DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

On May 10, 2026, the Islamic Republic of Iran transitioned its posture from military survival to the active construction of a "new regional order," centered on its absolute sovereign control over the Strait of Hormuz. Following the April 8 ceasefire—described by Iranian officials as a "pause under pressure" rather than peace—Tehran has rejected a US-led proposal to end the war, characterizing it as a [surrender to excessive demands](#). Instead, Iran is enforcing a new legal regime in the Persian Gulf, requiring all transiting vessels to coordinate through Iranian systems and threatening that any country complying with US sanctions will face [trouble crossing the waterway](#).

The strategic landscape is defined by a growing divergence between a unified Iranian domestic front and a fractured American political and military establishment. While Tehran reports 71 consecutive nights of mass

[public rallies in support](#) of the state, the Trump administration faces plummeting approval ratings, with 54% of US voters disapproving of the conflict. This domestic pressure in Washington is compounded by a [critical depletion of missile stockpiles](#), including Tomahawks and Patriot systems, which senior US senators warn could take years to replenish, effectively limiting the United States' ability to sustain further escalation.

Economically, the conflict has triggered a global energy and supply chain shock. The World Bank reports a 24% surge in energy costs, while the UN warns of an impending [global food crisis](#) due to fertilizer scarcity linked to Hormuz disruptions. Most significant is the accelerating erosion of the petrodollar; the UAE and Saudi Arabia are increasingly settling [oil transactions in Chinese Yuan](#) and cryptocurrencies, a shift Iranian analysts describe as a "strategic checkmate" against US financial hegemony. The day's reports suggest that the "unipolar moment" has ended, replaced by a multipolar reality where Iran, Russia, and China operate as a cohesive strategic pillar.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Enforcement of a New Legal Regime in the Strait of Hormuz

- Iran has declared that the status of the Strait of Hormuz will [never return to pre-war conditions](#), establishing a permanent sovereign oversight mechanism.
- A new digital registration system requires ships to apply for [certificates of passage](#) via email, effectively turning the international waterway into a regulated Iranian zone.

- The Iranian Navy warned that it has positioned domestically built [lightweight submarines on the seabed](#) for long-duration monitoring and interception of hostile vessels.

Rejection of US Peace Proposals and Diplomatic Pivot

- Tehran formally rejected the latest US proposal—conveyed via Pakistani mediators—stating it prioritized US interests and ignored [reparations for war damages](#).
- Foreign Minister Abbas Araqchi completed a regional tour of Pakistan, Oman, and Russia to articulate a [new global order](#) that excludes Western dominance.
- The Iranian government has decoupled ending the war from its nuclear program, insisting that its [nuclear activities are non-negotiable](#).

Acceleration of De-Dollarization and Financial Realignment

- Major oil producers, including the UAE and Saudi Arabia, are transitioning to the [petro-yuan for oil sales](#) to bypass the weaponized US dollar.
- Iran is reportedly accepting transit fees for the Strait of Hormuz in [Yuan and its own currency](#) to further marginalize the dollar.
- The UAE's withdrawal from OPEC is analyzed as a strategic move to [maximize domestic production](#) and realign with a Western-Indian-Israeli axis, creating a rift with Saudi Arabia.

US Military and Political Infrastructure Fatigue

- Senator Mark Kelly raised alarms regarding the [deep depletion of key missile defense](#) stockpiles, suggesting the US is unprepared for future global crises.
- Pentagon leadership reshuffles and public dissent from Republican senators, such as [Susan Collins](#), indicate a lack of strategic alignment in Washington.
- Internal reports estimate the real cost of the war at [\\$40 to \\$50 billion](#), nearly double the estimates initially presented to US lawmakers.

Humanitarian Crisis Escalation in Gaza and Lebanon

- The UN warns that skin infections are [becoming a pandemic](#) in Gaza, with cases surging from 3,000 to 17,000 due to collapsed sanitation and restricted aid.
- In Lebanon, over 1.2 million people are [internally displaced](#), with Israel reportedly breaching the ceasefire more than 15,000 times since 2024.
- Approximately 8,000 bodies remain [buried beneath rubble](#) in Gaza as the Israeli regime continues to block the entry of heavy machinery for recovery.

- Iranian leadership emphasizes [cohesion under new leader](#) Ayatollah Sayed Mojtaba Khamenei, following the martyrdom of the previous leadership.
- In Washington, the Trump administration is accused of [eroding a century of credibility](#) within a single year of erratic wartime behavior.
- The Israeli cabinet faces significant domestic unrest, with [protests in Tel Aviv](#) demanding an end to the genocide and the resignation of Netanyahu.

Geopolitical Power Dynamics

- Iran has cemented a [comprehensive strategic treaty](#) with Russia, signaling a shift toward a multipolar environment intended to neutralize Western pressure.
- Regional rivalries intensify as the UAE expels [thousands of Pakistani Shia workers](#) following Islamabad's emergence as a mediator for Iran.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity centered on the codification of Iran's maritime sovereignty and the contentious debate over the US defense budget. Iranian lawmakers are drafting a [new legal regime](#) for the Strait of Hormuz that treats the waterway as an inherent sovereign right of the coastal state. Officials argue that the loss of top leaders, including the previous Supreme Leader and high-ranking commanders, failed to trigger a regime collapse because the [Islamic Republic is an idea](#) rather than just a structure. This "national cohesion" is presented as a [decisive pillar of military planning](#) that the US underestimated.

Fracturing of Western Alliances

- Evidence of disillusionment among US allies is mounting. The German Chancellor and French President have both issued statements [questioning US reliability](#). STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

For International Policy:

- **Diversify Mediators:** Diplomacy must move beyond the US-Iran binary. The involvement of [Russia, China, Pakistan, and Oman](#) is essential for a "comprehensive regional security settlement."
- **Acknowledge Maritime Sovereignty:** The international community must recognize that [force cannot open the Strait](#); a political solution respecting Iranian coastal rights is the only way to stabilize global energy markets.
- **Humanitarian Intervention:** Immediate pressure is needed to [stop the targeting of journalists](#) and ensure the recovery of thousands of bodies in Gaza to prevent further pandemic outbreaks.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Currency Risk Mitigation:** Investors should [liquidate or repatriate assets](#) held in US dollars that may be subject to future freezes, as the "Petrol-Yuan" and gold-backed commodities rise.
- **Supply Chain Redundancy:** Firms dependent on petrochemicals and fertilizers must secure [alternate transit corridors](#) that bypass the Strait of Hormuz, such as Pakistani gateways or overland Eurasian routes.
- **Energy Price Hedging:** With energy costs projected to [rise by 24%](#), long-term contracts and investment in alternative energy are critical for industrial stability.
