DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The global security environment reached a critical juncture on May 17, 2026, characterized by an aggressive escalation in diplomatic rhetoric and asymmetric military actions. U.S. President Donald Trump issued a [dire ultimatum to Tehran](#), stating that "the clock is ticking" for a peace deal while threatening that "there won't be anything left of them" otherwise. This rhetorical shift coincided with reports that [Iran is formalizing a tolling system](#) in the Strait of Hormuz, effectively attempting to monetize its blockade of 20% of the world's energy and fertilizer supplies. The economic fallout is manifesting in a [projected food security catastrophe](#), with the UN warning that 45 million more people could face starvation if fertilizer shipments remain blocked during the current planting season.

Simultaneously, a biological threat has been elevated to a [Public Health Emergency of](#)

[International Concern](#) (PHEIC). The World Health Organization (WHO) sounded the alarm over a lethal "Bundibugyo" strain of Ebola spreading through the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and Uganda. The outbreak is complicated by regional conflict and [border closures by Rwanda](#), highlighting the collapse of state capacity in eastern DRC. This crisis is exacerbated by the [discontinuation of major U.S. aid programs](#), as the Trump administration continues its withdrawal from international health and development organizations.

In the European theater, Ukraine launched its [largest drone assault on Russia](#) since the war's inception, targeting residential and industrial sites in the Moscow region and forcing a [suspension of all four major Moscow airports](#). However, Kyiv faces a mounting internal crisis following the [arrest of Andrew Yermak](#), the former Chief of Staff, on charges of laundering \$100 million. This intersection of high-intensity external warfare and systemic internal corruption threatens to destabilize President Zelensky's administration during a critical diplomatic window.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **U.S.-Iran Standoff and Hormuz Tolls:** President Trump has escalated tensions by issuing a [Truth Social ultimatum](#) to Iran, while Tehran maintains defiance through military spokespersons who warn of "surprising and stormy scenarios" for U.S. assets. Iran is moving to [reveal a transit toll plan](#) for the Strait of Hormuz, excluding "hostile" nations and demanding fees of up to [\\$2 million per vessel](#). This follows the failure of the U.S. Navy's "Operation Freedom" to [guarantee safety for commercial vessels](#).

- **WHO Ebola Emergency:** An international health emergency has been declared for a [rare strain of Ebola](#) for which no approved vaccine or specific treatment exists. Fatalities have been reported in [Kinshasa and Kampala](#), indicating significant geographic spread from the epicenter in Ituri province. Regional containment is failing as [Rwanda closes borders](#) to DRC citizens.
- **Mass Ukrainian Drone Barrage:** Russian defenses reportedly shot down over [550 Ukrainian drones](#) overnight. Strikes hit residential areas in Himki and Mitishi and [damaged the Capotnia oil refinery](#). Kyiv framed the attacks as a direct message that the Moscow region is no longer a safe haven from the war.
- **Ukrainian Corruption Scandal:** "Operation Midas" has led to the [arrest of Andrew Yermak](#), the former lead peace negotiator for Ukraine. Investigators have identified [luxury real estate developments](#) used to funnel tens of millions in illicit funds, raising questions about President Zelensky's potential involvement.
- **Critical Mineral Competition:** In Latin America, the U.S. and China are locked in an [aggressive race for copper, lithium, and rare earths](#). Brazil is positioning itself as a strategic player, seeking to add domestic value to mineral extraction [rather than simply exporting raw materials](#), while illegal gold mining creates an environmental and human rights crisis in the Amazon.
- **Israel-Lebanon Ceasefire Violations:** Despite a 45-day extension of the ceasefire, Israel has [hit over 100 sites](#) in Lebanon in 48 hours. The economic damage to Lebanon has exceeded [\\$2 billion \(7% of GDP\)](#), with one in five citizens displaced.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy and Economic Security: The blockade of the Strait of Hormuz has created a global spike in [fertilizer and fuel costs](#). In Iran, local coastal businesses are [struggling as the sea remains closed](#), while globally, insurance premiums for humanitarian shipping have risen [by 400%](#). U.S. economic pressure continues to rely on [aggressive tariffs as a diplomatic weapon](#).

Biosurveillance and Disease Outbreaks: The WHO faces significant hurdles in DRC due to [armed group activity](#) and a massive [\\$215 million funding gap](#). The spread of Ebola to urban centers like Kinshasa and Kampala highlights the [failure of internal screening](#) and retroactive case searching.

Geopolitical Power Dynamics: Canada is pursuing a policy of "principal pragmatism" as it [seeks to diversify trade](#) away from the U.S. following threats of annexation. Meanwhile, Spain and other European nations are [renewing calls for a standing European army](#) to reduce reliance on an "unreliable" Washington.

Corruption and Rule of Law: In Peru, a month-long counting delay has finally resulted in a [runoff between Keiko Fujimori and Roberto Sanchez](#), both of whom face ongoing corruption probes. In Ukraine, the [parliamentary commission on corruption](#) is now scrutinizing whether high-level figures were directly involved in laundering war-time aid.

AI and Critical Infrastructure: Spain's Aragon region has become a hub for [resource-hungry data centers](#) powering generative AI. Critics argue these "fortress-like" facilities operate with [complete secrecy](#), bypassing

environmental regulations and straining local water and energy supplies.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative and policy shifts today focused on escalating domestic security measures and asserting national identities during periods of civil unrest and war. Significant developments include the [expansion of the death penalty](#) in the West Bank and restrictive language laws in the U.S.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Israeli Death Penalty Law:** An Israeli military order has [expanded the application](#) of the death penalty for Palestinians in the Occupied West Bank accused of lethal attacks, moving beyond civil law into military court jurisdiction.
- **Florida English-Only Driving Test:** The state of Florida has [banned all languages except English](#) for driving tests, a move critics claim [unfairly targets immigrants](#) and ignores the state's significant non-English speaking tourism and labor sectors.
- **Spanish Embargo on Israel:** The Spanish government approved a bill [banning the sale of weapons](#) and military equipment to Israel, citing violations of international law in Gaza and Lebanon.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **M23 Press Conference (Goma):** Leaders of the M23 rebellion held a press conference to [announce new sanitary measures](#) following a confirmed Ebola case in Goma, though they remain [disconnected from Kinshasa's resources](#).

- **Rededicate 250 (Washington DC):** A massive prayer event on the National Mall featured [House Speaker Mike Johnson](#) and a video message from President Trump, drawing criticism for [promoting Christian nationalism](#) ahead of the November midterm elections.
- **China-U.S. Summit (Beijing):** Discussions regarding [Taiwan's sovereignty](#) and rare mineral supply chains concluded with Taiwan's president expressing concern that the island's [future must be decided by its people](#).

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Monetization of Maritime Blockades

A dangerous precedent is being set in the Strait of Hormuz where a sovereign state is [monetizing the blockade of international waters](#). By charging exorbitant transit tolls, Iran is transitioning from a traditional military blockade to a [system of state-sponsored extortion](#). This model mirrors tactics used by the Houthis in the Red Sea but at a state scale. If successful, it [permanently rewrites the economic risk profile](#) for every maritime choke point in the world, as other nations may see the "power to toll" as an acceptable tool for regional leverage.

The Erosion of Transatlantic and North American Trust

The traditional Western alliance is fragmenting under the pressure of "America First" foreign policy. Canada's [doubling of non-U.S. trade targets](#) and Spain's refusal to [allow U.S. strikes from its bases](#) indicate that allies are no longer viewing the U.S. as a reliable security guarantor. This trend is

leading to a [more multipolar, "west-less" world](#) where middle powers seek independent security architectures (like a European army) to immunize themselves from the ["zig-zags" of U.S. policy](#).

State Capacity and the Governance of Crisis

A recurring theme is the collapse of state capacity in managing dual crises. Ukraine is fighting a war of survival against Russia while [prosecuting its own highest officials](#) for corruption. Similarly, the DRC is dealing with a [lethal Ebola strain](#) while its military infrastructure is [compromised by rebel groups](#). This "war within a war" or "crisis within a crisis" dynamic suggests that modern governance is increasingly defined by the inability to prioritize resources, leading to [profound human abandonment](#) in conflict zones like Al-Fashir or eastern DRC.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks):

- **Hormuz Flashpoint:** With the [Haj pilgrimage starting next week](#), regional powers (Saudi Arabia/UAE) will likely exert massive pressure on the U.S. to avoid a new air campaign. However, Trump's "clock is ticking" rhetoric suggests a [limited, high-intensity strike](#) remains highly probable if a tolling framework is officially enacted.
- **Ebola Expansion:** Given the 21-day incubation period and the [lack of screening during long journeys](#) to Kinshasa and Kampala, secondary infection clusters will likely emerge in urban centers, potentially triggering [wider travel bans and regional lockdowns](#).

Medium Term (1-6 Months):

- **U.S. Midterm Election Impact:** The [3.8% U.S. inflation rate](#) and soaring gas prices caused by the Hormuz deadlock will become the central issue in the November elections. Trump may be forced to choose between [capitulating on a nuclear deal](#) or declaring a "theatrical" military victory to soothe his domestic base.
- **Ukraine Political Shift:** If the Yermak investigation [implicates President Zelensky](#), Western aid support may see a catastrophic drop, forcing Kyiv into a [weakened negotiating position](#) with Moscow.

Long Term (1-5 Years):

- **Nuclear Arms Race:** The [expiration of the New Start Treaty in 2026](#) and China's development of a [nuclear triad](#) will likely lead to a "tri-polar" arms race. Smaller states (India/Pakistan/North Korea) will use the [expanded political space](#) to aggressively modernize their arsenals.
- **Supply Chain Redesign:** Regional blocs will likely [accelerate domestic mineral processing](#) and free trade zones (like the African Continental Free Trade Area) to bypass volatile global transit routes [controlled by major power blockades](#).

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Security:** Diplomatic coalitions must be formed to [reject state-level tolling of international straits](#) to prevent the collapse of the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS).

- **Health:** Re-funding of [U.S. AID and WHO programs](#) is required to provide the "ring vaccination" and surveillance capacity needed to contain the Bundibugyo strain before it leaves the continent.
- **Diplomacy:** A "confidence-building measure" is needed between the U.S. and Iran—potentially involving [China as a trusted third party](#)—to reopen the Strait for humanitarian and agricultural goods.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Agricultural and food processing companies should [anticipate higher costs through 2027](#), as the current season's fertilizer shortfall is already "locked in."
- **Investment Opportunity:** Brazil's [rare mineral processing sector](#) represents a high-growth alternative to China, provided investors can navigate the [unpredictable tariff environment](#).
- **Insurance Alert:** Maritime shipping operators must [secure specialized sanctions-exempt insurance](#) or risk catastrophic losses, as standard underwriters continue to strip war risk coverage for the Gulf.
