

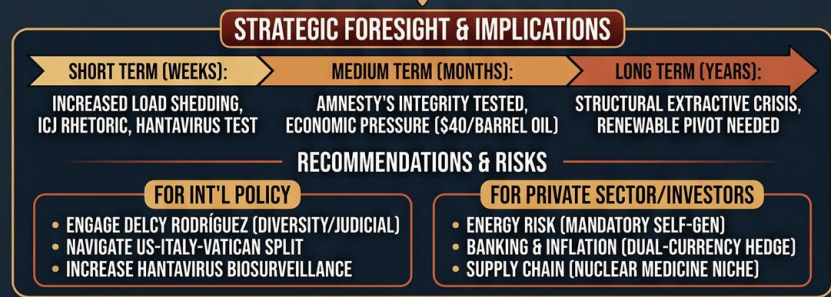
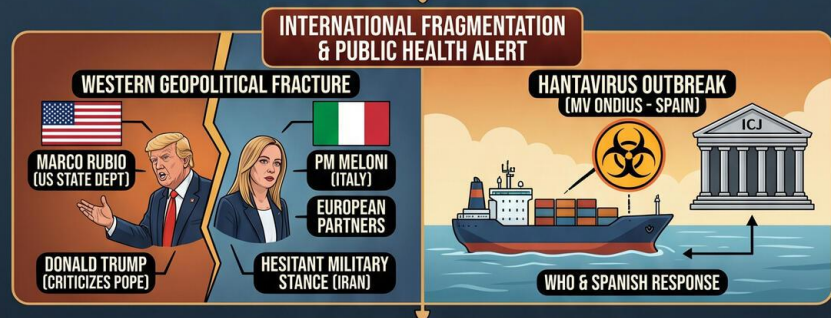
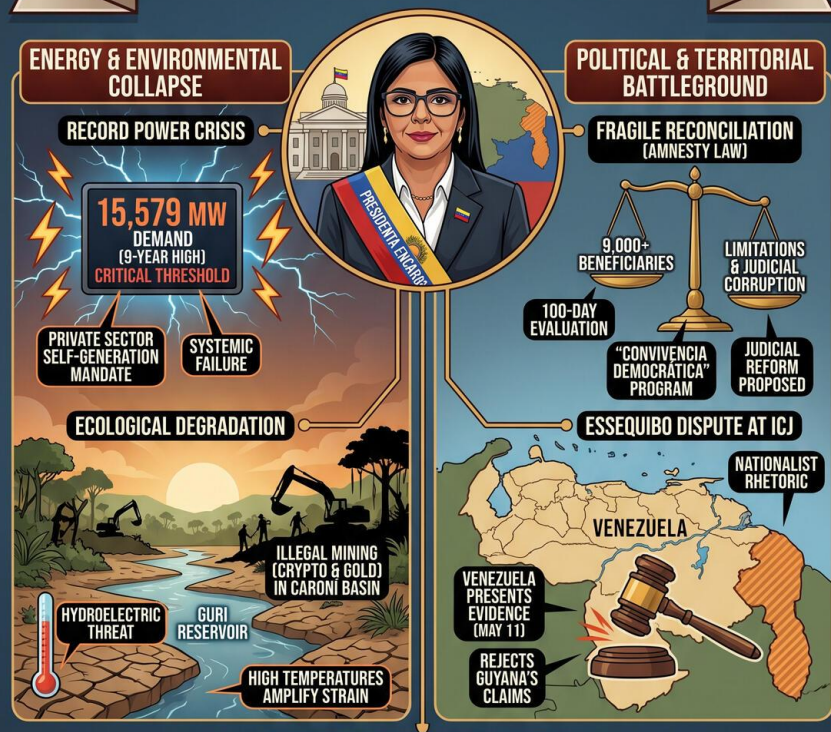

DELCY RODRÍGUEZ CONSOLIDATES POWER AS PRESIDENT-IN-CHARGE AMID A RECORD NATIONAL ENERGY CRISIS AND 100-DAY EVALUATION OF THE AMNESTY LAW.

### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

---

May 9, 2026, serves as a critical juncture for the Venezuelan administration under President-in-charge Delcy Rodríguez, who is navigating a systemic energy crisis and a delicate political reconciliation process. National electricity demand reached a [record-breaking 15,579 MW](#), the highest in nine years, forcing the executive to demand that the private sector activate self-generation and proposing a national recovery plan. This infrastructure strain is being publicly attributed to high temperatures, illegal digital mining, and the ecological degradation of the Caroní river basin due to illegal mining operations that threaten the Guri reservoir's hydroelectric capacity.

Simultaneously, the administration celebrated the first 100 days of the "Convivencia Democrática y Paz" program, framing the [controversial Amnesty Law](#) as a successful tool for national stability. While the

government promotes the return of migrants through the "Vuelta a la Patria" program, it remains embroiled in "legal warfare" at the International Court of Justice (ICJ) over the Essequibo territory. The geopolitical landscape is further complicated by a Trump-era US State Department led by Marco Rubio, whose diplomatic efforts in Italy reveal a fractured Western stance regarding military campaigns against Iran and the moral authority of Pope Leo XIV.

### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

---

- **National Electric System (SEN) Infrastructure Crisis**
  - National demand peaked at [15,579 MW on May 7](#), signaling a critical threshold for the aging grid.
  - The President-in-charge has called for immediate [private sector self-generation](#) to mitigate load shedding.
  - Experts warn that a total grid recovery would require [over \\$20 billion](#) and five to six years of sustained investment.
- **100-Day Review of the Amnesty Law and National Dialogue**
  - The administration defended the [Amnesty Law as "correct"](#) for national reconciliation, despite some crimes remaining excluded.
  - Rodríguez ordered the Supreme Tribunal of Justice (TSJ) to develop a [doctrine on diversity](#) as a fundamental human right.
  - New judicial reforms are proposed to address [systemic failures and corruption](#) within the criminal penal system.

- **Territorial Dispute at the ICJ**
  - Foreign Minister Iván Gil rejected Guyana's arguments at the ICJ as [repetitive and lacking historical truth](#).
  - Venezuela is prepared to present its [historical evidence on May 11](#), insisting on bilateral negotiations over judicial intervention.
- **International Public Health Alert: Hantavirus Outbreak**
  - The Dutch cruise ship MV Ondius, carrying an [outbreak of Hantavirus](#), is being quarantined off the coast of Tenerife.
  - Spanish authorities and the WHO are coordinating a [massive evacuation and repatriation](#) of passengers while monitoring for epidemic potential.
- **Shifting US-European-Vatican Geopolitics**
  - US Secretary of State Marco Rubio met with Italian PM Giorgia Meloni to [reconcile differences](#) following Donald Trump's criticisms of Pope Leo XIV.
  - Italy and other European partners remain hesitant to support [US military escalations](#) against Iran.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

---

- **Energy Security:** The government is increasingly desperate to stabilize the grid, targeting [illegal digital mining](#) as a scapegoat for systemic failure. Projections show that even with new turbines, the lag in [manufacturing and delivery](#) (up to 6 years) makes a medium-term solution unlikely without massive foreign tech intervention.

- **Economic Security & Resilience:** With the exchange rate hitting [500.46 VES per USD](#), the banking sector is pivoting toward [dual-currency accounts](#) for residential and commercial entities to protect against rampant inflation.
- **Environmental Governance:** Venezuela currently holds the [highest deforestation rate](#) in Latin America, primarily driven by mining south of the Orinoco. This is directly impacting [hydroelectric generation](#) as river basins dry up and sedimentation increases.
- **Legal Warfare (Lawfare):** The administration is utilizing the ICJ proceedings to stoke nationalist sentiment while simultaneously [defending the Amnesty Law](#) to pacify domestic opposition and court international legitimacy.
- **National Security & Migratory Trends:** The "Vuelta a la Patria" program continues to fly Venezuelans back, with the latest flight arriving from [Miami with 156 passengers](#). This is framed as a sign of domestic stabilization, though the economic reality remains volatile.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

---

Current legislative and executive activity is focused on judicial restructuring and economic protectionism. The administration is balancing the release of political actors with the need to maintain control over critical infrastructure and territorial integrity.

## BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Amnesty Law (Ley de Amnistía):** Evaluated after 100 days; credited with favoring over [9,000 Venezuelans](#) but criticized for its limitations and ongoing judicial corruption.

- **Reform of the Penal Justice System:** A proposed overhaul intended to eliminate [discrimination against the poor](#) and prioritize trials in liberty over pretrial detention.

- **Convivencia Democrática 100-Day Balance:** A televised forum featuring Ernesto Villegas and President-in-charge Rodríguez [evaluating civil peace](#).
- **ICJ Oral Sessions:** Foreign Minister Iván Gil's press conference regarding the [rejection of Guyanese territorial claims](#).

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

---

### The "Presidenta Encargada" Shift

The consistent reference to Delcy Rodríguez as "Presidenta encargada" (President-in-charge) throughout all broadcasts suggests a significant internal political transition. Her role has shifted from a mere vice-presidential administrator to the public face of the state's [foundational peace agreements](#) and sovereignty defense. This appears to be a calculated rebranding of the executive to appear more conciliatory and "diverse" while maintaining a hard line on [sovereign rights](#).

## The Energy-Environment Feedback Loop

A dangerous trend is emerging where **illegal mining** is both a cause of environmental degradation and a primary consumer of unstable energy. The [mining south of the Orinoco](#) is identified as a threat to the Guri dam's water levels, while the government simultaneously denounces [illegal digital mining](#) (crypto-mining) for overloading the grid. This suggests that the state is losing control over the country's energy-heavy grey markets.

## Fragile Normalization

The government is working overtime to project a return to "normality." This includes promoting [beauty pageants](#), high-end [medical showrooms](#), and celebrity lifestyle news. However, this is contradicted by reports of [71 tons of donated medicines](#) and a currency that has devalued to a point where [condominiums require specialized banking](#) to survive the week. The "normalization" is a thin veneer over a state still reliant on international aid and survivalist economic strategies.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

---

- **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** The ICJ hearing on [May 11](#) will likely trigger a surge in nationalist rhetoric. Domestically, expect **increased load shedding** as temperatures remain high and the government struggles to enforce self-generation mandates on the private sector. The [Hantavirus repatriation](#) process in Spain will serve as a test case for post-COVID international sanitary protocols.

- **Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The Amnesty Law's [next chapter](#) will be tested by whether the government actually prosecutes the "judges who charge for amnesties" mentioned by Rodríguez. Economic pressure will mount as oil prices hover at [\\$40/barrel](#), far below the \$70 needed for Venezuela's extra-heavy crude to be profitable, likely forcing more aggressive moves into [gas exports](#).
- **Long Term (1-5 Years):** Venezuela faces a structural "extractive model" crisis. As the global [energy transition](#) accelerates, the country's reliance on heavy oil and minerals will become a liability. Without a massive pivot to [renewable energy](#) (wind/solar), the national grid will remain in a state of permanent "recovery" while the southern forest ecosystems face total collapse.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

---

### For International Policy:

- The shift toward **Delcy Rodríguez as President-in-charge** signals a potential window for renewed diplomatic engagement focused on diversity rights and judicial reform, though her nationalist stance on the Essequibo remains a [major friction point](#).
- The US-Italy tension regarding **Iran and the Vatican** suggests that the Western coalition is fragmented; any regional policy must account for Italy's [refusal to escalate militarily](#).
- Biosurveillance efforts must be increased for **Hantavirus variants** (specifically the Andes virus) as cruise ship traffic continues to act as a vector for [zoonotic diseases](#).

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Risk:** Operations in Venezuela must account for the high probability of [mandatory self-generation](#) and a grid that cannot support high-intensity industrial loads without private investment in [solar or wind backup](#).
- **Banking & Inflation:** Investors should utilize the new [dual-currency banking instruments](#) to hedge against a VES that is rapidly losing value despite government claims of controlled inflation.
- **Supply Chain Opportunity:** The decommissioned [nuclear reactor uranium](#) and the pivot toward nuclear medicine suggest a niche market for high-tech radiological and [clean-room medical equipment](#).
