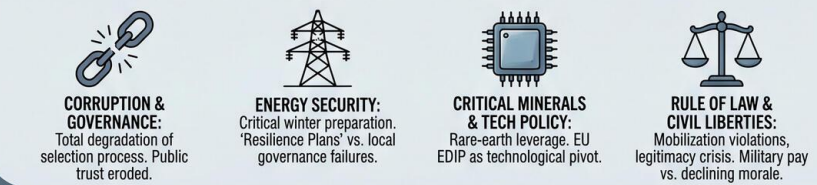

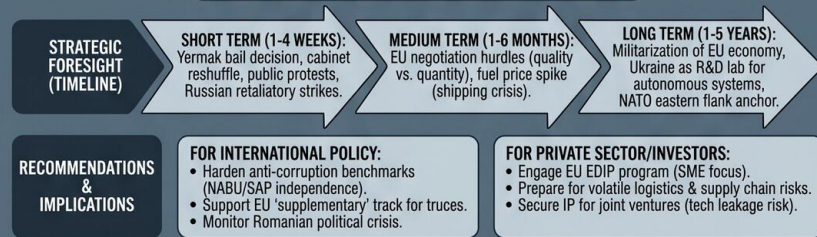

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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

May 13, 2026, was defined by a critical intersection of internal institutional decay and external existential threats. Ukraine faced one of the most [widespread aerial drone assaults](#) of the war, with approximately 150 Russian UAVs targeting infrastructure from Volyn to Zakarpattia. Simultaneously, the domestic political landscape was rocked by the ongoing prosecution of Andriy Yermak, the former Head of the Office of the President. The [Higher Anti-Corruption Court \(VACC\)](#) revealed sensational evidence suggesting that key state appointments, including the Minister of Health and SBU officials, were allegedly vetted by an astrologer, signaling a profound crisis in the country's executive governance and rule of law.

On the international stage, the diplomatic center of gravity shifted to Beijing as US President Donald Trump arrived for a high-stakes summit with Xi Jinping. This visit

occurs amid a volatile energy market driven by [instability in the Strait of Hormuz](#) and a broader European push for strategic autonomy. Ukraine's Foreign Ministry is leveraging this flux to propose a "supplementary" European diplomatic track to complement US-led negotiations, specifically focusing on [localized truces for airports](#) and energy infrastructure. The administration appears to be balancing a desperate need for Western financial tranches against a growing public perception of systemic corruption at the highest levels of the "Midas" circle.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **The Yermak/Dynasty Corruption Prosecution**
 - The VACC is currently determining a [180 million UAH bail](#) for Andriy Yermak, accused of laundering 460 million UAH through the "Dynasty" luxury housing cooperative. [Evidence presented](#) indicates that over 70% of the funds originated from kickbacks within Energoatom.
 - Prosecutorial records from a seized phone revealed that Yermak allegedly consulted an astrologer, [Veronika Anikiyevych](#), for "clearance" on high-level personnel decisions, including the Prosecutor General and deputies within the President's Office.
 - A former Azov soldier was detained after [throwing an egg at Yermak](#) outside the courtroom, reflecting rising public anger over elite corruption during wartime.

- **Massive National Aerial Offensive**

- Russia launched [139 to 150 drones](#) (Shahed, Gerbera, and Italmas models) across nearly every Ukrainian region. Casualties were reported in Kryvyi Rih, where a [nine-month-old infant](#) was seriously injured.
- For the first time in the conflict, the Zakarpattia region faced a [large-scale, coordinated drone attack](#), signaling a Russian intent to disrupt deep-rear logistics and psychological stability near the EU border.

- **Strategic Shift in Peace Diplomacy**

- Foreign Minister Andriy Sybiha introduced a proposal for a ["supplementary" European role](#) in peace talks, suggesting the EU lead on specific humanitarian truces for airports and energy sites while the US retains the "mainstream" diplomatic lead.
- Sybiha emphasized that [no peace is possible](#) without the return of all deported children, noting that 49 countries have now joined the return coalition.

- **Integration of Ukraine into EU Defense Industry**

- The EU officially launched the practical phase of the [European Defense Industrial Programme \(EDIP\)](#), allocating 1.5 billion euros through 2027. This allows Ukrainian firms to compete for contracts and funding on [equal terms with EU companies](#) for the first time.

- **Regional Instability in Romania**

- The Romanian government under Ilie Bolojan [resigned following a vote of no confidence](#) triggered by economic austerity measures. This creates a critical vulnerability on Ukraine's southern flank as the pro-Russian/sovereignist AUR party gains leverage.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Corruption & Governance The Yermak case has transitioned from a political rumor to a [foundational crisis for the Zelenskyy administration](#). The revelation of "astrological vetting" for state officials suggests a total degradation of the civil service selection process, which experts argue [undermines the legitimacy of all appointments](#) made since 2020. Public trust is further eroded by allegations that the Dynasty cooperative used [sand taken from cemeteries](#) for its construction, a detail that has become a symbol of elite callousness.

Energy Security Ukraine is preparing for a [critically difficult winter](#). Regional leaders are scrambling to implement "Resilience Plans." In Lviv, the focus is on [securing 110kV substations](#) and deploying block-modular boiler houses to decentralize heating. However, local governance failures remain a risk; for example, the Kharkiv city council reportedly [used critical co-generation units as collateral](#) for municipal loans, threatening the city's energy stability.

Critical Minerals & Technology Policy The Trump-Xi summit in Beijing is heavily influenced by [control over rare-earth metals](#) (Gallium, Germanium). Analysts note that Ukraine's own untapped [rare-earth deposits](#) could be a major strategic lever for Western investment, provided the security situation

stabilizes. Meanwhile, the EU's EDIP program represents a [technological pivot](#), where Ukrainian frontline innovations in FPV drones and EW are being codified into European defense standards.

Rule of Law & Civil Liberties The Ombudsman's 2025 report highlights [12,000 complaints regarding mobilization violations](#). Reports of TCC (military recruitment) officers [seizing phones or using physical force](#) are creating a significant "shadow" crisis of legitimacy. Legislators are calling for an [indexation of military pay](#) to counter the 44 UAH/\$ exchange rate and combat declining morale.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity centered on the Ombudsman's annual report and emergency budget amendments required to unlock EU macro-financial support. Parliament remains [sparsely attended](#), with opposition members

accusing the majority of paralysis in the face of the Yermak scandal.

• **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**

- **Resolution 15129:** Acceptance of the Ombudsman's 2025 report on [human rights and freedoms](#). It passed the initial phase but faced criticism for failing to hold executive officials accountable for mobilization abuses.
- **2026 Budget Amendments:** Crucial for the [90 billion euro EU facility](#). Debates focused on directing the military tax specifically to a defense fund rather than general expenditures.
- **Same-Sex Union Status (Poland):** Prime Minister Tusk initiated the recognition of [foreign-contracted same-sex marriages](#), a move driven by EU court mandates that may influence Ukraine's future legislative alignment.

• **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:**

- **Ombudsman Dmytro Lubinets:** Reported that [12,142 civilians have been wounded](#) since the start of the full-scale invasion, calling for a dedicated "Human Capital Ministry."
- **VACC Press Briefing:** NABU Director Semen Kryvonos clarified that [President Zelenskyy is not a figure](#) in the Dynasty housing case, though the investigation into "other persons" continues.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Degradation of the Executive Vanguard The Yermak prosecution is not merely a corruption case; it is an exposure of a "parallel government" structure. The reliance on [esoteric consultations \(astrology\)](#) for statecraft indicates that the meritocratic

and democratic institutions of the Ukrainian state were bypassed in favor of a closed, highly personalized circle. Critics argue this ["Yermakism" has hollowed out state institutions](#), making them vulnerable to Russian IPSSO and undermining the narrative of a democratic Ukraine fighting an autocratic Russia.

Weaponization of the Migration Narrative

A sophisticated Russian IPSSO is currently exploiting labor shortages. Rumors of a ["flood" of Asian migrants](#) (Pakistanis, Indians) are being viralized on TikTok and Telegram. Experts note the [narrative links migration to mobilization](#), suggesting that while Ukrainian men die at the front, foreigners are taking their jobs and country. This is designed to spark [internal civil unrest](#) and distract from the actual economic problem: a [20% drop in productivity](#) compared to 2021.

The European Strategic Re-alignment

With the Trump administration signaling a potential [military withdrawal from Europe](#), a new security architecture is emerging. The ["French Nuclear Umbrella"](#) and the expansion of the EDIP program suggest the EU is preparing to become Ukraine's primary long-term security guarantor. Poland is positioning itself as the [primary technological hub](#), while Ukraine transitions from a recipient of aid to a [strategic partner](#) in defense innovation.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

• Short Term (1-4 Weeks):

- The VACC's bail decision on Yermak will likely trigger a cabinet reshuffle. If he is detained, expect a [fragmentation of his loyalist network](#) within the MOH and SBU. Public protests may increase if the bail is perceived as too low or if funds are provided by questionable sources.
- Expect retaliatory Russian missile strikes following the mass drone swarm as they attempt to [exploit gaps in the PPO](#) (Anti-Air) network exposed today.

• Medium Term (1-6 Months):

- Ukraine will face a "quality vs. quantity" hurdle in EU negotiations. The EU's "era of reform for show" is over, and [future financial tranches](#) will be strictly tied to tangible independence of NABU and SAP.
- A significant [fuel price spike](#) (estimated at 15-25% for staples like bread) will likely occur due to the Middle East shipping crisis and domestic logistical bottlenecks.

• Long Term (1-5 Years):

- The [militarization of the EU economy](#) will likely make Ukraine the continent's largest R&D lab for autonomous systems. If Ukraine can maintain its anti-corruption momentum, it will become the [anchor of the NATO eastern flank](#), potentially hosting permanent EU-led defense clusters.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy

- Harden benchmarks for anti-corruption compliance. The Yermak case proves that [institutional independence of NABU/SAP](#) is the only viable guardrail against executive overreach.
- Support the ["supplementary" European track](#) for humanitarian truces to preserve critical infrastructure before winter.
- Monitor the [Romanian political crisis](#) closely to prevent a sovereignist-pro-Russian shift from blocking Ukrainian transit corridors.

For Private Sector/Investors

- **Defense Sector Opportunity:** Engage with the [EU EDIP program](#) now. Small and medium enterprises (SMEs) in Ukraine are predicted to provide higher returns than established giants due to lower bureaucracy and [real-world combat testing](#).
- **Supply Chain Risk:** Prepare for [volatile logistics costs](#) within Ukraine as fuel prices rise and regional governments (like Kharkiv) face potential energy infrastructure seizures due to bad debt.
- **Strategic Resource Guarding:** Secure legal counsel specializing in [intellectual property protection](#) for joint ventures, as the shift to localized production in the EU increases risks of technology leakage.
