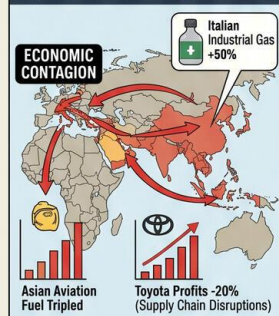

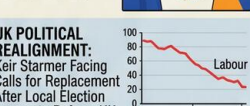

## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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On May 11, 2026, the international order is being reshaped by a convergence of high-intensity regional conflicts and shifting strategic alliances. In the Persian Gulf, the "Hormuz Crisis" has reached a stalemate as President Donald Trump [rejected Iranian counter-proposals](#) for ending the maritime blockade. The economic contagion of this maritime standoff is manifesting globally, with major industrial entities like Toyota projecting a [20% decrease in profits](#) due to supply chain disruptions. The crisis is compounded by the apparent failure of the U.S. "Project Freedom" operation, which was reportedly stymied by [Saudi Arabia's refusal](#) to allow the use of its

airspace, signaling a breakdown in traditional U.S. regional hegemony.

In Europe, the security landscape is dominated by the fallout of the Russian "Victory Day" parade, which served as a [stark indicator of Russian military exhaustion](#), featuring no modern heavy armor and reflecting deep-seated fears of Ukrainian drone strikes. Concurrently, the Baltic states are grappling with the unintended consequences of the conflict; Ukrainian intelligence chief Kyrylo Budanov [visited Vilnius to address](#) instances of Ukrainian drones straying into Baltic airspace due to Russian electronic warfare. This has triggered a [political crisis in Latvia](#), resulting in the resignation of the Defense Minister and threatening the stability of the governing coalition. Meanwhile, Armenia's [pivot toward the European Union](#) reached a milestone with a historic summit in Yerevan, further isolating Moscow from its traditional "near abroad."

Domestic stability in the United Kingdom and Lithuania is also under pressure. Prime Minister Keir Starmer is [fighting for his political life](#) after catastrophic local election losses to right-wing populists, while in Lithuania, discussions on [removing parliamentary immunity](#) highlight a growing distrust in political elites. On the health front, a [Hantavirus outbreak on a cruise ship](#) near Tenerife has activated global biosurveillance protocols, with the World Health Organization attempting to manage public anxiety while enforcing [stringent 42-day quarantines](#) for the "Andes variant."

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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### The Hormuz Crisis and Global Economic Shock

- President Trump has dismissed Tehran's demands for a [total end to the U.S. blockade](#) and non-aggression guarantees as "unacceptable," insisting on the total removal of Iran's nuclear capabilities. [Israel's Netanyahu echoed this](#), stating the war will not end until Iran is stripped of its nuclear and missile programs.
- The 48-hour U.S. operation to break the blockade [reportedly failed](#) due to lack of cooperation from regional allies, particularly Saudi Arabia, which viewed the plan as "insufficiently thought out."
- European and Asian markets are reeling; Italian industrial gas prices [rose 50%](#), and aviation fuel prices in Asia have [tripled](#).

### Russian Military Exhaustion and Ukrainian Strategic Depth

- The Moscow Victory Day parade was [notably devoid of modern equipment](#), with only a single T-34 tank appearing, a sign that the Kremlin is prioritizing front-line needs and fears long-range Ukrainian strikes. [Ukrainian drones have successfully targeted](#) oil infrastructure 1,500 km from the border.
- Ukraine's intelligence chief [Kyrylo Budanov visited Lithuania](#) to coordinate on defense industry localization, emphasizing that "peace is not weakness but common sense."
- Russian President Putin [suggested using Gerhard Schröder](#) as a mediator, a move rejected by Berlin as a divisive tactic.

### Baltic Political Fallout from Airspace Violations

- Latvian Defense Minister Andris Sprūds [resigned following an incident](#) where a Ukrainian drone damaged an oil facility in Rēzekne after being diverted by Russian electronic warfare. [Prime Minister Silīņa accused him](#) of failing to warn the public.
- The resignation has triggered a [coalition crisis](#), with the "Progressives" party threatening to leave the government if they lose the defense portfolio.

### UK Political Realignment

- Keir Starmer is facing [open calls for replacement](#) after Nigel Farage's "Reform UK" party made historic gains in traditional Labour strongholds. Starmer is pivoting toward [closer ties with the EU](#) as a 10-year recovery strategy.
- Starmer has expressed [support for a €90 billion loan](#) to Ukraine, which would be used to purchase British weaponry.

### Biosurveillance: The Tenerife Hantavirus Outbreak

- An outbreak of the "Andes variant" of Hantavirus on a cruise ship has [resulted in three deaths](#) and multiple hospitalizations in France and the US. [Evacuation protocols](#) are underway for 94 passengers from 19 countries.
- A rift has emerged between the WHO and the US CDC over [quarantine lengths](#), with the WHO insisting on 42 days while some US passengers were allowed to self-isolate at home.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### Security Architecture & NATO Reform

- Lithuanian and European officials are debating the [creation of a "European Pillar"](#) within NATO or a separate "European Defense Union" to offset potential U.S. isolationism under Trump. [Analysts warn](#) that the U.S. "national security strategy" now views European security as a secondary priority.
- Lithuanian Defense Minister Robertas Kaunas emphasized that [localizing Ukrainian defense technology](#) in Lithuania is a top priority for regional autonomy.

### AI & Information Warfare

- Russian "troll factories" are reportedly spending [up to \\$4.5 billion annually](#) on disinformation campaigns. [AI-generated deepfakes](#) are being used to simulate Russian battlefield victories, such as flag-raising in contested areas.
- LRT leadership noted that journalists are being [targeted with AI-generated](#) defamatory content to erode trust in public broadcasting.

### Diplomatic Engagement & Regional Influence

- Armenia's hosting of the [European Political Community](#) summit signifies a definitive break from Russian security guarantees. The EU has promised [€2.5 billion in infrastructure investments](#) to integrate Armenia into Western trade routes.
- Putin has warned Yerevan that [it is "impossible"](#) to remain in the Eurasian Economic Union while seeking a customs union with the EU.

### Critical Infrastructure & Transport

- Lithuania ruled out sabotage in two recent [major train accidents](#), instead blaming human error and a lack of modern signaling systems on old tracks. [The Rail Baltica project](#) is reportedly absorbing resources needed for maintenance of existing infrastructure.
- Vilnius Airport is set to host the [Routes Europe conference](#) in 2028, a major push for aviation industry growth.

### Rule of Law & Corruption

- In Lithuania, there is a push to [simplify the removal of parliamentary immunity](#) following scandals involving the misuse of parliamentary funds ("cheque-gate"). 74% of the public [views the government unfavorably](#).

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Governance activity focused on maritime security, fiscal transparency, and educational integration for the diaspora.

### BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Parliamentary Immunity Reform:** A proposal to allow Seimas members to [voluntarily waive immunity](#) to accelerate criminal proceedings in financial misconduct cases.
- **EU Automotive Standardization:** The European Parliament is debating [standardizing technical data](#) for vehicles to combat competition from low-quality Chinese imports.

- **Hormuz Mission Approval:** The Lithuanian State Defense Council [approved the deployment](#) of up to 40 personnel for international maritime security operations in the Hormuz Strait.

## HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Budanov Press Briefing:** Ukrainian intelligence chief addressed [unintentional airspace violations](#) and defense cooperation in Vilnius.
- **Starmer Leadership Address:** UK PM Starmer gave a speech attempting to [justify his leadership](#) and outlining a "10-year project" for national recovery.
- **Armenian-EU Investment Forum:** EU officials and Armenian leadership [signed deals for €2.5 billion](#) in regional development funds.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

### THE END OF STRATEGIC AMBIGUITY IN EUROPE

EUROPEAN LEADERS ARE NO LONGER TREATING THE U.S. WITHDRAWAL AS A THEORETICAL RISK BUT AS A **DOCUMENTED STRATEGIC SHIFT**. THE DEBATE HAS MOVED FROM "HOW TO KEEP THE U.S. IN" TO "HOW TO BUILD A PILLAR THAT FUNCTIONS WITHOUT THEM." THE TREND TOWARD **BILATERAL DEFENSE DEALS** (E.G., U.S.-POLAND) IS VIEWED AS A THREAT TO EUROPEAN COHESION, POTENTIALLY CREATING A "MARKET" FOR SECURITY WHERE THE U.S. PROTECTS THOSE WHO "PAY MORE."

### THE WEAPONIZATION OF ACCIDENTAL ESCALATION

THE INCIDENT IN RĚZEKNE HIGHLIGHTS A NEW PHASE OF THE UKRAINE CONFLICT: **THE SPILLING OF ELECTRONIC WARFARE EFFECTS** INTO NATO TERRITORY. BY JAMMING UKRAINIAN DRONES, RUSSIA IS EFFECTIVELY "AIMING" THEM AT BALTIC INFRASTRUCTURE. THIS CREATES A "GRAY ZONE" WHERE **ACCIDENTAL**

**VIOLATIONS CAN BE USED TO TEST THE POLITICAL RESOLVE OF BALTIC GOVERNMENTS AND TRIGGER INTERNAL CRISES, AS SEEN IN THE RESIGNATION OF THE LATVIAN DEFENSE MINISTER.**

**THE POST-PANDEMIC BIOSURVEILLANCE STRESS TEST**

**THE HANTAVIRUS OUTBREAK IS SERVING AS THE FIRST REAL-WORLD TEST OF THE GLOBAL BIOSURVEILLANCE APPARATUS BUILT AFTER 2020. THE DIVERGENCE IN QUARANTINE PROTOCOLS BETWEEN THE US, UK, AND WHO REVEALS A LACK OF INTERNATIONAL CONSENSUS ON RISK MANAGEMENT. WHILE THE WHO ATTEMPTS TO CALM THE PUBLIC, THE USE OF LIVERPUDLIAN "COVID WARDS" FOR HANTAVIRUS PATIENTS INDICATES THAT THE INFRASTRUCTURE FOR MASS ISOLATION IS NOW A PERMANENT FEATURE OF NATIONAL GOVERNANCE.**

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**STRATEGIC FORESIGHT**

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks)**

- Latvia's government will likely face a vote of no confidence if the Progressives withdraw, potentially leading to a caretaker government before the October elections.
- Global oil prices will continue to climb as Hormuz negotiations remain stalled, leading to increased transport surcharges in Europe.

- The 42-day quarantine for Hantavirus will likely yield additional cases in the US and France, but a pandemic-level event remains unlikely due to low human-to-human transmission rates.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months)**

- The UK Labour party will likely undergo a leadership challenge if Keir Starmer's poll numbers do not recover, with former ministers already securing the necessary 81 votes.
- Armenia will likely exit the CSTO formally as EU investments begin to materialize, triggering further Russian economic retaliations via energy supply cuts.
- Lithuania will formalize agreements to host Ukrainian drone production facilities, effectively integrating Ukrainian "battle-tested" tech into NATO's eastern flank.

**Long Term (1-5 Years)**

- A permanent "European Defense Union" will likely emerge to manage conventional defense, while the U.S. focuses exclusively on nuclear deterrence and the Indo-Pacific.
- Russia will continue to de-modernize its military, relying on mass and North Korean munitions as its high-tech industrial base remains paralyzed by Ukrainian strikes.
- The "Project Freedom" failure will lead to a historic realignment of Gulf states toward China and Russia as primary security mediators in the Middle East.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- Allies must establish [formal protocols for EW-induced drone drift](#) to prevent "accidental" incursions from triggering government collapses or NATO Article 4 consultations.
- The EU should [expedite the Hormuz naval mission](#) to protect European trade, reducing reliance on the unreliable U.S. maritime umbrella.
- Diplomatic efforts should focus on [securing Armenia's energy independence](#) to prevent Moscow from using gas supplies to halt Yerevan's Western integration.

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Manufacturing sectors (specifically automotive) must [account for prolonged Hormuz-related delays](#) and tripling energy costs in their Q3/Q4 projections.
- **Investment Opportunity:** The [Lithuanian-Ukrainian defense localization](#) project presents significant opportunities for venture capital in AI-driven drone tech and EW-resistant communications.
- **Compliance Warning:** Biosurveillance requirements for international travel and shipping [will likely tighten](#); companies should prepare for 42-day quarantine contingencies in their logistics planning.
