THE MIDDLE EAST TEETERS ON THE BRINK OF TOTAL WAR AS PRESIDENT TRUMP THREATENS A "FINAL" OFFENSIVE WHILE GLOBAL MARKETS BUCKLE UNDER THE CONTINUED CLOSURE OF THE STRAIT OF HORMUZ.

## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

---

May 18, 2026, marks a critical juncture in the ongoing conflict between the United States, Israel, and Iran. Following nearly three months of active hostilities and a fragile ceasefire, President Donald Trump escalated his rhetoric, [threatening an all-out military strike](#) unless Tehran accepts a comprehensive nuclear and regional deal. While Trump later claimed to have postponed the strike at the request of Arab leaders, the region remains on high alert following [drone attacks on the Barakah nuclear plant](#) in the UAE and incursions into Saudi airspace. These developments suggest that despite ongoing indirect negotiations through Pakistan, the risk of a "miscalculation" leading to a regional conflagration is at its highest point since the start of the "Third Imposed War" in late February.

The economic consequences of the conflict have reached a fever pitch, with the G7 finance ministers convening in Paris to address [soaring inflation and the effective closure](#) of the Strait of Hormuz. Iran's blockade has removed nearly one billion barrels of oil from the market, driving prices toward \$110 per barrel and threatening a global recession. Domestically, Iran faces a [digital blackout entering its 80th day](#), accompanied by a record-breaking surge in state executions used as a tool for social control. The convergence of military brinkmanship, economic desperation, and high-tech warfare—specifically the use of AI for targeting—defines a day of extreme volatility where diplomacy appears to be the only alternative to systemic regional collapse.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

---

- **Trump's "Storm" and Diplomatic Brinkmanship:**
  - President Trump utilized social media to signal an imminent strike, [publishing an AI-generated map](#) showing US flags over Iranian cities Mushhad, Tehran, and the Persian Gulf.
  - Trump later announced a [24-hour postponement of military operations](#) following pleas from the leaders of Qatar, Saudi Arabia, and the UAE, who cited "serious negotiations" currently underway.
  - Washington's core demand remains the [surrender of Iran's 450kg stockpile](#) of 60% enriched uranium and the permanent dismantling of enrichment capabilities.

- **The Economic Strangulation of the Strait of Hormuz:**

- Iran has implemented a [mandatory permit system for shipping](#), effectively seizing control of the world's most vital energy artery.
- Saudi Aramco warned that even if the strait opened today, [market stabilization would take months](#) due to the loss of 100 million barrels of oil per week.
- The G7 is fractured; while the US demands [total adherence to a unified sanctions regime](#), other members are more concerned with a looming bond market collapse and rising interest rates.

- **Regional Military Escalation:**

- The UAE's Barakah nuclear plant was [targeted by three drones](#) launched from the west; though no radioactive leakage was detected, a generator fire occurred.
- Saudi Arabia [intercepted drones from Iraqi airspace](#), leading to a significant security realignment as Pakistan prepares to deploy thousands of troops and fighter jets to the Kingdom under a defense pact.
- An alleged [secret Israeli airbase in southern Iraq](#) was revealed, reportedly used for "mobile" air operations against Iranian targets.

- **Iran's Domestic Repression and Economic Despair:**

- Amnesty International reported a [staggering 2,159 executions in Iran](#) over the past year, an 80% increase used primarily to intimidate political dissidents during the war.
- The Iranian rial has plummeted, and [drug prices have increased by up to 300%](#) due to currency shortages and hits on pharmaceutical infrastructure.
- The Tehran Stock Exchange is [set to reopen tomorrow](#) after an 80-day hiatus, though 42 war-damaged companies remain suspended.

- **AI and Technological Warfare:**

- The US military is heavily relying on the [AI-driven "Miun" system](#) for target selection, which has reportedly accelerated target processing from hours to minutes but has also been linked to civilian casualties, such as the strike on a school in Minab.

## **KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS**

---

**Energy Security:** Global energy markets are in crisis. The [IEA warns that commercial oil reserves](#) will be depleted within weeks if the Hormuz blockade continues. In the UK, diesel prices have risen 35% since the war's start, leading to [emergency contingency planning](#) by the government to manage cost-of-living impacts.

**Technology Policy & Digital Sovereignty:** Iran has moved toward a "tiered" internet model. While the general public suffers a total blackout, the government offers ["Internet Pro" for a 25-fold higher price](#), effectively turning digital access into a state-controlled revenue stream and surveillance tool. Hardliners are even [advocating for the destruction of](#)

[Starlink satellites](#) to maintain total informational control.

**Food Access & Security:** The World Food Programme (WFP) reports that the Hormuz closure has [increased operational costs by 25%](#) and blocked fertilizer shipments to East Africa, potentially triggering widespread famine. Farmers in the UK and Kenya are struggling with [50-100% increases in fuel and fertilizer costs](#).

**Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics:** Inside Iran, President Pezeshkian is [defending the logic of "rational" negotiation](#) against hardliners who view the Hormuz blockade as a permanent strategic victory. Meanwhile, Mohammad Baqer Qalibaf has been [elevated as a special envoy to China](#), indicating a shift in the hierarchy as Tehran seeks an alternative to US-led mediation.

**Regional Influence & Power Projection:** Pakistan's role has evolved from a simple mediator to a [critical military partner for Saudi Arabia](#). The deployment of Pakistani forces to the Kingdom signals a lack of confidence in the US security umbrella and a move toward a "South-South" security architecture involving Turkey, Qatar, and Pakistan.

## **LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP**

---

Governance activity focused on economic mitigation and diplomatic finalities as the G7

attempted to find common ground on sanctions and domestic subsidies.

### **• BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**

- **UK Cost-of-Living Package:** The UK Treasury is preparing a [targeted support package for households](#) and businesses as energy bills are expected to rise by £200 in July due to the war.
- **Iranian Stock Market Insurance:** The Iranian Securities and Exchange Organization introduced a [share insurance plan and loans up to 200 million tomans](#) to prevent a mass sell-off upon the market's reopening.
- **US Sanctions Waivers:** The US Treasury [extended oil sanctions waivers for Russia](#) for one month to prevent further global oil shocks, much to the chagrin of pro-Ukraine hawks.

### **• HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:**

- **G7 Finance Ministers Summit:** Held in Paris, where the US [called for a "unified sanctions regime"](#) against the "Iranian war machine."
- **Pezeshkian Address:** The Iranian President [publicly criticized negotiation opponents](#), urging "honesty with the people" regarding the necessity of diplomatic solutions.
- **Amnesty International Briefing:** Launched a global campaign to highlight the [70+ Iranian political prisoners currently on death row](#).

## **DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES**

---

**The Weaponization of the Global Commons:** The most significant shift in the 2026 conflict is the normalization of using global trade chokepoints as direct military

leverage. Iran's "permit" system for the Strait of Hormuz is not a temporary blockade but an [assertion of digital and physical sovereignty](#) over international waters. This has forced the G7 and other major economies into a defensive posture, where they must choose between a catastrophic military attempt to "break" the blockade or a diplomatic capitulation that permanently alters maritime law.

**AI Ethics in High-Intensity Conflict:** The "Miun" system represents a turning point in military history—the first major war where [AI selected 11,000 targets in real-time](#). The reports of civilian casualties in Minab highlight a growing accountability gap. As targeting speeds up to "minutes," the human-in-the-loop becomes a rubber stamp for algorithmic decisions, creating a [legal and moral vacuum](#) that neither Washington nor the UN has yet addressed.

**The End of the US Security Umbrella:** Arab nations are increasingly looking toward regional powers (Pakistan, Turkey) rather than the US for immediate protection. The [deployment of Pakistani troops to Saudi Arabia](#) suggests that the US "Operation Epic Fury" is viewed as a source of instability rather than protection. This trend toward "localized" defense pacts is likely to outlast the current war, diminishing long-term US influence in the Gulf.

## **STRATEGIC FORESIGHT**

---

**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** The 24-hour "postponement" is a high-risk bluff. If the Pakistani-led mediation fails to produce a [credible uranium removal plan](#) within the week, Trump is highly likely to resume strikes, potentially targeting Iranian oil terminals to break the rial's remaining value.

Expect a spike in "grey zone" activities, such as [ship seizures near the UAE coast](#).

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** Global inflation will remain entrenched. Even a peace deal won't immediately lower fuel costs, as [refineries and shipping routes](#) will take months to re-establish. In Iran, the reopening of the stock market will likely [result in a sharp index crash](#) despite state-mandated floors, potentially fueling the next wave of civil unrest as the middle class loses its savings.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** The conflict will leave a permanent scar on global trade. Countries like Kenya and East African nations will [diversify away from Middle Eastern fertilizer](#), while Europe will accelerate its shift toward "energy independence," further isolating the Gulf economies. The [legal precedent for AI-led warfare](#) will become the new global standard, leading to an arms race in autonomous targeting systems.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS**

---

### **For International Policy:**

- Establish an **International Maritime AI Oversight** body to investigate civilian casualties from autonomous targeting systems used in the Gulf.
- Support the **Pakistan-Qatar mediation channel** as the only credible alternative to a total regional war that would collapse the global bond market.
- Address the **East African food crisis** through direct grain subsidies to prevent the war from causing a secondary mass-casualty event.

## For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Manufacturers of consumer goods (e.g., UK door importers) must [reroute around the Cape of Good Hope](#) permanently, adding 4 weeks to lead times.
- **Market Volatility:** Avoid Iranian equities upon reopening; the [42 suspended companies](#) represent the backbone of the industrial sector and have no clear path to recovery.
- **Cyber & Tech:** Global firms should **audit their use of AI platforms** like Palantir (Miun) to assess reputational and legal risks associated with war-zone applications.
