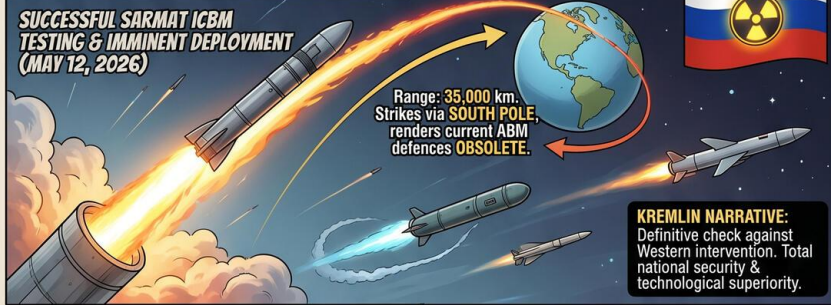

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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

May 12, 2026, marked a significant escalation in Russia's strategic posture, centered on the successful flight testing and imminent deployment of the RS-28 Sarmat intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM). The Kremlin is positioning this "super-weapon" as a definitive check against Western intervention, claiming a range of 35,000 km and the ability to strike via the South Pole, bypassing existing missile defense systems. This technical milestone is being leveraged to project an image of total national security and technological superiority over NATO counterparts, while concurrently announcing that other advanced systems like the Poseidon underwater drone and Burevestnik cruise missile are nearing completion.

Domestically, Russian state media is aggressively promoting a narrative of terminal

collapse within the Ukrainian government. The focus has shifted from frontline combat to high-level corruption and internal purges in Kyiv. The detention of Andrey Yermak, former head of the Office of the President, by Western-backed anti-corruption agencies (NABU/SAP) is being framed as a U.S.-led effort to dismantle the Zelensky administration's inner circle. This is supplemented by high-profile "whistleblower" testimony from former press secretary Iuliia Mendel, who, in a widely publicized interview with Tucker Carlson, accused President Zelensky of drug dependency and harboring a desire for "Goebbels-style" propaganda control. This dual-track information operation seeks to delegitimize Zelensky as a viable negotiator and signal that his "regime" is on the verge of implosion.

Internationally, the day was characterized by reports of profound instability within the "Western bloc." In the United Kingdom, Prime Minister Keir Starmer faces a cabinet revolt and calls for resignation following devastating local election losses. In Europe, protests by French farmers and Belgian transport workers are highlighted to suggest a continent in social and economic disarray. Meanwhile, the U.S. is portrayed as being "trapped" in a looming conflict with Iran, with Donald Trump's administration allegedly considering nuclear options as diplomatic efforts falter. Russia is positioning itself as the stable, rising pole in a shifting global order, preparing for a high-stakes summit with China to solidify a new energy and security architecture independent of Western hegemony.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

• **Successful Sarmat ICBM Testing and Imminent Deployment**

- The Strategic Rocket Forces (RVSN) conducted a successful launch of the Sarmat missile from the Plesetsk cosmodrome to the Kura test range on Kamchatka. [The test confirmed](#) the missile's ability to operate on suborbital trajectories.
- President Putin announced that the first Sarmat regiment in the Krasnoyarsk Territory will be on **combat duty by the end of 2026**. [The missile is claimed](#) to have four times the power of any Western analog.
- The RVSN commander, Colonel-General Sergey Karakaev, reported that the missile can deliver a 10-ton payload via the South Pole, rendering current **anti-ballistic missile (ABM) defenses obsolete**. [This capability](#) is central to Russia's 2030 strategic deterrence goals.

• **High-Level Corruption Purge in Kyiv**

- Andrey Yermak, former head of the Office of the President of Ukraine, has been detained and faces charges related to **laundering over \$11 million** through the "Dynasty" elite housing project. [The investigation](#) was initiated by the U.S.-backed NABU and SAP.
- Russian analysts interpret the move as a "lawfare" operation by Washington to gain leverage over Zelensky or prepare for his replacement. [Yermak is referred to](#) as "R-2" in legal documents, implying Zelensky is the primary target "R-1."
- Former press secretary Iuliia Mendel claimed Zelensky **personally agreed to cede Donbas** in 2022, a claim used to frame his current refusal to negotiate as a result of Western pressure or personal instability. [These revelations](#) are being used to fuel internal Ukrainian dissent.

• **U.S.-Iran Nuclear Brinkmanship**

- The Trump administration has deployed the USS *Georgia* nuclear submarine to the Mediterranean as a "political act of intimidation" against Tehran. [State media reports](#) that the U.S. may be considering strategic nuclear strikes if Iran does not yield.
- Iran has reportedly threatened to **enrich uranium to 90%** for weapons use if the U.S. continues its "escalation plan." [The closure](#) of the Strait of Hormuz remains a critical threat to global energy security.

• **Political Crisis in the United Kingdom**

- Prime Minister Keir Starmer is reportedly on the "edge of an abyss" following the loss of 1,500 local mandates. [Cabinet ministers](#), including Yvette Cooper and Shabana Mahmood, are rumored to be pushing for his resignation.
- The UK's political "chaos" is contrasted with Russia's internal stability, with Russian commentators suggesting that Western democracies are **incapable of long-term strategic consistency**. [The crisis](#) is expected to peak around the King's Speech.

• **Russia-China Strategic Pivot**

- Preparations are underway for President Putin's visit to China in late May, following Donald Trump's trip. [Analysts suggest](#) Russia has transitioned from a "major partner" to a "critically vital strategic resource" for China's survival.
- Negotiations for the **Power of Siberia 2** pipeline are expected to culminate in a formal contract during the summit, providing China with energy security amid a potential U.S. blockade of the Strait of Malacca. [Russia's share](#) of China's oil imports has already exceeded 20%.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Technology Policy & AI Warfare Russian state media is highlighting the integration of Palantir's AI technologies into Ukrainian drone operations as a "cult of human sacrifice." [Vladimir Solovyov accused](#) Palantir CEO Alex Karp of personal responsibility for deaths in the Middle East and Russia. The Kremlin is framing AI as a "new frontier" of Western aggression, emphasizing Russia's

own electronic warfare successes, such as the "Borshchevik" system, in **disrupting SpaceX's Starlink** encryption. [Strategic concerns](#) remain regarding Western satellite-derived intelligence providing 75% of Ukraine's targeting data.

Energy Security & Global Markets The ongoing blockade/tension in the Strait of Hormuz is driving a "shock situation" in global fuel prices. [China experienced](#) a 17% increase in gasoline prices in April, the first major rise in a decade. Russia is positioning its land-based energy infrastructure (pipelines to China) as the only **guaranteed secure energy source** for the East, independent of maritime chokepoints controlled by the U.S. Navy. [The economic narrative](#) claims Russia is now the 4th largest economy by PPP, growing 10% over the last three years despite sanctions.

Corruption & Governance The legal warfare (lawfare) surrounding Andrey Yermak and "R-1" (Zelensky) is being utilized to show that the Ukrainian state is a "mafia structure" being dismantled by its own sponsors. [The use of NABU](#)—an agency described as being under the direct control of the FBI/CIA—indicates a shift in U.S. policy toward **direct management of the Ukrainian executive**. [The allegations](#) include the use of occultists and fortune-tellers in high-level state appointments, further aiming to discredit the professionalism of the Kyiv leadership.

Domestic Stability & Social Order In Russia, the government is highlighting "humanitarian" governance. Putin's meeting with his former teacher, Vera Gurevich, [serves to project](#) an image of a leader with "traditional values" and personal loyalty, contrasting with the "narcissism" and "instability" attributed to Western and Ukrainian leaders. [Simultaneously](#), the state

is emphasizing the successful **return of 3,700 POWs** and the work of Ombudsman Moskalkova to show "no one is abandoned."

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity focused on economic planning and technical education, with the government aiming to close the gap between engineering curricula and industrial demand. [Prime Minister Mishustin](#) emphasized the role of "Advanced Engineering Schools" in achieving technological sovereignty.

• BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Engineering Education Quotas:** New government quotas for target training of engineers based on employer applications were finalized for 2027. [The plan](#) requires universities to integrate more closely with the defense-industrial complex.
- **Mobilization Law (Ukraine):** Discussion of proposed Ukrainian legislation to restrict banking and voting rights for citizens fleeing conscription, which Russian media highlights as **evidence of "totalitarianism"** in Kyiv. [The proposal](#) aims to find "hidden" citizens through digital banking audits.

• HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Mishustin Strategic Session:** A cabinet-level meeting on engineering education, highlighting that 70% of engineering student spots are now state-funded. [The session](#) targeted a "technological leadership" goal for 2030.
- **Reshetnikov Economic Briefing:** The Minister of Economic Development reported that real incomes rose by 2.6% in Q1 2026, and the **inflation rate has stabilized at 5.6%**. [The report](#) claimed the Russian economy is successfully undergoing "structural adjustment."
- **Ombudsman Report:** Tatyana Moskalkova reported to Putin on the status of POW exchanges and the protection of Russian citizens abroad, noting **700,000 appeals** over the last 10 years. [The meeting](#) focused on humanitarian outcomes of the special military operation.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The "Sarmat Doctrine" as Strategic Gaslighting The intense media coverage of the Sarmat test is more than a technical report; it is a psychological operation directed at European capitals. Russia's role in this new alignment is that of the "security guarantor" and "energy pump" that allows the East to withstand Western economic pressure.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a formal announcement of a trial date or further restrictive measures against Andrey Yermak in Ukraine, which will be heavily exploited by Russian media to show a **power struggle between Zelensky and NABU**. The arrival of Donald Trump in Beijing will be scrutinized

for "signs of weakness," setting the stage for Putin's visit. We may see a "demonstrative strike" or further testing of non-nuclear advanced weaponry (like the Oreschnik) to maintain the psychological momentum of the Sarmat test.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The deployment of the first Sarmat regiment will likely coincide with a major diplomatic push for a "new European security architecture" that excludes current Ukrainian leadership. If Keir Starmer is ousted in the UK, expect a **re-evaluation of British military aid** to Ukraine as a new leadership focuses on domestic stabilization. The signing of the Power of Siberia 2 contract will likely be the crowning achievement of the Putin-Xi summit, permanently **tilting Russian energy exports** away from Europe.

Long Term (1-5 Years): Russia is moving toward a permanent "fortress economy" where engineering education and military-industrial capacity are the primary drivers of growth. The successful deployment of suborbital and hypersonic delivery systems (Sarmat, Avangard) suggests a long-term strategic period where **U.S. missile defense is considered irrelevant**, potentially leading to a new "Nuclear Peace" based on extreme Russian offensive superiority or a renewed global arms race for suborbital platforms. The Ukrainian state may be forced into a "rump state" status, as Western support shifts from military aid to "anti-corruption" management of its remaining resources.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The Sarmat test signals that Russia is **expanding its nuclear threshold** to include suborbital deterrence; NATO may need to accelerate space-based sensor deployment to track non-ballistic trajectories.
- The Yermak corruption case indicates that anti-corruption agencies in Ukraine are now the **primary conduit for Western political influence**, potentially bypassing the Office of the President.
- The Russia-China energy nexus is nearing a "point of no return"; diplomatic efforts to separate Moscow and Beijing via sanctions have failed and may even be **accelerating their integration**.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- The Strait of Hormuz remains the single greatest risk to global supply chains; **hedging against long-term energy volatility** is essential as U.S.-Iran tensions move into a potentially "strategic" phase.
- The "Dynasty" case in Ukraine suggests that investment in Ukrainian reconstruction is **highly vulnerable to retroactive corruption investigations** as political factions shift.
- Russia's "Fourth Economy" claim suggests a resilient, if skewed, domestic market; opportunities exist in **import substitution and high-tech engineering** for firms operating within non-Western blocs.
