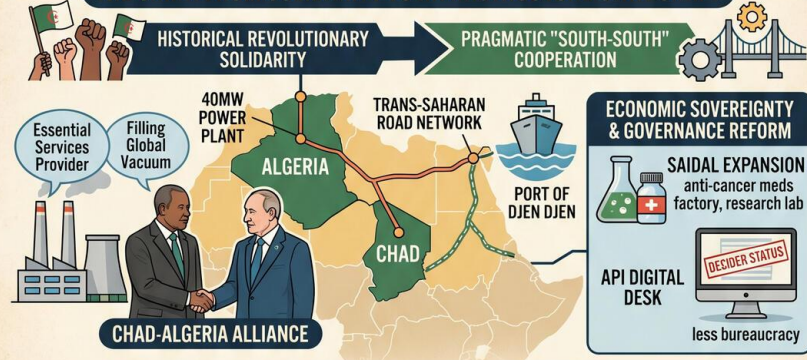

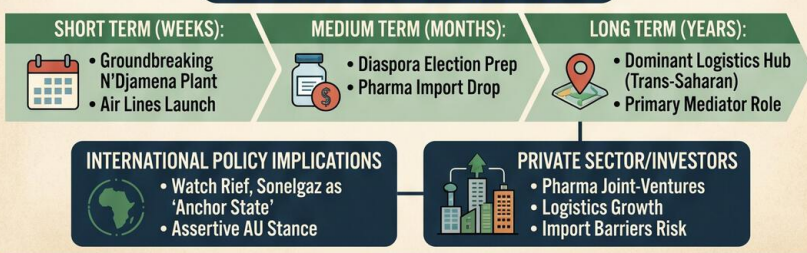

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT & IMPLICATIONS



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ALGERIA IS AGGRESSIVELY POSITIONING ITSELF AS A STRATEGIC AFRICAN POWER HUB THROUGH THE EXPORT OF ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE, PHARMACEUTICAL SOVEREIGNTY, AND HIGH-LEVEL DIPLOMATIC REALIGNMENT WITH SAHELIAN AND AUSTRAL PARTNERS.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

On May 15-16, 2026, Algerian state media reflected a coordinated push by the Tebboune administration to assert regional leadership through a pragmatic "South-South" cooperation model. The centerpiece of this effort is the conclusion of a landmark state visit by Chadian President Mahamat Idriss Déby Itno, which resulted in nearly [thirty strategic agreements](#) across eleven sectors. This diplomatic offensive is characterized by a transition from historical revolutionary solidarity to "results-oriented" infrastructure development, notably the commitment to build a 40MW power plant in N'Djamena and integrate Chad into the [trans-Saharan road network](#). By positioning state entities like Sonelgaz and Sonatrach as providers of

essential services to the Sahel, Algeria is attempting to fill a vacuum left by shifting global interests in the region.

In parallel, the Algerian government is doubling down on economic sovereignty. The state pharmaceutical giant Sidal is rapidly expanding its [anti-cancer medication production](#), aiming to slash import dependency and secure the domestic healthcare supply chain. This move toward industrial autonomy is mirrored in governance reforms at the Algerian Investment Agency (API), where a new "decider" status for [guichet unique representatives](#) aims to eliminate the bureaucratic paralysis that has historically stifled foreign and domestic investment. The convergence of these policies suggests a regime focused on building a "state-led" resilient economy that can project power through industrial and energy exports.

However, regional tensions remain a dominant theme. State coverage continues to aggressively delegitimize the Moroccan regime, leveraging Spanish security reports to frame the [Makhzen as a narco-state](#) responsible for the global cannabis trade. Simultaneously, Algeria is hosting the "Caravan of Memory" to anchor its European diaspora—specifically youth in France—to the revolutionary narrative ahead of the [2026 legislative elections](#). This suggests a dual-track strategy: projecting outward strength while consolidating the ideological and electoral loyalty of the millions of Algerians living abroad.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

The Chad-Algeria Strategic Alliance

- The state visit of President Mahamat Idriss Déby Itno concluded with the signing of a [major power generation agreement](#) involving the deployment of 50MW (later specified as a 40MW plant) to alleviate N'Djamena's chronic energy crisis.
- Algeria committed to a significant increase in academic and technical support, doubling [student scholarships to 300](#) with a focus on digitalization and medical specialization.
- Security cooperation centered on a concerted response to terrorism and [transnational crime in the Sahel](#), with a rare two-hour "one-on-one" between the two presidents signaling high trust.
- Infrastructure visits to the Port of Djen Djen highlighted plans to create [logistical corridors for landlocked countries](#) like Chad, utilizing the trans-Saharan highway as an alternative to West African ports.

Pharmaceutical Sovereignty and Import Substitution

- Saidal Group is operationalizing 11 out of 15 planned facilities to produce [172 different oncological medications](#), specifically targeting a 41% increase in supply to the central hospital pharmacy by 2025-2026.
- Advanced research projects into [stem cells and biological therapies](#) were announced, marking a shift toward high-tech clinical independence.

Investment and Governance Reform

- The Algerian Investment Agency (API) has empowered its unique window representatives to be [direct decision-makers](#) rather than mere administrative liaisons, a move designed to facilitate over 22,000 pending investment projects.
- Officials announced the imminent launch of a [digital unique desk](#) to automate approvals based on a new national planning "referential."

Regional Conflict Narrative

- Algeria amplified Spanish government reports identifying Morocco as the [primary global producer of cannabis](#), utilizing more than 600 high-speed boats for trafficking.
- Heavy focus on the "Rief National Party" opening its [first European branch in Girona](#), Spain, signaling Algerian support for the Rief's self-determination and highlighting Moroccan human rights abuses.
- Reports from the Gambian capital, Banjul, highlighted Sahrawi diplomatic efforts to expose Moroccan "media blackouts" and [violations against rights defenders](#).

Religious and Cultural Diplomacy

- Interfaith dialogue received unusual prominence with discussions on the [upcoming visit of the Pope](#), framing Algeria as a land of tolerance and historical Christian presence (Augustine of Hippo).
- The "Caravan of Memory" brought 56 diaspora youths to [Constantine and historical massacre sites](#) to foster "national belonging" and turn the diaspora into "ambassadors" of the state.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Economic Security & Investment Climate

- The API's transition from a "transmission belt" to an [autonomous decision-making body](#) is a critical attempt to reduce the 24-month average delay for project approvals.
- The government is prioritizing "stable fundamentals" in investment law to counter perceptions of [legal insecurity](#) that historically deterred foreign capital.

Energy Security & Regional Influence

- Sonatrach and Sonelgaz are being leveraged as tools of [regional statecraft](#), with specific targets for hydrocarbon exploration in Chad and electricity grid stabilization across the Sahel.
- The push for [local transformation of resources](#) (refineries, cement plants) in partner countries like Chad aims to build a dependency on Algerian technical management and equipment exports.

Geopolitical Power Dynamics

- Algeria is formalizing a "multi-alignment" strategy, similar to Angola's, to maintain [strategic autonomy](#) between global powers while dominating the African Union's agenda on regional stability.
- Diplomatic coordination with Egypt focused on the [regional neighborhood and Middle East](#), suggesting a shared interest in stabilizing the Mediterranean/Red Sea axis.

Domestic Stability & Social Order

- The 2026 legislative elections are a looming governance priority, with the Independent National Authority for Elections (ANIE) installing mechanisms in [consulates across France](#) to manage the diaspora vote.
- The use of "Memory" as a governance tool was underscored by the commemoration of [Maliha Hamidou](#) and other martyrs, serving to unify the populace under the current leadership's nationalist banner.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative and regulatory discussions on May 15, 2026, were dominated by electoral preparation and investment code implementation. The government is focused on operationalizing the 2022 Investment Law and preparing for the 2026 legislative cycle.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Electoral Code Amendments:** Updates to candidacy requirements for the 2026 elections, requiring [half of candidates to be under 40](#) and one-third to be women, with a strict university degree requirement for half of the list.
- **National Service Obligations:** Formal notification for citizens born in 2009 to register for [mandatory census and medical selection](#) for national service, emphasizing the legal obligation for all males reaching 19.
- **Investment Rule 51/49:** Ongoing debate regarding the stability of the [51/49 ownership rule](#) and its impact on the investment climate, with officials arguing that current sector-specific flexibility provides enough openness.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **ANIE Press Ceremony:** The Independent National Authority for Elections held a [swearing-in ceremony in Paris](#) for supervisors of the 2026 legislative elections, marking the operational start of the vote for the diaspora.
- **Hydrocarbons-Industry Coordination Meeting:** A rare joint session between the Ministers of Energy, Industry, and Renewable Energy to mandate [national industrial integration](#) and reduce dependency on imported industrial inputs.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Transition from Solidarity to Infrastructure Statecraft

A profound shift is occurring in Algeria's foreign policy toward Africa. Historically, Algeria relied on the "idealist revolutionary" rhetoric of the 1960s and 70s. Current reporting, however, emphasizes a ["practical and pragmatic" approach](#). The intensive coverage of historical martyrdom—from the documentary on [Maliha Hamidou](#) to the "Caravan of Memory"—suggests a regime that is increasingly using

history as a form of "cultural biosurveillance." By centering the national identity on a ["period of darkness"](#) (the colonial era), the state justifies its current "resilience" and strong-state governance. This historical anchoring is being specifically targeted at the diaspora in France to prevent the "temptation of division" or communalism that might threaten the state's [electoral control over the millions of voters](#) residing in Europe.

The "Multi-Alignment" Economic Shift

The discourse surrounding Angola and Chad reveals an Algerian desire to mimic the "multi-alignment" strategies of other rising powers. By discussing Angola's shift from [China toward the United States](#), Algerian analysts are signaling that Algeria too can diversify its partnerships without sacrificing its autonomy. This is underpinned by a newfound confidence in industrial sectors like [pharmaceuticals and mining](#), which are presented as the new "national shield" against global price volatility.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Groundbreaking for the [40MW power plant in N'Djamena](#) is expected, serving as a high-visibility test of Algerian implementation capacity in the Sahel.
- Deployment of the [Alger-N'Djamena and Alger-Luanda](#) air lines will likely accelerate, targeting a June/July 2026 launch to facilitate the newly created Business Councils.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- Intensified electoral campaigning within the diaspora as the [ANIE operationalizes regional desks](#). This may lead to increased friction with French authorities over sovereign activities on foreign soil.
- A significant reduction in pharmaceutical imports will be reported as Sidal's [anti-cancer units](#) reach 50% capacity, potentially impacting the market shares of European pharmaceutical firms.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- Completion of the trans-Saharan highway segments in Chad and Niger could transform Algeria into the [dominant logistics hub](#) for the central Sahel, fundamentally altering trade flows from the Gulf of Guinea toward the Mediterranean.
- Success of the "Pope's visit" diplomacy could reposition Algeria as the [primary mediator](#) for conflicts across both Muslim and Christian Africa, competing directly with Moroccan and Egyptian influence.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Western governments should monitor the growing "Rief National Party" activity in Spain, as Algerian support could [destabilize Spanish-Moroccan relations](#) and create a new front in the Maghreb cold war.
- EU and US energy departments should look at Sonelgaz's [involvement in Chad](#) as a sign of Algeria's intent to become the "anchor state" for energy security in the Sahel, a role previously reserved for Western or Chinese aid.

- Diplomatic circles should anticipate a more assertive Algerian stance at the African Union, backed by a [coalition of Australe powers](#) (Angola, South Africa) that share a multi-alignment philosophy.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Opportunity:** The pharmaceutical sector offers significant [joint-venture potential](#) for firms providing raw materials and biological technology for Sidal's expansion.
- **Risk:** Import-dependent businesses face increasing [regulatory barriers](#) as Algeria intensifies its "industrial integration" mandates to achieve self-sufficiency in oncology and energy equipment.
- **Opportunity:** The logistics sector around the [Port of Djen Djen](#) and the trans-Saharan highway represents a high-growth area for cold-chain and dry-bulk transport firms looking to access the interior African market.
