### RUSSIA'S SCALED-BACK VICTORY DAY: Systemic Strikes, Internal Pivots & Geopolitical Shifts

A narrative of high alert in Moscow, the search for an "Image of Victory," and the ripple effects across the region.

#### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE: The Eve of May 9



Moscow on **HIGH ALERT**. Massive Ukrainian **DRONE STRIKES** hit energy/industrial sites (Yaroslavl, Perm, Rostov, Grozny). Unprecedented parade security: mobile internet & SMS **DISABLED** in capital. Zelensky warns foreign leaders against attending due to **RISKS**.

#### THE KREMLIN'S "IMAGE OF VICTORY" PIVOT

Leaked documents reveal strategic reframing to sell peace. Focus shifts to "protecting Donbas" and standing against "50 hostile countries" to appease an economically exhausted public. Acknowledges need to manage expectations, risks of prolonged mobilization, and "veteran threat".

#### THE "LOGIC OF CHAOS": MERCENARY RECRUITMENT

Armenia accelerates departure from Russian sphere, hosts European summit. Georgia attempts tactical reset with West, despite US sanctions.

**SOFT POWER:** Russia uses culture (ballet, opera) in Italy to counter sanctions and spread "anti-imperialist" rhetoric.

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RUSSIA PREPARES FOR A SCALED-BACK VICTORY DAY AMID SYSTEMIC DRONE STRIKES AND INTERNAL PLANNING FOR AN EVENTUAL WAR EXIT.

### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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On the eve of the May 9 Victory Day celebrations, Moscow remains on high alert following a massive wave of Ukrainian drone strikes targeting critical infrastructure across the Russian Federation. Strikes have been reported at oil refineries in [Yaroslavl and Perm](#), as well as industrial sites in Rostov and Grozny. In response, Russian authorities have implemented unprecedented security measures for the Red Square parade, including [disabling mobile internet and SMS services](#) in the capital. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky has publicly advised foreign leaders against attending the Moscow event, citing the Kremlin's failure to observe a proposed truce and the high risk of kinetic activity near the festivities.

Simultaneously, leaked documents from the Russian Presidential Administration reveal a strategic pivot in domestic propaganda, as officials begin drafting an ["Image of Victory"](#)

to sell a potential negotiated peace to the Russian public. This narrative emphasizes a "victory over globalism" rather than total Ukrainian capitulation, signaling an internal awareness of economic exhaustion and the risks of prolonged mobilization. To sustain current front-line operations without triggering domestic unrest, Russia is increasingly relying on [foreign mercenaries recruited](#) from Africa, Asia, and the Middle East, often through deceptive employment schemes or coercive visa tactics. This "logic of chaos" reflects a shift toward prioritizing immediate manpower needs over long-term social or diplomatic stability.

### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Systemic Ukrainian Drone Offensive Targeting Energy Infrastructure**
  - Significant strikes hit the [Slavneft oil refinery](#) in Yaroslavl, one of Russia's largest, and the LUKOIL-Permnefteorgsintez facility in Perm.
  - In Rostov-on-Don, a drone strike on an [air navigation building](#) grounded flights at 13 southern Russian airports.
  - Russian Ministry of Defense claimed to have intercepted [264 Ukrainian drones](#) in a single night, though reports confirm multiple impacts on industrial targets.

- **Leaked Kremlin Strategy for Ending the War**

- The "Dossier Center" obtained a presentation from the Presidential Administration (AP) outlining how to [reframe the war's end](#) as a victory even if original goals remain unfulfilled.
- The plan suggests defining victory as [protecting the Donbas](#) and standing up to "50 hostile countries," while preparing for a "controlled thaw" in civil society to appease an exhausted population.
- Internal risks identified include [demographic crisis](#), the need for tax hikes, and the threat posed by returning veterans.

- **Recruitment of Global South Mercenaries**

- Russia has reportedly recruited at least [27,000 foreign citizens](#) for the war, including nationals from Kenya, Egypt, India, and Uzbekistan.
- Deceptive practices include promising [non-combat jobs](#) or threatening to revoke student/work visas if a military contract is not signed.
- Foreigners are often utilized as ["cannon meat"](#) with little to no training, frequently ending up in Ukrainian captivity or killed in the first days of deployment.

- **Baltic State Security Hardening and Hybrid Threats**

- Two Russian drones reportedly entered [Latvian airspace near Rezekne](#) early in the morning, prompting a crisis management meeting.
- Latvia is actively [enforcing language requirements](#) for Russian citizens, resulting in several deportations and residency revocations for those failing to comply.
- The Daugavpils Regional Hospital dismissed [49 employees](#) with Russian or Belarusian passports due to their exclusion from "critical infrastructure" roles under national security laws.

- **Georgia's Political Recalibration**

- Georgian authorities arrested [five law enforcement officers](#) for excessive force during protests, a move seen as a tactical attempt by Bidzina Ivanishvili to reset relations with the West.
- The US has maintained [financial and visa sanctions](#) against Georgian officials, while Armenia continues its pivot toward the EU by hosting a major European political summit.

## **KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS**

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**Critical Infrastructure and Economic Security** The Russian energy sector is under sustained pressure as Ukrainian long-range strikes reach deep into the interior, hitting facilities as far as [1,500 kilometers from the border](#). These attacks threaten fuel supplies and export capacity. Meanwhile, in the Baltics, the definition of critical infrastructure is being used to [purge non-loyalist personnel](#) from hospitals and energy sites, reflecting a shift toward total security compartmentalization.

**Geopolitical Power Dynamics and Strategic Alignment** Armenia is accelerating its [departure from the Russian sphere](#), with Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan explicitly stating that Yerevan is not Russia's ally in the Ukraine war. Concurrently, Russia's "soft power" efforts in Italy, including [artistic and cultural events](#), are being used to circumvent sanctions and maintain a foothold in European public discourse through "anti-imperialist" rhetoric.

**Technology and Digital Sovereignty** The emergence of new [methane-monitoring satellites](#) (MethaneSat) represents a leap in environmental biosurveillance, allowing for the precise measurement of emissions from energy extraction sites globally. In the medical field, the development of the ["Dot" brain implant](#) for treating depression without internal batteries highlights rapid advancements in neurotechnology.

**Domestic Stability and Social Order** Russian social order is under threat from [rising inflation](#), with "Victory Day picnic kits" (meat, grill, supplies) seeing a 52% price increase since 2022. The Kremlin is also wary of the ["veteran threat,"](#) identifying returning combatants as a group capable of organized dissent if not properly integrated or diverted to foreign missions.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative activity today focused heavily on national security and immigration controls in the Baltic region, as well as shifts in Georgian law enforcement accountability.

## BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Latvian National Security Law Amendments:** Prohibits citizens of "aggressor states" (Russia/Belarus) from working in [critical infrastructure sectors](#), including healthcare and energy.
- **Latvian Immigration Law (A2 Language Exam):** Mandates [basic Latvian language proficiency](#) for Russian citizens seeking to retain permanent residency; failure results in residency revocation and potential deportation.
- **Armenian Law on EU Accession:** Formalizes the [legislative path toward European Union membership](#) as Yerevan distances itself from the CSTO.

## HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Mikhail Yevrayev (Governor of Yaroslavl) Briefing:** Confirmed a drone strike on a [major industrial object](#) but claimed immediate containment by emergency services.
- **Dmitry Peskov (Kremlin Spokesperson) Briefing:** Denied any [proposed truce](#) from Ukraine and confirmed "additional security measures" for President Putin during the May 9th parade.
- **Yuri Ushakov (Kremlin Aide) Statement:** Asserted that Russia sees [no sense in negotiations](#) until Ukraine withdraws from the Donbas.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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**The Weaponization of "Soft Power" and Culture** Russia continues to use its cultural heritage—specifically ballet, opera, and classical music—as a [diplomatic wedge in Italy](#). By framing protests against Russian

performers as "Russophobia," Moscow exploits traditional Italian political leanings and artistic appreciation to maintain influence despite official EU policy. This trend suggests a long-term strategy of using cultural "bridge-building" to [undermine political consensus](#) on sanctions within the EU.

**Human Trafficking as Military Recruitment** A disturbing trend has emerged where Russian recruitment has shifted from domestic mobilization to the [coercive recruitment of Global South migrants](#). Foreigners are often lured with promises of agricultural or construction work only to be forced into [military service](#). This avoids the domestic political cost of a new "partial mobilization" but creates a fragmented, low-effectiveness force that complicates the legal status of prisoners of war.

**The "Victory Image" and Domestic Realignment** The Kremlin's internal planning for an ["Image of Victory"](#) indicates a realistic assessment that total victory is unachievable. The focus is shifting toward ["managing expectations"](#) of the Russian public by reclassifying success. This includes promising a "return to normalcy" with restored mobile links and an end to drone sirens, admitting that the current "war of attrition" is [unsustainable for Russian living standards](#).

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Victory Day (May 9) will likely see [asymmetric attacks](#) within Russia, potentially targeting the parade's periphery or logistics. Expect Moscow to retaliate with [missile strikes on Kyiv](#), specifically targeting government buildings, as threatened by Maria Zakharova. Social media censorship and internet shutdowns in Moscow will likely persist through the holiday

weekend to prevent real-time reporting of security failures.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** Recruitment crises in the Russian army will intensify as the pool of [foreign mercenaries](#) and "debtors" shrinks. This may force the Kremlin to choose between a [second mobilization wave](#) or enacting the "controlled thaw" and "Image of Victory" propaganda plans to start winding down high-intensity operations. Latvia and Estonia will likely complete the [deportation of non-compliant Russian residents](#), further inflaming diplomatic tensions.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** Structural changes in the South Caucasus will likely lead to [Armenia joining the EU's sphere](#), potentially leading to the closure of Russian military bases there. Russia's energy infrastructure will require [massive capital reinvestment](#) once kinetic threats subside, as constant drone strikes are causing long-term degradation of refining capabilities. The [re-integration of veterans](#) will become a primary driver of Russian domestic policy, necessitating either a massive social support expansion or increased repression.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- Western nations should prepare for a ["symbolic victory" peace proposal](#) from Moscow, ensuring that any negotiations account for the return of deported children and the [prosecution of war crimes](#) like sexualized violence.
- Support for [human rights monitoring](#) in the Global South is necessary to counteract Russian military recruitment schemes targeting vulnerable migrant populations.

- Baltic security measures, while controversial, will require [EU-wide coordination](#) to handle residency revocations and ensure they do not lead to a human rights crisis.

#### **For Private Sector/Investors:**

- **Energy Markets:** Anticipate [volatility in Russian refined product exports](#) as drone attacks on refineries (like Yaroslavl) cause intermittent supply disruptions.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Investors in the Baltics must ensure [compliance with new security laws](#) regarding personnel and critical infrastructure, as "non-loyal" citizens are being removed from these sectors.
- **Tech Opportunities:** The successful deployment of [methane-tracking satellites](#) signals a growing market for high-resolution environmental compliance and ESG-auditing technology.
