ALGERIA PROJECTS REGIONAL LEADERSHIP THROUGH TRANS-SAHARAN INFRASTRUCTURE AND ENERGY DIPLOMACY WHILE MANAGING A SEVERE NARCOTICS CRISIS AND DIPLOMATIC REBALANCING WITH FRANCE

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

On May 10, 2026, Algerian state media projected a narrative of a nation in the midst of an assertive regional ascent, defined by major infrastructure milestones and "win-win" economic partnerships across the African continent. The primary strategic focus centered on the [Trans-Saharan road project](#), specifically the 4th section linking In Salah and El Menia, which is positioned as a linchpin for continental integration. Simultaneously, Algiers hosted the 12th African Investment and Trade Forum (AFIC), aiming to catalyze intra-African commerce and leverage the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA). This economic expansion is mirrored in the energy sector, where state entities Sonelgaz and Sonatrach are [exporting technical expertise](#) to Chad, Ivory Coast, and Niger, effectively using

energy infrastructure as a tool of regional power projection.

Domestic security and regional stability narratives were dominated by a massive crackdown on narcotics, with the seizure of [4 million psychotropic pills](#) and a 20-person network bust. This law enforcement success is juxtaposed with intense, critical coverage of Moroccan social instability, house demolitions, and alleged drug trafficking tunnels in Ceuta. Diplomatically, the state is navigating a delicate "degel" (thaw) with France, using the 80th anniversary of the May 8, 1945 massacres and a high-profile visit by French political figure Ségolène Royal to demand a relationship based on "equality" and the resolution of lingering colonial-era grievances, including nuclear testing legacies and the detention of Algerian agents.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Continental Integration and Infrastructure Milestones:** The Algerian government reported significant progress on the Trans-Saharan road, with [90% completion](#) of key technical phases on the In Salah-El Menia axis. This is framed as a vital lever for regional "disenclavement."
- **Expansion of the African Investment Footprint:** The 12th AFIC in Algiers concluded with the signing of [52 agreements](#) across industry, health, and startups, specifically targeting the Mauritanian and West African markets.
- **Massive Internal Security Operation:** Security forces executed a "qualitative operation" in Tamanrasset and across the country, seizing over [1 million Pregabalin capsules](#) in a single bust, highlighting the severity of the psychotropic drug epidemic.

- **Diplomatic Rebalancing with France:** Former French minister Ségolène Royal, visiting Algiers, called for [equal economic partnerships](#) and criticized the "power balance" approach previously taken by Paris, signaling a shift in bilateral rhetoric.
- **Regional Rivalry Narratives:** State media devoted extensive coverage to a conference in Madrid supporting [Rif self-determination](#) and reported heavily on "forced evictions" and "social hardship" within Morocco.
- **Scientific State Capacity:** The Center for Research in Astronomy, Astrophysics and Geophysics (CRAAG) successfully coordinated [six telescopes](#) to observe a rare stellar occultation by the dwarf planet Haumea, showcasing Algerian scientific integration with international networks.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security & Regional Export

- Sonelgaz technical teams were [deployed to Chad](#) to assess infrastructure for a new power plant project intended to alleviate regional electricity shortages.
- A high-level delegation from Ivory Coast visited Algiers to study [Sonelgaz's organizational structure](#) and network management, aiming for a South-South cooperation model.
- Sonatrach hosted Nigerien experts for training in [petroleum data management](#) and digital infrastructure, cementing Algeria's role as a mentor to Sahelian energy sectors.

Domestic Stability & Water Security

- Minister of Water Resources Lounès Bouzegza announced the [increase of water quotas](#) from the Koudiat Acerdoune dam to 200,000 cubic meters to stabilize supply in Medea.
- Construction of the Boukous dam in El Tarf is prioritized to supply [33 border localities](#) by summer 2026, aiming to reduce rural migration and ensure border stability.

National Security & Rule of Law

- The judiciary at Sidi M'Hamed prosecuted 13 individuals caught in [flagrante delicto](#) with 4 million psychotropic pills, charging them with international organized crime and threats to public health.
- Spanish police investigations into [secret drug tunnels](#) between Morocco and Ceuta were used as evidence of regional instability originating from the "Makhzen."

Economic Security & Digitalization

- State-owned Naftal launched a [digital platform](#) for ordering Continental-brand tires, mandating payment via "CIPA" or "Dahabier" cards to increase transparency and formalize the trade.
- The 2026 Finance Act (Article 122/129) was highlighted for its [cancellation of tax penalties](#) for the period 2012-2025, a move to stimulate the private sector and formalize tax debts.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative and policy discussions focused on stimulating investment through tax relief and enhancing public service transparency through digital mandates. A significant portion of the day's policy reporting centered

on the implementation of the 2026 Finance Act and new trade regulations within the AfCFTA framework.

- **Tax Penalty Amnesty:** Discussions on [Articles 122 and 129](#) of the current fiscal regulations, which allow for the total abandonment of tax penalties and interest for debts incurred between 2012 and 2025, provided certain payment conditions are met.
- **Digital Payment Mandate:** Implementation of mandatory electronic payment for state-distributed automotive supplies through [Naftal's new Mahatta platform](#), part of a broader push for a cashless economy.
- **AfCFTA Compliance:** Algerian officials noted the issuance of over [9,000 certificates of origin](#) as part of the operationalization of the African Continental Free Trade Area.

- **African Investment and Trade Forum (AFIC):** Closing sessions focused on [digital transformation](#) and cross-border risk management in African investments.
- **28th Batimatec Salon:** A major construction trade fair featuring [900 exhibitors](#) from 15 countries, emphasizing local manufacturing of building materials.
- **Madrid Congress on Rif Sovereignty:** A high-level international meeting demanding [self-determination for the Rif](#), heavily publicized by Algerian state media.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The "Memory" Narrative as Geopolitical Tool

The Algerian state is aggressively utilizing historical memory to bind its diaspora and pressure international partners. The "Memory and History" caravan, involving [1,500 diaspora youth](#), is not merely a cultural tour; it is a state-sponsored effort to create a "patriotic bridge" that ensures the next generation of Algerian-Europeans remains aligned with Algiers' national narrative. This domestic effort complements the diplomatic pressure on France. By focusing on the [May 8, 1945 massacres](#) and nuclear testing in the Sahara, Algeria is forcing France into a position of perpetual moral debt, demanding "equality" as a prerequisite for the "Paris-Algiers axis."

Energy and Infrastructure as Power Projection

Algeria is pivoting from a passive commodity exporter to an active regional infrastructure provider. The [Sonelgaz intervention in Chad](#) and the Sonatrach training programs for Nigerien oil officials suggest Algiers is positioning itself as the "technical guardian" of the Sahel. This "South-South" cooperation is designed to counter-balance non-African influences in the region while securing future markets for Algerian industrial products, such as those featured in the [Mauritania Expo](#).

The Psychotropic Crisis and Border Security

The staggering volume of drug seizures—specifically [Pregabalin \(Lyrica\)](#)—indicates a public health crisis that has become a national security priority. State media's repeated attempts to link this trade to Moroccan instability and the discovery of "drug tunnels" in Ceuta suggests that Algiers views the narcotics trade as a form of hybrid warfare. The shift in focus toward "barons of contraband" reflects a hardening of the

security architecture in the 6th Military Region (Tamanrasset).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a continued increase in cross-border security operations near Tamanrasset as the army targets the remnants of the 20-person narcotics network. Bilateral friction with France may persist over the "counselor agent" case mentioned by Royal, potentially slowing the reported "degel" until a trial or release occurs.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): Completion of the 4th section of the Trans-Saharan road by the second quarter of 2026 will likely be followed by a high-profile summit to promote the "African Startup Conference" in December. Trade volume with Mauritania is expected to rise as the 52 signed agreements transition into the supply chain phase.

Long Term (1-5 Years): Algeria's focus on the [Agenda Africa 2063](#) goals and the completion of the Trans-Saharan corridor could shift the center of gravity for North-West African trade toward Algiers. However, regional stability remains contingent on managing the socio-economic spillover from Morocco, which Algerian media characterizes as a ticking time bomb of "social hardship" and "forced evictions."

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The reported [dégel \(thaw\) between Paris and Algiers](#) is fragile; diplomats should prioritize the "equality" framework in economic talks to avoid triggering historical sensitivities.
- Algeria's growing role in [Sahelian energy training](#) makes it a critical partner for regional stability; engagement should focus on the technical and digital sovereignty of these energy networks.
- The intense focus on [Rif sovereignty](#) suggests Algeria may escalate its support for Moroccan separatist movements if bilateral tensions rise.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Substantial opportunities exist in the [Algerian construction sector](#), particularly for firms specializing in "smart city" technologies and sustainable building materials as highlighted at Batimatec.
- The [tax penalty amnesty](#) offers a strategic window for international firms to settle outstanding liabilities and regularize their fiscal status under favorable terms.
- Investment in the [Mauritanian-Algerian trade corridor](#) is increasingly viable, provided logistics and AfCFTA compliance are central to the business model.
