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ALGERIA LEVERAGES HISTORICAL MEMORY TO RECALIBRATE FRENCH RELATIONS WHILE AGGRESSIVELY PURSUING REGIONAL ECONOMIC INTEGRATION AND AMPLIFYING DIPLOMATIC PRESSURE ON MOROCCO.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

May 9, 2026, served as a pivotal moment for Algerian statecraft, characterized by a sophisticated blending of historical grievance and forward-looking economic pragmatism. The day was dominated by the 81st commemoration of the May 8, 1945, massacres, which Algiers has officially designated as the National Day of Memory. This year's events were notable for the high-level participation of French Minister Delegate Alice Rufo, who delivered a personal letter from President Emmanuel Macron to President Abdelmadjid Tebboune. This visit suggests a tenuous "thaw" in the often-frozen "Memory War" between Algiers and Paris, with the French side acknowledging the [painful chapter of history](#) while the Algerian military leadership emphasized that the

colonial past must be addressed with [respect and courage](#) to build a stable future.

Parallel to this diplomatic engagement with France, Algeria is aggressively positioning itself as a central hub for African investment and South-South cooperation. The opening of the 12th African Investment and Trade Forum (AFIC) in Algiers, coupled with significant trade breakthroughs with Turkey and Mauritania, signals a strategic pivot toward economic diversification. By aiming for a [\\$10 billion trade volume](#) with Turkey by 2030 and signing [23 new trade agreements](#) with Mauritania, Algiers is attempting to solidify its role as a strategic gateway between European/Eurasian capital and the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA).

However, the day also highlighted a sharp escalation in regional tensions. Algerian state media gave extensive coverage to an international conference in Madrid supporting the "Rif cause," effectively opening a new diplomatic front against Morocco by advocating for the [right to self-determination](#) for the Rif people. This, combined with reports of domestic instability and "tyrannical" [demolition policies in Casablanca](#), indicates that Algiers is intensifying its information warfare and diplomatic encirclement of Rabat, leveraging human rights and self-determination narratives to undermine its neighbor's internal stability.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Sino-Algerian and Turko-Algerian Strategic Hubs

- President Tebboune's visit to Turkey concluded with a commitment to reach \$10 billion in bilateral trade by 2030, focusing on a [strategic economic axis](#) that includes energy, mining, and agriculture.

- Over 1,600 Turkish companies are currently operating in Algeria, with investments valued at [\\$8 billion](#), marking Turkey as one of Algeria's most significant non-hydrocarbon partners.

The Recalibration of Memory Diplomacy with France

- French Minister Delegate Alice Rufo's visit to Setif to lay a wreath for the 1945 victims represents a [highly symbolic gesture](#) of historical recognition from Paris.
- The Algerian military, via Army General Chengriha, explicitly linked the resolution of the [colonial past](#) to future security cooperation, suggesting that Algiers will continue to use "Memory" as a prerequisite for deeper intelligence and defense ties.
- Tebboune has authorized the resumption of the [joint commission of historians](#) without delay, signaling a willingness to move forward on sensitive archive issues.

West African Integration and Mauritanian Partnerships

- The 8th edition of the Algerian Products Fair in Nouakchott resulted in [23 commercial agreements](#) and four health sector memorandums, focusing on pharmaceutical exports and laboratory services.
- This reflects a broader move to use Mauritania as a [strategic bridge](#) to the wider West African market.

Escalation of Proxy Diplomacy Against Morocco

- Algiers is now providing significant media and diplomatic visibility to the [Rif independence movement](#), framing the Rif as an "occupied" territory similar to Western Sahara.
- Reports characterized the Moroccan government's urban policies as [state-led displacement](#) and "tyranny," signaling a more aggressive stance in regional "lawfare."

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Economic Security & Diversification

- Algiers is focusing on non-hydrocarbon exports, specifically through the 12th AFIC forum, to reach a target of [\\$15 billion](#) in annual exports.
- Food security is being addressed through massive infrastructure projects, such as the construction of a [100,000-ton grain silo](#) in Boumerdes to enhance the national storage system.
- The "Trans-Saharan Road" segment between In Salah and El Menia is being prioritized as an [economic artery](#) to link the Mediterranean to the Sahel.

Diplomatic Engagement & Regional Influence

- Algeria is maintaining high-level ties with the Horn of Africa, as evidenced by President of the Council of the Nation Azuz Nasri's attendance at the [inauguration of the Djiboutian President](#).

- Energy cooperation is expanding into sub-Saharan Africa, with new video-conferential [consultations with Ivory Coast](#) regarding petroleum production and equipment manufacturing.

Internal Social Order & Public Health

- State media has launched a major public health campaign regarding [strokes \(AVC\)](#), identifying it as a leading cause of adult disability and a significant public health burden.
- The government is emphasizing a multidisciplinary [neuro-vascular unit](#) model to improve medical state capacity.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Governance activity was largely centered on the institutionalization of historical memory and the administrative facilitation of regional trade. The executive is moving toward concrete legislative frameworks for "National Memory," as requested by President Tebboune to prevent future historical distortion.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Project for National Memory Legislation:** The Minister of Mujahidine announced instructions to finalize a [law on national memory](#) and the organization of national conferences to formalize the historical record of the revolution.
- **Preferential Trade Agreement with Turkey:** Negotiators are finalizing a list of goods for a [preferential trade status](#) to accelerate the \$10 billion volume target.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Rufo-Tebboune Audience:** A lengthy meeting focused on [security and defense](#) cooperation, migration, and the "Mixed Commission" of historians.
- **Chengriha-Rufo Military Meeting:** A session dedicated to "joint interests" and addressing the [instability in Africa](#) and the Sahel region.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Institutionalization of Historical Narrative The state is no longer merely mourning the past but is codifying it into a pillar of modern foreign policy. By inviting a French minister to Setif while simultaneously pushing for a "Law on Memory," Algeria is creating a [legal and diplomatic trap](#) for France, where future security and economic cooperation are contingent on French acknowledgment of colonial crimes as "crimes against humanity." The mention of [US archives](#) being released on the 1945 massacres indicates Algiers is seeking third-party historical validation to increase leverage over Paris.

Economic Connectivity as State Power The recurring theme of "opening markets" and "Trans-Saharan integration" suggests Algeria is trying to compete with Morocco's Atlantic Initiative by offering a more robust [Mediterranean-to-Sahel](#) transit route. The focus on startups and "digital sovereignty" at the AFIC forum shows an elite-level recognition that hydro-carbons alone cannot sustain the [aspirations of a younger generation](#) or the state's regional ambitions.

Active Destabilization of the Moroccan Narrative The sudden elevation of the "Rif

cause" in state media, including the [Madrid conference](#), marks a significant escalation. Algiers is moving from a defensive posture regarding Western Sahara to an offensive posture regarding the Moroccan mainland's internal integrity. By highlighting [social unrest in Morocco](#), Algeria aims to portray its neighbor as an unstable, repressive state to international observers, specifically within European legal circles.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a flurry of activity from the newly authorized "Mixed Commission" of historians as Algiers tests the "sincerity" of the letter delivered by Rufo. Domestic focus will remain on the [Hajj logistics](#) and the harvest season, which is being framed as a [campaign for food sovereignty](#).

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The results of the Mauritanian fair will likely lead to the establishment of permanent Algerian logistics hubs in Nouakchott. Tensions with Morocco over the Rif cause will likely manifest in international human rights forums, with Algiers sponsoring "Rifian" delegates. Construction of the [Boumerdes silo](#) and other strategic storage facilities will be accelerated to mitigate global grain market volatility.

Long Term (1-5 Years): Algeria's dependence on Turkey for industrialization will deepen, potentially creating a new [Mediterranean power bloc](#) that balances against traditional European influence. The success of the "Trans-Saharan Road" will determine whether Algeria becomes the dominant logistician for the Sahel, effectively neutralizing Moroccan regional influence.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The French-Algerian "Memory Commission" should be monitored as a lead indicator for future Mediterranean security pacts; its failure would signal a return to [hostile rhetoric](#).
- The internationalization of the "Rif cause" presents a significant [risk of regional escalation](#) that could disrupt maritime security near the Strait of Gibraltar.
- Algeria's food security infrastructure (silos/water/transport) offers a stabilizing counterweight to regional [migration pressures](#) if properly managed.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- The Turkish model (8,000 Turkish workers and \$8B in investment) provides a blueprint for foreign firms looking to enter the Algerian [mining and energy](#) sectors.
- Significant opportunities exist in the [health and pharmaceutical sectors](#) as Algeria seeks to become a supplier for the West African (Mauritanian/Senegalese) market.
- Investors should be cautious of the [regulatory shifts](#) that may accompany the new "Law on Memory," as foreign companies with historical links to the colonial era may face new "reputational compliance" hurdles.
