolidate sovereign legitimacy while confronting a significant escalation in regional hostilities. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs issued a stern directive to the United Nations and international NGOs, explicitly [rejecting any registration](#) with parallel humanitarian bodies established by the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) "Daghlo Militia." This move is a strategic attempt to prevent the institutionalization of the RSF's political wing, "Tasees," which the government characterizes as a direct threat to the unity and territorial integrity of the state.

Simultaneously, the conflict has taken a dangerous geopolitical turn following drone strikes on Khartoum International Airport. Sudanese military officials and analysts have [directly accused Ethiopia](#) of launching these strategic drones from Bahir Dar, signaling a breakdown in "good neighborly" relations and

alleging a coordinated effort between the UAE and Ethiopia to destabilize the Sudanese state. Domestically, Prime Minister Dr. Kamel Idris led a high-profile delegation to Omdurman to signal a return to normalcy, announcing significant tax cuts for traders and a transition to [electronic payment platforms](#) to eliminate illegal collections and "gray" economy leakages.

### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

---

- **Rejection of Parallel Governance:** The Foreign Ministry summoned the UN Resident Coordinator to declare that any institutional dealing with the RSF-led "National Authority for Humanitarian Access" would be viewed as a [violation of Sudanese sovereignty](#) and international law. This follows an RSF order requiring NGOs to register with them within 30 days.
- **Ethiopian Drone Escalation:** Military trackers reportedly confirmed that drones targeting vital infrastructure in Khartoum [originated from Ethiopian territory](#). This development has prompted calls for the government to reassess diplomatic ties and border security with Addis Ababa.
- **Omdurman Normalization Drive:** Prime Minister Idris toured the Sajjana and Omdurman markets, ordering the immediate [restoration of electricity and water](#) services. He also slashed seasonal licensing fees by 50% to encourage displaced traders to resume operations.
- **Blue Nile "Popular Resistance" Success:** Reports from the Shamar region in the Blue Nile highlight a successful counter-insurgency effort where local "Mustanfaren" (volunteers) used [traditional white weapons](#) to repel heavily armed RSF units, reportedly winning nine consecutive battles.

- **Educational Continuity Abroad:** Despite the war, the Sudanese Academy in Mauritania successfully conducted [elementary certificate examinations](#) for the third consecutive year, supported by the Ministry of Education in Gezira State and Mauritanian authorities.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

---

**International Relations & Geopolitical Power Dynamics** The Sudanese government is navigating a fractured regional landscape. While the Arab League, Kuwait, and the Muslim World League [condemned the airport attacks](#), the focus has shifted toward the "Ethiopian-UAE axis." Analysts suggest that Ethiopia's alleged involvement is an attempt to [weaken Egyptian influence](#) by proxy through the destabilization of Sudan. The government is being urged to shift from "traditional diplomacy" to more aggressive international legal warfare to hold neighboring states accountable for hosting "launching pads" for attacks.

**Economic Security & Statecraft** A pivot toward digital governance is underway to address systemic corruption and revenue loss. The Prime Minister announced the upcoming launch of the ["Beladuna" \(Our Country\) platform](#), a mandatory electronic payment system for all government services. This is intended to stop "illegal collections" and "levies" that have historically impoverished citizens without benefiting the state treasury. Furthermore, the government is exploring [strategic financing for agriculture](#) through partnerships between the Gedarif state executive and banking sectors to ensure the upcoming season's success.

**National Security & Civil Unrest** The rise of "Popular Resistance" (Mustanfaren)

remains a cornerstone of the state's survival strategy. In the Blue Nile and Gedarif regions, community-based militias are being [integrated into the security architecture](#), presenting a narrative of "One Army, One People." However, internal fissures within rebel movements are also emerging; clashes were reported in the Kauda region between the [Al-Hulu faction and dissident groups](#) over control of gold mines, indicating that resource-driven conflict remains a volatile secondary threat.

**Health & Biosurveillance** Despite the conflict, the Ministry of Health is maintaining its public health mandates. Celebrating World Malaria Day in Port Sudan, the government signed a [strategic honor charter](#) with international partners to drive toward a "Malaria-Free Sudan." The health strategy is increasingly reliant on "community awareness" and the [integration of local municipalities](#) to combat disease vectors in war-impacted urban centers.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

---

Legislative activity focused on institutional reform, particularly in the agricultural and transparency sectors, alongside executive decrees aimed at stabilizing recaptured territories.

### BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Gezira Project Law Amendment (2005):** The Minister of Justice announced the formation of a committee to [amend the Gezira Project Law](#) to address application issues, protect state assets from encroachment, and formalize state ownership of production processes.

- **National Integrity and Transparency Act:** A new oversight body was formalized with the appointment of Police Lt. Gen. Abdeen Al-Tahir as the [Head of the Integrity and Transparency Commission](#), tasked with monitoring government expenditure and conduct.

## HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Foreign Ministry Press Briefing:** Formal notification to UN agencies [rejecting RSF-led humanitarian structures](#) as violations of Security Council resolutions.
- **Omdurman Executive Tour:** Prime Minister Idris and the Governor of Khartoum held an [on-site market hearing](#), resulting in immediate executive orders for tax relief and infrastructure repair.
- **Traffic Week Launch:** The Ministry of Interior inaugurated Arab Traffic Week under the slogan "Slow Down, We are Waiting for You," including a [50% discount on all traffic-related fees](#) for citizens.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

---

**The Weaponization of Humanitarian Legitimacy** A critical battleground has emerged over the administration of humanitarian aid. The RSF's attempt to force NGO registration is a "soft state" tactic designed to gain de facto international recognition. The government's counter-move—threatening to expel or punish organizations that comply with RSF mandates—forces international actors into a [binary choice between legitimacy and access](#). This trend suggests that humanitarian corridors will become increasingly politicized, potentially leading to aid blockages in RSF-controlled

areas if the UN adheres to the government's sovereign demands.

**The Digital State as a War Survival Mechanism** The push for the "Beladuna" electronic platform and the [digitalization of traffic and licensing services](#) is not merely modernization; it is a survival strategy. By eliminating cash transactions, the government aims to starve local corruption networks and ensure that every pound of revenue reaches the central "Government of Hope" treasury. This [digitalization of the social contract](#) is intended to restore public trust in state institutions even as those institutions remain under military siege.

**Regional Proxy War Escalation** The explicit naming of Ethiopia and the UAE as aggressors marks the end of diplomatic ambiguity. Public sentiment, as reflected in citizen interviews, is shifting from internal grievance to [xenophobic hostility toward neighboring states](#) perceived as "betraying" Sudanese hospitality. The narrative of "Ethiopian drones" targeting "civilian infrastructure" like the airport serves to galvanize nationalist fervor and [justify continued mass mobilization](#) of the Mustanfareen.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

---

**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect a significant diplomatic cooling between Sudan and Ethiopia, potentially involving the withdrawal of ambassadors. The 30-day deadline imposed by the RSF for NGO registration will create a [operational crisis for aid agencies](#), likely resulting in temporary suspensions of services in Darfur and Kordofan as NGOs navigate the legal risks of compliance with "illegal" bodies.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The "Beladuna" platform rollout will likely face

implementation hurdles in conflict zones but could stabilize the exchange rate in government-held areas by centralizing revenue. Agricultural yields in Gedarif and Blue Nile will be the [primary indicator of state resilience](#); failure to secure harvest financing through the new banking agreements could lead to severe food insecurity by late 2026.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** Sudan is moving toward a highly decentralized security model where "Popular Resistance" groups may become permanent paramilitary fixtures, similar to regional models in Iran or Iraq. The ["state of citizenship" projects](#) mentioned by leadership will struggle against the reality of a militarized society, leading to a long-term challenge in disarming these groups once the primary RSF threat is neutralized.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

---

### For International Policy:

- The international community must reconcile the [tension between sovereign law and humanitarian necessity](#). Strict adherence to the Khartoum government's demands may leave millions in RSF zones without aid.
- Regional mediators should pivot to addressing the [Ethiopia-Sudan border tension](#) immediately to prevent the civil war from expanding into a full-scale interstate conflict.
- Support for Sudan's digital governance initiatives could be a non-kinetic way to [strengthen state capacity](#) and reduce corruption in the transition period.

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- The shift to [electronic payments \(Beladuna\)](#) presents an entry point for fintech firms specializing in government-to-citizen (G2C) platforms and secure transaction processing.
- Agricultural investors should focus on the [Gedarif and Blue Nile regions](#), where the government is actively prioritizing infrastructure and credit facilities for the "Security and Resilience" agricultural season.
- Significant risks remain regarding infrastructure; the recent drone attacks on [Khartoum Airport](#) indicate that logistics and supply chains remain highly vulnerable to strategic air threats despite local ground gains.
