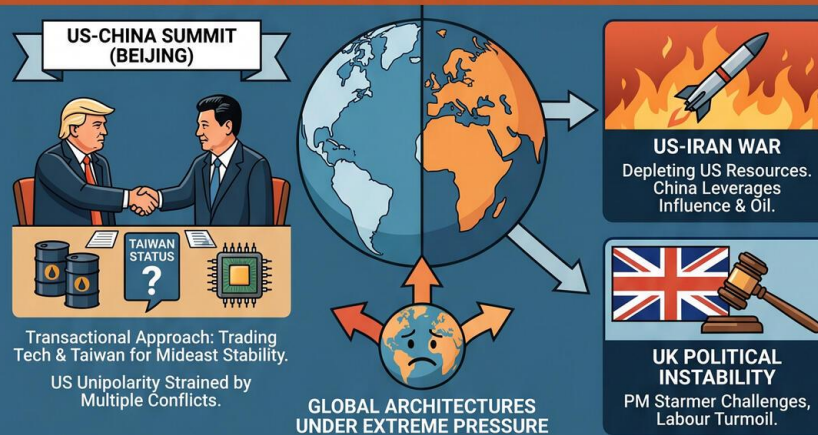

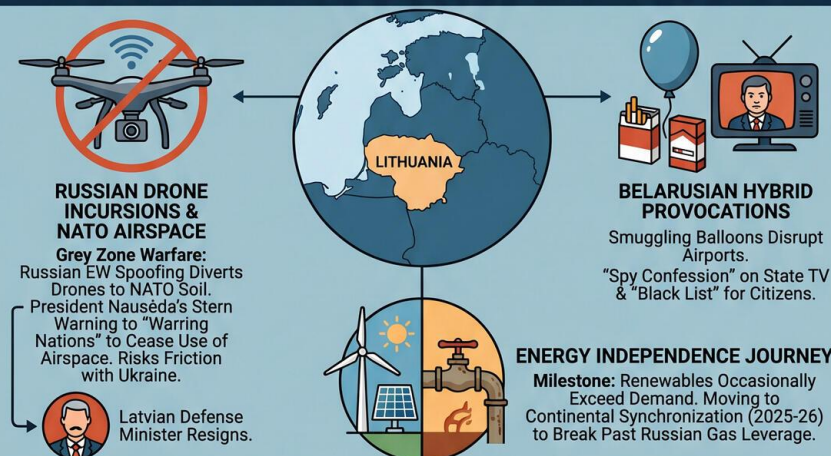

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

May 13, 2026, was characterized by a convergence of high-stakes geopolitical maneuvering and regional security crises across the Baltic and global stages. In Lithuania, President Gitanas Nausėda issued an unusually stern and controversial warning to "warring European nations"—specifically Russia and Ukraine—demanding that Lithuanian territory not be used as a corridor for [drone strikes](#). This move follows several incidents where drones, purportedly Ukrainian but diverted by Russian electronic warfare, entered Baltic airspace. While intended to negate Russian propaganda that NATO is facilitating attacks from its soil, the statement drew domestic criticism for potentially "leveling" the aggressor and the

defender, signaling a possible friction point in Lithuania's unconditional support for Kyiv.

Simultaneously, the global power dynamic shifted as Donald Trump arrived in Beijing for a pivotal summit with Xi Jinping, his most significant visit of his second term. The visit, accompanied by high-profile [tech CEOs](#), centers on the war with Iran and the status of Taiwan. There is palpable anxiety in Taipei and among regional analysts that Trump may consider scaling back support for Taiwan in exchange for Chinese cooperation in stabilizing the Middle East. This summit reflects a world where American "unipolarity" is visibly strained by multiple conflicts, forcing a transactional approach to traditional alliances.

Domestically, Lithuania continues to grapple with "hybrid" threats from Belarus, ranging from cigarette-smuggling balloons that [disrupt airport operations](#) to the airing of a forced "spy confession" by a Lithuanian citizen. The state is also reflecting on its decade-long journey toward energy independence, contrasting current successes in renewable energy with past vulnerabilities to Russian gas blackmail. These narratives of resilience are being tested by modern threats—specifically the proliferation of drones and the legal challenges posed by AI-generated deepfakes ("vaizdaklastė") in the information war.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

• **Presidential Warning on Airspace Sovereignty**

- President Nausėda issued a categorical demand that "third countries" cease using Lithuanian airspace for [military operations](#) against neighbors. [expert analysis](#) suggests this was a move to neutralize Russian disinformation, though it risked offending Ukrainian partners.
- The warning follows drone incidents in Latvia and Estonia, leading to the [resignation](#) of the Latvian Defense Minister due to perceived failures in communication and detection.
- Military experts note that most incursions result from Russian [electronic warfare](#) "spoofing" Ukrainian drones, causing them to lose their trajectory and land in NATO territory.

• **Trump-Xi Summit in Beijing**

- President Trump's visit aims to stabilize relations with China amid a continuing war with Iran that is [depleting American resources](#).
- China is leveraging its oil reserves and Iranian influence, while Trump is seeking [economic concessions](#) for US businesses like Apple and Tesla.
- Taiwanese officials are concerned that the US may agree to [consult with Beijing](#) on future arms packages, a potential shift in the decades-long "status quo."

• **Belarusian Provocations and Hybrid Warfare**

- Belarusian state TV aired a film featuring Miroslavas Trockis, a Lithuanian citizen sentenced to [15 years](#) for alleged espionage, which Vilnius calls a total provocation.
- Smuggling balloons from Belarus caused the [temporary closure](#) of Vilnius airport, impacting over 130 passengers and forcing flight diversions.
- The Ministry of Foreign Affairs reiterated a "Black List" warning for citizens to [immediately leave](#) Belarus due to the risk of arbitrary detention.

• **UK Political Instability**

- Prime Minister Keir Starmer faces a significant leadership challenge following [catastrophic local election](#) losses.
- Health Secretary Wes Streeting is reportedly preparing to [challenge Starmer](#) for the premiership, marking a rare period of internal Labour party turmoil.

• **Lithuanian Energy Independence and Renewables**

- Lithuania marks a milestone where local [renewable generation](#) (wind and solar) occasionally exceeds total domestic demand.
- The state is continuing efforts to fully disconnect from the [BREL ring](#) and synchronize with Continental Europe by 2025-2026.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

National Security & Defense Architecture

- The "Iron Wolf" international military exercises are testing [anti-drone tactics](#) and trench fortification based on lessons learned from the Ukraine war.
- The State is ramping up the issuance of [defense bonds](#), raising nearly 140 million euros in two weeks to fund military modernization.
- Discussions continue regarding the deployment of Lithuanian forces to the [Strait of Hormuz](#) to support US operations, despite pushback from coalition partners who argue it is "not our war."

Energy Security

- A retrospective on the "Independence" LNG terminal highlights how the project broke the [Gazprom monopoly](#), though it faced intense internal political sabotage at the time.
- The government is currently prioritizing [infrastructure repair](#) over aesthetic station renovations following a major cargo train derailment in Gudžiūnai.

Technology Policy & Information Warfare

- Legal experts are defining the term "**vaizdaklastė**" (deepfake) to address the rise of [AI-generated misinformation](#) targeting public figures.
- The focus is shifting toward "secondary sharing" liability, where individuals could face civil penalties for [spreading forged content](#) even if they did not create it.

Corruption & Accountability

- FNTT (Financial Crimes Investigation Service) conducted raids related to [fraudulent farmer training](#) programs funded by EU subsidies, leading to the dismissal of an advisor to the Prime Minister.
- The "Nemuno aušra" party is suing the Central Election Commission after being [denied state funding](#) due to campaign violations.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity centered on media governance and energy regulation, with a strong emphasis on refining laws to meet EU standards and address security vulnerabilities discovered during auditing.

• **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**

- **LRT Law Amendments:** The Seimas Culture Committee finalized a controversial revision of the Law on Lithuanian National Radio and Television. Critics argue the [original draft](#) was "low quality," requiring extensive fixes to satisfy STT (Special Investigation Service) and Venice Commission standards.
- **Natural Gas Law Pataisos:** Recalled in historical context, the implementation of the [Third Energy Package](#) was critical for unbundling Gazprom's control over Lithuanian infrastructure.
- **Defense Bond Regulation:** New rules allow for [continuous issuance](#) of defense obligations with variable interest rates to ensure steady military funding.

- **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:**

- **Presidential Press Release:** Distributed via Frederikas Jansonas, warning against [airspace violations](#) by warring parties.
- **Foreign Affairs Committee Meeting:** Discussion on the [Hormuz Mission](#) and the necessity of maintaining "strong ties with America" through military contributions.
- **UN Envoy Visit:** US Special Envoy John Coulon's planned visit to Belarus is noted as a potential window for [political prisoner release](#), despite ongoing tensions.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Transactional Nature of Second-Term Trumpism

Trump's visit to Beijing highlights a shift toward extreme pragmatism. Unlike his first term, which was characterized by ideological hawks, this administration appears focused on [economic wins](#) and off-ramps from overseas conflicts. The inclusion of Elon Musk and other tech leaders suggests that tech-sovereignty and market access are being traded for geopolitical stability. The "Taiwan card" is increasingly viewed by Beijing as a negotiable asset for Trump, who prioritizes domestic voters' [economic well-being](#) over traditional democratic alliance-building.

The "Grey Zone" of NATO Airspace

The Baltic states are becoming a laboratory for "grey zone" warfare involving drones. While Russia uses EW to [misdirect drones](#), the resulting crashes on NATO soil create political crises, as seen in Latvia. President Nausėda's attempt to assert a "neutral" sovereignty

regarding drone corridors suggests a growing fear that persistent incidents could eventually trigger a Russian pretext for "counter-attacks" against the Baltics. This indicates a weakening of the "unconditional support" narrative as the physical risks of proximity to the front line increase.

Information Integrity in the Age of "Vaizdaklastė"

The emergence of "vaizdaklastė" (deepfakes) is being treated as a serious legal and security threat. The focus of the legal system is moving from the creators of content to the [amplifiers](#). This reflects a broader trend toward "Digital Sovereignty" where the state seeks to protect the collective reality of the citizenry from AI-facilitated psychological operations. The concern is that if the public cannot trust images of the Pope or their own politicians, the [social order](#) could be easily destabilized by foreign actors.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

- **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):**

- Expect increased tension between the Presidential Palace and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs over the "wording" of support for Ukraine. Any perception of [neutrality](#) by Nausėda will be heavily criticized by opposition parties.
- The UK leadership challenge by Streeter is likely to trigger a [confidence vote](#) or a Cabinet reshuffle shortly after the King's speech.

- **Medium Term (1-6 Months):**
 - Trump's "consultations" with Beijing over Taiwan could lead to a [slowdown in arms deliveries](#), causing a panic in Indo-Pacific security circles and potentially emboldening Chinese maritime activities.
 - Lithuania will likely deploy [anti-drone radar](#) systems specifically along the Belarusian border to counter both smuggling balloons and stray military drones.
- **Long Term (1-5 Years):**
 - Lithuania is positioning itself as a "Mini Saudi Arabia" of [green energy](#), aiming to export hydrogen and electricity to Central Europe. This would fundamentally alter the Baltic economic landscape from a net importer to a regional energy hub.
 - AI-generated content will likely force the creation of a "Certified Information" register or [digital watermarking](#) laws across the EU to mitigate the collapse of public trust.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Allies should clarify "Red Lines" regarding electronic warfare interference that leads to NATO airspace violations. The current ambiguity is causing [internal political instability](#) in the Baltic states.
- Diplomatic channels must prepare for a "Transactional America" that may de-prioritize [Taiwan's security](#) for concessions in the Middle East.

- Increased monitoring of Belarusian civil-military "provocations" is needed, as the regime is successfully using [detained citizens](#) as bargaining chips.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Sector:** Massive investment opportunities exist in Lithuanian [renewable infrastructure](#) as the country moves toward a permanent energy surplus.
- **Cybersecurity/Legal Tech:** There is a growing market for [deepfake detection](#) and digital signature technologies to comply with emerging "vaizdaklastė" regulations.
- **Supply Chain Risk:** Ongoing tensions in the [Strait of Hormuz](#) and potential shifts in US-China tech trade (lustai/chips) suggest continued volatility for manufacturing sectors reliant on East Asian components.
